As to Nathan and William my source is limited due to me being unemployed and not able to afford Ancestry.com and related sites at the moment. I found them on Rootsweb.com, I was looking up Nathan's family when I came across Mary Ann Shipp and noticed that she had married 2 Upchurch's, William Allen, and Nathan A.. Some how I have erroneously attached Nathan to both William Allen (1810 -1884) and Patrick Bogan (1816 - 1886). So I am trying to fix my error. I have deleted him from PB and attached him to WA.

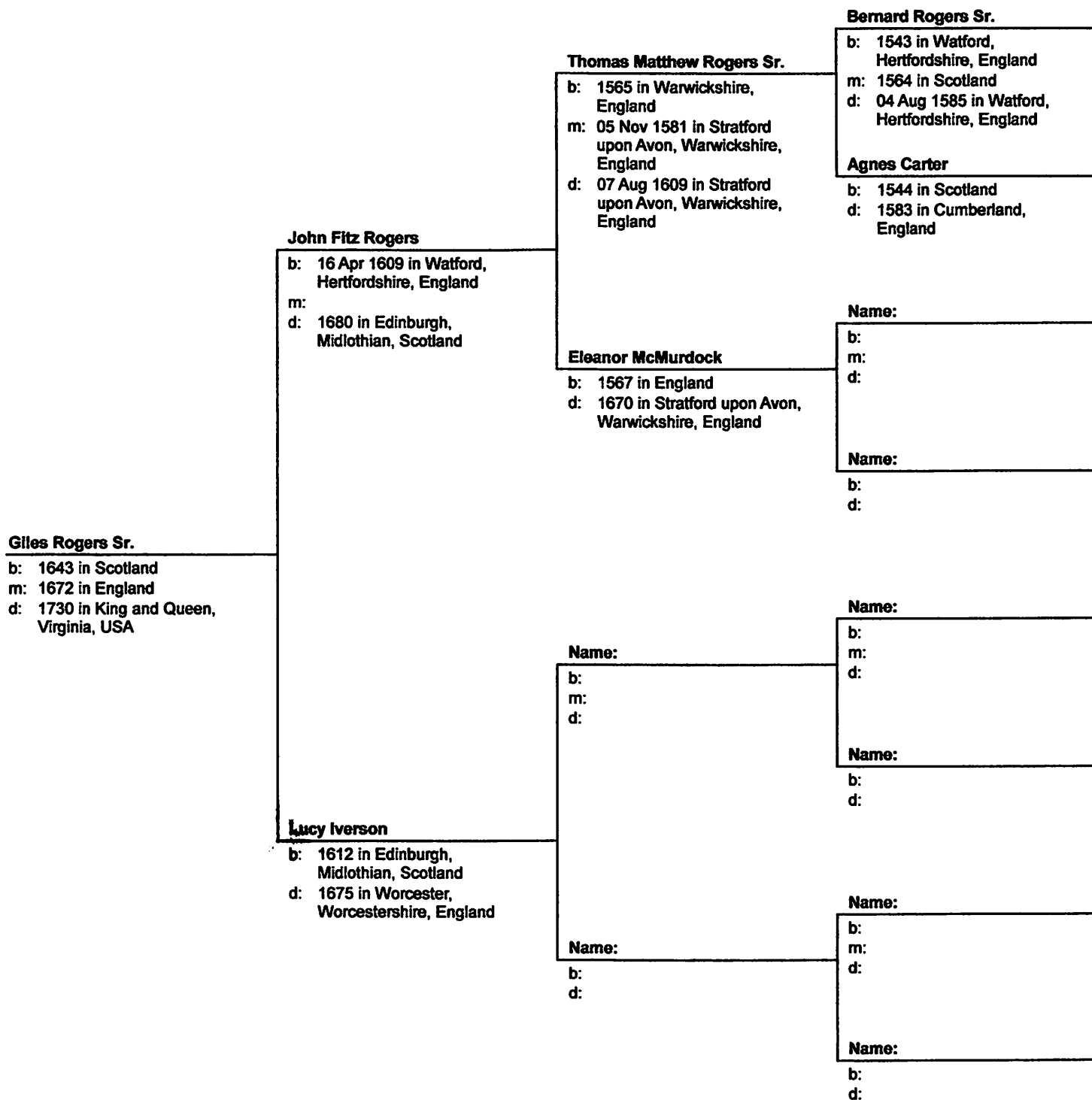

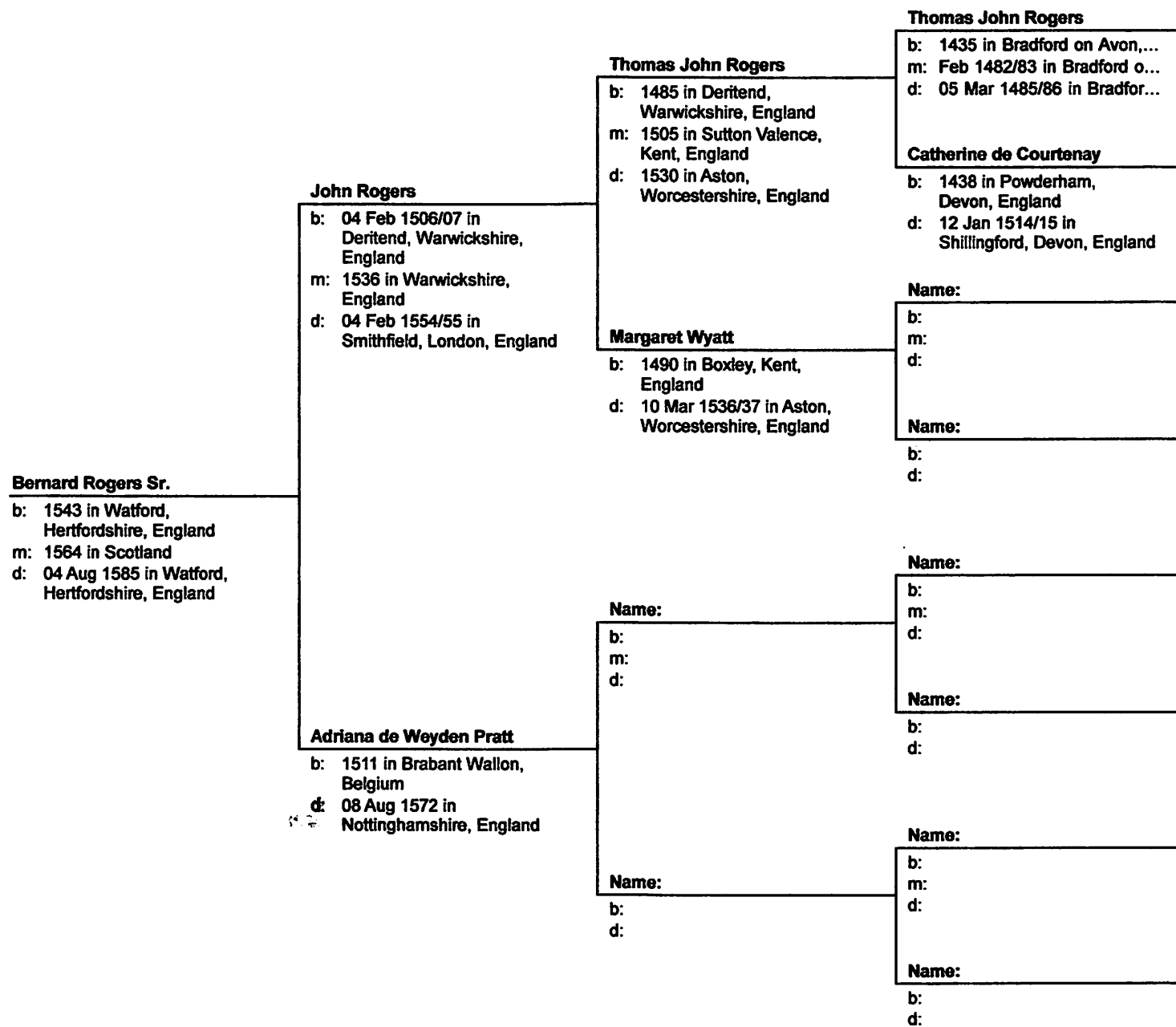

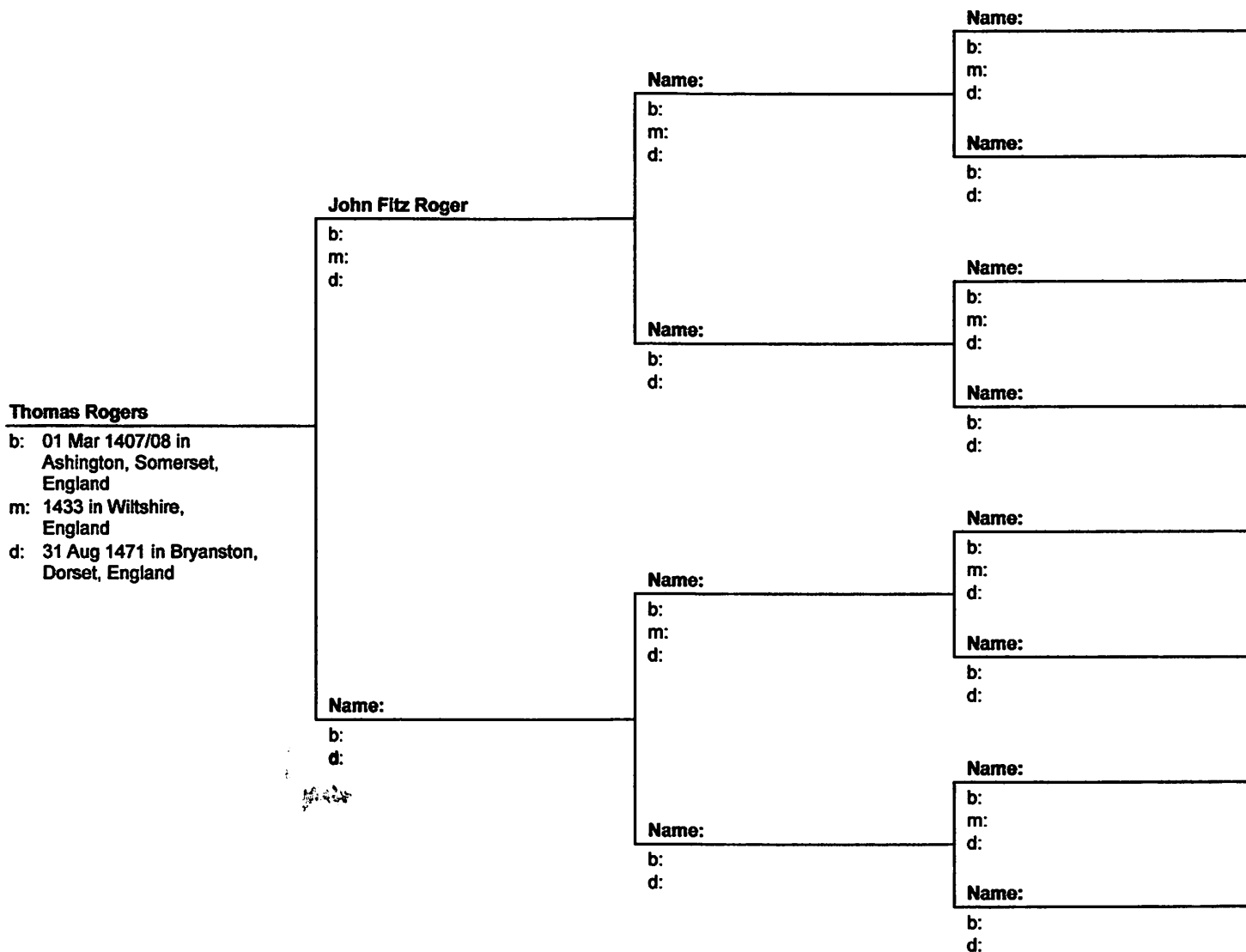

This morning I got my Biofile for Caroline from my Valley files. She is XID-58284. I did have a note from Kim Beach in 2009 that she married an Upchurch but I did not follow up. I have good census records for the Castleberry Family tracing Caroline back as a descendant of Nathan U., I. Her mother Nancy (Maynard) Castleberry appears on the census for 1900, 1910, 1920, and 1930. In her household in 1920 is a Nellie whom I thought to be Caroline and a Nettie in 1930 whom I thought to be Caroline but not so as Caroline died in 1915. I have now pulled up from Find A Grave Salem Church (which I know well) her record which shows her as Mrs Upchurch. However I have not been able to learn the name for her Upchurch husband. I was unable to find her as Caroline Upchurch on the 1910 census.

