Duke Trustee Emeritus, Shell Oil Executive Upchurch, 79

Walter McGowan Upchurch Jr., trustee emeritus of Duke University, founder of Duke's Chapel Choir, and a retired Shell Oil executive, died Sunday night in Duke Hospital. He was 79.

Upchurch, a graduate and long-time supporter of Duke, was honored for his devotion to Duke when he received the University Medal for Distinguished Meritorious Service on Dec. 8, 1988.

"We are deeply saddened by the loss of W.M. Upchurch, who had a long and distinguished relationship with Duke University as a student, staff member and trustee," said President H. Keith H. Brodie. "His vision and leadership were profoundly important to us, especially in the area of student affairs, and his influence will continue to be evident for many years. The university has lost a beloved and valued friend."

Over the years Upchurch developed close ties to the James B. Duke and Benjamin N. Duke families, long-time benefactors of the university.

"We've always felt like he was a member of our family," said Mary Semans, granddaughter of Benjamin N. Duke, trustee emerita of the university

and chairman of The Duke Endowment. "We've been strong friends for all our lives, and he was one of the most kind and compassionate people I've ever known. He was truly a remarkable person."

A native of Raleigh, Upchurch was active in both student government and music organizations while a student at Duke. He received his bachelor's degree in 1931 and his law degree in 1936.

From 1931 to 1941 Upchurch held a variety of administrative positions at Duke and played a vital role in student life and the arts. For 10 years he was general manager of Duke's Quadrangle Pictures, which at that time was the principal source of organized entertainment on campus. He was also director of the Office of Student Activities, a job that involved handling funds and accounts of all student organizations and directing Page Auditorium, and director of summer school activities.

In 1933 he founded the Duke Chapel Choir and became its first director. In 1940 Upchurch became director of Placement Services, a program he expanded to provide educational and placement help for students

and alumni during a time of economic hardship. He also assisted in Duke's admissions programs.

In 1942, on war leave from Duke, Upchurch joined Shell Development Co. in Emeryville, Calif., as its first personnel director. He entered the Navy in 1944 as a labor relations officer, and in 1946 resigned from Duke to return to Shell Development.

He was named assistant personnel manager of Shell Oil Co. in 1949 and manager of the Employee Publications Department in New York headquarters in 1950.

In 1954 he was appointed to assist the Shell companies with philanthropic and civic programs and was elected secretary and chief staff officer of the Shell Foundation Inc. In 1961 he was elected vice president and director of the foundation and in 1962, a member of the foundation's executive committee and senior vice president. He retired from Shell in 1971.

Upchurch joined the Duke board of trustees in 1964, and served on the board's executive committee throughout his tenure as an active member. He was vice chairman of the board during 1975-77. As a trustee

he continued his interest in student activities, arts programs and Duke Chapel, and was influential in establishing the Duke University Archives in 1972.

He was named trustee emeritus in 1977 and had continued to attend board meetings regularly since then.

Listed in *Who's Who in Commerce and Industry*, Upchurch was active in The National Industrial Conference Board and its Council of Executives on Company Contributions, and worked with the National Merit Scholarship Corporation, the U.S. Chamber of Commerce Education Committee, the National Better Business Bureau and the United Way of America.

Upchurch was a member of Duke Memorial United Methodist Church. He was a resident of the Methodist Retirement Home in Durham.

Upchurch is survived by one brother, Herbert J. Upchurch of Columbia, S.C., and a niece and nephew.

A graveside service will be conducted at 2 p.m. today in Annex B, Section 14 of Maplewood Cemetery in Durham by the Rev. Eric Carson.

The family has requested that flowers be omitted. Arrangements are by Howerton-Bryan Funeral Home.

A Raleigh native, Mr. Upchurch received his A.B. in 1931 and his law degree in 1936.

From 1931 to 1941 Mr. Upchurch held a variety of administrative

positions at Duke. In 1933 he founded the Duke Chapel Choir and became its first director. In 1940 Mr. Upchurch also became director of Placement Services, a program he expanded to provide educational and placement help for students and alumni during a time of economic hardship.

In 1942, on war leave from the university, Mr. Upchurch joined Shell Development Co. in Emeryville, Calif., as its first personnel director. Later, after holding various personnel posts, he worked with Shell's philanthropic foundation, retiring in 1971.

Mr. Upchurch served as a Duke trustee from 1964-77, and then was named trustee emeritus.

He is survived by his brother, Herbert J. Upchurch of Columbia, S.C.

