Hi Clayton----

This is to update our exchanges on the Moses U./Whitney Upchurch SubClan and, hopefully, to set the stage for a fuller collaborative treatment of this family. In addition to Biofiles of children sent to you and to Michael Lynn Upchurch in TX for transcription I now add children Candis and Bennett to the list for you and Michael. You have satisfied me that Claudia Ann (Aka Clary Ann) is a child of Whitney. As a ninth child I posit that there was one born 1813 about whom we know nothing.

We will continue to work with Michael to transcribe all of the Biofiles for Moses U. and his children and grandchildren and their spouses and to put them on line-a big but powerful project.

Additionally, we need to move to populate the Allied Families Family Tree for the Moses Upchurch Family as a companion of the narrative for this family already enrolled on our website. As a part of setting the stage for this activity and to augment our recent exchanges I have printed a copy of my Master Outline for the Moses U/Whitney U. Subclan through the 9th generation. This covers 30 pages and if you will provide me with a mailing address I will get it off to you. I have had 22 cooperators in compiling this document. Not included in the print out are details on descendants of 57 great grandchildren of Whitney.

As Allied Families creates a Family Tree on Ancestry for an enrolled family such as the one for Moses we add only a couple of dozen names to get started. We then anticipate finding a volunteer Tree Master to populate the tree. We would be happy to have a volunteer Tree Master for just the Whitley part. At this stage I do not anticipate making entries beyond the 9th generation. The tree will always belong to Allied Families and that way successive Tree Masters can be appointed as the future unfolds. I am assuming you or someone else already has a tree from which we can import much of what is needed. The 30 pages I am sending would be a source .

In addition to the family tree for the Moses U Family we will have other items on our website--annotated cemeteries, historic sites, road names, documents, etc.,etc.

You can see that I am challenged in moving from the manual and print world to the electronic age. I will welcome your help and that of others to accelerate the transformation.

This email is being copied to several other who may have an interest.



Hi Clayton---

Further re you interest in records for your ancestor Whitney U., S/O Moses U., Head of Clan NO 1. I checked the Biofile of Whitney today and found that a nurr of cooperators seem comfortable with a death date of 1863 but I found no hard evidence.

You expressed an interest in seeing the Biofiles of Whitney and his children. Today I prepared them to give to Jay to be treated to OCR and to be sent to Cousin Michael I Lynn U in TX for transcription prior to them being posted on our website. Michael had already done Whitney before we started using the OCR process but think it in good shape. The Biofile of one of the six children, James Monroe U., had been sent to Cousin Jeff Brown to transcribe but he has medical problems in hi family and cannot get to it so we will send it on to Michael to transcribe. Jay will send you the OCR'd copies

One child is variously styled as Claudia U. and as Clargy Ann U. Her records need more work.

If you or your daughter Susie have more items or clarifications to add to these Biofiles do not hesitate to frame an addition with your name and date attached send it on to Michael for inclusion. Thew Biofiles are "Field Notes" and we need to keep adding entries as new information is encountered. I have always been intrigued about one of the children moving to MO and on to CA.

Passing

She was one of those Land's Sake and Mercy Me women, a beatitude in an old print dress, and he was tall and quiet and solemn with the inner peace of a Buddhist monk, though the analogy would offend his Baptist soul. He died first, in his eighties and very tired, and she wept softly and privately, then washed, folded his clothes, packed his worn farm tools in cardboard boxes, and gave everything to others. She kept nothing of her husband but a few faded photos and 55 years of memories.

When she died a decade later, also in her eighties and tired, her passing was as calm and untraumatic as his. Neither feared death because neither had feared life.

After her funeral the family gathered and someone remarked that an era had died with the old man and woman, that a chapter of traditional ideas and ideals, customs and social mores had closed on American Southern life that could never be reopened. Not really, of course. Not yet. Eras don't end with the deaths of individuals but are dissolved by time until the generational images are too dim to register on the collective human psyche. The past becomes textbook footnotes and museum displays.

But too soon, within the framework of history, the era of the old man and woman will die and its passing, I think, is to be as dramatic as the disappearance of dinosaurs. Their generation is the last to have been born in and nourished by rural America. Forever after the world is urban, scientific, glossy, and perhaps unredeemably complex.

