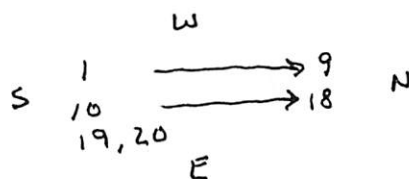

ried and following Martha Helen's marriage to Allen, made her home permanently with the couple.

Allen died at his home on November 18, 1920. As was the local custom, the funeral was held at the house the following day. The minister from Poplar Springs Church officiated at the funeral. He was buried in the family cemetery located a few hundred yards behind the house.

A farmer, Allen and Martha Helen Perry lived in the Sutton community of Franklin County near the small crossroads that would later become known as Pine Ridge. Their comfortable frame house, with front and back porches, was still standing in 2006. They were members of nearby Poplar Springs Baptist Church.

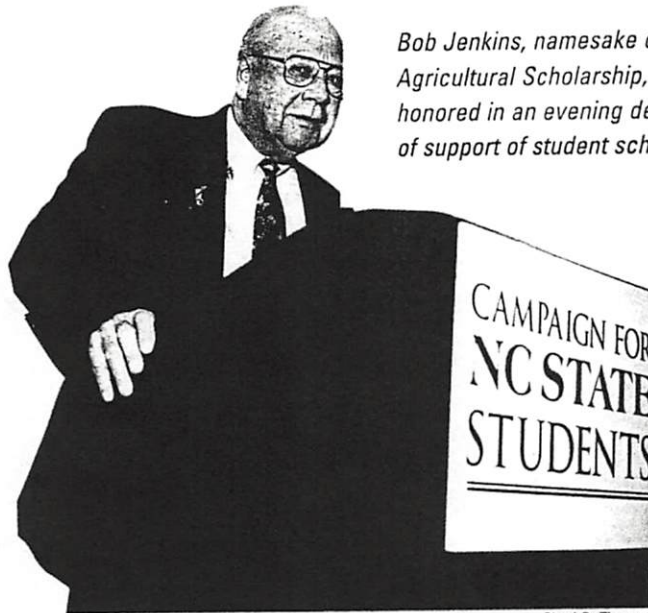
CALS Campaign for N.C. State Students, Jenkins Scholarship endowment celebrated

Saturday, Dec. 4, was a triple-strength red-letter day for the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences. That's when alumni, donors and friends of the College gathered at the Sheraton Imperial Research Triangle Park to celebrate the success of the CALS Campaign for N.C. State Students and the W.B. "Bob" Jenkins Agricultural Scholarship and to recognize scholarship donors and recipients.

Dean James Oblinger welcomed the audience to the three-part gala celebration, which included presentations by Chancellor Marye Anne Fox. Among special guests were CALS Campaign Committee co-chairs Bill Fike, Mozelle Costner-Parker and Bryan Perry, Norris Tolson, Bob Jenkins Scholarship Committee member and former secretary of the state Department of Transportation; Larry Wooten, N.C. Farm Bureau Federation; David Rouzer, office of Sen. Jesse Helms; and U.S. Rep. Bob Etheridge.

Chancellor Fox presented plaques to Fike, Costner-Parker and Perry commemorating their efforts in the CALS Campaign for N.C. State Students. "As with any great effort, there are always those that step forward to get the job done," Fox said. "These individuals have not only led by example, but they have given by example as well."

Fike recognized the campaign committee and Costner-Parker led the recognition of the campaign donors. Then Perry (whose "commitment of \$1.5 million put our campaign over the top," Oblinger said) came forward to make the campaign's grand total announcement.

Bob Jenkins, namesake of the W.B. "Bob" Jenkins Agricultural Scholarship, was among those honored in an evening dedicated to the celebration of support of student scholarships in the College.

"We should keep in mind that this campaign began with a goal of \$5 million, then it went to \$7 million and finally ended up at \$15.45 million," Perry said. "I don't believe anyone involved in this campaign from the beginning ever thought in their wildest dreams that it would be this successful." Perry then revealed just how successful it was – the CALS Campaign had reached more than \$18.5 million. (At press time, the amount had climbed to \$19.3 million.)

