

Hi David ---

Thanks for your three emails on last Sunday. All have been preserved in your Biofile and I am updating my Master Outline with any information that was new. There are a number of things on which we can return to and collaborate but right now I want to have some exchanges on your trip to England.

It is amusing to go to the village of Upchurch in Kent but it is a fact that there has never been known that a person named Upchurch ever lived there. Upchurch visitors to England often go there thinking this is the mother lode for Upchurch. This is not

so. There is a history of Upchurch pottery made there (in two eras ) but that is another story. I first visited in 1964.

You will not find Cemeteries with Upchurches linked to our branch of the Upchurch family. Also, pursuit of look alike names such as Achurch is not likely to be productive. The key that links our ancestor Michael Upchurch, I to England are the four letters he wrote back to England in the1650's. This story has been well told in the issues of the Upchurch Bulletin and I hope you will go there for this story. It is convoluted as it was first thought he came from Little Gidding but not so. He came from Brington. We still have a connection of sorts with both Little Gidding and Brington and a visit to both will be informative especially after you have studied articles in the Upchurch bulletin. Little Gidding is happy to have visitors and they have an Upchurch Room there. I suggest you attend church at Brington if you can be there on a Sunday. Do you have a desire to see the four letters preserved at Cambridge University? It might or might not be possible.

Our Upchurch heritage in England has been researched in detail by Professor Ransome whom we hired over a twenty year

period. See reports in the Upchurch Bulletin all issues of which are on our website.

As we exchange more perhaps your plans for going to England will mature. Then there are other aspects to consider. In preparation for more exchanges I hope you will study our two websites regarding our records for the Richard Upchurch, III enrolled family to which you belong. There is much more we need to do on it and we can use any help you can provide.
