On pages 269 & 270 the Author describes the antebellum situation with regard to Raleigh merchants. In 1851 owners were concerned with being open too long - from sunrise until dark 5-7 in summer - a 14 hour day. The 1851 movement came to naught. In 1858 the merchants were concerned about the practice of extending 12 months credit. These interests did not lead to a formal merchants association until years later. Those signing a document in January 1858 re representatives at a Commercial Convention in Richmond are listed below.

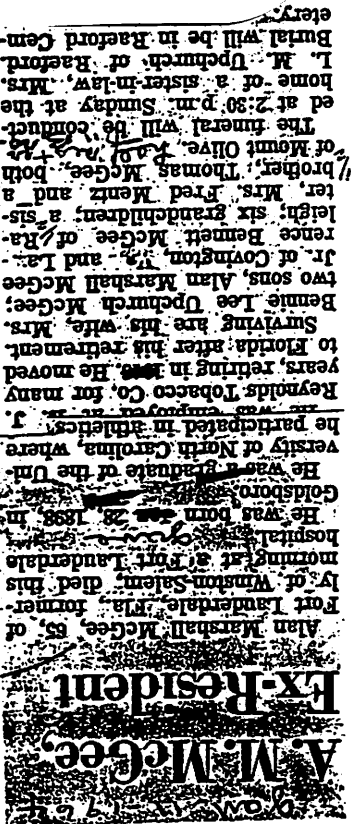

Barnetta McGhee White, Ph.D., NCC, is a retired University Professor with many awards in the field of Education. Born in Oxford, NC, prepared at Mary Potter Academy, she was formally educated at West Virginia State College, Columbia University, University of Texas at El Paso, University of Colorado at Colorado Springs, culminating with the Ph.D. Degree in Counseling and Guidance from Atlanta University in Atlanta, Georgia. She also spent a post-doctoral summer at the Harvard Graduate School studying developmental psychology. She taught at Auburn University at Montgomery, Alabama, before returning to North Carolina to teach at NCCU. This move led her to a hobby which rapidly became an absorbing avocation; that of locating, translating, transcribing/abstracting original legal documents, primarily from the 19th century, which relate to the African American experience in North Carolina.

She has appeared on television and spoken on radio, in public schools, and in libraries. Her other publications include: In Search of Kith and Kin: The History of a Southern Black Family, Baltimore: Gateway Press (out of print but available at most libraries), a three (3) volume reference work destined to become the standard reference work for African American genealogical research in NC, Somebody Knows My Name: Marriages of Freed People in North Carolina, County by County available from Iberian Publishers in Athens, Georgia, journal article in the Western Journal of Black Studies and a chapter in a book edited by Robert Staple, "The paper trail: An historical exploration of the Black family"

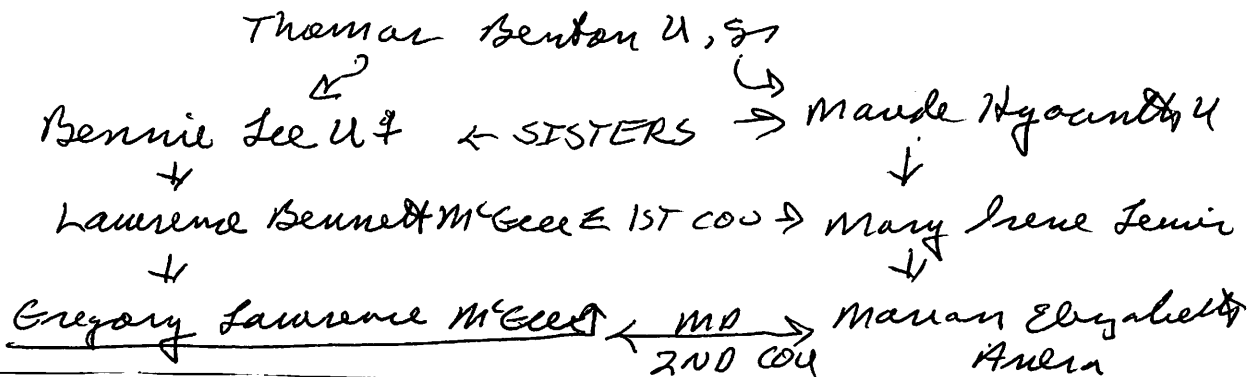

'Bleeding' a little for Uncle Sam in WW II

CONGRATULATIONS to Greg McGee upon receiving his Eagle Scout Award from the troop at Benson Memorial United Methodist Church; and to Dr. Fred R. Tarver, Jr., who was recently appointed District Commissioner for the Baden-Powell District, Occoneechee Council.

"World War II veterans must be on the list of endangered species," I said as I hung up the phone Sunday afternoon last.

"Why's that?" my wife asked.
"That's the second call in five minutes asking for an interview with me on World War II."

I was to soon learn my sudden popularity as an expert on that war of wars was due to an assignment by an enterprising teacher at Carnage Junior High.