Dr. George Barthalmus, associate dean and director of Academic Programs, told the audience that "the positive effects of this campaign are already taking place in the College" and announced that during this academic year, the College will award \$610,000 to 550 undergraduate student recipients and more than \$400,000 to 50 graduate students.

Fox then directed attention to an-

other special honoree, Bob Jenkins. "I am pleased to join you today in recognizing and thanking someone who, reading from his list of accomplishments, must be one of a kind," she said.

In addition to serving as president of the N.C. Farm Bureau Federation, Jenkins has chaired or co-chaired the CALS Campaign for N.C. State Students, the Dean Durward Bateman Scholarship Campaign, the Commissioner James A. Graham Campaign and the Eastern North Carolina 4-H Environmental Education Center Campaign.

A video tribute to Jenkins was followed by the announcement that, with a lead gift of \$50,000 by the N.C. 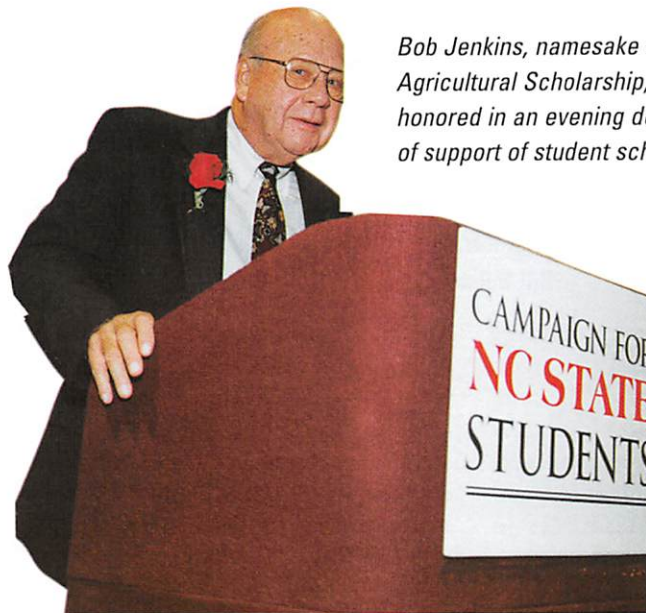
CALS Campaign for N.C. State Students, Jenkins Scholarship endowment celebrated

Saturday, Dec. 4, was a triple-strength red-letter day for the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences. That's when alumni, donors and friends of the College gathered at the Sheraton Imperial Research Triangle Park to celebrate the success of the CALS Campaign for N.C. State Students and the W.B. "Bob" Jenkins Agricultural Scholarship and to recognize scholarship donors and recipients.

Dean James Oblinger welcomed the audience to the three-part gala celebration, which included presentations by Chancellor Marye Anne Fox. Among special guests were CALS Campaign Committee co-chairs Bill Fike, Mozelle Costner-Parker and Bryan Perry; Norris Tolson, Bob Jenkins Scholarship Committee member and former secretary of the state Department of Transportation; Larry Wooten, N.C. Farm Bureau Federation; David Rouzer, office of Sen. Jesse Helms; and U.S. Rep. Bob Etheridge.

Chancellor Fox presented plaques to Fike, Costner-Parker and Perry commemorating their efforts in the CALS Campaign for N.C. State Students. "As with any great effort, there are always those that step forward to get the job done," Fox said. "These individuals have not only led by example, but they have given by example as well."

Fike recognized the campaign committee and Costner-Parker led the recognition of the campaign donors. Then Perry (whose "commitment of \$1.5 million put our campaign over the top," Oblinger said) came forward to make the campaign's grand total announcement.

Bob Jenkins, namesake of the W.B. "Bob" Jenkins Agricultural Scholarship, was among those honored in an evening dedicated to the celebration of support of student scholarships in the College.

"We should keep in mind that this campaign began with a goal of \$5 million, then it went to \$7 million and finally ended up at \$15.45 million," Perry said. "I don't believe anyone involved in this campaign from the beginning ever thought in their wildest dreams that it would be this successful." Perry then revealed just how successful it was – the CALS Campaign had reached more than \$18.5 million. (At press time, the amount had climbed to \$19.3 million.)

