Carpenters are the same?

The name "Beedy" "Bedy" shows up several  
times among Ludmell's descendants. one  
suspects that this comes from his first  
wife Beedy. I just let that was originally  
Obedience but that in some generation  
it was converted formally to the short

mission.

We finally made a firm decision to make a family trip to NC. we leave 29 NOV 2001 and return on 17 DEC 2001. Most of our time will be spent in Wake County. we do have a stop planned for Guilford college to check on Quaker records and a brief trip to Newbern to attend the traditional gathering of Sallaries siblings and their families. We put the AB in the mail last week  
and you should have your copy by now.  
Since then I have returned to processing current  
mail including your most welcome letter of  
17 SEP 2001. Your letter & enclosure gave me  
much new information and several hundred  
new Biopiles have been created. XID's have  
been assigned where appropriate. I'll share  
my new Master Outline with you in  
due course. In the meantime there are some  
minor items I hope you can clarify.

Enclosed is a copy of the page with some census records you sent me and here are my comments/questions:

#1 It makes sense that the Elizabeth age 7  
on the 1850 census and the Elizabeth age 18

on the 1860 census are one & the same (she is highlighted in red)

- #2 It also makes sense that the Elizabeth age 18 on the 1860 census is the sister of the Betsy Carpenter age 26 in whose home Elizabeth resides. They are daughter of Thomas Carpenter. Betsy Carpenter [BEETY ANN CARPENTER] is highlighted in yellow. One assumes Betsy is the mother of Nelly A. age 7 and John A. age 2 on the 1860 census. What about the father of the two children? Did Betsy marry a Mr Carpenter who died or otherwise was absent from the home in 1860 - or did Betsy have these children out of wedlock. The 1880 census would lend credibility to the first of these two options as Betsy is listed as "WIDOW". In any case can I reasonably assume that Nelly & John went by the last name of Carpenter.

- #3 Back to the Betsy Carpenter 1860 household. How does ROSA age 3 1/2 fit in? Is she a daughter of Elizabeth age 18? and if so did Rosa go by the last name of Carpenter? or by HARTRELL. I note

that Elizabeth married 13 AUG 1860 (1)

I know you must have been very concerned about your family members who could have been in harm's way on 11 SEP. We have been very concerned about

our daughter Debra Heck as she travels extensively domestically and internationally in her work with Pharmacia. For a short while they cut back on company travel by air but they will start up again soon. I think one can now begin to feel more secure about travel.

I am very proud about how our Government and all of our people are handling the emergency. This is a job we had to do sooner or later and now is as good time as any to lead the world in a campaign to deal with the bad people.



Dear Dr. Upchurch,

This has been quite a week in our country. It has been difficult to concentrate on anything other than the sad events in Washington and New York. My daughter-in-law is in Europe setting up computer programs on installations where our government has troops (she is a GS employee). She had spent three weeks in Kosovo and was near the end of a three weeks job in Bosnia. We learned yesterday that the German Airlines flights left and arrived on time — the last leg was from Austria to Frankfort. She has confirmed tickets for a U.S. Air flight (on the 19<sup>th</sup>) from Frankfort to Richmond via Charlotte, N.C. The airlines inform us that passengers with confirmed tickets will not be bumped to accommodate passengers whose flights have been cancelled. We do hope she will get home safely late Wednesday. A grandson works with United Airlines and his wife is with American Airlines — both were at home with a few free days. The other grandson is a Marine at a N.C. base. The wife of a nephew was in Spain on tour with seven friends. She is expected home today. I imagine there are such stories all over the country.

I do hope the enclosed records will be a help. I look forward to each issue of the Upchurch Bulletin and this one should hold special interest for me.

Good luck as your research continues. Also, a special wish and blessings for this time in which we find ourselves.

As I expressed by phone it has become increasingly clear that the Elizabeth Updegraff who married John Carpenter was clearly the daughter of Benjamin Updegraff. Accordingly, I have started to assign XID numbers to the descendants of this couple. The first batch of these will appear in the next UB.

Enclosed is a copy of my Master's outline for the former Judwell carpenter line in the Benjamin & Elizabeth A Subdans. This outline

Covers James Ludwell Carpenter, his children, (9) and grandchildren. The descendants (if any) of the grandchildren are covered in Continuation Sections as indicated by the numbers on the left hand side of the page. These are all provided here with (after the pink sheet).

I will welcome any corrections or additions to this outline which you can provide without going to any extra trouble.

I still have to assign XID's to the siblings of James Ludwell Carpenter & their descendants.

