Reverend Joseph Randolph Jeffreys, Sr.

RALEIGH - Reverend Joseph Randolph Jeffreys, Sr., 87, of 2703 Tryon Road, died Friday from complications of heart failure. He was



born in Knightdale, NC on October 18, 1915 to William Henderson Jeffreys and Dorothy Etheridge Jeffreys. He was a 1943 graduate of Wake Forest

College. Affectionately known as "The Bubble Gum Man" by the children of Inwood Baptist Church, Randolph Jeffreys was a loving father, faithful husband, and devoted Christian. He was strong, genuine, joyful and filled with laughter. Ordained in the Baptist Church, he claimed shaping the lives of children as his ministry. To that end, he served as an educator, mentor, and example extraordinaire for 35 years in the Wake County School System as both teacher and principal. His profound influence on the lives of his family and thousands of others will be felt for generations to come.

Funeral services will be held 2 p.m. Monday, November 11, 2002 at Inwood Baptist Church with Rev. Joe Zimmerman officiating. Burial will follow in the church cemetery.

Surviving are: his wife of 63 years, Lois Upchurch Jeffreys; sons, Joseph Randolph Jeffreys, Jr. and Frank Upchurch Jeffreys of Raleigh; daughters, Bonnie Jeffreys Brown and husband Michael of Wilmington and Ann Jeffreys Romeo of Raleigh; brothers, Tommy Jeffreys and wife Shelby and Phillip Edward Jeffreys and wife Judy of Raleigh and Robert Henderson Jeffreys and wife Patricia of Louisburg; sister, Martha Jeffreys Moras of Raleigh; five grandchildren, Paul Shannon Romeo, Philip Michael Brown, Jr., MD and wife, Paige Fisher, MD, David Jeffreys Brown, Gina Autumn Romeo, Karrie Brown Rushing and husband, Matthew; three great-grandchildren, Andy and Karli Hctor and Max Romeo.

He was predeceased by his parents and 11 siblings.

