Dr. Upchurch, here is what I reviewed this moming on Margaret Yates Upchurch. Feel free to review, comment, and share if at all helpful:

Per William's Will dated 1806 and recorded 1808: " item I give Margaret Yeats one featherbed and furniture and one cow and one calf." This is my evidence that she is his daughter. The 1800 census (last he was in) he has 1 white female between ages 1 and 10, and 1 other older white female between ages 20 and 40 (likely his wife).
He also names the following daughters in his will (I've listed them in order of appearance, which may or may not correlate with age. Only Margaret and Sally are the only two listed still having their maiden name leading me to believe they were unmarried in 1806):
Elizabeth Gregory
Creecy Strickland
Mary Beasley
Milly Harrod (Harwood,Harward,etc spellings were off back then)
Sally Yeats
Probate on Burtis Upchurch was done in 1846 and Margaret was still living. I have in my tree (not backed by any evidence) her birth year as 1788, but that doesn't line up with the 1800 census so closer examination is likely needed. Without a headstone it is harder to pinpoint the birth year and death year. We see her in the 1850 census and not in the 1860 so that might be a reason her death is listed as 1859 . Her age in 1850 is listed as 70 , which would put her birth year at 1780 .

The next earlier census was the 1790 (first Federal Census) and as he purchased land in 1784 from Absolom Harwood at the edge of Wake/Chatham we'd expect to find him in the Hillsborough district either in Wake or Chatham (Luckily, as the link below denotes, the records for Wake and Chatham survived where other counties in that district were destroyed). We find a "Wm Yeats" in Wake with 3 males under 16, 1 male over 16, and 7 females (sadly not broken out any by age and, I believe, would've included his wife).

As you can see, it is difficult to pinpoint her age. I would think that if she was named by her maiden name in 1806 that she'd still be living with her parents in 1800, but the census doesn't align with that (it could be her or Sally, but not both). She (or her sister) might've been listed (maybe living with) one of her brothers' families. Unfortunately, it wasn't until the 1850 census that they listed each member of the household by name. It would take more review of Burtis Upchurch in the census because that might show when he and Margaret maried. Gilbert Burtis Upchurch (buried in Prestonwood CC) was bom in 1820, so they were certainly married prior to that year, possibly earlier as I don't have all the siblings in that generation listed in my notes.

For the info on William - I've never seen valid evidence that his wife was a Tapp, nor that he was a son of George (or clear evidence of who his parents at this point). Further research here is welcomed, but it may be left only to circumstantial evidence or remain a mystery as records might've been destroyed or otherwise lost to time. Closer scrutiny of the tax records and similarly non-indexed and arduous to search materials may yield clues which are yet undiscovered on his origins. That generation is also made more complicated by the 1752 adoption by the British of the Gregorian calendar from the Julian.

As Mr. Staley Smith has stated, I am very interested in any additional information you have.
I have a suspicion we may be kin to some degree as one of our ancestors, Lewis S Yates (1845-1920) married Amelia Unchurch (1846-1879). According to what I have already researched "Melia Ann" was the daughter of Gilbert Unchurch (1820-1895) and Margaret Byrd (1820-1896). Gilbert was the son of Kurtis Upchurch (1781-1840) and Margaret Yates (1788-1859). Burtis was the son of Nathan Upchurch (1759 1835) and Mackey Johnson ( -1831 ). Nathan Unchurch was in the Revolutionary War and here was his pension application: http://revwarapps.org/s7777.pdf Interestingly enough Margaret Yates seems to be the daughter of William Yates who was married to Mary ?? He is the one people refer to as William of Wake and several people attach him to Mary Cap, but I'm skeptical of that link.

Our Yates line goes like this:
My father is Woody Herman Yates
His father was Herman Yates
His father was Matthew Thomas Yates who married Nancy Jane Markham
His father was the above mentioned L.S. Yates who married 1st Amelia Upchurch 2nd Martha ??
His father was William Yates (1824-1899) who married Middy Jane Ferrell (1821 1901)

His father was Lewis Yates (1797-1827) and I have him married to Mary Beach (17971896), but I've also found another marriage entry of a Lewis Yates in this time period and in this area to a Polly Riech/Rich and I haven't had a chance to straighten this out. His father was Matthew Tyson Yates (1773 - 1837) and Elizabeth Wimberly (1766 1806)

His father was the above mentioned William Yeates/Yates of Wake with a will dated 1806/1808.

Some of the older generations live not verified $100 \%$ the date ranges, but I have seen probate and will records enough to know the line to William of Wake seems correct. I've shown Staley some land indentures of William of Wake buying land from Absolom Harwood and some indentures again deeding (what I think is a portion of that land) to his son Mathew.

