



Many thanks for your letter of 19 JUL 00 and for the copy of the 1869 Kearney U letter. This is a valuable historical document not only for the Upchurch Family but also for the history of the Civil War period.

I have taken several steps in processing the letter. First I reduced the page by 5% so as to get it on 8 1/2" x 11" sheets (now it will be easy to send copies to others); next I made a transcription in my own hand (copy enclosed) to make sure I understood each word and to provide a "working copy", next I made an extract (copy enclosed). Then I placed a copy of the extract in my Profile system for each name mentioned. Several of these individuals already had Profile sheets in the system from previous extracts of this sort. Along the way I compared all

all of the names mentioned with comparable entries found in the history book for Wake Co, NC (Wake-Capital County of NC by Elizabeth Reid Munnay). Most of the names in Kearney's letter were found in the History Book as these individuals were quite active in the county in one way or another. Everything seems to fit together nicely.

I have made a note to report on the essence of this letter in a future issue of the U B. I don't know if I would have space to reprint the entire letter - but if I did would you have any objections?

Do you know if a copy of this letter resides in any of the historical depositories in NC - such as the State Archives or the Wake County Family Center? It would certainly be in order to make sure a copy is in one of these places.

I take it your son has the original of this letter. Can you tell me where the original resided in the early years of





from Richard U, III and I am descended from Nathan U, I. Nathan U, I (my GGGF) married there & started his family but left about 1802 and moved to the western part of Wake Co, NC. Your ancestor Richard U, III lived & died in the area in 1817. A map of his land holdings at his death has been published in the U.B. Richard U, III had 8 children of whom your ancestor is one - namely James U, III. It seems that James U, III bought some or all of the shares of land he and his siblings inherited from their father. In due course James U, III passed some or all of this land along to his son Kearney U, your ancestor and for whom you are named. Sometime about 1830 Kearney U moved to the Crossroads District of Wake Co, NC. I have always wondered why he moved. I suspect it is because he wife people lived in the Crossroads District. Perhaps you know. In any case Kearney U seemed to hold on to his Franklin Co, NC land for many years after he moved

The given name "KEARNEY" appears in the family of Richard U, II several times. This causes one to suspect that there was an Upchurch-Kearney marriage in the 1700's but I have no evidence of this. There were Kearney Families in the Moccasin Creek Area in the 1700's. I've got a few details on this I can send if you are interested.

I enclosed in a copy of my 14 Page 37 Item Profile on Kearney U. This is raw material and I keep adding to it without stopping to refine or interpret. Some of the items duplicate others. Still, a lot of the story of Kearney U became clear from this Profile. Perhaps you would read over this and let me know if you have questions or anything to add. Could you let me have a copy of the letter you have that Kearney wrote?

I am looking forward to getting my letters into this Richard U, II Project and will be grateful for participation by you & others.