The 5 who changed their names from Upchurch to Carpenter in 1803 & their descendants are all kept in my records as if they were actually children of Elizabeth & John since these children appear to have been adopted by Elizabeth & John (probably if not legally) - But I have not yet reached the point of

assigning XID's & there 5 & their descendants.

Recently an idea has occurred to me as to how to get a lead on the 5 who changed their name. one could look at the overall census records for Franklin Co, NC for 1800 to find a home where the children could have been (3 of them were born before 1800 & 2 after 1800). one would look first at homes headed by Upchurch and Carpenter family members. I have these Upchurch records in my hands and at some point will try to obtain the Carpenter records.

It has been wonderful to have you as a collaborator all these years and I look forward to our continued association.

Thanks for your renewal on the U.B. for the  
year 2000 and for your questions about JUBAL U.  
My records contain 3 individuals with the  
name Jubal U and I designate them I, II & III.  
The name is spelled a variety of ways but on  
balance it seems JUBAL was the original intended  
spelling. However, it is not uncommon for  
later generations to utilize different spellings  
as a formal name.

Jubal H. I was one of the 11 children of Richard H. II, the latter having come from Brunswick Co, NC to Franklin Co NC about 1755. Jubal H. I was the brother of Benjamin H whose daughter Elizabeth H and John Carpenter. It was their father & Elizabeth who took over the 5 upcountry children whose name was changed to Carpenter in 1803. One of these children had

(2)

gone by the name of Juhal II before his name was changed to Carpenter. I carry him as Juhal II, II (and as Juhal Carpenter). The father Carpenter who and Elizabeth II had a lot of dealings with Juhal II, I who was a large land owner.

Juhal II, III was the son (1 of 9!) of BURTIS II who was a son of Nathan II, I, another son of Richard II, II. Juhal II, III was born about 1829 and died in the Civil War.

Thus you can see the name JUBAL was used in successive generations of the Upchurch family. I can't figure out how the name got into the family in the first place but it was by 1775 at which time Juhal II, I was born.

In the next 2-3 years I hope to visit Upchurch sites in Stanly Co., NC and at that time will hope to meet you. I have written to Paul Lilly of Plymouth, NC about joining me on such a visit but have not heard from him.

From time-to-time I find that it is productive to collect information on families that lived near Upchurch families in the distant past. The NORTON & CHAMBLEE families lived in Eastern Wake Co, NC in the 1750-1850 era. We have some documented information on the interaction between these two families and the Upchurch Family and I am always alert to find more. Recently a large packet on the Upchurch family arrived us a 9 FEB 1999 letter from David Scarborough Hoyle, Jr and I have returned to it several times, just today I noted that Theresa Weston married a William Carpenter. So far I have not been able to link this William Carpenter to the Upchurch/Carpenter name change of 1803. However, this William Carpenter must have been a cousin of the Carpenters that interested you

The HONOR ROLL lists A.C. HEARTLINE as died - 30 Jul 1921.

The death certificate lists Andrew HEARTLINE as died - 30 Dec 1920, and his birthplace as Troutman's Depot, NC. Informant: George HEALILINE.

The obituary uses the spelling HARTLINE, gives birthplace as Troutman's Depot, NC., and identifies George HARTLINE as his son.

The death certificate is Primary evidence.

The obituary is Secondary evidence, but shortly after his death.

The HONOR ROLL is Secondary evidence, since it was compiled over 30 years after the event.

The surname spelling on the death certificate was signed by George HEARTLINE, the same spelling as recorded by the clerk.

It is possible that the spelling in the south was HEARTLINE and changed in the north. Current telephone book shows only the spelling HARTLINE.

Dear Mrs. Curlee,

I hope you don't mind my writing on behalf of my mother but there were several items that interested me greatly in your last letter. Thank you so much for the information on the name change for Simeon, Benjamin, Jubal, Winifred, and Churchwell. We were very glad to learn this but it certainly does complicate matters. This name change appears to mean that these five children are the adopted sons of John Carpenter. I don't understand why Benjamin Upchurch would refer to John as his "son-in-law," though, unless this term meant the adoptive father of Benjamin's grandchildren. This would seem to indicate that Elizabeth was Benjamin's daughter-in-law instead of his daughter as I had originally presumed. I have no idea who her first husband might have been or about her maiden name. The strange thing is that the census information I have seems to confirm (or confuse!) what I had thought earlier. In 1800, John Carpenter had a wife, three sons and a daughter. Simeon, Benjamin, Ludwell, and Jubal must be included in the three sons although you can see it is one short. The only problem with this is that Churchwell was born an Upchurch in 1801 so it seems that these two families might be different. I can't figure it out. Living near John are Benjamin Upchurch and Abel Upchurch who later moved to Greene County, Alabama. You are probably right that Ludwell is a natural son of John Carpenter because Ludwell is definitely a Lee name (John's mother was Mary Lee). If he weren't related to the others, though, it seems a little odd that he would name three children after them. I will have to write Dr. Upchurch. Perhaps he can help us figure everything out.