I have almost all my data in ancestry.com - my login name is imagesinblue. I can export a GEDCOM file, but I haven't figured out how to print the reports like FamilyTreeMaker could produce.

My mother is a Sears so from her I have lines to a lot of old families in the Chatham/Durham/Orange/Wake counties such as Barde, Mason, Stone, Carpenter, Booth, Jenkins, Herndon, Williams, and others.

1) I found A.B. Markham's original land grant maps guide and then found out how to get the actual maps. I have contacted his son Allan B. Markham Jr. here in Durham and am in the process of mailing him the check for the maps. Several of my old families purchased lands from these original grants or were the original grantees themselves.
2) I saw references on the Durham/Orange County Genealogy Society site that I believe you and Kim Wrenn worked together on a book about families/land "Houses, Lands, and Histories of Some Western Wake County Families". I've been working to connect up with Kim Wen because her husband is a Yates descendant and she most likely has a lot of notes to compare. Since she also lives here locally (in Durham) Ill be trying to meet up with her as soon as it is convenient.

Yes, the Church histories in this area fascinate me as well. I saw that M. Pisgah was founded as a Yates Church originally. Online, I found where Kim Wrenn had obtained from Ernest Dollar the records from the civil war era at Mt. Pisgah. Here:

As you said, there are so many facets to it that it does blow my mind.
My wife and I are building our first home together (we just got married last Sept 17). The closing date is not set in stone yet, but were thinking it will be sometime in the beginning of October. You can use the following mailing address now:

I live just outside downtown Raleigh in a renovated historic cotton mill. I have close proximity to the NC Archives and the State Genealogy Library. I work full time so I'm somewhat limited with the hours I can get in there - most Saturdays and a few hours here and there on weekdays depending on the week. I could spend weeks in there and probably not get close to finishing. I love it!
I'm not sure in what ways I can be of assistance to you, but please don't hesitate to make any requests. I'm excited about collaborating. I've definitely been bit hard by the genealogy/history bug.
I suppose my dad and I would like to focus on the Yates family land. Starting with the original grant Absalom Harwood deeded to William of Wake. Then I believe he deeded a portion of that to his son Matthew. I'm not sure the divisions or ownership between that Matthew Tyson and my great grandfather Matthew Thomas Yates. I'm not certain if Matthew Thomas' $\sim 290$ acres were part of the original William of Wake tracts. I can send you a direct email with more information on these when I get to this. I'm hoping Mr. Staley can assist me with Deed Mapper and maybe I can figure this out from there.
My dad has several other resources that we will be working to digitize. Things like the family bible and old photographs (some of which he's not able to identify the people). I can try to itemize these items, scan them, and somehow make copies available to you and whoever is interested.
Another item lm interested in knowing/documenting is where the ancestors are buried. For the Yates, I don't know beyond L.S. Yates. For the Upchurches, the oldest one I know of is Gilbert/Margaret. You may already know this, but Gilbert Unchurch and his wife are buried in a family plot which happens to lie currently in the back yards of 2 neighbors in Prestonwood Country Club. Interestingly enough, my parents live in Preston and my dad didn't know that one of his ancestors was lying less than a mile from his house. We walked by there one day together and met one of the men whose back yards borders the cemetery. He keeps it locked and he and his neighbor work to keep the graves well kept.
I have a difficult time keeping emails short for topics I'm passionate about. Thank you again for your time and assistance!

I was able to access the website and download the back issues of the Upchurch Bulletin. A while back I had found and consumed the youtube videos associated with this and was very pleased and impressed with the information as well as the quality of the presentation of it. I look forward to hearing/reading more about Nathan Upchurch.

My dad and I will become members. I have some other good news that our tree has grown by 1. Tyson Franklin Yates was born on May 3, 2014 to my wife, Lauren Estee Love Yates (of Ft. Lauderdale, FL), and I. His name comes from Matthew Tyson Yates' (the missionary) middle name. Franklin was Lauren's father's middle name (He passed away in 2012).

We know Mrs. Doris Jean (Yates) Unchurch (my father more than I do, but l'm hoping to change that soon) and I'm very confident that we fall in the same Tree under that revolutionary Yates ancestor. At present I don't know the relation, but if I speak more with my dad I can figure it out quickly. The revolutionary war ancestor was William Yeates (Yates) also known to family genealogists as William of Wake. He had a will on page 314 of Wake County Will Book 7 in Feb 1808. There are some who speculate about his orgins, but the physical data I have begins with him being in the war and then after the war we see him buying land from original grant holders at the edge of Wake and Chatham counties. I can provide some of those pieces or try to help you some if you have questions. I need to do more work in other, more obscure sources like court records, tax records, and others where available to flesh his story out more, but being a new dad has kept me from visiting the archives as often.

