 Henry Arnold.



- Extract of Notes of R PD Visit on 24 FEB 1979 to Bud Burns
in a Nursing Home at Carpenter, Wake Co., NC. [Bud
knew my GF. Eugene D. Cross] ["D"]
 - Bud said he was quite aware that "D" had a girl
and that he knew her [Bessie Elvira Edwards]
 - Bud reports that Rose Edwards lived in the SE corner
of the intersection of Six Fork Road & Creedmoor Road. Bud
had always heard that "D" had a girl by Rose. Rose
was beautiful [ROSE - must be Matthe Edwards - R PD] {The "GIRL"
must be Bessie Elvira Edwards - R PD}
 - Bud's relationships:
 - I. ABSOM BUNN (a farm) md (?) Annie Bascom
 ↳ S/o George Bunn - lived at Wakefield, Zebulon, NC
 - A. Bud Bunn md 1812 (?) Ethel Ferguson
 - Bud knew Adolphus Creightons
 - D had a tenant named George Thompson who lived in a
log cabin just south of D's home. In the home were:
 - .. Lorena Thompson
 - .. Minnie Thompson
 - .. Pat Thompson (M)
 - .. Daughter Thompson
 - .. + A 3rd son
 - on the east side of "D" was Neil Fassiter (of Fairview Mill)
 - on the west of "D" was the Julian Place & Bud thinks there
was a corner with land of Rob Stockland on the west
Rob farmed in the community & had 3 boys + 3-4 girls
 - Bud knew John Dossier - tenant - a large strapping man
- had land just south of "D". Al Bailey bought the land -
then lost his mind - was in Dix Hill - died about 1975
 - There was a Dr Hutchinson who lived towards Bayleaf -
he sold liquors - but stopped that and started preaching
 - Bob Grissom (Negro) owned land south of "D"
 - Bud knew of STONEY HILL ↑ to the north of "D" in the
Hammond section of Wake Co noted as a source of
whiskey but does not know of STORM HILL ↑