To answer your question about John Carpenter's orphans court record, I am reproducing it below:

Greene County, Alabama, Orphans Court Book D, Page 390. John Carpenter, deceased. Jubal Carpenter, administrator. April 9, 1838. Elizabeth Carpenter, the widow; Ludwell Carpenter; Benjamin Carpenter; Jubal Carpenter; Churchwell Carpenter; James Sanderford in right of wife Winifred Sanderford (formerly Winifred Carpenter); Lawrence Williams in right of wife Elizabeth Williams (formerly Elizabeth Carpenter); James H. Rainey in right of wife Mary Rainey (formerly Mary Carpenter); Furney L., Thomas, Rowena, Elizabeth, Jubal, Stephen, and Nancy, children and heirs of Simeon Carpenter, deceased, in right of their father; Julia A., Milly M., and Elizabeth Richardson, children of Nancy Richardson (formerly Nancy Carpenter); John Z., James H., Nancy J., and W. Lutt, children of Harriet Lutt (formerly Harriet Carpenter).

I hope that this is helpful to you.

Regarding your question about Benjamin J. Carpenter and Samuel Benjamin Carpenter of Lauderdale County, Mississippi, that Helen Kukendall is descended from, Samuel was the son of Benjamin, probably the oldest. Both of them were sworn in as Lauderdale County constables in 1839 but I never found anything further on Samuel until the newspaper announcement about Benjamin's death which lists S. B. Carpenter as an heir. That was interesting for me to know that Samuel's wife was Mary Rice. His mother was Nancy Rice so he must have married a cousin (very common in the Carpenter family). I will have to write Helen Kukendall to see if she has any information on my ancestor Hilliard Carpenter. I believe he was the son of Benjamin but don't have definite proof.

You also mentioned a Shoffner line that you were working on. I was very interested in this because I have an Anna Margreth Schafner on my father's side who moved to Mecklenburg County, North Carolina, with her husband Hans Jacob Pfeiffer in 1773. They were emigrants from near Basel, Switzerland. Pfeiffer was later anglicized to Phifer so I thought that perhaps Schafner might have become Shoffner. Anna Margreth may have had brothers that also moved to Mecklenburg County. There is still a lot of information I don't have on this side of my family but I am enclosing an ancestor chart for my great-great-grandmother Mary Catherine Byrd Wooley which shows these lines. If you make any connections with any of them, please let me know. I am appreciative of any information I can learn on all sides of the family.

I am returning your two stamps which I thank you very much for but there is no need for you to send these as we are exchanging information of mutual interest. My mother and I are looking forward to hearing from you again.

Your letter of June 13, 1986 and the Carpenter profiles prompted me to spend this 101<sup>st</sup> day searching through Carpenter files and Carpenter related data. My interest in this John Carpenter, with the son named Ludwell, continues to grow.

I have asked Mary Bryant whether she can supply a copy of what she termed Orphans Court Record - listing the orphans of John Carpenter. I also asked for a copy of the wills of John & Elizabeth.

Mrs. Bryant sent a copy of a record she termed Orphans Court Record of James Lee. The two extracts appear to be what N.C. law terms Will & Estate records. Perhaps terminology is creating the big question I had on orphans of John Carpenter.

Let me explain that Donna Jo Wright, a Georgia Carpenter researcher, sent a copy of a letter from Mary Bryant's son, Barrett. By the time I wrote to him he was so busy with teaching duties at University of Alabama, Birmingham that his mother replied sending a family page Barrett prepared on John Carpenter with her letter. I am enclosing a copy of that correspondence and their address is:

Mrs. Bryant's letter listed Benjamin J. Carpenter.

I had only Benjamin in other records. To answer your question as to whether Samuel Benjamin Carpenter

and Benjamin J. Carpenter are the same man — do you think an old "S" is being read J. It wasn't unusual for first and second names to be reversed — Samuel Benjamin to become Benjamin Samuel or Benjamin S.

In your profile on John Carpenter No. 9 notes Elizabeth Pearce as widow of John Carpenter who died 9 Apr. 1838. Mrs. Bryant had listed Elizabeth Upchurch as the wife using the Deed of gift from Benjamin Upchurch to his son-in-law John Carpenter as source. The deed mentioned is shown on p. 6 #15 in your John Carpenter profile. Is there better proof for Elizabeth Pearce or did Elizabeth Upchurch first marry Pearce. Are we showing two John Carpenters, one who married Upchurch and one who married Pearce?