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I have a question for you. I haven't found in the archived UB yet, but do you know if anyone has been able to find out Gilbert Burtis Unchurch's wife Margaret Byrd's (~1820-1896) grandparents? I know Jesse Byrd (~1778-1863) and Edith Jackson ( $\sim 1778$ - 1860) were her parents, but live not been able to get anywhere beyond them. As a side note, my parents live walking distance to Gilbert's and Margaret's graves.

Certainly.
I'm going to try to concisely share quite a bit of information, so bear with me.
What you'll find in the attached image is a screenshot of my ancestry tree focused on my mother's side. First, you'll likely spot the Yates name. Well, beyond that there are several other overlaps I've found. Usually the marriages were further out than hst cousins, but it did happen a few times in my tree. You'll see L.S. Yates, who married Amelia Ann Upchurch (I'm never sure how to spell that - media), had this William Mclver Yates (who went by Billy) who in turn produced the line to my mom and L.S. Yates and Miss Unchurch had Matthew Thomas Yates, my great grandfather on my paternal line. I'm terrible at calculating cousins, but my great-grandma Cassis Yates would've been a first cousin of my grandpa Herman Yates. The generations are off by 1, but the relation originally was close.

Now, you were asking about the Sears family of western wake, which is interesting. My mother's paternal line is of Sears of Chatham, but my mother's matemal line has a link to some Sears from wester Wake.

Ill start with the line that was her namesake from Chatham. Feel free to skim over this if it is not relevant. As you can see in the graphic is that her paternal line was Sears of Chatham, and before that Virginia. The screenshot only goes back to the civil war generation, but I can share the furthest back info I have if you're interested. I don't add people to my tree that I can't prove solidly. She has several big names of Chatham county - Barbee, Mason, Stone, Williams, Yates, Jenkins, Boothe, and that Murrell line which links to Dempsey Powell of Wake. Also, of most importance to you: Unchurch! :)

My grandma Doris' grandma was Alice E. Sears, who married William Henry Carpenter (who founded the Carpenter Farm Supply in Carpenter/Morrisville/Cary). Alice E. Sears was the daughter of Barley G Sears and his 3rd wife Nancy Ann Marcom. Bartley G's probate is a real help in sorting out the multiple children he had by each of his 3 wives. He is the source of some of the Sears that youll find in Western Wake I believe like Berry Fred Sears and others. I'm actually working to confirm that as fact because as a side note: my grandma Doris now lives at SearStone ( http://ww.searstone.com/ ) and I wanted to see if she was related by marriage to the namesake of the place. I asked those living Sears descendants to verify my theory that they too were actually
bor of Bartley $G$ Sears. bor of Barley G Sears.

Now, the mystery. I had found a mention of a Mr. Edwards online searching for info on Bartley G. Sears ~1999 and I never saw anyone reply, but he seemed to believe that Bartley G. tied into the Sears family of Chatham. I have started working on that, but it is a real tough one to try to solve. The difficulty comes in trying to go back a couple generations and trace down, and the easy "low-hanging fruit" like wills, probate, etc are not there for those other branches. Perhaps if I were just a shade better at genealogy ld think of some tax records or other obscure data to formulate a decent direction to discover where Barley G. Sears came from.

Hopefully at least some of this will provide useful to what you were actually looking for.

However, there is a puzzle. Find A Grave shows her with an Upchurch name. This is a puzzle to me as she was not nee Upchurch and she never married an Unchurch and she was never in a home where she could have been considered as a step-daughter of an Upchurch male. So am I missing something? The only connection I can see is that her daughter Susan Adelaide Scott married late in life John Thomas Horton but produced no issue. John was a stepson of William Burtis Upchurch, I and it is conceivable that John could at some point have gone by the Upchurch name of his stepfather or could have been called by that name by someone but I have no evidence of either. My guess is that someone who had a glimpse of the connection of John to an Unchurch looked at John as the son in law of Samantha and incorrectly deduced that somehow Samantha belonged to have the Unchurch name appended.

