


## WAKE COUNTY CEMETERY SURVEY LISTING BY TOWNSHIP (Pt. 7)

#### LEESVILLE TOWNSHIP

One of the smaller townships in Wake, its shape is somewhat like a slice of pie - a first bite taken and the crust fallen away, taking some of the filling with it! Both sides leave Durham Co. and go SE, along the way becoming encompassed by House Creek Twp. The southwesterly side follows US70 (Cedar Creek Twp. on the southwest as far as the airport) to just before SR2018 (on east side). The northeasterly side follows SR1831 (Bartons Creek Twp. on the east as far as SR1829). SR1831 meets SR1830 by which the line goes east ca.1 mi and at Hwy 50 goes south to SR1828 and by it, westward onto SR1826 and south again to SR1822. On this route, the bounds go southeasterly to SR2018 and west on it. At Pleasant Grove Church Road, N/NW to SR1824; south thereon a short distance to road's end An invisible line extends to US70, N of SR2018, to complete the township.

Leesville became a "new" township (in 1911?), formed from a bit of old Cedar Fork's northeastern lands along with some from Oak Grove, former Wake township, and from Bartons Creek and House Creek townships. More than a fourth of Cedar Fork Township, the northwestern segment of its original square, in 1881 helped to form Durham County (as did about half of Oak Grove on the north and in 1911, most of the remainder; no such township in Wake anymore but the name is carried in Durham). Wake's original boundary with Orange and Chatham counties was a straight line. N from Granville County to Chatham on the SW. The line began E of where Flat River joined the Eno River and became the Neuse River (now Falls Lake on into Wake). Ancestors in the area, formerly Wake, would be listed in Durham County's survey, if any family graveyards are left or in church cemeteries.

From US70 take ACC Blvd and go .8 mi to SR1646. Turn rt. and go .2 mi. W side.

## Baptist Grove Church Af-Am

W side of SR1822, ca .4 mi NW of SR1826 (7109 Leesville Road).

+ Chavis, John R. Af-Am - two stones left on second inventory of this large cemetery. W embankment in curve of SR1833 between SR1826 and (nearer) SR1834.

# Chestnut Grove Baptist Church Af-Am

On west side of SR1834 about 1 mi from the Durham Co. line. The church itself is across the road on E side (Bartons Creek Twp).

? Edwards, J.T. - There in 1980; not found in 1998. Disturbed by relocation or not? On NC50 N, turn W on SR1831. Go ca 200 yds. On SW (left) side ca 50 yds.

## Edwards, Joseph

From US70 go 1.2 mi N on NC50, turn W on SR2018 and go .8 mi. At SR1822 go N ca 1.5 mi. Graves on left.

## Harward, James G.

N side of SR1828, Howard Road (should be Harward), less than .1 mi W of NC50 in parking lot of swim and racquet club

# Hickory Grove United Church of Christ Af-Am

From SR1834 go W on SR1822 ca .6 mi onto NW forks (New Leesville Road); then take immediate right, SR1840 (wrongly called Shady Grove Road on one map). E side .1 mi.

## Holloway, Foya A.

SW corner of SR1822 and SR3299 - across from Henry Holloway Cemetery (see next).

# Holloway, Henry E.

From SR1829., go N .6 mi on SR1822, E side on private property.

## Jordan, John Samuel

On NC50 N turn W on SR1829, go .3 mi and turn S on SR3332. Go .2 mi and turn W onto SR3335. Go .15 mi. Cemetery on right between houses number 8721 and 8725.

#### \* King family

Moved from SR1831, W side, across Olde Creedmoor Subdivision - where to unknown.

# Layton, Aquilla Byrum - single grave

From SR1834, go S on SR1833. In woods behind house at 3rd driveway E side.

# Leesville Baptist Church - has not been inventoried.

S side of SR1836, W off N end of SR1835

- Lynn/Page this one is in Durham Co. only ca .2 mi from Wake line
  On US70 take ACC Blvd for .8 mi to SR1646 and go N 1 mi to SR1822. SE quadrant.
- McGhee, Charles M. restricted; only place to park is in a private driveway

  From US70 go 1.2 mi N on NC50, turn W on SR2018 and go 8 mi. At SR1822 go N ca 1.5

  mi. Graves on right.

# New Bethel Baptist (original name of the church)

Going N on NC50, turn W on SR1834 and go .6 mi; turn N on SR1831. Church is 2.2 mi on W side - ca .2 mi before Durham Co. line.

### + Perry

N side of SR1828, 0.1 mi W of NC50; in 1981 had 3' high wire fence. Locked gate.

#### Pool/Crawford

E side of SR1826.2 mi N of its intersection with SR1829; close to road.

Restlawn Memorial Gardens - rather new; probably will not be inventoried

Entrance is on S side of ACC Blvd. which can be reached N off US70 or W off Northern Wake

Expressway. It can be seen from US70.

#### Richards-Adams

On west side of SR1646 ca .2 mi northeast of US70

### Sykes family - had not been inventoried

NE intersection of SR1822 and Cresmont Dr.

#### Smith, Thomas S.

From US70 turn N on SR1835 and go .6 mi. Graveyard in curve E side of road.

Soapstone United Methodist Cemetery - church relocated to 12837 Norwood Road.

W side of SR1831 .5 mi. S of SR1834. 40 yds from highway; chain link fence. N side of building now used by another denomination.

# Sorrell, Robert - Has not been inventoried 800' into SE quadrant of SR1647 and SR1837

## Terry, James G.

Between SR1833 and SR1831 in heavily wood area reached from dirt road off SR1833 (ca.5 mi S of SR1834) some 200 yds to the E. Walk some 100 yds to the S.


State and National Highways as in bounds of Leesville Township:

# Carlton Cemetery Raleigh, Wake County, North Carolina

Country Trail, Leesville Twp. Wake Co, NC

Located at the end of Country Trail in a densely wooded area, which is east of Hwy 1835 and on the west side of Raleigh.

Located in a densely wooded area, this small family cemetery, which has been abandoned for many years, was found by Earl Flannery, while using a metal detector. He recognized it as the proper location for a headstone that had been left on his driveway 2 years ago, in April 2004, by a prankster.

Mr Flannery realized that another headstone that had been dropped off at the Wendy's Restaurant about 30 miles away in Cary, about the same time, must also belong in this cemetery. There had been a widespread search for that tombstone's home. The police and a lot of interested people got involved, but to no avail, so the headstone remained in police custody for all this time.

I posted a message on the Internet during the time we were looking but had completely forgotten about it until 2 days ago when I got a message that the cemetery was found and one tombstone returned, and that the police were going to bring out the other one. Mr. Flannery, who had the other headstone, is a computer user and had found my post and e-mailed me. We both notified the police who are delighted to get this off their books. It is like a miracle that this turned out so well.

Thanks to Mr. Flannery and the Cary Police Dept. which has been storing the headstone for 2 years there is a happy ending to this tale.

I surveyed this cemetery on Mar 03, 2006.