Within the half hour, two young men, Greg McGee and Mac Sitton, were sitting in the den, plying me with questions about not only my exploits in World War II, but also my attitude toward that war — any war — and, for the icing, did I think the atom bomb should have been dropped on Japan?

"At the time, oh, did I!" I answered. And speaking from that emotional Pearl Harbor time of 35 years ago, the draft was right! The bomb was right! And war was right!

As the interview neared conclusion, I detected an "Is that all?" expression on the boys' faces and was conscious that now, 30 years later, the excitement and drama so real then, were almost burned out. Certainly my epic was no "From Here to Eternity." After all, as a member of an air transport squadron dropping food and paratroopers, we seemed always at the edge of battle, never in the center of it. In fact, our outfit was dubbed "Biscuit Bombers."

I felt I owed my two young guests something more. I gave one

each represented when the Army was sending men home from overseas on the "point system" priority.

"Daddy, is that the suit you wore to fight in?" my 8-year-old asked, looking up from the 500-piece puzzle she was working on the coffee table.

"This is what I wore in the Air Force," I answered, carefully evading the question.

"Well I don't see any blood on it," she said, half accusingly.

"Well no," I countered, becoming impatient with her persistent probing, "not everybody was killed or even wounded."

"You mean you didn't even bleed during the whole war?"

"I guess not," I answered lamely. I could not explain to her that in war, everybody bleeds some — but not necessarily from flying shrapnel, a bullet wound or bomb bursting in air.

Frightened fresh-faced kids from farm and town smiled wanly through those bus-station goodbyes and later, thousands of miles from home, endured that awful loneliness that comes with the last lingering note of taps losing itself in the night over a boot camp barracks. Overseas, they bled, if not from battle, from the sameness of the days that blended into months and years, broken only by the tragedy of a letter from home saying somebody special had gotten married or somebody close had died. And then there would be those days when a buddy, still another one, would be lowered into a palm-shaded, sandy grave on a tiny island lost in the enormous Pacific.

Bleeding? In a way, yes.

Dear Kathy,

It was great to talk to you by phone on 25 JUL 1994 as a follow-up to your letter to Mr. Norgaard of CA which she had in turn forwarded to me it having arrived in my hands on 18 JUL 1994. I am delighted to have you as a correspondent since we have few contacts relating to your section of the Uppshurck Family. Details on the Uppshurck Bulletin (U.B.) are enclosed.

As I indicated, your records and mine do not agree in all respects. Let's proceed to look at my records and to make corrections either in your records or mine as information dictates.

I think it is clear you and I are both descended from Richard U, II who arrived in what is today Franklin Co, NC in 1755. He was the Grandgrandson of Michael U, I, the original Uppshurck Immigrant who came to America from Little Gidding in England about 1649.

Richard II, II had several children including my GGF Nathan II, I and Charles II, whom I believe to be your ancestors. We are lacking hard evidence on the children of Charles II but circumstantial evidence supports and I have long accepted the concept that he had at least four children as follows:

Thomas Gay II, Sr

Keaton II

Eaton II

Charity II

Charles II and his four adult children moved from NC to GA about 1820 \pm 5 years. I have a huge amount of detail on Thomas Gay II, Sr & his descendants and a fair amount on Charity and her descendants (she had 3 children all of whom appeared to be illegitimate). Much less is available on Keaton & Eaton. Eaton had a son Henderson II for whom I enclose my single Master outline sheet. Note that Henderson has a son Calvin II b ca 1839. You propose this Calvin as your ancestor but I do not think so. I believe your Calvin II ancestor to be Calvin II b 1845, the son of Keaton II. Enclosed in my entire Master outline on the Charles II/Keaton II subplan including 7 continuation sections. Please study these records and let me

know what you think. Also please note that you and I have since of certain names assigned to different husbands. On some of my listings I have substantiated backup information - but not on all.

It is my hope that you have already accumulated information which will allow us to upgrade the enclosed Mart's outline sheets. Anything you can supply will be appreciated. I have enclosed a list of questions on your immediate family.

You seem to be hooked up well to electronic communications. I am not and so rely on old fashioned methods. However, we are getting ready to return this fall and move to Missouri.

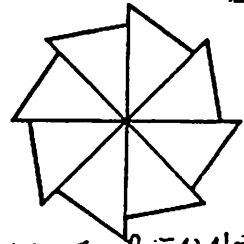

In an effort to speed up the use of North Carolina wood for industrial fuel, Governor Jim Hunt today announced the establishment of a Wood Energy program for North Carolina. → A

The program will be directed by Larry McGee, long-time state employee, within the Department of Natural Resources and Community Development. A coordinating group of state and university representatives will oversee the program.

Early estimates are that 24 million barrels of oil could be replaced annually by using wood energy without depleting the state's commercial forestry base. Twenty-four million barrels of oil represent seven percent of our state's annual primary consumption.

Economic benefits to the state could approach \$200 million dollars annually, including the employment of 5,000 additional loggers. There are presently 3,000 loggers in the state.