I hope we can solve this puzzle. Let me know if you learn more.

We are now well into our budget year of 2016 for Allied Families. I write in hopes that you will continue to provide your support for our family history effort as you have done in past years. A membership form is attached. We have continued to grow our effort in a number of ways. Our number of participants has grown to 175 of whom many have continued to renew their membership but not all. Our budget is at about the \$10,000 per year level. We have quite a few volunteers including 17 remote transcribers of Biofiles and more are expected. You are our most productive transcriber. I'm still working on her Biofile, sorry it has taken so long. I have a question. On the pg 1 no. 1 child 5 James Alexander Scott shows he married a Minerva Lassier. I have not been able to verify that. The only marriage I have for him is a Mary Anne Byrd.

Also as it pertains to Ada the theory I have about who Adah (Upchurch) Scott's parents are is that Burtis and Margaret (Yates) Upchurch are her parents. In the 1850 Federal Census - Western Division, Wake County, North Carolina, John Scott, Jr and Adah are listed as family # 609. John Scott, Sr and his wife Rachel (Baucom) are Family # 605. Margaret (Yates) Upchurch, missing Burtis who died in 1855, with sons Jackson and Jubal are Family # 584. Abel, son of Burtis and Margaret, with his wife Nancy (Sorrell) with daughter Adaline are Family # 583. Gilbert Upchurch, another son of Burtis and Margaret's, and family is Family # 585. If we could find a Federal Census for 1810 or 1820 for Burtis Upchurch this would help answer whether Adah was his daughter or not. There are no census records that I could find with her attached to any parent. Since she married in 1827 the 1830 census would not be any good for seeing who her family is. But in the 1830 Federal Census John Scott, Jr and Burtis Upchurch are listed on the same page, which shows that they lived in the same area.

Also could her name be Adaline shortened to Ada? Could the M. in Ada's middle name be for Margaret, her mothers name. Burtis's will makes no mention of any daughters. What do you think? Any thoughts or comments?

I have followed all of thoughts about the parents of Ada U. expressed in you email and come up with nothing new. My entry Item No. 2 in her Biofile still represents my thoughts. It is true that Burtis and Margaret were old enough to have been the parents of Ada but I find no evidence or even a hint that this is the case. I looked at census records again---no help. In a broader sense we can continue to look at the children and grandchildren of Nathan and Moses as possibly including Ada. But again we have no evidence or hint. Having said that it is true that there might be more grandchildren that we do not know about. It would be nice to have the list of them with dates revisited/firmed up. Somewhere there could be room for Ada. I have not opened up the possibility that Ada could have been illegitimate or a foster child. I have looked again at the records for the John U., III Clan who lived about five miles south of Nathan and Moses. Ada could easily have been a member of this family possibly a grandchild of John U., III but again no hints support this path.

With continued research on the Upchurches of the Wake /Chatham border 1780-1850 we may solve a number of puzzles. One route for doing this will be via our E-Newsletters one for the three Clans mentioned. .

I have noted your new address. Thanks.

Your willingness to dig deep on puzzles is deeply appreciated. Continued effort should bring some rewards.