Dr. George Barthalmus, associate dean and director of Academic Programs, told the audience that "the positive effects of this campaign are already taking place in the College" and announced that during this academic year, the College will award \$610,000 to 550 undergraduate student recipients and more than \$400,000 to 50 graduate students.

Fox then directed attention to an-

other special honoree, Bob Jenkins. "I am pleased to join you today in recognizing and thanking someone who, reading from his list of accomplishments, must be one of a kind," she said.

In addition to serving as president of the N.C. Farm Bureau Federation, Jenkins has chaired or co-chaired the CALS Campaign for N.C. State Students, the Dean Durward Bateman Scholarship Campaign, the Commissioner James A. Graham Campaign and the Eastern North Carolina 4-H Environmental Education Center Campaign.

A video tribute to Jenkins was followed by the announcement that, with a lead gift of \$50,000 by the N.C. Farm Bureau Federation Board of Directors, the commitments to the Jenkins Scholarship Endowment had reached \$175,000, with more coming in. Staying on the **forefront** of safety issues...

Bringing food products from farm and sea to table requires diligence on the part of all those whose job it is to produce safe and healthy food and to protect the environment in the process. This Winter 2000 issue of *Perspectives* reports on the College's research, extension and teaching activities to ensure safe practices and provide assistance in compliance with government regulations to those sharing responsibility along the production, processing and utilization chain: farmers and processors who must follow animal health guidelines, adhere to regulations in applying plant protection chemicals and perform point of control practices in handling and processing food products; and consumers, whose increased knowledge of safe food handling and nutritional practices can keep them alert to prevention of foodborne illness.

Concerns about foodborne illness were in the news last fall when tainted meat was found at several North Carolina businesses, pointing to the need for better food-handling practices. The feature "Healthy Process" outlines some of the teaching, research and extension activities in the College to help minimize the potential health and economic impacts of food-related illness throughout the chain of meat production, processing and preparation. Another feature article, "Critical Control," then specifically relates the work of N.C. State University's seafood laboratory in educating the state's seafood processors in compliance with the U.S. Food and Drug Administration's Hazard Analysis and Critical Control Points (HACCP) food-safety system regulations.

You'll also learn, in the news section, how students can access the latest research and regulatory developments in food safety via Dr. Pat Curtis' on-line food science course, Food Law

and Regulations.

In the feature "Good Coordination," you will read about the Poultry Coordinating Committee, a multidisciplinary team of Extension field faculty and poultry specialists that educates growers and integrators in Best Management Practices (BMPs). The committee's work is especially timely as increased vertical integration of the poultry industry has called for more assistance along the continuum of the production cycle and into the food-safety arena, from pre-harvest to post-harvest. On the campus front, committee members are slated to teach sections of a three-part graduate course in food safety that is evolving out of the needs of the food-producing industry.

Research in the College is helping to address gaps or needs arising from regulatory decisions made by the Environmental Protection Agency based on the Food Quality Protection Act. The FQPA, passed by U.S. Congress in 1996, mandates a single health-based standard for pesticides in all foods, provides special protections for children, expedites approval of safer pesticides, creates incentives for

the development of effective crop protection tools for American farmers and requires periodic re-evaluation of pesticide registrations and tolerances.

As it assesses the risks of various pesticides and determines residue tolerances, the EPA is to consider the actual exposure to residues on various foods and the percent of a crop treated with a particular pesticide. This *Perspectives* reports on the work of College faculty members to assist EPA policy makers in this area by developing crop profiles that describe how pesticides are used in North Carolina, as well as our planned field research to evaluate the new classes of chemicals that will come along to protect fruits and vegetables.

Food safety and nutrition for the consumer have been for 30 years the focus of North Carolina Cooperative Extension's Expanded Food and Nutrition Program. This issue shows how EFNEP provides nutritional education for North Carolinians with limited resources, targeting not only adults who prepare food, but also pregnant teens and nursing mothers.