The old couple was born into a society little changed in four or five centuries. It was agrarian and simple, though often hard and harsh, that final decade of the 19th century, a time when Southern America's philosophy was a Trinity of land, God, and work. Each came into life in a rough chinked-log farmhouse hardly different from those first built by our Pilgrims almost three hundred years earlier. Their food came from the land. Clothes mostly were sewn at home. Transportation was wagon, buggy, and horse. Their religion was taken in the community-built church of hand-sawed planks, a homely structure heated by wood stove, lighted by lamps, possessed only of crude benches and a poorly made lectern for the part-time preacher who took his pay in chickens and roasting ears.

They met and married in the early 20th century, found 150 acres in Central Texas, rented a mule, and began farming, unaware that in the life beyond theirs, the phenomenon historians would call The Industrial Revolution was forever redesigning the future. They began a family as countries of the world indulged in a global war somewhere beyond their small farm. The first child died. The second and third survived. The fourth died. In the year Lindbergh flew the Atlantic, the cotton crop was excellent and they celebrated by ordering a suit for him, a church dress for her, new shoes for the children from the Sears & Roebuck catalog—and fretted for years about the extravagance.

When the depression arrived, neither they nor any of their neighbors were affected by it, as though they were stones in a river unmoved by the swiftly running current of history and change. In 1939 he bought the first family car. He was 44. She was afraid of it.

In the 1940's their small farmhouse still was heated by wood stoves. Rural electrification had not arrived, nor had indoor plumbing and telephones. The farm was a calm place with an orchard, cows for milk and butter, chickens for eggs. He rose before dawn each day, stoked the fire, read his Bible by lamplight, and went to the fields. She cooked and canned and planted flowers around the porch, milked and churned and washed clothes in a black pot under the chinaberry tree. They helped their neighbors as the neighbors helped them. The daughter married a town man and left. The son was drafted into another global war beyond the farm. He went away and never came back, and



for the rest of the couple's lives they were distressed because his body could not be returned home for burial.

Finally, in the late 1950's the farm was sold and they moved to town, into another small frame house. He brought his farm tools with him, kept them oiled and polished should they ever have to return.

Except that they now lived in town, their lives changed little. They still arose before dawn, read the Bible, helped their neighbors. She still made biscuits from scratch and exquisite fruit pies. There was a garden out back for the vegetables she canned. He bought a radio, though never a television. Each found part-time jobs because idleness offended their Puritan souls. Together they chose their gravesites and planned their funerals, neither of which would come for more than 20 years.

There was a benign innocence about them. Man walked on the moon and they walked, holding hands, to the neighborhood church. Communications were instantaneous and worldwide, and they chose to talk with neighbors on the front porch at sunset. Great corporations spun out shiny gadgets holding all of mankind's knowledge since the beginning of time, built machines that flew in space, and he sat each evening in a rocker his father had bought in 1902. Grandchildren went off to summer in Europe and returned to grandparents who had never traveled more than 100 miles from where they were born. The old farm was absorbed into a larger agricultural complex worked by an incorporated man whose sons went to college to learn that the orchard planted in the year Henry Ford first produced Model T's was not cost efficient and thus had to be replaced by a money crop, while daily he had to work in the small town garden, had to feel the moist earth to recharge his spirit.

They were untouched and undisturbed by this Futureworld around them. He said he was proud that he once had walked 8 miles to repay a \$20 loan and that in all of his life he had never broken his word to any man. She believed food bought in store cans tasted of tin.

And so they died, he first, she later, and they were buried in the graves they had selected so many years earlier. They were gone and there was nothing to pass on, except memories and ancient photos, the old rocker and the pink brooch he had given her when they married. The era had not died with them, but little of it remained. There is less of it now and it will be smaller still tomorrow and the day after, until that quiescent age is gone forever, buried like the old couple in a grave.

that Ruffin & Whitney had a sister and that Henry
Goodwin was their father. Arsey Goodwin has to fit
in somehow - probably as a brother of Henry & an
uncle of the girls. Another note shows a Margaret
Goodwin at the wedding (Another daughter of Henry?)