Hi All---

I think we have just about reached a milestone in our AF operation and I provide you this update. The milestone was amplified in a meeting yesterday involving Bob Heck, Mary Lou Brown, Jay Buck and myself. Deb and Bob have been interfacing with Teresa to see how we can most effectively continually add to our AF website. Our basic proposed advance is that we can use the merge program we have purchased (Nuance) to continually merge new data/text we have digitized with related data/text already on the website. Yesterday we were all pretty much able to get on the same page. Jay in AF Headquarters will now work closely with Bob as he and Deb interface with Teresa to iron out any wrinkles. The mechanics are all beyond me but I have confidence that our Team now in place will get the job done. It has taken us quite a few months to get to this point as the advice of well meaning experts has not always been such that we could grasp what to do next. Now we have adopted a plan to be tested.

In the intervening months we have proceeded to advance our AF work schedule using the expertise of Mary Lou and Jay and bringing volunteers to our undertaking. The result is portrayed in the attached Status of Work. Note that we are in one stage or another of enrolling 27 families. We hope to add more enrolled families concentrating on families that lived close to our enrolled Upchurch families for many decades. This way our in depth work on an enrolled family will reinforce the records of other enrolled families in the same geographic area. We need to get at least a rough narrative on the website for each enrolled family and Jay is working with me on drafts to send to Teresa. Jay has already created rudimentary Family Trees for many of the families and we are recruiting volunteer Tree Masters to proceed to embellish the trees taking the workload out of our Headquarters. Likewise we hope volunteer Administrators can be recruited for the Group Facebook pages. Note that we are beginning to recruit Researchers who will be surfacing information to be posted on our website for the enrolled families they represent.

Our most robust venture is to recruit volunteer Transcribers. They will concentrate at first on digitizing the Biofiles for the first three generations of enrolled families. These Biofiles are from the late 1700's and early 1800's and contain really valuable information. It is easy to recruit volunteer transcribers as we can assign skinny Biofiles to transcribe so as to not overwhelm a transcriber at first. As they get into the work and see their efforts portrayed on our website they will become more closely tied to AF. This is a really important tool for building momentum and gaining serious participants. Before long we should have a steady flow of several new transcribed Biofiles each month.

Mary Lou and I are well advanced in substantially expanding the information under our Projects Tab on the website and will soon be sending Teresa our version and getting her inputs as she adds this to the website.

Mary Lou and Jay together provide 20 hours of staff time in AF Headquarters. They are both extremely competent and productive and they give us a chance to make AF work for the long term. However, we must improve our revenue stream if we are to afford this help in 2016 and beyond. Now that Jay is getting to the end of some key projects I hope he and I can work together to undertake special initiatives to recruit members and financial support for AF. At some

We had a nice chat on the 19th and I made some notes but my mind was not quite fully operational due to our recent 8 day trip. Anyway, here are some more thoughts.

I had put your Adah U Biofile Transcription in my Scott pile to study for a response to the Scott girls. From another email you will see I have now performed that task. I will now give the transcription to Mary Lou to log in. We will vet it and Jay will put it on the website--all in due course. Did you have a question about Adah U. that I need to address?

I note that you need me to resend the Biofile for Moses U and one for his wife for you to transcribe. Let me check my correspondence file on that mailing. But, anyway, I will defer resending it as per the next paragraph.

We have reached several important milestones on our Biofile Transcription project and will suspend sending Biofiles to transcribe until we can put improved procedures in place. One aspect concerns using standardized formats so that all posted Biofiles look alike. More on that later. Of greater importance is the prospect of submitting Biofiles to OCR before they are sent to Transcribers. Jay Buck works part-time for the St Louis County Library Genealogical Section. They have just installed a \$20,000 OCR scanner. Jay has tested some of our Biofiles and finds that the taped in printed items convert perfectly to a digital format. This means Transcribers will have to type less---a big step forward. The scanner is free to us as long as we do not print. We will scan-OCR and leave with a thumb drive. I need to double check this all with Jay tomorrow.

Please let me know if I have not addressed some of your questions.