You are right that my father's name was Walter Alonzo Carpenter. His father was James Claude Carpenter, his grandfather was Allen Carpenter and his great-grandfather was James Ludwell Carpenter. In records the great-grandfather was James L. Carpenter Ludwell or Lud Carpenter, never just James. Old residents in the area where his lands were refer to him as Lud Carpenter.

I did send your name & address and publication flyer to the Bryants. Do let me know if anything valuable comes from the contact.

In the meantime, I shall continue to study these records & any others that become available on the families in which we have an interest.

For the past week the main project in my  
free time has been the processing of your  
very fine letters I.D.# 1700685 and 23444786. I  
regret that it was taken so long to get them  
but there seem to be many claims on my time.  
Every detail in your letters has been extracted  
and placed in the appropriate envelopes.

I am delighted to have the first Dr. & Mrs.  
Carpenter and their birth & the day of Benjamin H.  
This is new information for me. Can you tell  
me who supplied this information and their  
source. With such valuable information one  
always wonders of the source contains another  
bit of information.

The parents of the 5 individuals who changed  
their names from Upchurch to Carpenter is still  
a mystery and it even deeper with some of the  
facts you have provided. The history of the Upchurch  
or Upshur seems very peculiar and I have

no explanation for it. Do you have a copy of the document after the capture? Were all ten children listed and if not which ones were listed. This could help.

It also seems peculiar that Judwell was not among those whose name was changed if he was intermediate in age among the boys. How far have you gotten in establishing the ages of the 10 children. Details on their ages, or even the order of birth, could help in our reasoning.

Enclosed inclosed are copies of six profiles which you need not return. I would be grateful if you would scan these and let me know if any entries are improper or not being related to the profile for whom the sheet is intended. The six include John Carpenter (XID-15712) who and Elizabeth U., dau of Benjamin L and the 5 children who had their name changed. Note that for Benjamin (Wolfe) Carpenter there are two profiles - one headed Samuel Benjamin Carpenter and one headed Benjamin J. Carpenter. Are these two people or one and the same?

Reference #1 in these profiles refers to "Baptisms of Franklin County North Carolina 1793-1844" published in 1935 by Joseph H. Watson. If you study these profiles perhaps you will see something of significance that has escaped me.

It seems almost certainly that the ten children listed for John and Elizabeth (Upchurch) Carpenter include the five who had their name changed 1600-1804. However, it seems to me there are too many unanswered questions to presume that John and Elizabeth are both the natural parents of all ten children. And yet they could be. It would have been that Elizabeth was the wife (or common law wife) of John and that they had five children and then separated whereupon the five children went by their mother's name. It could be that John & Elizabeth remained and then had more children. This is sheer speculation and you could come up with several other speculations that would account for the ten children. We need more facts or a better interpretation of the facts in hand.

Do I assume correctly that you are the daughter of Walter Alonso Carpenter?

It is a joy to work with someone who is so thorough and I look forward to our continued exchanges.


# 376 - NOTATION ON RICHARD CARPENTER OF BALTIMORE, MARYLAND

*(The following is a contribution from your editor.)*

Richard Carpenter is named as a godparent of Sera Jane Clark, who was born in October of 1846 and baptized on February 6, 1848. She was the daughter of William and Mary Clark.

The above data is from the baptismal and birth records of St. Peter the Apostle Roman Catholic Church in Baltimore, Maryland. Several Clark family members are mentioned in these records. The original records, which are in Latin, have been microfilmed and may be consulted at the Maryland Hall of Records in Annapolis, Md. They are also being run in serial form in *The Maryland Genealogical Society Bulletin*, headquarters at 201 West Monument St., Baltimore, Md. 21201.

The railroad industry was in its infancy in the mid 1800's when the little section of Baltimore known as Mt. Clare was turned from farmland into rows of neat residences sheltering railroad men and their families. These devout Irish immigrants lacked a place of worship until St. Peter the Apostle Church was dedicated in 1844. Workmen of all faiths, believing erection of a church worthwhile, helped build it.- 46 -

Thanks for your letter of 19UG85 about the Upchurch who changed their name to Carpenter in 1803. Yes, I am aware of the situation. However, the extract of the will of John Carpenter provided in your letter included some details not available to me before and they have now been properly extracted and recorded.