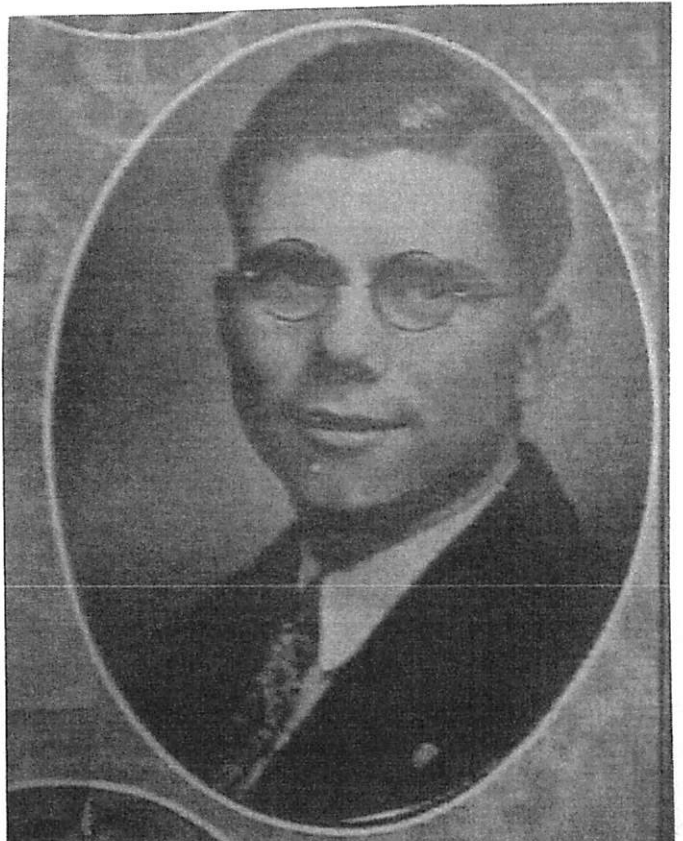

At long last - at least an acknowledgment of your good letter of 28 Oct 80, if not a real reply. I have been waiting to talk with my aunt in Raleigh (Mrs Hogue - the only living member of my grandfathers [A. P. Upchurch] children) before writing in response to land of my great grandfather, Kearney

U.

Mrs Hogue tells me Kearney did leave land to each of his living children, including a daughter. Since you have a copy of Kearney's will you can double check this. I do not have a copy of the will, but hesitate to ask that you send me one unless you can do so very easily.

PM later sent him a copy

Mrs Hogue, Mr Hogue and I drove out to the area of Kearney's land. You will find it marked as best we could on the enclosed piece of a N.C. map. It bordered on Neuse River. The piece going to my grandfather included the house in which Kearney lived. My grandfather and his wife Sarah McGowan (Mitchell) Matthews were

living in the house and taking care of Kearney when he died and their earlier children were born there. My grandmother Sarah inherited a larger farm from her mother in a nearby area.

Mrs Hogue tells me most of the Kearney land is still held (by will or purchase) by members of his family. This is true of the homeplace which I visited. It has been "renovated" but at some expense to its original simple colonial architecture!

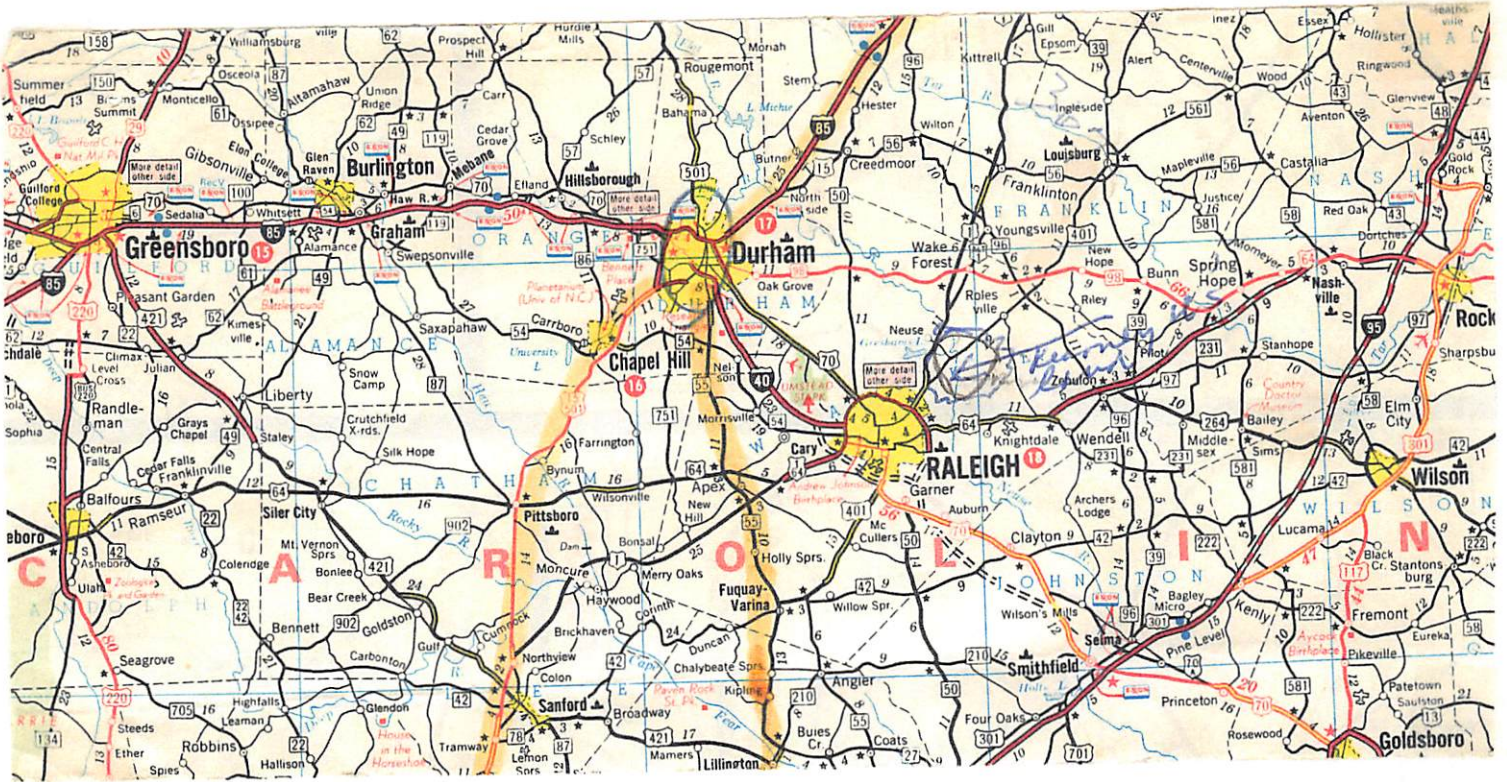
