① "on the 24th of June 1784 James U, III made his will thus:

To son John: 'all lands below eastward road on N side - Whiteoak beginning at Zachariah Sims line to Stephen Smith's line' - Also mentioned sons James, Harmon, Dan Selah and Edith Moseley, grandsons Burnell and John U. [1782 ? RPL]

A John U who appeared on the Personal Property Tax list of Brunswick Co., Va in 1882, was the son of James U III, which is proven by the fact that he, John, on the 23rd of September 1786 sold 16 acres of land for £6 10s, 'beginning at whiteoak Cr., etc' -- land which he had inherited from his father, according to James' will (Brunswick Deed Bk. 14/339). Rec Court 25 Feb. 1788. - signed John U.

On 13 NOV 1786 John U and wife Nancy sold 230 acres land in Brunswick Co Va for £20 to John Neall - with Isaac Moseley, Charles Smith, Stephen Smith, Collier Neall. - signed John & Nancy U.

In 1786 John U bought 300 acres in Chatham Co NC on Shadlock's Creek, on E. side of Hau River, from Robert & Elizabeth Russell (Chatham Co. NC Deed Bk. D/346)

On 7 JUL 1794 John U was granted 100 acres in Chatham Co NC (Land Grant Records, Raleigh, NC.)

1790 NC census shows John U in Chatham Co with 8 in family. On 13 FEB 1796 John U of Chatham Co, NC sold to Benerly Randle of Brunswick Co Va 57 acres for £30 "land which John said Randle, headman Quarrell swamp to Thomas Collier! 4 witnesses - recorded Brunswick Co Va Court by John Godwin, Thomas Brongode, Edmund Tansor, Jesse Taylor 23 APR 1796. signed John U

A John U appeared with Michael U III and William U in the militia of Brunswick Co Va in 1758 and served in the French and Indian War. (Hennings Statute At Large - Laws of V.A.) (28)

The will of Joseph Hamilton (Hambleton) was written in 1780, recorded Nov. 1784. His heirs: Wife Ann, dau Ann Upchurch, daus Elizabeth Ezell, Sarah Sandros.; sons Walter, William, John, and Samuel Hamilton. Test: Benjamin Harrison, Patty Harrison. (Will at Virginia State Archives).

Nancy, Nanny and Nan are diminutives of Ann, therefore, it seems that John 2 son of James (3) married Ann Hamilton, her brother was Samuel Hamilton, they were children of Jos and Ann Hamilton. John 2 died intestate in Chatham County North Carolina in 1795. Buyers at the sale held in 1798 included Ann Upchurch and Samuel Upchurch.

A. Joseph Hambleton (Hamilton) of Brunswick Co VA wrote his will 19 MAY 1780, recorded FEB 1783 (Parish of Meherrin) mentions children and dau Ann U, to whom he gave 20 shillings. The searcher says "Note: Nancy and Nanny are diminutives of Ann, so or Nan. Therefore it seems that ^{XID-2068} Ann Hamilton (Hambleton) and ^{XID-157} John U, ^{XID-155} the son of James U who died in Brunswick County in 1784. Refers to this will and deed book 14 pg 240 & John U and Nanny his wife to John Neal--"

B. Pg 35. According to land taxer of 1782 Farmer U Sr (XID-155) had 710 acres + 57 acres not before assessed. Grandson Barnell sold 237 acres in 1803; son Herman (Harmon-XID-161) sold 237 acres in 1788; one John U (XID-157) sold 230 acres in 1786. One John U of Chatham Co NC (Grandson of Farmer -XID-155) sold 57 acres in 1766. In 1786 son John U of Brunswick sold 16 acres total 177 acres. Discrepancy of 10 acres may be due to resurvey but no mention of same in deed.



 to have signed an oath in 1778. If John u, B exists he is
 not on the 6 Generation chart and must be a new



All appear to be located in present-day SE Chatham Co. At least one is adjacent to a David Mimms (Mims) Chatham Co grant that is positioned precisely on the southwest corner of Chatham and Wake counties. 

Moss, Chairman of the Revolutionary Grave Committee, and Miss Jeannette Biggs, Chairman of the Genealogical Research Committee of the John Penn Chapter, Daughters of the Revolution. A beautiful granite boulder with bronze tablet in memory of soldiers and patriots of Granville during the Revolution was erected by the John Penn Chapter, Daughters of the American Revolution on the parkway at Main and Spring Streets. This marker was formally presented to the Chapter in the fall at the District D. A. R. meeting. The thirty five graves of soldiers from Granville which have been located, will be marked during the summer with appropriate markers by the Chapter. Mrs. Moss, Ch. Revolutionary Grave Committee and Miss Jeannette Biggs, Ch. Genealogical Research Committee of the Chapter, have compiled a list of all Patriots and Soldiers in Granville during the Revolutionary War. This war list contains 636 names which have been compiled from North Carolina Colonial Records, Revolutionary Army Accounts and from private records. The copy with the names of the 66 members of the John Penn Chapter which created the Memorial, were placed behind the bronze tablet. This copy has been placed in the Court House to be kept in the custody of the Clerk of the Court and will be sent to the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution at Memorial Conference in August of the John Penn Chapter's wonderful work in genealogical research work. This list is contained in the Public Library and can be taken until the names of the names have been gathered showing the families living in Granville County in olden days.