As a reported matter I have a note on one Jesse Goodwin who was on the 1840 census of Wake Co, NC made because he was 2 doors away from the residence of Whitney U - he would have been related somehow - perhaps as a relative of Elizabeth (Goodwin) U. The above premises that Cardie U is indeed the dau of Whitney U. The evidence for this link is circumstantial and in general in U B Vol 2 Issue 3 pg 31 which should have reached you by now. One possible slip in the circumstantial evidence is that a record cousin of Moses & Nathan U lived in Chatham Co, NC before 1800 and he could have had descendants which could have included Cardie U. The 2nd cousin was John U III (XID-157) who d 1795 in Chatham Co, NC we know he had two sons John U & Samuel U. Samuel U left the state and moved to Illinois and we have much info on him and no room for a Cardie U. Son John U may have stayed behind and had descendants. The records on John are still unfolding. I feel sure that there will be more facts found which bear at least circumstantially on the parentage of Cardie U if not providing actual proof. Let's keep looking.

I have dated personally with Garland Worth U, a grandson of Merritt U, and he portrays the same kind of man as your great Aunt Bulah (Marr) McLean. Garland knew her for the last ten years of her life as Merritt U lived with Garland's family. One can account for Merritt's behavior in part through her abuse of alcohol.

I have received my 1980 volume of the Upchurch Bulletin and would like to thank you for making this publication possible. I am looking forward to receiving the 1981 edition and have enclosed my \$10.00 check for the aforementioned.

What little information I have I will convey to you now, some of which you may already have. S. Merritt Upchurch was born March 23, 1841 and died March 12, 1921. His wife was Anice Mariah Mann. They were married June 1, 1861 in Chatham Co. Both are buried, side by side, in the Christian Chapel Church cemetery, Merry Oaks, N.C. Their plots are in the back left corner of this cemetery. My great-aunt Beulah Mann McLean was my source of information as to Merritt's first name being Silas, but she wasn't positive. It well could be Sion. Beulah says that Merritt had a poor reputation and that her father, Lindsay S. Mann, Merritt's youngest half-brother, would have little to do with him. Most of Lindsay's children never even saw uncle Merritt even though he lived only 15 to 20 miles away. Merritt supposedly was hard on his wife (aunt Annie) and children, and drank too much. My great-grandfather Lindsay gave a speech at Merritt's funeral that was quite unusual in that he spoke no praise, but stated that he hoped that those who had known Merritt had learned a lesson on how not to live one's life. As far as Anice's connection to the Mann family goes, I think she must have been the daughter of the Gracie Mann, evidently a widow, who is listed on pg. 472 of the 1850 Chatham Co., lower regiment, family #7.

The Esquire Holt I noticed on pg. 117 of vol. 1, no. 3, should read Squire Holt.- B. Oct. 8, 1802, D. Sept. 16, 1882. Squire was the nephew of my great-great-great-grandfather, George Anderson Holt. I am not sure about the Louisa U. on page 117 even though there are many Holt-Johnston (Johnson) marriages in my family history (several Mann-Johnston, also).

What evidence did you find to conclude that Candace U.'s father was probably Whitney U., (XID-11)? I would be quite interested in knowing.

The 9 JAN 1837 deed from Benjamin Tedder
is a surprise in that I would not expect these
two Upshur men to be listed quite so late.
As I reported in my last letter John U, III d
in the Shaddock's Creek Area ca 1795 and he had
sons John, Samuel and Stephen - but I
thought they were gone from the area by 1820
at the latest. However, it maybe that they
had departed before 1820 but still owned

land in the area or late or the late 1830's. However, I think a more likely explanation is that the deed refers to land previously owned by these Upshur men. Certainly the reference to "John Upshur's old line" implies earlier ownership, of course this would make sense for John U, III as he d in 1795.

My memoir went up in the UB on the land associated with John U, III was in UB Vol 8 No 2 Pg 69 APR 1987. Could you take a look at that presentation, if you still have the issue, and see if you learn anything new.

I have reread everything you sent in the memoir files. I note that there are still Tedders in the area today.

I am most grateful for your latest input and will continue to reflect on the 1837 deed. Probably some additional info will surface for one of us.