Cooperative Extension continually offers programs to increase the safety of the farm practices that produce the food. The work of the College in devising strategies for helping farmers and their families stay safe in the face of hazards posed by machinery and toxic chemicals is the subject of the feature "Precautionary Measures."

In all of these safety-themed articles, you will learn about the ongoing role of the College: to identify additional methodologies that will be benign to human health and to the environment.

Pat Perry looks out of her Wilmington home and sees the water, sky and harbor through the eyes of an artist. "There's something ethereal about water. It changes so much; and with each change, the water tells a story," says Perry as she surveys the sun's pink and orange rays reflecting on the water. "When the sun is out, it looks like jewels dancing on the water."

Pat and Bryan Perry spotted land at the curve of Airlie Drive almost a decade ago. They came to Wilmington from their Raleigh home looking for a condo. While driving around with their real estate agent, they spied a white house surrounded by wrap-around porches with a for sale sign in the expansive yard. Situated on three lots in the Edgewater subdivision, it had incredible views of the Intracoastal Waterway.

"We saw the owner out raking leaves and told the agent to pull over," Pat recalls. "The owner, who was a doctor in Wilmington, showed us the house and that was it. We were surprised to learn it was actually three lots so we sold one, sold the house and built on the lot closest to the water."

Bryan saw the lots through a developer's eye – he owns Perry Development Company in Raleigh, but Pat's vision leaned more to the sculptural and vista-leaning possibilities the setting offered.

"I'm just a deadbeat artist," she laughs and points to the watercolors inspired by her travels and surroundings. Their daughter Tricia's art also lines the walls of the Mediterranean-style home.

"What I love about building is the creativity of it. This house was like my palette. Bryan can look at raw land and see the finished product. I can look

at a house plan and see it finished, she says."

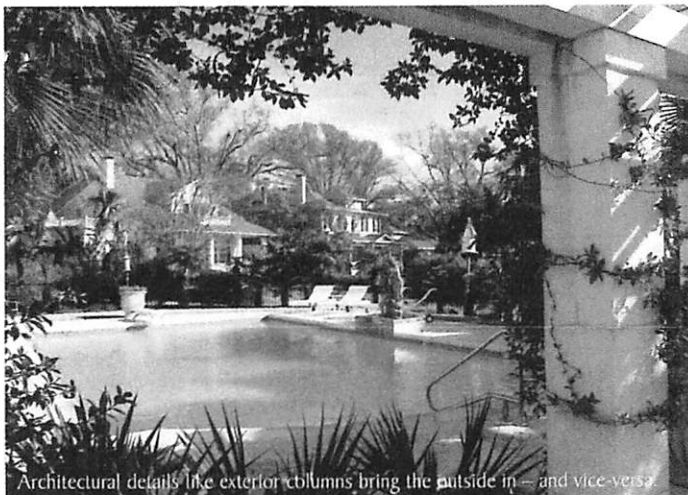
Evidence of Pat Perry's work is captured in the intricate wrought iron gates and iron work that she sketched and had metal workers bring to life in the house and gardens. The mammoth front doors are carved with the Perry family crest.

The family built their Wilmington home themselves, an 18-month adventure that resulted in the Mediterranean style villa that is unique to the Wilmington area. Pat moved to Wilmington, living in rented condos until the work was completed. With five grown children bringing grandchildren to the house to visit, the Perrys wanted a design that was both beautiful and functional for their coastal home. They turned to Jan Conrad of Jan C. Designs, Inc. of Wilmington.