Details associated with the 5 adopted children indicate that they were most likely children of one of the 11 offspring of Richard II (XID-152). One of these 11 was my GGGF Nathaniel II. If the 5 were legitimate we presume that the father was one of the 8 males among the 11. In this case I can rule out several of the 8 as we know their offspring rather well. I had long thought that Jacob II (one of the 8) would be found to have been the father but I have just recently identified a batch of children belonging to him. Let me know how deep your interest is in the 5 so I can know how much to send to you.

I had not stopped to think about your Carpenter connection and about the prospect of you and I having some sort of linkage or at least mutual interest from that vantage point. Could you give me a brief sketch of your Carpenter line. Do you trace back to any of the 5 who changed their name from Upchurch to Carpenter in 1803?

Also, do you have any linkage to the Carpenters associated with the village of Carpenter in Western Wake Co, NC? This village is in the immediate area where my GGGF Nathan H I settled in 1802±.

Can you tell me more about the William Carpenter in whose will Eton H is mentioned. Charles H (one of the 11 (3 males) referred on pg 3) had children: Thomas Guy H Jr, Kenton H, Eaton H and Charity (and one for this in fact - not excellent). Eaton H and but no children have been located. Could your Eaton be my Eaton?

The Stockland name was very closely associated with the Upchurches in the Morris Creek Area of NC 1750-1850 and with the 11 referred to above. The name Burnell comes from an entirely different branch of the Upchurch family.

I have finally found the time to check out the records on the marriages of John Dudney Upchurch and his brother, James. Though I did not find as much as I would like to have, I certainly found enough for us to know that you have the accurate information.

The 1850 Census does show both John and James still at home with Mary(at least, I had supposed that these were her sons) while John's marriage date is given as 30 July 1844. Our marriage records begin in 1851, with only one recorded for 1850.

I tried to learn more about Martitia Ross Upchurch through Ross family descendants; I had no luck with my calls. We do have the Revolutionary War Papers of her grandfather, Williamson Ross, should you have any interest in those. I checked only two townships for Martitia as I read the 1870 census. It is possible that she moved out of the area where the families were living in 1850 and 1860.

*Upchurch*  
Thomas Allen is the correct name for the executor of William Allen Upchurch. That should teach me to be more careful to proof read!

As yet, I have not had a reply from Mrs. Rhines nor Mrs. F. N. Standifer. I will get back to you with any information that may come from these ladies.

The Upchurch records in your last package are most interesting. I shall use them where I feel they may help gain more information on this family. I will place copies in the Heritage Room of our Stanly County Library only if I have your written permission to do so.

Perhaps by the next time I write, something new will be in from Arkansas.

John Lilly assures me that you will hear from him and Paul. He mentioned the last issue of the UPCHURCH BULLETIN in such a way that I knew he had enjoyed it as much as I did. He and Mrs. Lilly missed the meeting of our society on the 24th of June; I expected to talk with him there. However, I'm sure the telephone conversations served the same purpose.

I feel sure you have some of the material I am enclosing. It is sent just to be certain I include what may be of value to you.

If more proofs show, I shall certainly pass them along to you. Accept my thanks for all the help to researchers of this area; your records are invaluable!

Dear Lucille,

I was very impressed by your letter of January 3, 1985 and all the details included. In fact I have spent over two full days in the last week extracting your letter and reviewing my related files, census records, etc. There still is no answer as to who is the parent of the Mary - who and Isaac Cooper, brother of yours and/or Roswell Cooper. Let me recap my relevant information.

Harmon U <sup>(167)</sup> is not listed among the 11 Upchurch Heads of Household in America in the 1790 census. Presumably the census takers missed him (or extractors of the records have missed him) as his oldest son Allen U (3564) was b. 1779 and Harmon was presumably married / head of a household at that time. I do not have an 1800 census extant for Upchurches for Montgomery Co., NC but I do for 1810, 1830 & 1840.

For 1810 there are 3 heads of households - B. U, Allen U & Harmon. The B. U was age 16-26 as was his wife & they had a son & a daughter under 10. I don't know who this B. U was but suspect he was a son of Harmon U. B. U does not appear on the 1830 & 1840 census of Montgomery Co., NC and I have not yet located him elsewhere. His son on the 1810

was too old to have been your Mary (W.) who was b 1826. Since B. H. was not in the 1830, 1840 Montgomery census it is unlikely that a daughter (Mary W?) would have had Isaac Cooper in the late 1840's. Allen 4 on the 1810 census is the son of Harmon H. In Allen's household is his wife Mary (Budney) H [who as a widow appears on the 1850 census of Stanley Co, NC at age 60 with her son John and James] and 2 as yet unidentified daug [too old to be your Mary] and one son who has to be William Allen H (4411, b 1807). In Harmon's home are Harmon and his wife Elizabeth —, an unknown daughter age 10-16 and 3 sons. The oldest son is Howell H age 20 but the 2 youngest are ~~as yet~~ <sup>as yet</sup> unidentified by me.