At current prices, the operation of a 600 horsepower boiler with wood as fuel, rather than oil or natural gas, could save the operator \$150,000 annually. Wood can produce the same amount of heat as oil or natural gas at approximately half the price.

The first job will be to pick a site for a pilot program using North Carolina timber as a fuel source for either institutional or industrial fuel. Western North Carolina University has expressed an interest in being the site.

The idea to better utilize North Carolina's trees for fuel arose in part from efforts of the N. C. Forestry Division to develop a market for low grade trees on the state's 20 million acres of commercial forests.

About one third of North Carolina's commercial forestland contains nothing currently of market value and almost 2 percent of the state's commercial forests are reverting annually to less desirable species.

Twenty of the state's 100 counties have no market for pulpwood, and at least half of the counties have a very limited market.

In addition, the poorer grade trees are choking much of the forest lands and preventing good growth of higher quality trees.

McGee previously was assistant director for industrial development in the Department of Commerce. He has held various positions in the industrial development area in state government for the past 15 years.

He was an engineer in the industrial extension service at North Carolina State University from 1955-1962. He was graduated from NCSU with a B.Ch.E.

Wood urged for energy needs

North Carolina forests produce enough wood each year to meet the state's commercial and industrial energy needs, a legislative commission studying gasohol and its applications was told Friday.

A → Larry McGee of the Forest Resources Division of the state Department of Natural Resources and Community Development said the use of forest products for energy by businesses and factories would free 30 million barrels of oil each year for automotive use.

McGee said that would represent about 50 percent of the imported oil used annually in North Carolina.

The discussion by the commission and those appearing before it did not focus

on the capital cost of converting existing oil-fired equipment to wood use.

Sen. James B. Garrison, D-Stanly, the commission's co-chairman, said the development of gasohol, a 90 percent-10 percent gasoline-alcohol combination that can stretch existing fuel supplies, would be vital to North Carolina in the energy-short 1980's.

"I think this thing's really going to amount to something," he said. "Some large companies are wanting to come in."

"I think we can interest people in North Carolina in distilling alcohol and it can make a difference in energy in this state. With the way oil companies are cutting back, something's got to be done," the Albemarle oil distributor said.

Garrison, along with state Board of Alcoholic Control officials, cautioned that it could lead to a resurgence of illegal distilleries under the cover of producing alcohol for energy uses.

"Of course, if the truth were known, some people are anxious to get this going to get back into the liquor business," Garrison said. "It's going to be enough of a problem if they start setting up these small stills."

He said that "what we're talking about (for addition to gasoline) isn't much different from white liquor."

Other speakers before the commission covered topics including the availability of alcohol-producing farm products, taxation of gasohol, and small-scale production facilities.

Gov. James B. Hunt Jr. recently announced the creation of a state wood energy program within the N.C. Department of Natural Resources and Community Development to use more of the state's forests for industrial fuel.

Lawrence B. McGee, wood energy program coordinator, said there was no current shortage of firewood because of numerous firewood sellers in the area.

But McGee said the wood energy program concept would concentrate on regional wood and special lots to prepare wood for industrial use, and as a result there would be even more residential firewood in the future.

N.C. looks to wood for energy

Plans are being made to use wood, the one energy source North Carolina has plenty of, as an industrial fuel.

A → Larry McGee of the state Forestry Resources Division says the use of wood as an industrial fuel could actually prevent wood shortages, reduce unemployment and halt waste of wood.

Gov. James B. Hunt Jr. recently announced a pilot project to demonstrate how low-grade trees can be used as a substitute for dwindling coal, gas and oil supplies.

Meanwhile, some local officials in western counties poohpoohed a proposal of the Center for Improving Mountain Living at Western Carolina University for \$66,667 in federal and state grants to finance a study of wood as an alternate energy source.

A Raeford man won a \$200 award for the best spraying and distribution pattern at the N. C. Agricultural Aviation Association's (NCAA) Spring Fly-In last Saturday.

A → Larry Upchurch was awarded the prize after he came the closest to spraying a perfect pattern at the Laurinburg - Maxton Airport. Competitors sprayed a pattern laid out for them by the NCAA.

The NCAA represents about 100 agricultural pilots who spray by air. It includes industrial members that supply spraying equipment.

Upchurch, a Raeford native, is married and has two children.

Upchurch, a local cropduster, attributed his win to the performance of his airplane, a 1978 Cessna Agtruk.

Program aims to hike use of wood for fuel

Gov. James B. Hunt Jr. announced Monday the creation of a state wood energy program to increase the use of the state's forests for industrial fuel.

Hunt announced that Larry McGee, a longtime state employe, will direct the new program within the Department of Natural Resources and Community Development.

The department estimated that 24 million barrels of oil or about 7 percent of the state's primary oil consumption could be saved annually by using wood energy without harming the state's forestry base.

It said economic benefits to the state could total \$200 million annually, including the employment of 7,000 additional loggers. Presently there are 3,000 loggers in the state.