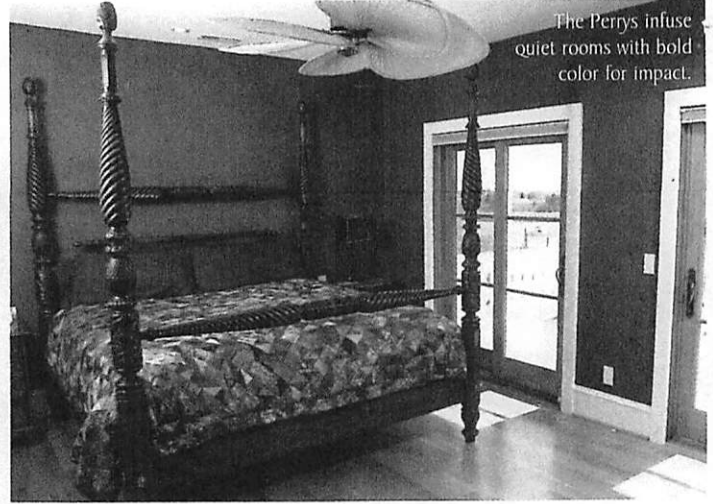
"The vistas are grand in the Perry House. There is no bad side to this house. It is designed to view the water from all faces and to catch the breezes off of the water. You can watch the boats go by on the Intracoastal or go up to the tower and see the ocean," says Conrad, who planned specifically to capture picturesque panoramas when she designed the home.

The home's exterior features white textured walls and a green tiled roof. Landscapes Unique of Wilmington helped the Perrys keep the native live oaks and coordinate them into the garden design. The loquat trees, though native to China, create a Mediterranean feel, plus their tolerance for cold, adaptation to any well-drained soil, and symmetrical growth pattern make them a maintenance-free garden accent.

"I've always loved the look of homes in Italy and the south of France. That influenced the look of this house," Pat explains. "Plus, I love the look

of the Episcopal Church on the corner in town and the old Babies Hospital. I've always loved the tile roofs and stucco walls."

Views of the harbor and gardens inspired Pat's use of colors inside the home. In the family great room, comfortable, oversized rattan pieces flank a Moroccan mantel that looks like stone but is actually concrete. An elk and caribou gaze down from the soaring two-story walls, trophies from one of Bryan's hunts in Alaska.

"The Victorians hung animals along with their chandeliers. (The mixed look) energizes me. I love it all," says Pat Perry as she points out treasures such as the hand-carved nativity set from Israel.

The rest of the interior is infused with color. The kitchen windows overlook the Intracoastal Waterway, and the imported blue tile from Italy coordinates with the view. The multi-colored hand-blown light fixtures are Italian and give the room a burst of red, orange, yellow, and green.

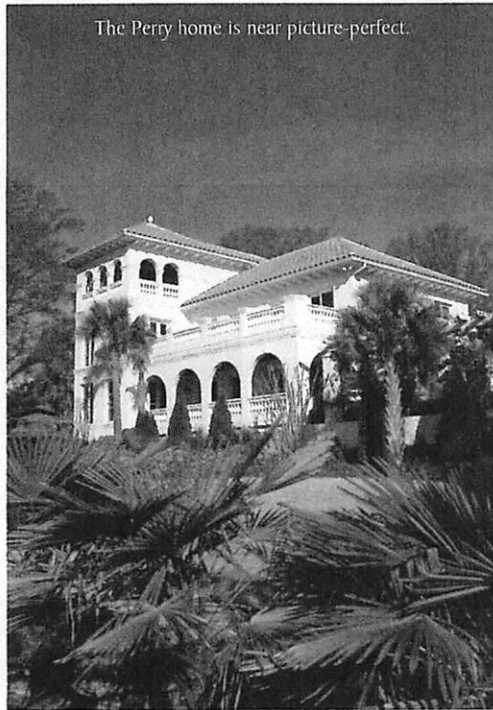
The barstools may look familiar to Wrightsville Beach old-timers. They were donated by the Blockade Runner Beach Resort to a resale store that benefits domestic violence victims. Pat Perry bought them to add local color to her bright kitchen and to lend a helping hand.

With panoramic views on each story, choosing a room with a favorite view is difficult. The master bedroom is sequestered away from the rest of the rooms on the second floor. The telescope in the sitting area allows for up-close nature and boat-watching.

Pat Perry designated an artist's studio that is adjoined to the media room. Inspiration from the gardens and pool below, the Fish House restaurant and neighboring harbor on Airlie Drive, or the view of Wrightsville Beach could make anyone itch to paint or create.