For the 1830 census I have 4 heads of households in Montgomery Co, NC - Allen H, Correll H, James H and Elizabeth H. My records must have been taken from a poor microfilm as it is difficult to believe what is recorded in every respect. All of the individuals in Allen's household are shown to be older than I believe to be true. Allen is shown as 70-80 when he should be about age 51. His wife Mary is shown to be 60-70 when she should be 40. Four young sons (Benjamin, James, John Budney, Palude Boggs) appear but they are too old as shown on the census. The 2 daughters from the 1810 census appear again in 1830 but they do not appear at age 40-50 when they should be no more than 30-40 if you believe the 1810 census. Also in 1830 Allen is shown as having a 3rd & younger daughter - age 30-40 - but she was not on the 1810 census and there could not have been age 30-40 in 1830. This 3rd daughter was born 1810-1830.

and there is an outside chance she could have been  
b as late as 1826 and have been named Mary  
and have married Isaac Cooper in the late 1840's.

I feel that the Cordell II on the 1830 census is  
a garbled spelling of Howell H. Cordell never appears  
later as a name. The ages on the 1830 census are  
greater than should be the case for Howell and  
his family members - but then the ages seem  
to be off generally for my extract of 1830 - Montgomery Co.  
Howell (Cordell) has the right number of girls in  
his household and we know all 4 names and  
none are named Mary (Hence it is unlikely that  
he ever had a daughter of the right age to have and  
Isaac Cooper in the late 1840's. - This confirmed  
by the lack of a female age under 10 in his household  
on the 1840 census).

Elizabeth II on the 1840 census is undoubtedly  
the widow of Harmon H. The lone dame on the 1810  
census is still in the home in 1830 but the age of  
60-70 shown is too great to be true.

I am not drawing any firm conclusions about the  
James II on the 1830 census. Maybe the writing is so  
poor on the microfilm is so poor that the name  
is not James but something else? If it is James II  
and if the ages are right (oldest male = James = 50-60 in  
1830 hence b 1870-1880) he would have been too old to  
have been the son of Allen or Howell II and hence  
would have been (possibly) another son of Harmon H.  
In any case my guess is that the James II is indeed  
another son of Harmon H. He could not have been

a son of Allen U because Allen U had a son  
 James U b 1828 (per 1850 census) who could, therefore,  
 not have been on the 1830 census as head of  
 a household. [There is an outside chance this James  
 U could have been the son of Howell U - but  
 unlikely]. Now for a guess. I think this James  
 U on the 1830 census is the same as B U  
 on the 1810 census - both in Montgomery Co, NC.  
 Maybe he was James B. U [James Benjamin U?]  
 Furthermore, I would guess that the two heads  
 of households in Stanly Co, NC in 1850 - Benjamin U b 1818  
 & Wesley U b 1819 were sons of the hypothetical  
 James Benjamin U. There is not an exact age  
 match (possibly because of error in estimation in 1830  
 census) but this fits better than anything else.  
 There is a puzzle about what happened to this group  
 in 1840. There is no James Benjamin U on the  
 1840 Montgomery Co, NC census (of course he could have  
 died) - But where are his children & especially the  
 two boys Benjamin & Wesley (ages 22 & 21 in 1840). I  
 don't find them in <sup>the</sup> other 4 U households listed  
 in 1840. Perhaps they were wandering and will appear  
 in a nearby county - or possibly are in a home  
 of a non-Uphurich relative & hence not listed as  
 an Uphurich as only heads of households were  
 listed in 1840. It is possible that this James  
 Benjamin U had a son Mary U b 1826. There

are born in her home in 1840 b 1810-1815 & b 1800-1810  
 - but then I have already suggested that ages are  
 wrong on these census records. If presumed  
 sons Benjamin & Wesley were b 1818 & 1819  
 (1850 census) then there could have been a  
 sister b 1826 - maybe.

For the 1840 census of Montgomery Co, NC I have  
 4 Upchurch Heads of Household and they & all of  
 the household members fit in an excellent fashion.  
 we have Allen U with 3 sons in his home and 2 living  
 apart (William Allen U & Patrick Boggs U). We have  
 Howell U with 2 sons & a son in his home. Looking  
 at these records it seems that it is not logical  
 for Howell U or any of his sons to have had a  
 daughter Mary U b 1826. Also it seems that none  
 of the children of Allen U could have had a  
 daughter Mary U that could have been b 1826  
 and m Isaac Cooper.