Wood burner Dix may convert to man's oldest form of fuel

Dorothea Dix Hospital hopes to heat with wood next winter.

But it won't be an old pot-bellied stove that will keep the hospital warm.

Some state officials want to spend about a half-million dollars to install a wood-burning boiler.

If so, it would become the only major facility in the state heated by man's oldest fuel.

The West Raleigh mental hospital now heats with oil, a source of energy that is far more expensive than wood.

Heating with wood could save the state up to \$128,000 a year, Larry McGee, forest

resources agent at the Department of Natural Resources, said Friday.

"The advantage is that burning wood fuel costs half as much on a per unit energy basis," McGee said.

Buying at bulk rates, the state purchases heating oil for 35 cents per gallon. McGee said wood is available for \$10 per ton delivered — and even less for sawdust residue.

Dix is one of three candidates for the conversion to wood. Also considered are John Umstead Hospital and Murdoch Center.

Dix is considered the top priority because only two of the hospital's three oil-burning boilers are operational.

Demolition of the old boiler, electrical

modifications, design, construction and installation of a new boiler would cost between \$500,000 and \$700,000 and would take about five months to complete.

"We're just waiting to get it off the ground," said John Emerson, who is in charge of state construction for the N.C. Department of Administration. Emerson said the next step will be to request the state to appropriate funds for the conversion.

"It looks like a very viable and feasible project that would save the state energy and money in operations," he said.

Unlike coal and oil, McGee sees no shortage or escalating prices in the near future for wood.

"Twenty million tons of pulpwood, saw timber, veneer timber and finished products are coming out of our woods now every year," McGee said. "But we have an additional 20 to 40 million tons that should be removed."

McGee is even more delighted with the prospect which the project holds for foresters.

"For years we've logged the high grade material, leaving the dead, culled, low-grade and undesirable wood. Soft timber and veneer are choked out by this low-grade hardwood residue. From a forestry management standpoint, we need to get

we need to get these moved out.

"It use to cost private landowners \$50 to \$100 an acre to clear off the lowgrade material in order to plant. Whereas now they can come in, chip it up for fuel and generate revenue from it."

As an example, McGee said a Salisbury forester recently received \$60 an acre from such a project on land that previously cost him \$80 to clear.

McGee said a pelletizing plant, which breaks down sawdust and wood residue, converting it to dried, uniform pellets of refined fuel the size of pencil erasers is to be built in Goldston.

He said he knew of an Oregon hospital which currently used the pellets as fuel, and that a similar project is underway in New York utilizing wood as fuel.

"I think you'll see a great interest in this in the near future — foresters are ecstatic over the possibilities," McGee said.

