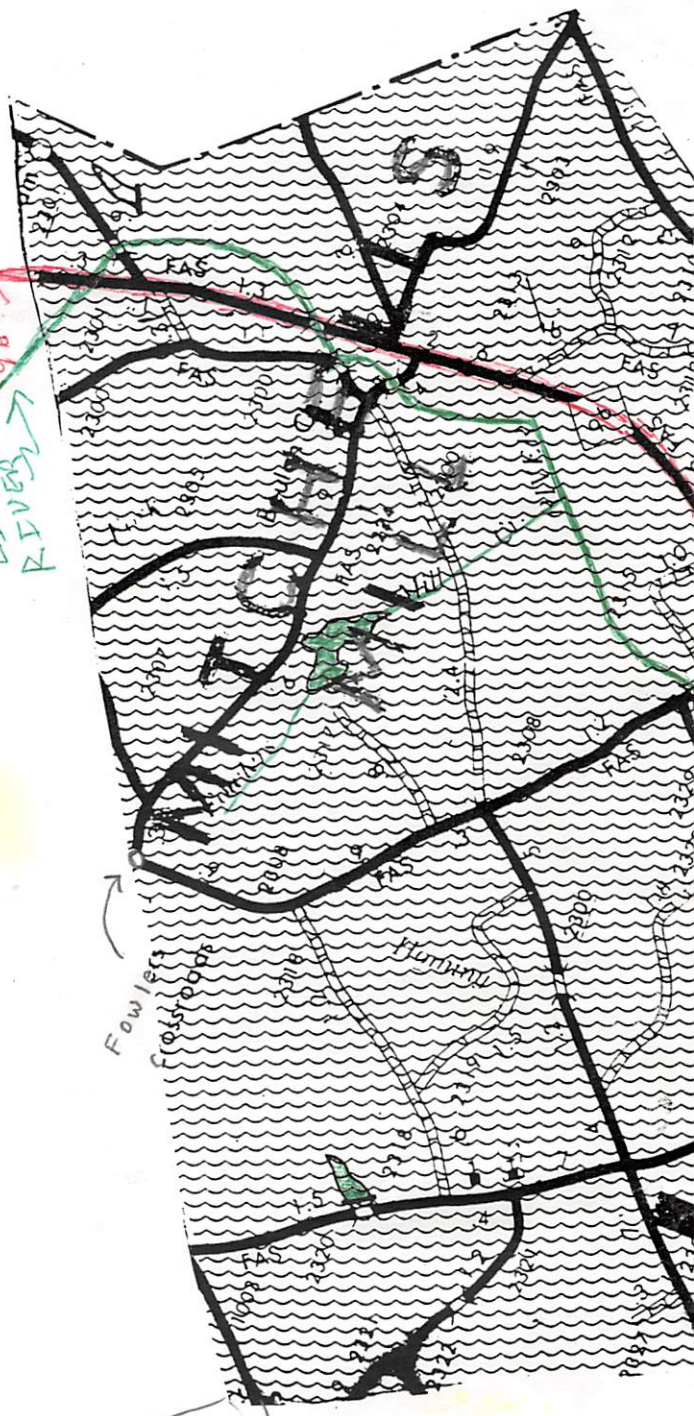

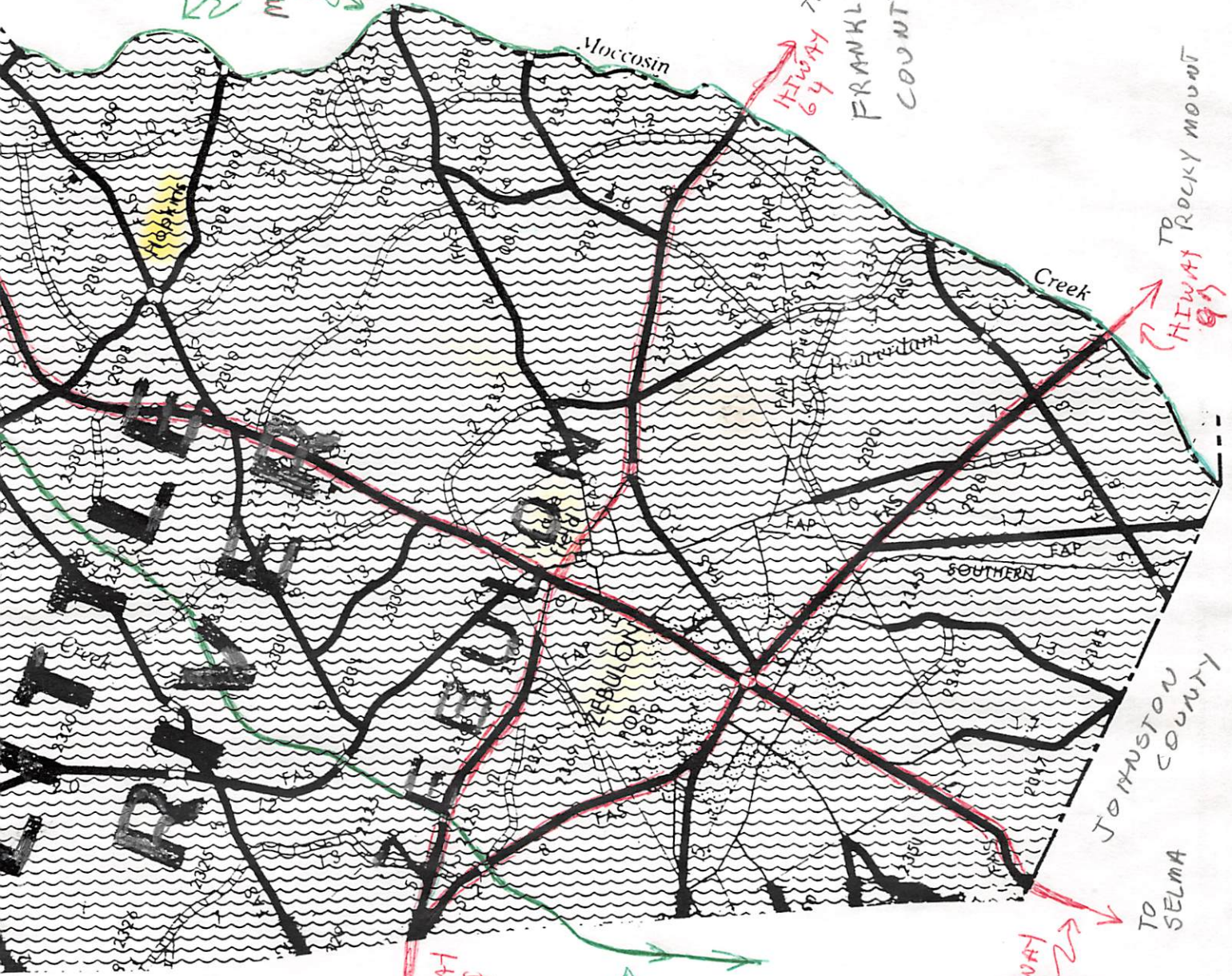

Researching family cemeteries a way

Digging around graveyards and cemeteries is not exactly what most people would consider fun and exciting. For some, graveyards manifest a feeling of apprehension — like someone is watching you from behind the bushes (or under the ground).

For Grady Doyle — a native of Hopkins and now a resident of Raleigh — digging around tombstones and uncovering old grave sites has become a favorite hobby.

Doyle is currently trying to accumulate names and dates for a cemetery survey of Little River Township to be published later by the Wake County Genealogical Society.

"This has become a really big project to undertake," Doyle said from his den in Raleigh last Saturday. "No one has kept any systematic records."

Doyle foresees putting a lot of time in researching this particular project. He's been in contact with local funeral directors for a peek at their records. He has spent hours with his head over maps of the area, and he has devoted time to just driving around trying to discover cemeteries that people have forgotten — or are just not on the maps.

"I need to be able to work on this six or seven days a week," he said. "I've been interested in several of the local cemeteries for years."

A lot of times, Doyle and his girlfriend Betty Jo Pedigo will take actual physical inventories of the grave sites.

"We've done a lot of work here in Raleigh," he said. "A number of these cemeteries are

located inside the corporate limits. Some are so grown over that most people don't even know they are there."

The weather and vandals are two elements that damage a lot of cemeteries.

"A lot of the really old headstones were made out of white marble and weathered quickly. Putting an old tombstone together is like a puzzle," Doyle explained. "You know, cemeteries are not the most pleasant subject for most people, but you have to take into account that all of those people were alive at one time.

"Death is just a fact that most people don't like to deal with," Doyle continued. "That might be why so many grave sites are vandalized."

Doyle looks at death a little differently than most folks. "I approach it from a history standpoint," he said. "I'm not sure when I first became interested in history — it probably came from my grandparents. The older people in the community were always the historians. We've got names and notes everywhere. It's gradually

coming together."

Doyle's interest in history got more involved when he was young. "I grew up on a farm and during that time I plowed up a lot of arrowheads," he explained. "I'd wonder what these people were like and where they came from.

"Betty and I recently had a chance to research her family cemetery in Virginia over this past Thanksgiving," he added.

Ms. Pedigo related that the experience for her was heart-warming. "It's amazing how much satisfaction I got from renewing some of those old memories. We really need our roots."