4.) I believe Elizabeth Goodwin's father may have been William Goodwin, born ante 1755. Only he and Gideon Goodwin have a girl, or girls, in their families in Wake County in the 1800 census of the right age to include Elizabeth. In fact, there are only three white Goodwins in Wake County in the 1800 Census index, the third being Rachel. Ironically, there is a Gideon and a William side-by-side in Chatham in 1800, page 153. William of Wake's family on page 732 breaks down in 1800 as follows: males - 2|1|3|0|1; females - 4|0|0|0|1. Gideon of Wake's family on page 731: males - 1|0|0|1|0; females - 1|0|1|0|0. My guess is that Gideon may not have gotten married early enough to be Elizabeth's father. Of course, the census index, or even the census itself, may not be complete with regards to the Goodwin families of that time, but assuming it is, since Elizabeth was married in 1813 in Wake County, I think it's not unreasonable to believe that William was her father. I need to do some more Wake tax list study, specifically in the White Oak district. This might just clear up most of the uncertainty, and give us some new insights into the Upchurches, as well. I have reviewed many of the Buckhorn district tax lists for 1795 through 1830, and they were very, very helpful on the Mann family. Do you know any Goodwins, or Goodwin descendants, whom I might correspond with?

Note that his dau would have been of the right age to have had a child born ca 1905. See also a Biofile sheet on Settle Belle Goodwin. I don't know if the "Sinnie Mann" part of this has any bearing on a Sinnie Mann b ca 1905.

Re Elizabeth Goodwin possible dau of William Goodwin. I have placed all this in my Biofile System. Did not encounter reference to William or Gordon or Rachel as sometimes happen. However, I did encounter early 1800's reference to Martha, Alsey & Henry Goodwin, see enclosed Biofile on Alsey Goodwin. Ruffin W was a brother of Whitney W & an Uncle of Candice. With regard to a Goodwin contact I don't have a good logical one but there are several prospects. I have profiles on about 300 members of the Goodwin Family. I would like to suggest that you contact Bruce Goull Goodwin and his wife Jean in Apex. I don't have an address or phone no. Jean wrote a social section for the Western Wake Herald to which I subscribe. She enters a lot of family material with emphasis on the Goodwin & Mills families. I am related to Jean through her Uplund & her Mills ancestors but have never contacted either Bruce or Jean. We need some contacts in the Apex area. If they are not interested maybe they could suggest someone. If not get back to me and I'll work over my Goodwin files again.

Re your GGGF John Mann I only have the speculation that Thomas is the middle name as provided in your Ltr of 16 FEB 1986 to me - which

information in turn came from Godard Clauder
 "Bude" Mann. Thanks for the correction James
 Franklin Mann → James Frederick Mann.

Re marriage bond of John Mann & Candis U -
 All my records show that the bond and the
 marriage was in Wake Co, NC. Do you have other
 evidence? I thought you had to get married in
 the county in which you got permission (bond
 or license), I don't think the clerk out of
 Wake/Chatham would have a hearing - that is just
 my sense of the situation. The father on the
 Wake/Chatham border did a fair amount of
 crossing over. Moses U, the gf of Candis, lived
 just across the boundary in Chatham. Although
 Whitney always lived in Wake he had some
 dealings in Chatham.

Re Dorris. My contact is Mr James Shannon
 Elder P.O. Box 5419 Kingsport, TN 37663 (Phone 615-
 323-7192). He goes by Shannon and is deep into
 genealogy. His mother (still living) is also quite
 interested and she is the dau of John Shannon
 and Jesse Idella (Doris) U. On 30 OCT 90 Shannon
 wrote "I have found one of my Doris ancestors
 to be 1733 in New Jersey". Enclosed are two DORRIS
 Profiles.

Thanks for the transcription of the 1854 Deed of
 Trust re John Mann, et al. I think I now fully
 understand what was going on. It is a little

concoluted. Details have been extracted for each
of the individuals involved and placed in
their Biopiles. The Shadocks Creek Area involved
is where John U, III (Head of clan) lived with his
family about 1785-1795. After John died in 1795
I trace his sons west by the early 1800's (John,
Samuel, Stephen). We have never learned the names
of the girls and they may have married in the
area and stayed behind. Several years ago I
published in the U B an account of the Upshur
deeds in this area along with land descriptions.
Some of it was on the Wake Co line. I have never
found any evidence of interaction between
John U III (or his family) and the families of Nathaniel
U, I & his bro Moses U (They were 2nd cousins).
Anyway, the families were $5 \pm$ miles apart and
overlapped in the area a short time as Nathaniel
& Moses did not arrive until about 1802

Some of Whitney's children lived in the SW
part of Wake Co - not too far from Shadocks Creek.
Some of Moses' descendants lived in New Hill.
A possible source of information in the graveyard
just west of Hallsman Cross Road in Wake Co.
Have you ever visited that site. I came close
but ran out of time. I would love to have
a full listing of existing stones if there are
not too many. Maybe the Wake Co Cem survey

has recorded the details.