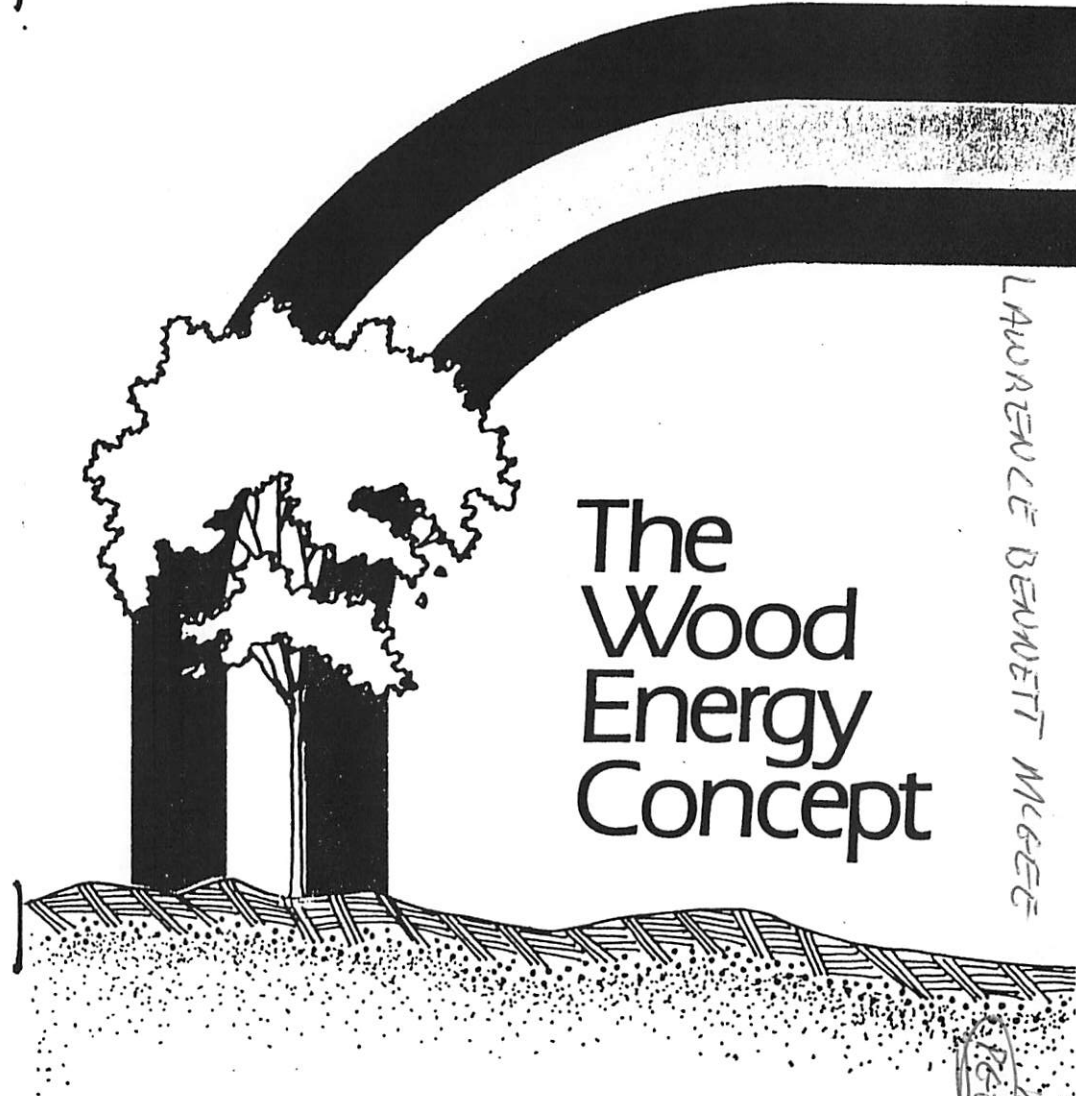

Current Development

Four North Carolina brick plants currently use wood fuel. At least two other plants are planning conversions. The average brick plant in North Carolina will consume 39,000 tons of green wood annually for fuel, replacing over 50,000 barrels of oil. If all brick plants in the state convert, they will consume 1.4 million tons per year of fiber, supplanting 1.8 million barrels of oil.

Three state institutions in Raleigh are being engineered for wood systems. A special legislative appropriation was made for Dorothea Dix Hospital. For Governor Morehead School, a pellet-fueled gasifier is planned. These facilities will consume over 20,000 green tons equivalent annually. The North Carolina State School of Veterinary Medicine will have an incinerator to generate recoverable heat from campus waste and wood. In addition, wood-fired energy systems are being designed for new state prison facilities in Greene and Montgomery counties. Each of these systems will use about 700 tons of wood pellets per year.

Two textile plants in North Carolina are already combusting wood fuels, and others are evaluating or designing wood systems to replace fossil fuels. Test burns with pellets have been conducted in plants of a number of textile companies.

A commercial wood gasifier is planned for a textile factory in eastern North Carolina. This should be operational during 1980 and will consume over three green tons per hour. The Energy Institute is partially supporting this conversion.

A Pullman-Woodex wood pelletizing plant is in operation at Goldston in Chatham County. Additional wood pellet plants are planned by Guaranty Fuels for Cleveland in Rowan County, and George in Northampton County. Typical pellet plants will purchase almost 200,000 green tons per year each and produce fuel equivalent to about 250,000 barrels of oil.

Wood pellets are successfully replacing coal in a small boiler at Vandora Springs School in Wake County. Greater efficiencies and ease of maintenance seem to have resulted from burning this cleaner fuel, but extended tests and documentation are planned.

While an accurate inventory of wood energy users has not been available because of limitations of data bases, an estimated 160 industrial and commercial installations are operating on wood energy in North Carolina. Most of these are in wood products and pulp and paper plants. Over the past year, however, there have been many inquiries leading to evaluations of feasibility for conversion. A number of conversions appear imminent.

A phenomenal increase in residential wood heating has occurred. Though some central systems have been installed, most activity appears to be in supplemental heating equipment such as wood stoves and fireplace inserts and accessories. While the total residential market for space heat is almost as large as the industrial market for process steam and direct heat, there are certain important differences.

1. Residential combustion equipment is smaller and less efficient.
2. Air quality is more difficult to control.
3. Safe installation, maintenance and operation are difficult to assure.
4. Procurement of fuelwood is more random and less subject to supervision for proper forest management techniques.

Milestones

A number of factors contributed to the development of North Carolina's wood energy program. Among them are:

1. The tremendous support generated by N. C. State's Agricultural Extension Service and School of Forest Resources.
2. The prime recommendation of the Governor's Advisory Task Force on Small Woodlot Management - 1978 - to emphasize wood fuel markets.
3. The agreement by the North Carolina Energy Institute and the Policy Research Alternatives Symposium on N. C.'s Energy Future that an expansion of woody biomass energy is among the most promising for technological impact in the near term, and the institute's financial support for wood energy projects.
4. The Governor's stance of evaluating wood for energy as a first priority for new state systems.
5. The increasing uncertainty of price and supply of fossil fuels.
6. The financial support from non-state agencies. In particular, the Appalachian Regional Commission, the Department of Energy and the U. S. Forest Service have made significant grants.

