

My present academic standing at Simpson College is at the junior year level. I am applying for "life-experience credit" for many reasons, including: age, health, academic achievement at Simpson, and not the least in that I feel deserving.

I am applying for "life-experience credit" hours which I believe I am qualified to earn from total life involvement in many areas, but most specifically in the study area of English and communication. As my outline indicates, I have a various number of interests and achievements in English and the arts. My background is also very strong in business.

As you can see by the outline preceding this essay, I have a lifetime involvement in diverse interests and activities. proud of my accomplishments at every level. There are three specific areas of achievement in my life which I feel qualify me for advanced standing at Simpson. In each area I have had on-the-job training which has consequently broadened my knowledge and outlook and attitude about life. The first area is marriage and motherhood as a farm wife and agri-business partner. area is my writing ability and job-related experience. my interest in antiques which led first to intense study of the subject teaching, of and then to my own, on Consequently I presented antique seminars and presented many many programs. It is important for me to mention my intense interest in reading, theatre and travel. All of these activities have enriched and broadened my life in many ways and have been an outgrowth of my home and work-related activities.

Our marriage is in its twenty-eighth year. My husband, Ted, and I have lived and worked together from the beginning. We have a partnership with my husband's parents and have worked and lived beside them for most all our married years. We have two daughters. A son, between them, was lost at birth because of complications with my diabetes. The girls have been closely

involved in our farming operation. Education has been a high priority of ours for our children. One daughter is a graduate student in Classical Studies and Latin at the University of Missouri. She has recently applied for admittance to Law School. Our youngest daughter is a freshman at Iowa State University in Agriculture Public Service Administration. My determination in continuing and completing my college degree work has set a good example.

Our farm operation, Marywood Farms, Inc., is a blend of livestock, both cattle and hogs, and grain production. approximately 1700 acres. We have diversified our farm operation because of difficult economic times. Ted and I began doing this in 1978, when we formed AT & CW, Inc. These letters represent the first names of our family members. We organized and promoted the sale of an anhydrous ammonia business. Our bulk plant is on our farm site and our customers fill their tanks and applicators on location. I set up the system handling promotion and sales work as well as a process for recording tickets on the loads sold. Our home is also an office and I answer the telephone as well as operate a radio system. I handle all billing and Our business has had a steady healthy growth every Ammonia sales are seasonal. It is applied in the spring before planting. If the fall season is a long warm one, farmers very often apply ammonia as they do their fall plowing. product is cheaper in the fall it is a savings if it can be purchased at that time. Since we haul the product from our source we have a semi-tractor and bulk tanks. In off seasons we can also keep the tractor busy as we have a livestock hauling business.

In 1980, Ted and I formed Marywood Farms II, Inc. We still lease the ground from the parent company but we handle all business transactions and all decisions about farm operations. I do payroll and complete all reports. We have an average of fifteen employees. Employer-employee relations are important and must be

carefully maintained. The farm is responsible for the livelihood of ten families and some part-time employees.

AT & CW established a liquid propane business in 1981. Ted and I organized and promoted sales and employed a delivery man with tremendous sales ability. Again, I set up the files, transact business, do all billing on accounts and answer the telephone. We handle over six hundred accounts in a five county area. We recently received an award from our supplier, Phillips Petroleum Company for 1984 promotion, sales and safe-handling of L.P. gas.

In 1982, Ted and I bought the Knoxville, Iowa John Deere dealership. We have a capable sales, service and office staff in charge of that operation. Although these times are difficult economically, we believe there is a future in agriculture.

Our latest venture has been the planning and planting of an apple orchard on the present farm site. We have approximately 40,000 apple trees. Some are fourth year trees, and there are trees planted each year after. Our first year of production and sales will be 1986. We believe that diversification is the key to success in farming. Marywood Farms and AT & CW are family originated, owned and operated. Many of our interests and activities have been farm related such as 4-H, Warren County Fair involvement, Warren County Pork Association and Warren County Cattlemen. My organizational ability and secretarial skills have been instrumental in the growth of our business.

Writing and the communication of ideas has always been important to me. Not only has this background and experience helped in my relations with others but it has been invaluable for my administrative and secretarial duties in our agri-business operation. I have included samples of my writing skills. I left my job as editor of Inter Lab at Diamond Laboratories to commence motherhood. But the year as editor of this publication was valuable training and experience. I wrote and edited articles, did layout work and consulted with the printer for final publica-

tion of the monthly magazine. Later, at home and as a young mother eager to become involved, I wrote news items and a column for the weekly Carlisle Citizen newspaper. My column, "Through My Window," sold to the East Des Moines Shopper, Lee Town News, and was published weekly for twelve years. It very often appeared on the front page. There were many letters through the years from readers indicating interest and a comraderie with my comments. It was basic homespun philosophy about life in general and daily events.

The third area of life experience is in the area of antique study and education. I have widely studied nearly every antique category. Subsequently, I prepared and taught a series of classes on antiques for adults, locally. I have conducted seminars and presented many programs. One was presented at the 1980 Simpson Summer Sampler. Recently, I presented a seminar entitled "Dish Talk" for the State Quester meeting. I have also organized and chaired an antique show and sale which has since become an annual event for Log Cabin Days. Many of my hobbies, visiting museums and reading books are related to my interest in antiques. My travels always include historic sites and are often related to my lifetime pursuits.

My life has been goal oriented and especially significant in the areas of writing and communication. My work in our agribusiness concerns is diversified, but for the most part, I am a public relations person. I work with our employees and represent our business to our customers. I enjoy meeting people and working with them. Since continuing my education at Simpson, I am not as active in some areas of interest for obvious reasons.

First has come the career and life-experience. Now, I seek a college education and work towards a degree. In retrospect, I probably would do it about the same way again. My life has been full and involved. It has been a fine educational tool of learning and accomplishment. I believe I am deserving of extra credit hours and advanced standing at Simpson College.



Comments: This variety is the most popular variety in the United States and has a very good shelf life. It was developed by Jesse Hiatt, near Peru, Iowa, in the 1870's.

Empire-Red, medium in size, firm, slightly tart, good for eating and cooking, ready near the middle of September.

Comments: This variety is a cross between a Red Delicious and a McIntosh so it is similar to a McIntosh variety. It is a good keeper.

Chieftaim - Red, medium to large in size, firm, sweet, good for eating and cooking, ready near the middle of September.