Beautiful scenes can be viewed from balconies on all three levels. The home has five bedrooms with plenty of baths for the large clan. Bryan Perry says that Airlie Road is "just pretty" and likes to spend time with his large family in Wilmington, a difficult feat with so many schedules to coordinate.

Bryan spends his time on the water cruising up and down the Intracoastal or up to Figure Eight Island. He traded in his Grady-White for 21-foot Hurricane that he bought at Chatlee Marina in Sanford. The family has a 31-foot Contender they purchased from Power Marine

Outfitters in Sneads Ferry for King Mackerel tournaments – a hobby of Bryan Jr.'s – who likes the proximity of his parents' house to both Morehead City and Southport fishing.

This is the second Contender that the Perrys have owned. Bryan Jr. customized this boat with a T-top from his fishing buddies, Danny and David Gore of Wilmington's Gore Marine. A custom T-top allows a fisherman to put his electronics and rod holders exactly where and how he wants them, according to Danny Gore.

"The T-top just completes the center console boat," says Gore. "It gives the boat more of an appealing look to a fisherman or boat enthusiast besides providing protection from the elements. It's a signature item."

The elder Perry prefers hunting over fishing, saying he had enough early mornings growing up on a dairy farm.

Meanwhile, Pat Perry, the family's true lover of the coast, prefers watching the water any time of the day.

"It's so pretty at night here," she says. "With all of the lights, it looks like diamonds are all around you."

Perry says that they never have formally named the house. "We should have gone on and named it House of Blessing in Italian. We have been blessed beyond measure and beyond our wildest dreams that we would be able to have anything like this, but it doesn't own us."

The Perrys' philosophy that "to whom much is given, much is required" shows in their generosity. They have opened their Wilmington home for retreats and getaways, once hosting 38 ladies. In 1994, North Carolina Governor Jim Hunt awarded the Order of the Longleaf Pine, the highest state award for a civilian, to Bryan Perry. The Perry family donated the family dairy farm that had been in their family for six generations to N.C. State for preservation.

"We develop land, but we didn't want to develop that," says Bryan Perry.

As for the land in Wilmington, the Perrys admit that they didn't really know what a good investment their Edgewater property was when they bought it. Pat Perry just had an eye for design and Bryan Perry had an eye for land. Their combined instincts led them to their house of blessing, a work of art where their cups runneth over with love for family and the coastal area of Wilmington.

A gift that keeps on giving Deal sets example for giving

RALEIGH — A. Bryan Perry and his brother, Miley "Monk" Perry, wanted it all. They dreamed of preserving their pastoral 167-acre family farm, but they wanted to make money off the land at the same time.

Together, they came up with the perfect deal.

The brothers gave away the family farm to N.C. State University, then used a complex trust and tax shelter formula to harvest a bountiful income from the land.

"It was a good deal for us

financially, it was a good deal for the university," said Bryan Perry, 46.

So everybody wins?

"Everybody but Uncle Sam," said Monk Perry, 47.

Under terms of the trade, the Perry brothers placed their farmland in what is known as a charitable remainder trust.

The trust then traded the Perry

farm for land of equal value — 93 acres of university property off Trenton Road. It then sold the 93 acres to SAS Institute for \$2.8 million. That sum was placed in the Perry trust, and the Perry brothers will live off its dividends — 7 percent annually — for the rest of their lives.

That means the Perrys will each get a check for at least \$100,000 every year.

"As remarkable as it may seem, in some cases this can return more income to the donor or to their heirs than they might otherwise have gotten," said Philip

Horne, NCSU director of gift planning. "Had they sold their property, they would have had to pay capital gains tax."

Meanwhile, NCSU now owns the Perrys' farm next door to two of the university's research parcels off Lake Wheeler Road. And when the Perrys and their wives die, the value of the Perry trust — an amount expected to build to several million dollars or more — will revert to NCSU.

For his part, Monk Perry is just glad that the old family farm is no longer his headache. Monk used

the land as a dairy farm until 1986, when he went out of the business.

"It really got to be a liability to me instead of an asset," he said.

So he and Bryan, who run a construction business called Edgewood Properties, decided to look into developing the farm that has been in the family for five generations.