To recap - there is a possibility that Allen U  
 could have had a daughter Mary U b 1826 who could  
 have married Isaac Cooper in the late 1840's. A second  
 possibility is that James Benjamin, hypothetical son  
 of Harriet U, could have had a daughter Mary U b 1826.

I am really pleased at the improvements made  
 in my records and understanding of the Upchurches  
 originating in Montgomery Co, NC in the early  
 1800's. I will hope to share some of this analysis  
 with the readers of the Upchurch Bulletin, possibly

sometime in 1985. of course there are a lot<sup>6</sup> more aspects to understand more thoroughly and the more progress we can make prior to a write-up in the UB, the better. on the other hand, if we wait to write until we understand everything - we will never write.

I do hope your interest in the Uplands family will continue and that you will do more in the way of interpretation of present data and collection and interpretation of more data. You are the kind of careful worker I enjoy as a collaborator. If you need any of my census records or other files just let me know. I'll gladly share anything I have -

We need to sort out whether Elizabeth Adeline Schaffner b 1828 (XID-4443) and John Sidney H or his brother James H (per Efrid Genealogy). I have the former. You asked for a descendant in this line. I have one - she is Mrs F. N. STANDTECK (nee Odile Marie H - XID-4447) 1634 BARCELONA RD SW, ALBUQUERQUE, NM 87105. She is a regular subscriber to the UB but I have not worked hard at getting

information from her. I don't know how ~~much~~ ⑦  
much she knows or whether she will be  
willing to write. I am missing a lot of  
details on her immediate family which I  
need. For example, I have the names of  
only one of her four children & no info  
on spouses or grandchildren. Odie was one  
of 9 children & details are sketchy. She  
was b 8 OCT 1911 and is dau of James Robert  
U b 15 AUG 1884 (Red River Co, TX) d 7 NOV 1962 (Hugo, OK),  
gd of James Allen U b 29 MAR 1852 d 30 MAY 1928

Dear Soule,

I am delighted to have your letter of 27 Nov 84 and to have hope that we can be helpful to each other. Details on the Upchurch Bulletin which you requested are enclosed.

I was born and raised in Wake Co, NC and was on the faculty at N.C. State University 1953-1965 and still have two sisters in NC-one in Raleigh and one in Greensboro. I usually visit NC once or twice each year.

In the mid 1970's I knew that Harmon II (XID-167) (Head of Upchurch class 16) was a 5th generation descendant of Michael II (146), the original Upchurch immigrant to come to America. Very little was known of the descendants of Harmon II but it soon unfolded that he had two sons Allen II (3564) and Howell II (3566). After a time I came across a note giving the initials of three brothers who had moved to AR in the 1850's. They were said to be from NC and of an

unknown father. These three males turned out to be the sons of Allen 4 (3564). Since I have developed a major family outline for Allen 4 (3564) and a modest one for Howell 6 (3566). There have been many sources including numerous correspondents. Of course there is a great deal yet to add.

I have about this dozen copies in my library system but none of them seem to fit your line. There is an Isaac Cooper but he does not seem to fit. A quick look at the marriage lists and the census records available to me does not suggest a solution. Perhaps some of my files will be more helpful with a more careful look and with more information in hand.

I presume from what you write that your only possible connection with the Upchurches is through your ancestor Mary — who and Isaac Cooper. Is this true? Can you tell me more about Mary and Isaac? When & where born, married, died & where buried and the names of their children. I will use this to search more in my files and still also place the details in myfiles for each individual for future reference purposes. With this

approach a solution sometimes appears <sup>(3)</sup> in due course. I probably have on the order of 100,000 profiles all selected because of their relationship or possible relationship to Upchurch.

On the 1850 census for Stanley Co, NC I find a Mary U, Head of Household, age 60 (presumably widowed) with son William (age 26) and James U (age 26) and female Eva Frederick(?) age 22. I assume this is short-given Mary. → b ca 1799  
For the children of Allen U (3564) I have:

A. William Allen U (no further details - could he have had a son Mary who m Isaac Cooper?)

B. Patrick Bogart U b 1816 (NC) d 1885 (AR)

I have much detail on his 11 children one of whom was Mary Katherine U. She md 20 NOV 1873 William Oliver Shavers.

C. Benjamin U - moved to Texas, AR 1859 - from NC

Had sons John & Thomas - no further details

D. James U - no further details

E. John Sidney U b 31 JUL 1824 d 11 MAR 1857

md 30 JUL 1844 Elizabeth Adeline Schopfer.