Doyle agreed. "I wish we had more time to devote to it. With all the development going on, there is a good chance we could lose some of our history.

"I'd like to see some incorporation of these into historic sites," Doyle said. "If these places are well kept, they can

be a real plus for the community. They can also be an eyesore to some."

One local site that this couple has devoted time to is located

just this side of Raleigh on U.S. 64 — the John Hinton family cemetery next to the Oakridge driving range, west of Knightdale.

"There is a certain sense of adventure when you actually find someone's history," Doyle said. "The state of North Carolina first started to keep vital records in 1913. Before that, things were kept in the family Bible or information was put on headstones."

Locally, Doyle and Ms. Pedigo have recently spent some time in a family cemetery near Wakefield. "We have found confederate soldier graves in Wakefield," Doyle explained. "The area where the graves are really needs to be fenced in. Right now it's in the middle of a

field full of cows and bulls. The Sons of Confederate Veterans Association is trying to preserve these types of graves.

With so much development occurring in the Triangle, there is a good chance that a lot of cemeteries will be disrupted.

"I'm concerned that we are

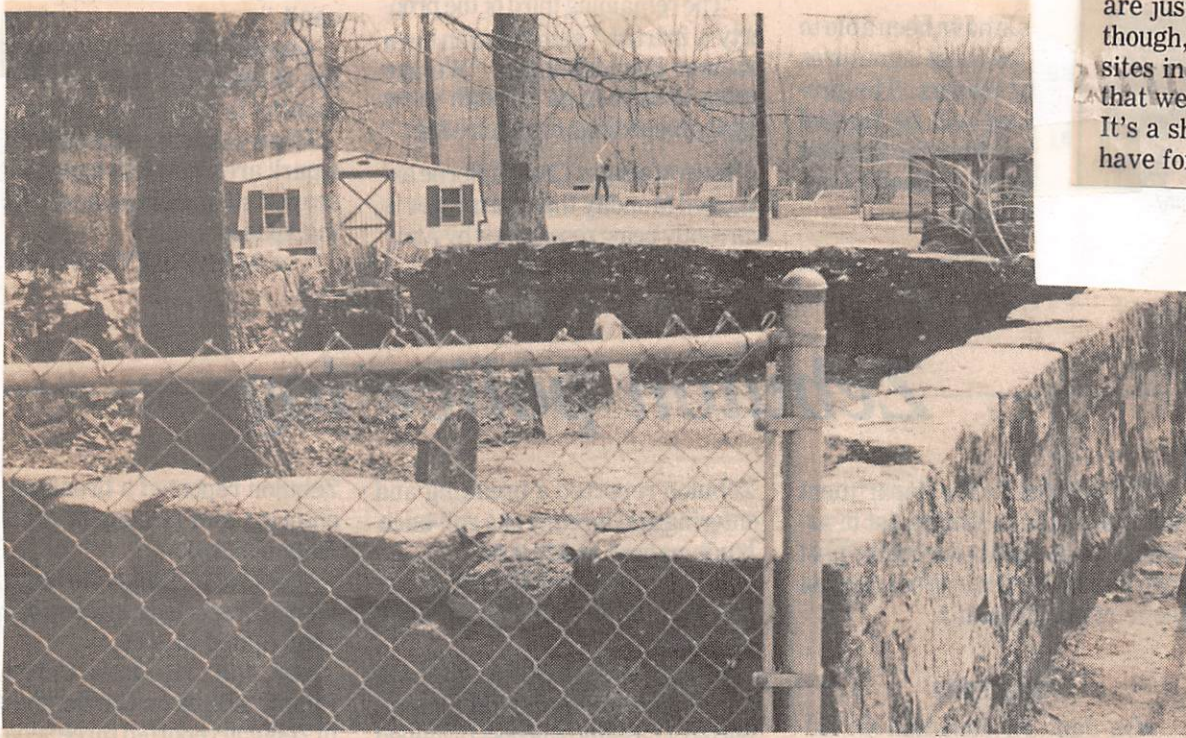
degrading the environment and we will lose things that we can't get back," Doyle said. "I'd like to see more young people get involved with something like this, but young people today have a real phobia for cemeteries."

Finding some of the hidden cemeteries is hard if someone doesn't know what to look for.

"I rode by one cemetery for 40 years before I discovered it," Doyle said.

As far as the Little River Township listing, Doyle has been able to get off to a fast start.

"We've got a lot of names for Little River Township," he said. "There were probably some heroes there, but most of them are just common folk. I'll bet, though, that there are a lot of sites in Little River Township that we just don't know about. It's a shame that a lot of people have forgotten."
