I lend to AILNY ADAMS the land I bought from ROBERT MELTON, during her life, and after her death to descend to heirs noted below; also lend to her 1/4 of my personal property during her life. The balance of my estate I give to MARTHA ANDREWS ADAMS, MARY ANDREWS ADAMS, & SARAH ANDREWS ADAMS to be divided equally among them, and also the property I accumulate after making this will.