This email is to thank you for your participation in our Allied Families History Association and to ask for your feedback concerning your future participation. You are among fifty on our list as active Biofile transcribers or as active in helping to create "Trees" on Ancestry.com. This same email is being sent to all cooperators who have volunteered to make computer entries for our family history effort. Our focus has evolved along the way and I may have missed a beat with some cooperators. This email may even cross paths with other exchanges I have with you. Let me describe to you our current priorities to give you more background.

Biofile Projects:

Part I: We are using Volunteers to transcribe the Biofiles of the Patriarchs of enrolled families along with Biofiles of their children and grandchildren and their spouses. This will extend to about 500 Biofiles of which over 100 have been transcribed and are posted on our website. We want to continue this process and to recruit more transcribers.

Part II: In our Chesterfield office we have a team working on preparing Biofiles to be scanned and to be put on-line. This effort goes far beyond the 500 Biofiles of Part II as we probably have about 250,000 Biofiles to scan. We have budgeted about \$7500 to make Part II happen.

Master Outline Projects:

Part III: During forty years of research I manually placed family history records in 50 Notebooks. They are subject to being lost by fire, flood or otherwise. Our current highest priority is to enter the data from these Notebooks into Ancestry.com trees Clan by Clan and to label them "RPU Legacy Trees". They are not to be changed but the data will be available for adoption or as a source to be cited. If you are familiar with making entries in Ancestry.com or are will to learn your help as a volunteer Tree Master will be highly valuable.

Part IV: After Part III has been completed we will ramp up our effort to create "Living" Trees on Ancestry.com for each of our enrolled families. Some of this work has been started but we prefer to concentrate on Part III covering the the Master Outlines for now.

Our correspondence with Cooperators has been somewhat irregular as we have juggled duties and my health issues and as the above process has unfolded. Sorry about that--now we hope for more orderly exchanges going forward. This brings me to ask you for your response to the following:

If you do not have a copy most of it was extracted and reproduced in the early Upchurch Bulletins. In the early 1990's we contracted with Professor Ransome to help. He worked intensively for nearly 20 years producing 24 reports. They were at first reproduced in the Upchurch Bulletins--all on our first website. Later I treated our English roots in Englandia 1996-1999. The issues are also on the first website. Jay can help you find things and he may have some spots on our second website where he has lodged some English items. I am just now arranging to have my reports to England typed for our websites.

We have assembled a huge amount of Upchurch English records. The story was garbled at first but now we have it straight. There are several dozens of Upchurch Enclaves all over England and Upchurch records going back to 1100. Unfortunately, claims to the contrary, we can link to ancestors only so far as Richard Upchurch, the father of Michael Upchurch, I, who lived at Brington.

There is a crying need for someone to take up our English story and to go beyond what Ransome and I and others have done. I have not yet found such person/persons.

Point Lookout was a terrible raw place that was cold, wet and windy, and the prisoners suffered from exposure and mean colored guards. "The bottom rail on top now."

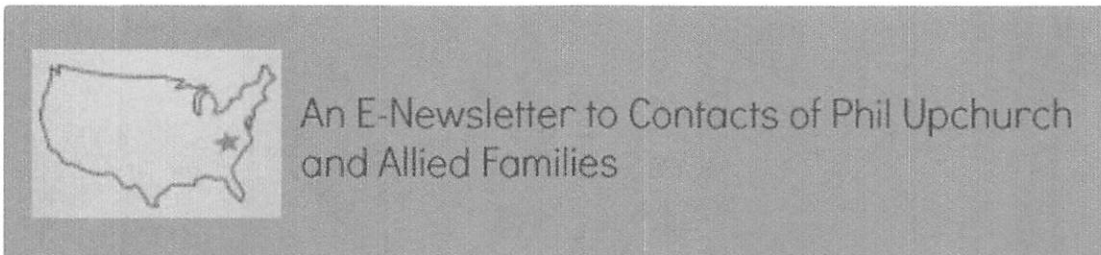
Thank you for your \$50 donation to Allied Families for your 2019 Membership which has arrived. I am encouraged at the pace of renewals.