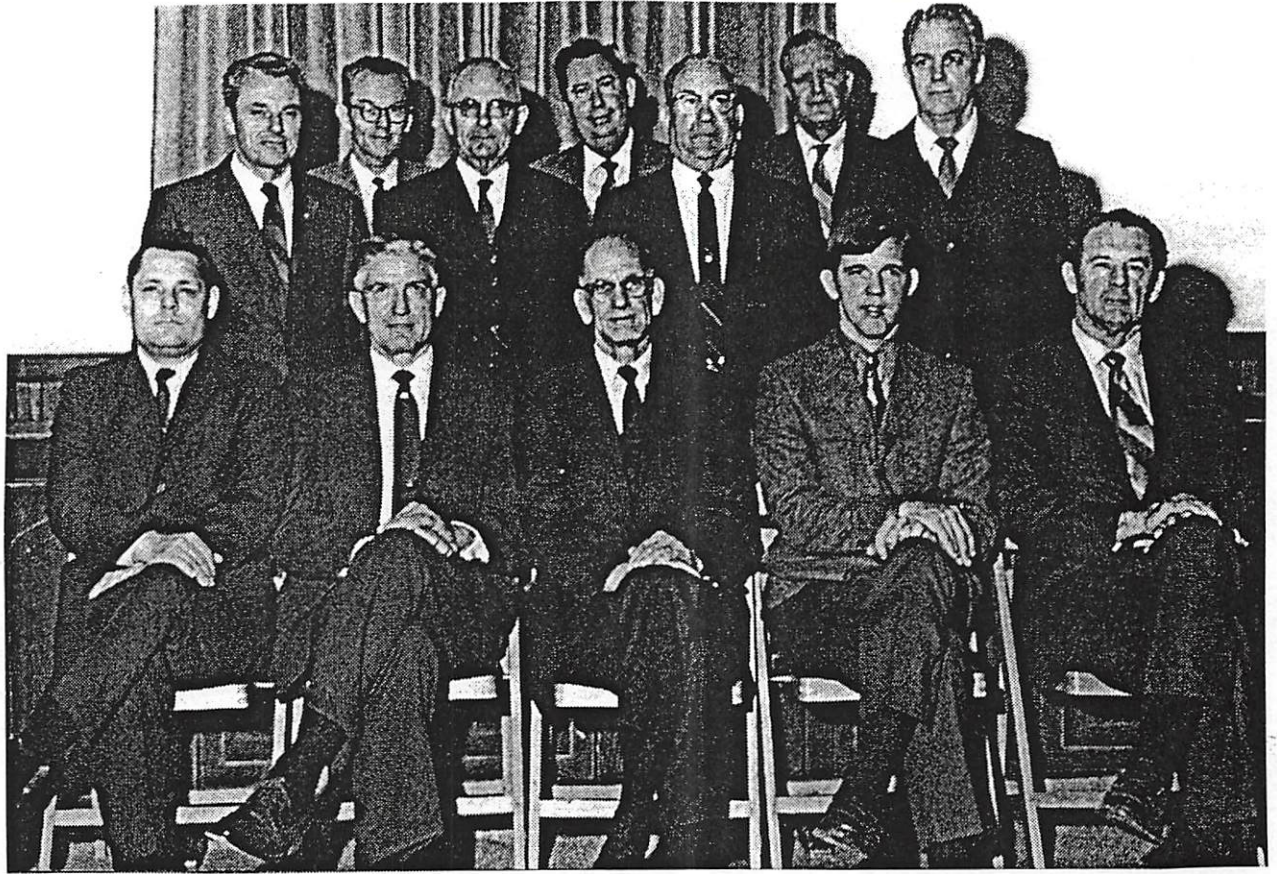

For several years Randolph Jeffreys had played an important role in the work of Inwood. He was a deacon, having been elected in 1946. In November, 1949, the deacons recommended his ordination as a minister. After the customary examination by a council of ministers and deacons, held on November 30, 1949, he was ordained on December 4. The church minutes report:

The recommendations of the ordination council were read to the church by the pastor V. S. Dowd. It was moved and seconded that they be accepted. Motion passed. Following which Bro. J. R. Jeffreys was ordained to the gospel ministry in a very impressive service. Bro. V. S. Dowd, pastor, preached the sermon basing it on Paul's conversion. Rev. J. Allen Easley, Wake Forest, delivered the charge, text 2 Cor. 6:3. Rev. M. O. Sears presented the Bible and made the ordination prayer. Then came the laying on of hands on the candidate. First Mr. W. H. Jeffreys, father of Bro. J. R. Jeffreys, then the three ministers present and the deacons laid their hands on him. Bro. J. R. Jeffreys pronounced the benediction.

Thereafter Jeffreys often preached at the church in the absence of the pastor. In the first election of a rotating board of deacons on October 5, 1952, he was chosen for a three-year term. He was elected to another three-year term in 1957, and another in 1962. He was chairman of the deacons for two years, 1957-1959.

Randolph Jeffreys, another of the older leaders, was also chosen to be a deacon as often as he was eligible, including filling the unexpired term of a deacon who moved out of the community. He was often on the nominating committee, the screening committee, and a wide variety of others. He was on the pulpit committee following Jackson's resignation. He was active throughout this entire period, though on August 20, 1978, the church bulletin noted his retirement "after 35 years of teaching in the Wake County Schools."