You mentioned your Ross ancestor who lived in that part of Wake to which is now Durham Co. I, too, had ancestors in that area. My cross ancestors were not far south but even closer were my RAY ancestors. My GF Bartley Jefferson lived at a place called Storm Hill (Family lore - have never been able to locate the place) which was very near Rogers Store (still exists). He and Aurora Ray there in the 1865-1868 period. They are still RAY's there and when I met about 10 years ago I encountered Ray who knew all about my GF and his my into the Ray family. Wonder if any Rays of that area/era have entered into your records. I have sketchy details of the family.

Have you been able to locate the exact spot of the farm where John & Candice lived? I think there are more family details to be discovered in the Christian Chapel/Shubochi Creek Area

Dear Cousin Phil,

Thank you so much for the written summary you sent me on the subject of Candis Upchurch Mann and Whitney Upchurch. It was all I had hoped for and more. I'm optimistic that one day we'll discover even more evidence that indicates Candis was Whitney's daughter.

Here are a few points and questions that I wanted to address to you. They are as follows:

1.) My daughter Susan Colclough "Susie" Mann was born December 18, 1990.

2.) I agree wholeheartedly that given the information on Candis and Whitney that is known to date, it definitely appears she is his daughter. It is very nice to now have your succinct summary regarding this relationship.

3.) I'm intrigued by the information supplied to you by William Shelton Upchurch by letter dated 31 OCT 1981. Specifically, the fact that there was a Lenny Mann, an orphaned boy, who was reared by W. S. Upchurch's parents. I can not at this time imagine who his real parents were unless it was Lindsay Mann's sister Melissa Malvina who nobody in my living extended Mann family seems to remember. My Great-Aunt Beulah did not remember her, either. For her and my Great-Uncle Buck to be completely unaware that she existed led me to believe that she died as a teenager. Maybe she married a Mann and had children, but for Lenny to have been born in the early 1900s (I assume he meant circa 1905), means that Melissa would have lived at least fifty years. Or did one of Leonza's sisters marry a Mann, and then she and her husband die by the early 1900s? This could better explain it, because then Lindsay would have been Lenny's half-great-uncle and Leonza would have been his uncle. I'm going to delve into this a little when I can find the time. Maybe the 1900, the 1910 census and the newly released 1920 census could help clear this up. I've never done the thorough research in those three censuses that I should have. What do you think? Can you help clear up any of my confusion?

4.) I believe Elizabeth Goodwin's father may have
 △ been William Goodwin, born ante 1755. Only he
 △ and Gideon Goodwin have a girl, or girls, in
 - their families in Wake County in the 1800 census
 △ of the right age to include Elizabeth. In fact,
 - there are only three white Goodwins in Wake
 - County in the 1800 Census index, the third being
 △+△ Rachel. Ironically, there is a Gideon and a
 △ William side-by-side in Chatham in 1800, page
 △ 153. William of Wake's family on page 732 breaks
 - down in 1800 as follows: males - 2|1|3|0|1;
 △ females - 4|0|0|0|1. Gideon of Wake's family on
 - page 731: males - 1|0|0|1|0; females - 1|0|1|0|0.
 △ My guess is that Gideon may not have gotten
 △ married early enough to be Elizabeth's father.
 - Of course, the census index, or even the census
 - itself, may not be complete with regards to the
 - Goodwin families of that time, but assuming it
 △ is, since Elizabeth was married in 1813 in Wake
 - County, I think it's not unreasonable to believe
 △ that William was her father. I need to do some
 - more Wake tax list study, specifically in the
 - White Oak district. This might just clear up
 - most of the uncertainty, and give us some new
 - insights into the Upchurches, as well. I have
 - reviewed many of the Buckhorn district tax lists
 - for 1795 through 1830, and they were very, very
 - helpful on the Mann family. Do you know any
 □ Goodwins, or Goodwin descendants, whom I might
 - correspond with?