Use of low-grade forest fiber from North Carolina's 19.5 million acres of commercial forests can provide a significant source of renewable energy and important economic benefits for the state.

Perhaps seven percent of the state's annual energy consumption can be replaced by using low grade forest fiber presently being wasted as logging residue or standing in the forest preventing reforestation and optimum growth of marketable timber.

Additional employment opportunities for loggers and others in the forest or wood industry, increased revenues for landowners because of additional fiber yields and reduction of energy costs would be among the important economic benefits.

At the same time we must assure that these new uses will be beneficial to the overall quality of our forests and environment. Consequently, Governor James B. Hunt Jr. has initiated a program to develop this fiber for energy.

In late 1977, the Wood Energy Coordinating Group was established to develop useful projects in public awareness, education, research, demonstration and technical assistance across North Carolina. The group has been composed of the state forester, the state energy director, the state construction officer and the vice president of research and public service programs of the University of North Carolina. The chairman is the deputy secretary of the department of Natural Resources and Community Development. There is also a staff coordinator.

The work of the group in conjunction with welcome leadership from the private sector has helped accommodate the rising interest in alternate energy sources. North Carolina's large brick industry is rapidly converting to wood, and several wood fuel processors are investing in the state. Aggressive marketing efforts from these interests as well as equipment suppliers are reinforcing the public awareness and educational efforts at N. C. State's Extension Wood Products. Several research and planning projects started last year are beginning to furnish guidance in areas of resource protection and to document technical and economic considerations of harvesting, delivery and combustion. Some specific projects are listed on the back page.

Staff Observations

Our work over the past two years has generated much data and many observations. While some of the following statements are subjective, it may be useful to include them.

The resource - Energy conservation on an overall basis includes the use of wood in conventional products to replace many energy-intensive items which are being made of plastics or metals.

North Carolina has total wood energy potential from unusable forest resources of at least 30 million green tons annually. Under current technical and economic constraints, if markets are developed it should be feasible to procure 16 million green tons annually. This could be an intermediate-term goal and should increase with increasing productivity of our forests.

The estimated four million green tons of mill residues that are produced annually are not included above. The uncommitted portion of this material is attracting the attention of potential buyers of wood fuel, but may now be less than one million tons.

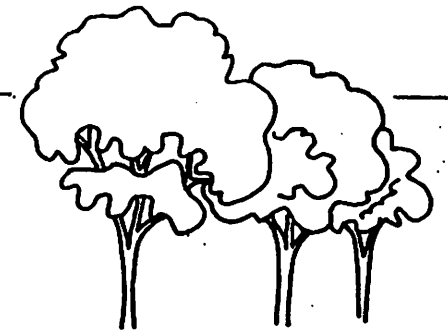
Processing - While wood densification (pelletizing) still seems to have some "debugging" to go through, it is attracting the attention of many potential investors. The most serious question appears to be, "When the mill residue feedstock rises in price or when whole-tree chips are used, will the pellet product still compete with fossil fuels?"

Conversion - Wood gasification is a developing technology with much potential for economic retrofit to existing oil and gas systems.

Residential wood combustion - The annual residential market for fuels (less electricity) is 122 trillion BTU or 15 million green tons of wood equivalent. However, the inefficiencies of wood stoves and fireplaces would dictate a much larger wood requirement. Other problems with residential wood energy include air quality degradation in some areas and unsafe installation, maintenance and operation.

Small scale wood-fired power plants are reasonable to fuel from a resource point of view. A 10 MW plant would require 145,000 tons per year. This amount of wood is only about 10 per cent of that required for an energy self-sufficient pulp mill of 500 tons per day capacity. Economics of such plants may become favorable at some future time. If so, they can create new markets where they are needed.

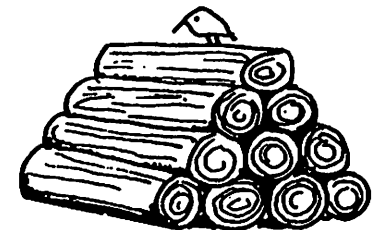
The greatest need in effectively creating wood energy markets is technical assistance in the fields of combustion and materials handling for would-be users.



