

"For love and affection I bear my children and one dollar all right, title, interest to land on which I now live lying on waters of Fall Creek which was allotted to me in the division between myself, my brother Thomas, and my brother Silas. . . .

This record clearly established the family relationships and proves that Ariadne was the mother of John Richard Cross and that Silas was his uncle. It also shows that Ariadne inherited the land on Fall Creek, not far from the Cross cemetery, through a land division.

Silas Cross to Ariadne Cross

November 30, 1850

"For natural love and affection for my sister all my part of land received from my grandmother Rachel Cross" along with personal property.

This not only establishes Silas and Ariadne as grandchildren of William and Rachel but indicates that the land came from Rachel's estate. However, William had directed in his will that his land was to go to son Thomas after Rachel's death. Later evidence, which will be listed, indicates that son Thomas died before his mother, thus leaving the property to be divided among her grandchildren.

The logical interpretation of this material, combined with what you have accumulated from local tradition, is that the land on Fall Creek belonged to William Cross who left his wife, Rachel, a life estate in the property. It was to go to his son, Thomas [not to be confused with Thomas L., son of Richard and brother of Silas], but this Thomas died before his mother. At least some of the Fall Creek land then went to Ariadne, Silas, and Thomas L., children of Richard and grandchildren of William and Rachel. Ariadne acquired all the land and had a home there. She seems to have married a Richard Cross, son of Thomas and a cousin, who died in late 1859 or early 1860. In the latter year, Ariadne gave the property to her three children: Anne Rebecca (Becky), John Richard, and Nicholas. John Richard later married Louvenia Cross, his first cousin, and apparently made his home on the property about where the Cross Cemetery is now.

Wake County Deed Book 21, p. 183

Thomas L. Cross to Arey A. Cross

March 13, 1856

For \$75, "...all right title and interest to the land on waters of Fall Creek... Being one-third of whole."

This deed clearly shows that the property on Fall Creek, on which Ariadne and her children lived, had been the property of William and Rachel Cross and had passed to the children of Richard Cross, son of William, after Rachel's death sometime before 1856. By 1860, Ariadne had consolidated all the property.

Wake County Land Entries, 1178-1846

p. 520 [#109 in land book] Warrant issued October 7, 1844

To Richard Cross 100 acres vacant land adjoining lands of George Cain and Richard Cross heirs.

I believe that the clerk confused the heirs and placed Richard's name when it should have been Thomas. This would be a correction to my Cross Ties reference to this transfer. Richard, son of William, was still alive in 1850, and the Richard whom I believed married Ariadne (see previous e-mail) was not active until the 1850s.



After some delay, I finally returned to the search for the elusive John Richard Cross. Guess what? I found his mother! She was Ariadna (aka Ariandna, Andriana, Arey, and Adda) Cross, daughter of Richard Cross and Rebecca Brown. That means she was also Silas Cross's sister. Proof without doubt can be found in Wake County Deed Book 23, p. 206 and Deed Book 19, p. 52. John Richard had an older sister, Anne Rebecca (Becky) and a younger brother Nicholas. Of course, this means that Silas Cross was John Richard's uncle and that John Richard and his wife Louvenia were first cousins.

So far I have been unable to positively identify John Richard's father, but there is enough circumstantial evidence to put together a good theory. The details are too extensive for this e-mail, but I can put it all together for you if you want. I wanted to let you know about my findings as soon as possible, but I can give you a summary.

It is my belief, at this point, that John Richard's father was a Richard Cross, son of Thomas Cross who married Chloe Lassiter in 1811. Thomas was the son of William and Rachel Cross and the brother of Richard, father of Silas and Adriana. I think he married his cousin Adriana in the early 1850s and fathered Anne Rebecca (1853), John Richard (1857), and Nicholas (1860). Richard is missing from the 1860 census and so is Nicholas, but the August 16, 1860 deed of gift clearly names Nicholas as Adriana's son. She must have been eight or nine months pregnant when the 1860 census was taken in June. What happened to the father of John Richard Cross is unclear. He may have died prematurely or possibly abandoned the family. I doubt that all three of Adriana's children were illegitimate, not in the 1850s.

I can also give you a good idea of where the land was located which had belonged to William Cross, was passed down, and on which Adriana and John Richard lived. I hope this data is helpful. I will continue when I can. Let me hear from you soon.

Richard was born in Virginia in early 1790 and brought to North Carolina as a baby since his father, William, was in Wake County by June of 1790. He grew up on his father's farm, but nothing is known about his early life until he married Rebecca Brown in Wake County in 1814.

Richard followed the family tradition of farming and may have lived on his father William's land for a while after marriage. The Wake County Tax List of 1820 showed Richard with 100 acres valued at \$330 in the Crossroads District. He also had one free poll (himself) and one slave. By 1830 his farm was located in Mark's Creek District (taken from old Crossroads District) and he had fathered three of his five known children: Charles, Mourning, and Silas. Two other children, Thomas and Andriana were born by 1832.

On October 7, 1844, Richard Cross entered a claim for another 100 acres of vacant land adjoining his own on the waters of Fall Creek [now Fall Branch], a tributary of Little River. On this expanded farm he and Rebecca raised their last three children and spent the remainders of their lives. Wife Rebecca had died and Charles and Mourning had left the household before the 1850 Census, which shows only Richard (60), Silas (22), and Andria[na] (18). Silas helped Richard run the farm.

The 1850 Census noted that Richard could not read or write despite his yeoman farmer status. No will was found and estate papers apparently were not filed. Richard Cross did not appear in the 1860 North Carolina Census, indicating that he died in the 1850s.