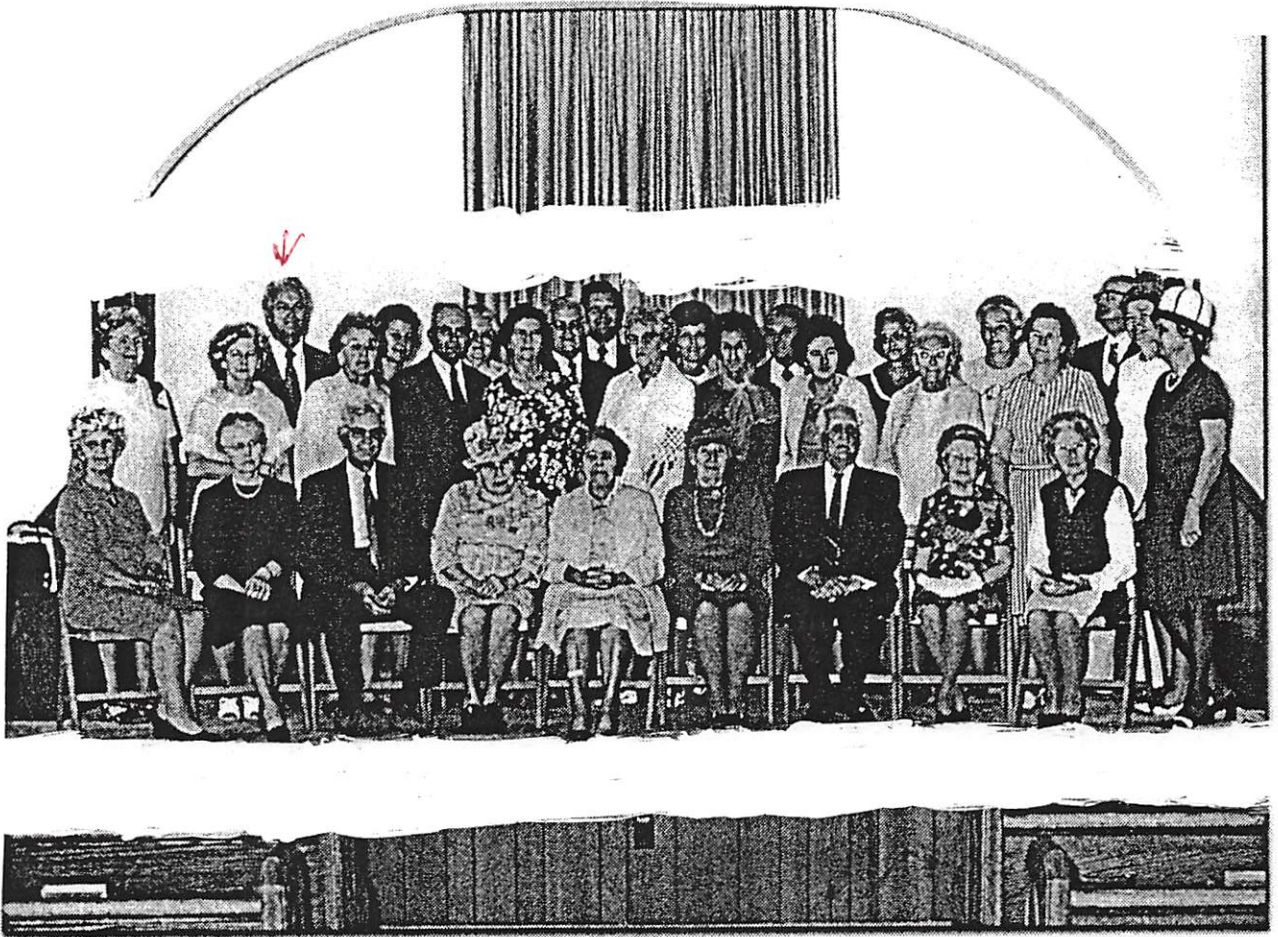
In December, 1946, near the end of this period, Randolph Jeffreys was elected deacon. He was only 25 at the time, and his greatest contribution to the work of the church would come in the next period in the church's history.

Some of the older generation continued to make significant contributions to the leadership of the church until well into the 1980's. Four were almost "perpetual" deacons. Willis Harris, who had been baptized in 1949, and whose first leadership position was that of director of the Sunday School in 1951, continued to have great influence. He was elected a deacon in 1980, and again in 1982. Twice during this era he was on the deacon screening committee, and in 1986, when other trustees were being elected for limited terms, he was elected "trustee for life." Rand Jeffreys, who had first been elected a deacon in 1946 and often re-elected since that time, was on the board in 1980 and was named co-chair in 1981. He was elected to another term in 1986. He was, of course, active in many other ways. He was chairman of the nominating committee in 1981 and a member of that committee again in 1988. In 1985 he was a member of the *ad hoc* committee to plan the best use of the church's physical facilities. After 1988, he held no office. James Jeffreys, who was first elected a deacon in 1950, was elected to three terms as deacon during this era: 1981, 1985, and 1988. Robert L. Baird had been elected to terms beginning in 1962, 1965, 1969, 1974, and 1978. He was elected once again in 1983. Neither of these four was elected to any church office after 1988.