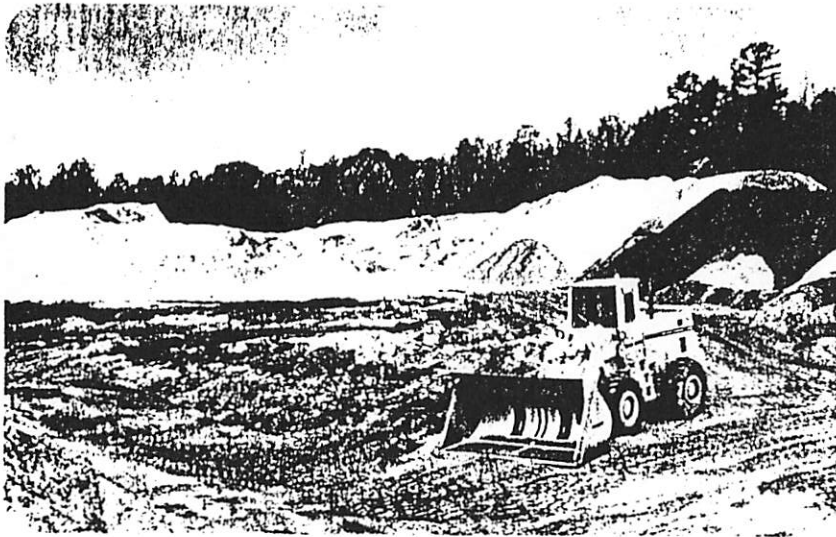
Looking Ahead

Increased interest in coal, peat, municipal wastes and agricultural residues focuses attention on systems which can also make use of wood. The materials handling, procurement, transportation and combustion or conversion equipment often are as suitable for wood as for these other energy sources. Further, wood could become an economically viable feedstock for the large scale production of alcohol for gasohol in addition to fuel for electricity production.

The proposed North Carolina Alternative Energy Corporation offers additional possibilities for further wood energy development. The U. S. Department of Energy is also preparing to administer very large programs leading to alternative fuel production. For example, Public Law 96-126 sets aside \$100 million for feasibility studies dealing with fuels such as biomass, peat, waste and unconventional gas. Another \$100 million will be available to support commercial scale development. As details on these and other programs unfold, opportunities will arise.

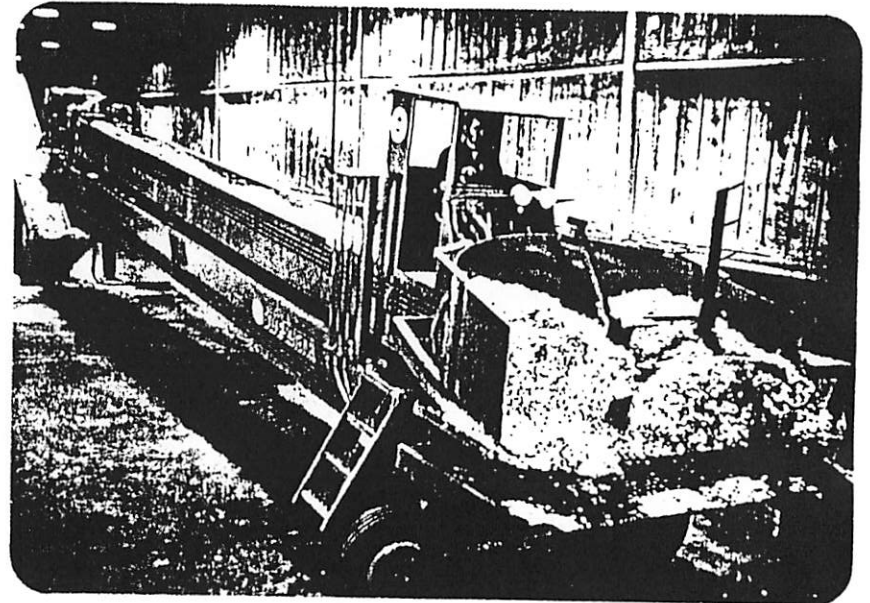


6 Some wood fuels can be stored in the open, while others need to be enclosed or covered.

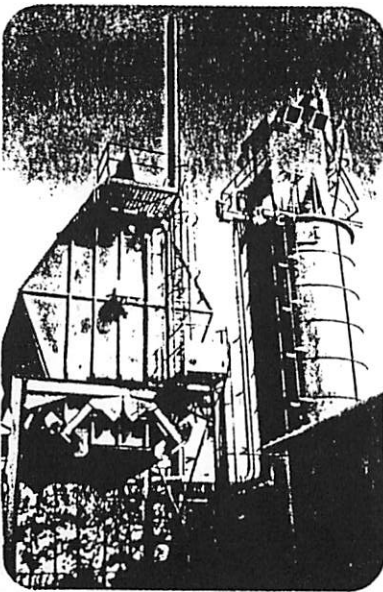


Open storage

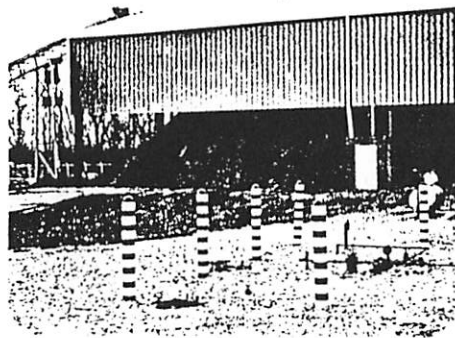
7 Materials handling equipment ranges from front-end loaders to sophisticated conveyors.



