Benjamin Adkins, Jr born 1825 in Wayne Co, KY, died circa 1894 in Jasper Co, IA. He was son of Catherine (Stigall) and Benjamin Adkins, Sr. Benjamin Jr married Rachel Williams (XID – 142) born 11 Nov 1824 died 31 Mar 1924.

(3) In a 30 Jul 2005 letter to RPU Robert Freddie Barrs, Sr provided a 35-page packet of family history information. This extract concerns pages 2 – 20 which pertain to SW Wayne Co, KY. These pages concern a homestead on Langham Creek and a mill on Little South Fork of the Cumberland River. Details are given about the Blevins, Hurt and Adkins families who lived in the area in the early 1800s and beyond. This is the same general area in which George Upchurch settled in the 1810 – 1815 era having come from NC. These four families intermarried. A sketch of relationships:

35. Miss Upchurch was born ca 1792 in Iredell County, North Carolina and died by 1844 Kentucky. There does not seem to be a record of her name. Her husband was Keeling Williams. She is mentioned in her father's will as the wife of Keeling Williams. Keeling is listed in the 1820 census of Wayne County, Kentucky. They were living next door to Shadrick Upchurch and near her father George Upchurch. Listed in their household was 1 male 26-44, 3 females 0-9, 1 female 26-44, Keeling was engaged in agriculture in 1820. Keeling remarried 5-18-1845 to Dorothy McClendon. Miss Upchurch and Keeling had 7 daughters

155. Rachel Williams was born 11-11-1824 Fentress County, Tennessee and died 3-31-1926 Grinnell, Poweshiek County, Iowa. Her husband was Benjamin Adkins who was born 7-10-1825 Wayne County, Kentucky and died 5-24-1887 Jasper County, Iowa at the age of 61 y 10m 19d. He was the son of Benjamin Adkins and Katie Stockwell. They were married 12-28-1853 Kentucky. Benjamin and Rachel were listed in the 1850 census of Wayne County, Kentucky.

Benjamin and Rachael were living in Wayne County, Kentucky during the 1860 census. Catharine Adkins age 66 was living with them in 1850. Catharine Adkins age 81 was living with them in 1860. Rachel and Benjamin were living in District 4 of Wayne County, Kentucky during the 1870 census. Granville Adkins age 22 born in Alabama was living with them in 1870. They moved to Iowa and were listed in 1885 Iowa census living in Kellogg Township, Jasper County, Iowa. Rachel and Benjamin were listed 1880 in Kellogg Township, Jasper County, Iowa.

- Rachel was living with her daughter Telitha in the 1900 census of Jasper County, Iowa. Rachel and Benjamin are buried at the Antle Cemetery, Kellogg Township, Jasper County, Iowa. Their children were:

From his obituary:

James Frances Adkins, son of Rachel Williams and Benjamin Adkins, and the eldest of a family of nine children, was born July 30, 1844, near Monticello, Wayne Co, Kentucky. He sprang from a sturdy American pioneer family. His grandfather, Benjamin Adkins, with his wife, Katie Stockall, and his sisters, were among the first settlers in Kentucky, making the long journey from North Carolina with one of the Daniel Boone parties. Two of his grandfather's sisters were killed by the Indians on this journey.