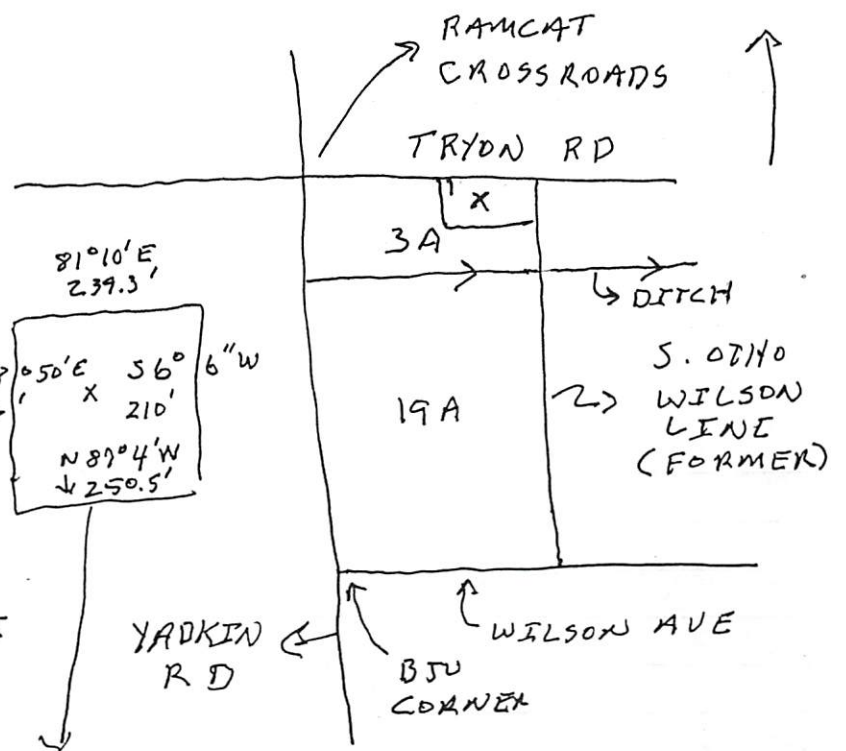

○ From its 8 OCT 1991 Jacqueline Linchey wrote to the Pastor of Inwood recalling her fond memories of growing up in Rhamhatta

I especially remember the music at Inwood. I loved to hear Mrs. Morris and her daughter Josephine sing duets. Then when Jo and James Jeffreys got married, I thought they were the handsomest couple I ever saw! (I'm sure they still are!) I loved to hear Marie Taylor play the piano, and Carol Medlin was a very special person to me. Elizabeth Lassiter was choir director when I was in the choir. And I loved to hear Rand Jeffries sing ~ and preach. (When Billy Graham came along, I thought he was almost as good a preacher as Rand, nearly as handsome! ~ not quite, on either count.) Did you know that you could take tobacco worms, bite their heads off and turn them inside out and go fishing with them? Or go rabbit hunting with a Coca-Cola bottle ~ not a gun ~ and just chunk that bottle, hitting ol' Brer Rabbit in the head, bring 'im home and skin 'im for supper? (Ask Rand, if you don't believe me!!) I remember when Lois delivered Bonnie; I think she was first little baby I ever knew, close up! I remember how proud grandparents Mr. Frank and Ms. Edna Upchurch were. I worked in the fields and in tobacco for Mr. Frank for years. Once he took me to Pine Drug Store and bought me a whole pint of cherry ice cream to see if I could eat the whole thing (I could . . .) He always brought me a watermelon on my birthday; he loved to tell a tale ~ he was good at that ~ that he bought me the biggest watermelon in Raleigh for my birthday, and that I ate half of it and cried 'cause couldn't hold the other half!