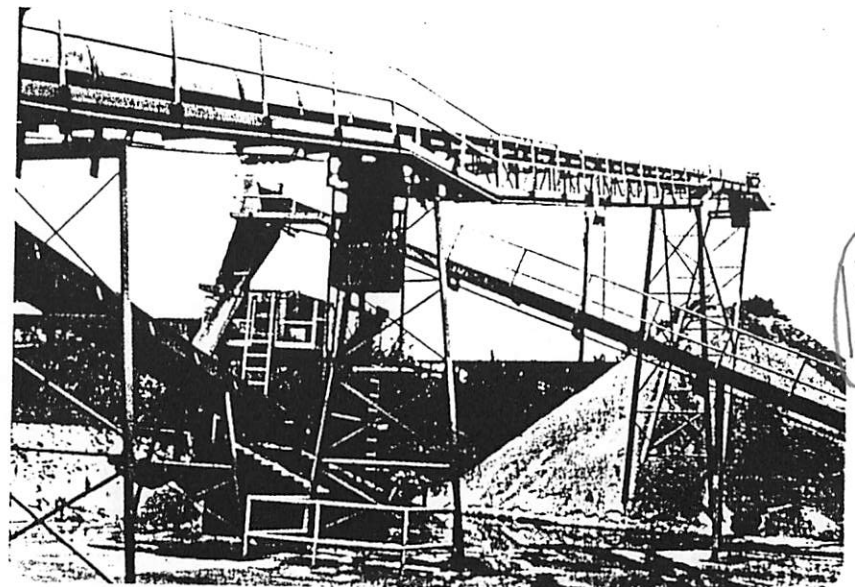

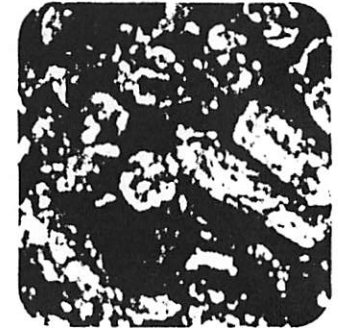

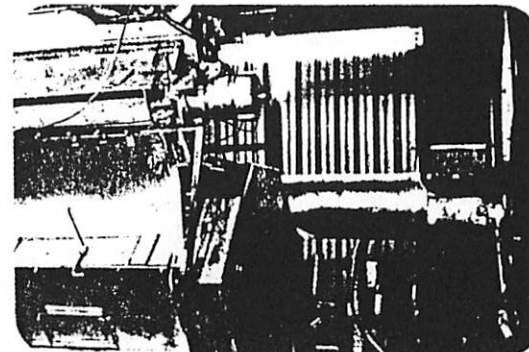

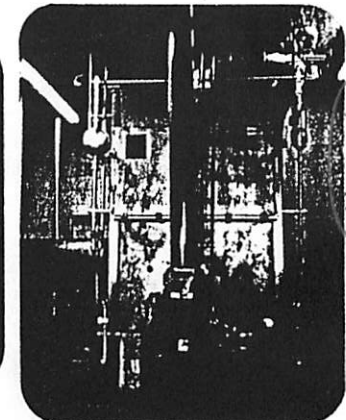

for wood fuel use

Dorothea Dix Hospital in Raleigh is one of three sites being considered by the state to test wood as a source of energy in large industries.

The plan is an outgrowth of a proposal made by a five-member wood energy coordinating group appointed by Gov. James B. Hunt Jr. in October.

John B. Umstead Hospital and Murdoch Center, both in Butner, are also being considered. Dorothea Dix is considered the top priority because the hospital needs a new boiler, according to Lawrence B. McGee, forest resources agent of the Department of Natural Resources and Community Development and coordinator of the wood energy group. Dorothea Dix now heats with oil.

McGee said in a telephone interview Saturday that the conversion to wood could save the state over \$100,000 a year by reducing fuel costs at the hospital by 50 percent.

The plan could be approved by the Advisory Budget Commission as early as mid-August, McGee said. But the new boiler would not be operational until some time in the spring, he said.

"Foresters are ecstatic that they can take out low-grade wood for boiling fuel," McGee said of the plan, which would involve cutting trees with no commercial value into chips and sawdust for boiler use.

The state is "not proposing to denude the forests, but is trying to get trees with no commercial value out of the way," said Ralph C. Winkworth, director of forest resources for the natural resources department. "We can then replant with high-grade lumber such as pine.

"There's a limit to it, of course — 20 years from now the wood might not be any benefit to us," Winkworth said. But, he said, "by that time we should have different sources of energy from which to choose."

Both Winkworth and McGee said rising oil prices have made the old-time practice of using wood for fuel a necessity.

Other than furniture industries, which often use wood residue as a source of energy, Dorothea Dix Hospital, if selected, would be one of only a few industries in the state that have converted to wood for energy use, Winkworth said.

But that might change soon, McGee said. He said, "there is a lot of interest in burning wood in the U.S. Department of Energy and it will continue to increase."

McGee said he has already had bids from foresters in Smithfield and Roanoke Rapids to supply Dorothea Dix with wood but said he would prefer tapping local woodlands.

"We have a lot of wood available to us right here. When we make clearings for the B. Everett Jordan Reservoir, there's wood we have nothing to do with," he said.