I have details on 4 children → b ca 1790 d 1846 (Stanley Co, NC)

For the children of Howell U I have:

A. Sarah U - no further details

B. Celia U - no further details

C. William Riley U b 26 APR 1824 d 1893 (Stanley Co, NC)

I have substantial detail on 1 of his 4 children

D. Nancy U. md Aaron Rogers - + a few details

E. Martha U - no other details.

The Upchurch Bulletin contains a lot of information on the Harmon U class including some pictures and some cutlines.

I am anxious to hear from you and to continue our exchange of information. Since you are a resident of Stanley Co, we perhaps some of your liner crossed the Upchurch liner more than once.

I know there were marriages between Upchurches and Shoffners in that time period. Were there also Cooper and Upchurch marriages? Was Mary, the wife of Isaac Cooper, an Upchurch? They were in Stanly County in 1850 and in Conway County, Ark. in 1860. In Conway County they were next door to William and Elizabeth Upchurch of N. C. Mary was born ca 1826 and died 1866-1870.

I have Cooper and Shoffner lines. If I establish that Mary, wife of Isaac Cooper was an Upchurch, I will certainly have a need for your publication.

A I do appreciate you effort to determine whether the Mary who married  
△ Isaac Cooper was an Upchurch. You are right in thinking that she  
— would be my link to the Upchurch family. I should also tell you that  
△ □ △ Isaac and Caswell Cooper, from whom I descend were brothers. Caswell  
△ Cooper married Christena Shoffner. After her death in Stanly County  
△ in 1860, Caswell took all of his children, except my great grandfather,  
△ and went to Pope County, Ark. Family records of Rebecca Malinda Brooks,  
— eldest daughter of Caswell Cooper, say that on their way to Pope Co.,  
△ Ark. they stopped in Conway County, Ark. to visit Uncle Isaac Cooper,  
△ Cousin Jeremiah Lowder and the Upchurches.

— Aside from wanting to have my Cooper records as complete as possible,  
△ I have never been able to prove the parents of Christena Shoffner.  
△ + □ Brooks family records say that she was daughter of Jacob Shoffner and  
△ + □ Millie Gould. At St. Martin's Lutheran Church in Stanly Co., she is  
△ + □ buried beside Jacob Shoffner and his wife, Mary Efird. It is said  
△ + □ + □ that this Jacob was son of a Jacob Sr. and Elizabeth who came from  
— Lancaster Co., S. C. to Montgomery Co., N. C. in 1790s. There is one  
△ + □ unknown daughter of Jacob and Mary Efird Shoffner listed in the Efird  
△ + □ Genealogy; I have thought this might be Priscilla, wife of Jeremiah  
△ + □ Lowder. A sister, Eliza A. Upchurch, is listed as marrying James → SHE MP NOT JAMES BUT IT'S BRO JOHN DUDNEY  
△ + □ + □ Upchurch, son of Allen and Mary, about 1850 (Eliza born about 1828).  
△ + □ James died about 1857. He and Eliza had four boys. In the 1870s,  
△ + □ Eliza went to Ark. with her brother, Martin Shoffner. This book also  
— states that she went on to Texas with Martin and that in 1880, she  
□ and three of her sons show in Red River County near Martin.

- Δ Conway Co., Ark. Marriage Index show that Sarah E. Cooper married Δ Robert Lauder 22 Jan 1873. I found one descendant of this couple, Δ + Δ + Δ but could not learn where Isaac and Mary are buried. Robert Lauder Δ + Δ was son of Jeremiah and Priscilla Shoffner Lowder; I learned nothing Δ new on this couple, either. Mary Cooper was alive in 1860, but gone - before 1870. If the youngest child on the 1870 census was hers (twins?) - she died between 1866 and 1870. I do not have a record of the 1880 □ census so my last information on Isaac is the 1870 census record.
- Though Montgomery County (from which Stanly County was cut in 1841) Δ had three courthouse fires, I feel that all of Kimbrol Cooper's - children were born in Montgomery County, N. C. The Brooks records Δ + Δ say that Margaret, wife of Kimbrol (Kimbrell) Cooper was a Rowland.

- + Should you have an address for a descendant of [John] And Elizabeth Δ Adeline Schofner Upchurch, I would love to try for information from that branch. Did brothers James and John marry Eliz A. Shoffners, Δ I wonder? If so, could my Christena Shoffner, wife of Caswell Cooper, - Born 15 May 1812 Died 8 Sept. 1864 Buried Stanly Co., N. C. be a - relation?