"Then we started talking to the city, but with the restrictions they put on you, it makes it difficult," Bryan said.

A family friend suggested the charitable remainder trust. The brothers took the idea to NCSU, which was their neighbor and Bryan's alma mater.

It took three years, endless meetings, and not just a little convincing before everyone signed on.

"You can imagine how a bu-

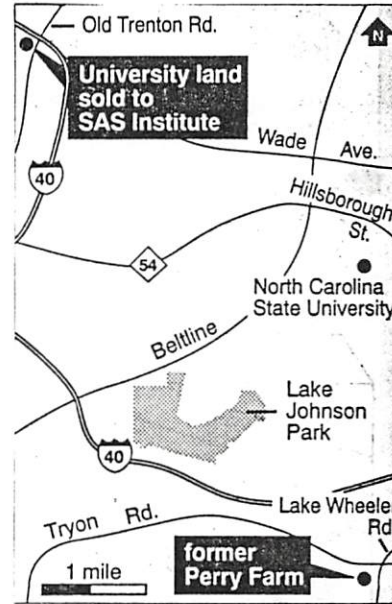
reaucracy tried to adjust to this story as it unfolded over two or three years," Horne said. "But our administrators were willing to see this through even though N.C. State had never tried anything like this."

The problem? It was just too different, the brothers said.

But wait, there's more. Because the brothers made such a tax savings on their gift, they were able to buy more than \$3 million in life insurance that will be paid to their children through a tax-free trust. Bryan Perry has five children, his brother has two.

All in all, a pretty sweet deal for both the Perrys and the university. Horne said such deals may be the wave of the future in gift giving.

"In a way, what these gentlemen have become is an example of what we refer to as the middle class become philanthropists," Horne said. "And it makes good sense."



How the deal works

- The Perry brothers placed their 167-acre farm in the Perry Charitable Remainder Trust.

- The trust traded its 167 acres for 93 acres of equally-valued university property.

- The 93 acres were then sold to SAS Institute for \$2.8 million.

- The \$2.8 million went into the trust. The Perrys will receive about 7 percent annually of the value of the trust.

- NCSU got the Perry farm, and when the Perry brothers and their wives die, the trust will revert to NCSU.

FACILITIES

The first building was constructed in 1880 by Mr. Neal Morris. This building was torn down in 1902 to make room for a new sanctuary which was built at a cost of \$222.23. Members gave timber and did much of the labor. Mr. Alph Johnson was foreman of the construction.

The vestibule and belfry were added when the East Wing was built in 1919. Mr. Cary B. Jones gave the bell which yet today resides in the belfry.

In March, 1965, the present sanctuary and fifteen Sunday School classrooms, three nursery rooms, study, kitchen, three bathrooms, a baptistry and a choir loft were completed at a contract price of \$66,629.00 by Davidson and Jones Construction Company. Mr. Roy

Womble was chairman of the Building Committee which consisted of Thelma Bartley, Gernon Holland, A. M. (Harry) Jones, Joe Jones, Charles Livengood, Neal Moore, and Doris Weatherspoon Vaughn.

In 1976, the Church purchased 1.74 Acres of land adjoining the Church on the north and east from Mr. Herbert Atkins for the sum of \$15,000.00.

Two committees were involved in planning and constructing this new building. The Building Planning Committee was composed of Wilton Grimes, Curtis Jones, Sharon J. Lawrence, Charles Livengood (chair), and Jimmy Rogers. Mr. Wilton Grimes was chairman of the Construction Committee which consisted of Dick Britt, John Dill, Margine Eagles (now Daniels), Curtis Jones, Sharon Lawrence, Charles Livengood, Bryan Perry, Jimmy Rogers, and Roy Womble.

In 1986, it was recognized that the Church Sanctuary was becoming outdated and needed renovation. A Remodeling/Redecorating Committee consisting of Jeannette Cox, Sue Gates, LaRue J. Holmes, Rosie Jetter (chair), Robert (Bobby) Mills, Brantley Murray, and Susan Temple was appointed to plan and carry out this long-term project.

