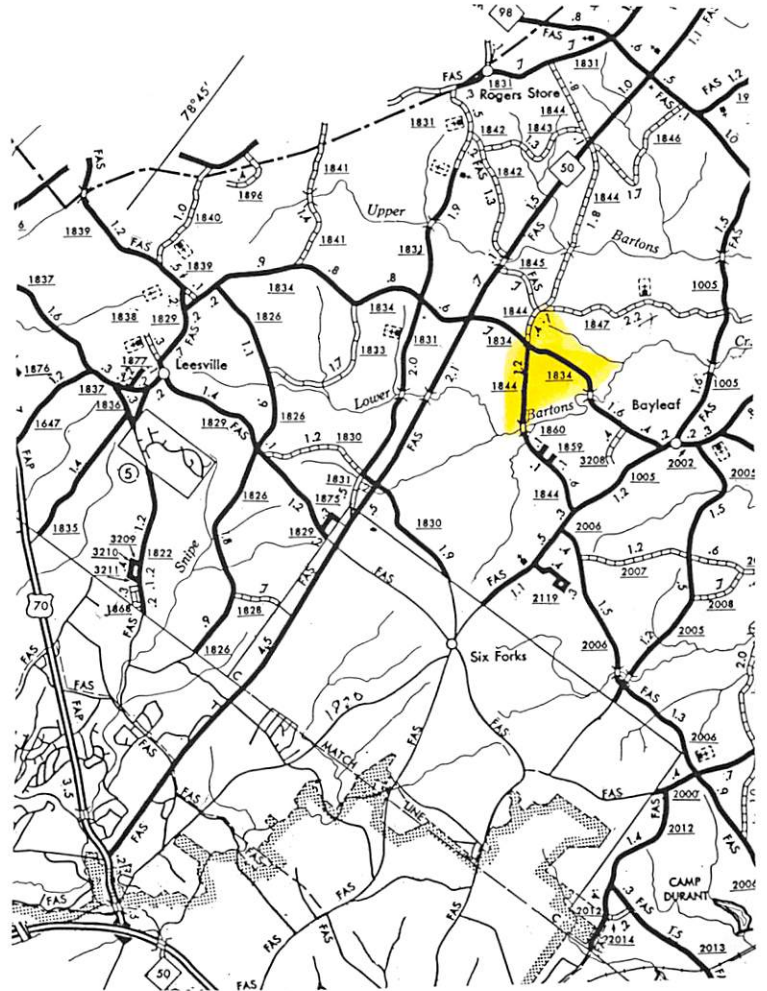

○ Extract of Notes of RPU Visit 24 JUN 1978 to Ernest M. Noyes

Ernest does not know of Storm Hill but knows of Stoney Hill. You go North on HWY 50 and turn right at the stop light. Close to Stoney Hill is the John R. Allen Place now owned by descendant Henry Arnold.

RPU Supplement:

#1 From the above description STORM HILL must be on the land between Barton Creek & Upper Barton Creek along the Bayleaf - Leesville Road.

- Extract of Notes of RPU Visit on 24 FEB 1979 to Bud Gunn
in a Nursing Home at Carpenter, Wake Co, NC. [Bud
knew my GF. Eugene D. Cross] ["D"]
- Bud said he was quite aware that "D" had a girl
and that he knew her [Bessie Elvora Edwards]
 - Bud reports that Rose Edwards lived in the SE corner
of the intersection of Six Forks Road & Creedmoor Road. Bud
had always heard that "D" had a girl by Rose. Rose
was beautiful [ROSE - must be Mathe Edwards - RPU] [The "GIRL"
must be Bessie Elvora Edwards - RPU]
 - Bud's Relationships:
 - I. ABSOM BUNN (a farmer) md O Annie Barlow
↳ S/o George Bunn - lived at Wakefield, Zebulon, NC
 - A. Bud Gunn md 1912 (?) Ethel Ferguson
 - Bud knew Adolphus Creighton
 - D had a tenant named George Thompson who lived in a
log cabin just south of D's home. In the home were:
 - Lorena Thompson
 - Mammie Thompson
 - Pat Thompson (M)
 - Daughter Thompson
 - + A 3rd son
 - on the east side of "D" was Neil Janiter (of Janiter mill)
 - on the west of "D" was the Wilian Place & Bud thinks there
was a corner with land of Rob Stuckland on the west
Rob farmed in the community & had 3 boys + 3-4 girls
 - Bud knew John Dories - tenant - a large strapping man
- had land just south of "D". Al Bailey bought the land -
then lost his mind - was in Dix Hill - died about 1975
 - There was a Dr Hutchinson who lived towards Bayleaf -
he sold legions - but stopped that and started preaching
 - Bob Gresson (Negro) owned land south of "D"
 - Bud knows of STONEY HILL to the north of "D" in the
thruway section of Wake Co noted as a source of
celery but does not know of STORM HILL