5.) How do you know my Great-Great-Grandfather Mann's
 □ middle name was Thomas? I have heard my Great-
 □ Uncle Buck say that he thought his Grandfather
 □ John Mann was John Thomas Mann, but he said he
 - wasn't absolutely certain. (On page 4 of your
 □+△ Candis U. biofile you have her son, Uncle Fred,
 △ named James Franklin Mann rather than James
 - Fredrick Mann.)

6.) I wonder why Candis and John obtained their
 □ marriage bond in Chatham and not Wake? Candis
 - must have already been living in Chatham, I
 □ suppose, but with whom?? Or did her earlier
 - birth of a child out of wedlock affect the
 - convention of obtaining the bond in the home
 - county of the bride?

7.) Perhaps there is a bastardy bond for Candis/Meritt
 - Upchurch in the 1842 to 1845 period in Wake
 - County. If so, it might name her parents. I'm
 - going to try to look into this, too. I don't
 - think it would be in Chatham, but I guess it
 - couldn't hurt to look there, as well.

8.) In a recent Upchurch Bulletin you mentioned someone
 □ by the last name of Dorris who lives in
 △ Tennessee. My GGGGrandfather Ross, a maternal
 - ancestor, who was born and died in Wake County in
 - that part of the county that is now Durham

Δ County, was named *Dorris* Ross. He was born circa
 Δ 1788 and died about 1854, and he was the oldest
 Δ son of Thomas Ross (1760 - 1840), a Revolutionary
 □+Δ War Veteran. I believe Thomas's first wife was
 Δ+Δ Sarah Hall, and she may have been Dorris Ross's
 Δ mother, but I'm not sure. Thomas's last wife was
 Δ Lucretia Tilley, but he did not marry her until
 - 1817. He may have had a wife in between, maybe
 Δ named Dorris. Then again, Thomas's mother may
 Δ have been a Dorris. His father was John and his
 □ mother was I think Mary, last name unknown.
 □ Anyway, the Dorris surname is very unusual. I
 - found a few in Orange County, NC in the late
 - 1700s (only Dorris in the State) near where the
 - Rosses lived, but then they disappeared by 1800.
 - Perhaps this person named Dorris who has
 - corresponded with you can help me. Like you
 - said, we genealogists live on hope.

- 9.) I have enclosed a photocopy and a transcription of
 □ the land record Nancy Crayton Dobbins Griffith
 - told you about in July, 1981 that involved
 Δ+Δ+Δ Anderson Holt, John Mann, and Whitney Upchurch.
 - It maybe more significant than I earlier thought.
 - What do you think?

□ 10.) My Great-Aunt Mary Joyce Mann Farabow told me last
 - year at the Mann Reunion that she remembered
 Δ+Δ thinking that John Mann died *after* Candis, that
 Δ he buried her in Chatham County in the woods
 - somewhat near Christian Chapel Christian Church
 □ and also near someone's saw mill. She admitted,
 - though, that her memory of this was a bit foggy.
 Δ I wonder if she was buried in that Mann\Cotten
 - cemetery up the road about 300 or 400 yards from
 - Christian Chapel. There are a few legible graves
 - left there, but they are in the woods and hard to
 - find now. I saw them about eight years ago, but
 Δ I saw no Candis Mann gravestone. Incidentally, I
 - never realized how close Christian Chapel and the
 - dirt road that leads north to Merry Oaks are to
 - the Wake County line until very recently when I
 - was at the 1991 Mann Reunion. At some points on
 - that short span of road I'm sure that Wake County
 - is within 200 - 300 yards. I mention this
 □ because maybe Whitney Upchurch lived in this area
 of Wake county in the Buckhorn District later in
 Δ+Δ his life and was actually very close by to his
 daughter Candis and son-in-law John Mann.

□ Thanks again for the information you sent me last week. I
 - look forward to hearing from again soon, but please do not feel
 - in sense of urgency in responding to this letter. I know you
 - have many matters, genealogical and otherwise, to attend to.