In 1950, Theo L. Jones and wife, Hettie A. Jones, gave one acre of land and framing material for a parsonage. The parsonage was located near the second location of the Burns School on Penny Road across the road from the Jones home (currently the residence of Steve and Jeannette Cox). H. H. Holland was the contractor for the parsonage.

Pews used in the sanctuary from 1919 to 1965 were built by L. B. Woodall, J. E. Massey, Furman J. Jones, and A. M. (Harry) Jones.

The first organ was purchased in 1894. A second organ was purchased in 1918. The first piano was purchased in 1928. Ursula Atkins was the first pianist. An electric organ was given the Church in 1964 by Carlisle and Ernestine Jones Abbott.

Dr. R. W. Stephens of Apex gave the Church a silver communion set in 1919. It consisted of two cups and a pitcher. The present set of four plates and four trays with places for individual cups was given about 1938 by Mr. and Mrs. T. Braxton Jones and Mr. and Mrs. Paul Hendricks. Later, another plate and tray for cups were given by Mrs. Ara Lee Jones in memory of her husband, Delno Jones.

In 1916, Ursula Atkins presented the Church with pine needle collection plates which are on display in the Church Antiquities cabinet. The T. Braxton Jones Family and Mr. and Mrs. Paul Hendricks presented the present collection plates.

In 1965, the audio system for the Church was given by Mr. Harry Jones and Mr. Bruce Weatherspoon. Ironically, the system was used the first time at Mr. Jones' funeral.

In 2003, a silver cross for the Communion Table was given the Church as a memorial by friends in remembrance of Mrs. Hazel Kirkpatrick.

For some years the upkeep of the parsonage had proved to be costly. In the meeting of the deacons on December 3, 1985, Elizabeth Lassiter raised the question of "purchasing Perry property next to the church rather than spending a lot of money on the presently owned parsonage." At the next meeting (January 7, 1986) Willis Harris was asked to contact the owner to discover whether the property was available. The matter moved rapidly, and the owner met with the deacons at their next meeting (February 4, 1986). The minutes state:

Mr. Perry later met with the deacon board to discuss the possibility of the church purchasing property from him. Mr. Perry also told the board that the property that his father, Alton O. Perry, had wanted to give to the church some years ago and could not due to stipulations in HIS father's, Miley Perry's, will, had not been deeded to the church and that the deed only needed to be signed for the transaction to be finalized. Mr. Perry also informed the board that he had an appraisal done on the house, utility building and land that the church is interested in purchasing. He would like for the church to have its own appraisal done and then we would consider the price. He also stated that he would like to give a gift to the church. Mr. Perry is also interested in buying the present parsonage and the land that goes with it. He said there would be no problem if the church wanted to keep the present parsonage, but that he would like the first option on the property if the church should decide to sell it. The deacon board agreed to have an appraisal done on the Perry property and on the parsonage property.

At the church conference a week later (February 12, 1986), the deacons recommended the purchase of the Perry property, "which consists of 2.07 acres of land, a one story brick house and a one story metal office and warehouse building," at a cost of \$230,500, and the sale of the parsonage to Mr. Perry for \$70,000. So that the congregation would have plenty of time to think about and to discuss the proposal, action was deferred until a called church conference one week later.

There was opposition to the proposal. At the called church conference on March 16, 1986, a substitute motion was passed asking that "a committee be elected to investigate the options available to our body and presented to our congregation 30 days later." The properties and space committee, the finance committee, one trustee, and the chairman of the board of deacons were appointed to make this investigation. Their report, presented at the conference on April 25, was carefully written and attractively presented. After describing all options and estimating the cost of each, the report concluded with a recommendation that the original motion be approved. Finally, on May 4, by a vote of 102 to 27, the congregation approved the transaction. The deal was quickly completed, a loan was negotiated to pay for it, and appeals were made for pledges for the payment of that loan. Within weeks the pastor and his family had moved into the house, and the young people began to use space in the metal building for recreational activities. A year later Albert and Bryan Perry[†] donated to the church another tract of land adjacent to the church property.
