Heavis received more votes than either of the other two. In fact Heavis was hardly in the race. Heavis received all the votes polled in Rutherford County less one hundred and sixty five, and ~~four states~~ all but four votes in Polk County. Heavis received seven more votes all told than Hogan.

We met in convention in the city of Raleigh and formed a new constitution, and submitted it to the people, and it was voted down. And another convention was held later in 186 and formed a constitution that was adopted.

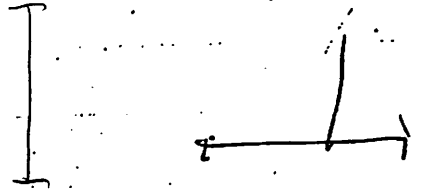

Major or Captain Francis Logan is buried in the old family cemetery three miles west of Logan Station and four miles north west of Rutherfordton.

The inscription on his tombstone reads; 'In memory of Francis Logan who was born in New York in the year 1734 - Departed this life in the year 1826 - aged 92 years'

Capt. Francis Logan born in <sup>Charleston S.C.</sup> New York in 1734 - ~~moved to Virginia~~ <sup>to</sup> North Carolina - then to Berkeley County, Fayette Carolina, served as private and Captain through the Revolutionary war.

After Independence he removed to Rutherford County and settled on Second Broad River where he lived until his death in 1826 - aged 92. Married Hannah Trebble of Virginia 1770.

Martina Hartau (or Hartou) wife of John Logan was the daughter of Howell Hartau a Revolutionary soldier who lost a leg at the battle of Guilford Court House and drew a disability pension in North Carolina.

Col Harris with his regiment was ordered  
 on various kinds of duty and he was  
 called on to furnish volunteers for the  
 army and where failed to volunteer he had  
 to resort to draft. The men so recruited were  
 sent either to headquarters at Raleigh, N. C.  
 or to Camp Vance near Morgantown, N. C.  
 (Morgantown).

The only equipment furnished Col. Harris'  
 regiment were old muskets - powder & cap  
 and rations only part of the time. The  
 regiment was ordered to defend Asheville  
 on several occasions.

Much time was spent hunting deserters.  
 Col. Harris and regiment were sent to Polk  
 County, N. C. in 1865 to put down lawlessness  
 there. The regiment was later moved to  
 Rutherfordton, N. C. where it remained  
 until the close of the war. over

This information was found in a book of family history written by Col. Harris. I believe for his grand daughter Margaret Harris Crocker in 1915.

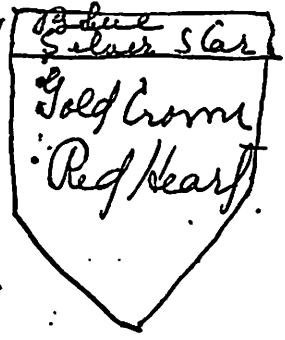
