Discussed with Monk the prospects of holding a meeting to discuss Project on developing a history of Ahamhatter & Swift Creek Township, Wake Co, NC. He thinks I should check with Rebecca Loye at Mill Park to get her ideas.

Re Uncle Mois' land Monk says it was about 2005 when Joseph Sr Jr sold the land to N.C. State Univ for about \$3 million. In earlier years Joseph ran cattle on the area. He lived in Raleigh but would come out often and Monk knew him.

Monk & I dismissed the fact that there were at least two tenant houses on the B. G. U land on Mid Pine Road. This led us to discuss the prospect that Uncle Miss could have been the father of the mulatto WOODROW ATWATER who died probably in the 1970's Monk knew Woodrow and half jokingly called him "Cousin". Both Monk & I remember Woodrow as a tall, light skinned man with a neat mustache.

Based on Monk & RPU comparing notes by phone on 3 FEB 2006 there is no question but that Woodrow in the mulatto I remember seeing at our old place about 1940 when he came to see a black lady who lived there. He was a handsome looking man. Monk said Uncle Getty teased Uncle Miss telling him to buy clothes for his "son". Uncle Miss protested. Still my memory is that it was said Uncle Miss had a child by a black woman.

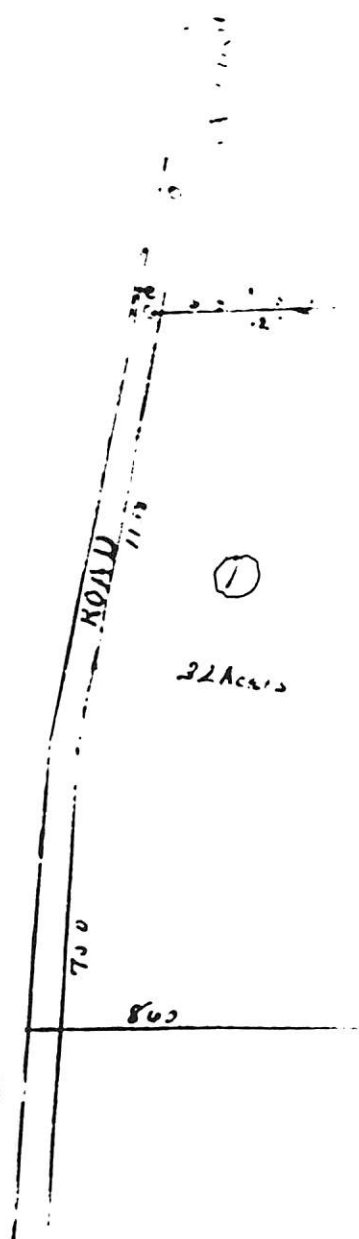

In 1955 Frances Helt & family paid under <sup>△</sup>Getter \$500 for land. What did he do with it.

FA remembers the roof on the <sup>△</sup>BSU home leaked badly. They replaced only some parts of the roof.

At one point <sup>△</sup>Helt Tilly offered to build a house for Aunt Maude, etc in exchange for the BSU home plan. Uncle Getter blocked this.

FA and I discussed in some detail possible reasons the 6 unnamed children of BSU lived in their father's name and let it fall down. We could come up with no satisfactory reason. Of course the Depression was a problem, I don't think we had good opportunities to make money etc, etc. Ma Perry (Aunt Bessy) said Getter, <sup>△</sup>Wick & <sup>△</sup>Malross were lazy. That is a good bet for Getter but <sup>△</sup>Wick did have a garden, hogs, chickens & helped with groceries - worked at Golf course & at Yates Chicken Farm. - <sup>△</sup>Wick just did not earn much. We agree <sup>△</sup>Frank Jr took advantage of the situation but while his children benefitted they should not be made to feel guilty.