Dr．Unchurch，
I appreciate you asking me and apologize for my delay in response．I think before you can answer the questions regarding the computer systems a clear strategy overall needs to be established．For example，if you＇re going to end up uploading mos th documents to ancestry．com，then you wont need to worry as much about the storage （ie：cloud／webhosting options）．For the interim I think the GoDaddy／Methodology 1 makes good sense．

The overall issue I see as challenging is the model．If you put things on ancestry，then I worry that folks would just copy it off and then never contribute to or support anything．Altematively，if a tool／resources is created that is separate from ancestry，then more fragmentation happens and for individuals who want it all in one place， they＇ll have to work to re－enter everything into ancestry（or their tool of choice）．Not to mention，why＂re－invent the wheel＂？Focus more on the research and entry of the data，not on building the system to house／search／display／etc that data because those meta tasks are tremendous in their own respects．I＇m always a fan of books，but I understand that were in a digital age and it really is great to be able to revise things as new data is found in a more real－time way．
The model that I＇ve seen work that crosses over the club joining and ancestry data realms are the hereditary societies．For example，SARIDAR，Society of Colonial Wars，Society of the Cincinnati，and others（many others．．．）．That being said，there isn＇t as broad a market for a 1 family（or small grouping of families）type society，not to mention that I don＇t think socials and speakers／events are exactly what your goal is here．Those organizations progress to the point that they＇re able to sponsor／generate materials related to their core mission． I＇ve also seen other organizations spring up around landmarks or other historical things and generate materials that delve into the genealogical past of the area．I also had the idea of maintaining／creating trees for purchase with proof sources for individuals interesting in hereditary organizations．Perhaps promoting them in a list form of what groups we qualify for and by which ancestor．Unfortunately，that approach doesn＇t keep recurring support that would be needed to maintain the other work you＇d like to achieve．

Perhaps，a blended model of sorts？Maybe it would be good to watermark materials uploaded to ancestry with the ur／logo of the entity in the expectation that interested persons would venture to the site and then make the site focused on value－added materials as a＂members only＂benefit．The unfortunate thing is that all too many people join ancestry and add on wrong data so focus could be placed on advertising or posturing the site and value－add materials as getting the real story．It is a high value thing to get a professional level of research without paying a professional genealogist．
For me，personally，the data I＇m most willing to pay for is the slightly more obscure pieces．For example，it has been easy for me to find wills，census Records，and some other core documents，but what is often much harder is to review the tax records and make the harder connections（like using known data and census data paired to make a case that one man relates to a family in the area when no single document spells the relationship out as such）．Also，newspaper entries（newspapers．com）that help flesh out the character of the historical persons， although they too are limited somewhat in scope／availability．Church records are another of those tougher places to find more obscure data that illuminates the ancestor＇s life．

Unfortunately，I have more questions than answers and several disjointed ideas．I think I do have some personal bias here and I wonder how my interests and interactions in genealogy relate to those of others．I＇m not sure there is much marketing research done on the industry around genealogy to know key trends．Matthew

Hi Matthew---
Thank you for your detailed response to my inquiry. You have covered a wide array of situations and I will preserve your comments along with other inputs as we move forward to resolve methodology issues for Allied Families. We now have enough experience to begin to deal with the hard questions to implement our vision. Your email arrives just a we are starting a twoday visit from a representative of the Holliman(Holleman) family from PA to consider bringing their operation under the banner of Allied Families. Attached are two related items. You can see we will be covering some of the ground you have exposed.

For now I will comment on the money aspect you have raised and look forward to going into detail on the other aspects in due course. Hopefully, some issues will become moot as we study enough to make choices and get things behind us. For example, we have now purchased the Go Daddy program Express Email to help us with our massive mailings and to make our ENewsletters more appealing.

Re the money. I favor anyone being able to access our home page unfettered. There they will be able to go to our massive Resource file by getting a password upon giving their name and email address(this gets them into our address system and allows us to do repeated followups via $\mathrm{E}=$ Newsletters or private emails as appropriate). A challenge is to make the Resources file search-able. Likewise visitors would be prompted on our home page to go to the narratives for any of dozens of enrolled families where, again, they would be able to see all details by providing name and email address.(A challenge is for us to allow members of a given enrolled family to readily access their prior inputs which will have been melded into our Resources file.) Ir no case would visitors be able to enter or change details. That would require them to be come a member of our system and even then rights would be carefully proscribed.

With the above approach we would be able to use accumulated email addresses to contact prior visitors to encourage them to become members at $\$ 20 / y e a r$ and to become active participants in a given enrolled family or to enroll their own. My experience is this this approach will bring us volunteer workers, numerous $\$ 20$ memberships and a fair collection of members who sign up at a higher level. Further our ongoing E-Newsletter program for each enrolled family will repeatedly encourage donations to provide long-term support for the enrolled family to which they have allegiances. In our first year we collected about $\$ 10,000$. Along the way we count on having a few deep pocket people to surface who will help carry the load (we have some in mind). So from this you get an idea on our financial model. There are, of course. many more questions that could be asked. I will welcome yours.

Over time I can send you more think pieces or updates. A real bonus will come when I am in Raleigh and we can go over items in detail.

Do continue to let me have your inputs. I am sensitive that you have other duties and time is valuable .
