Patricia Upchurch Alspaugh died Sunday, April 16, 2000.

A graveside service will be held at 10:30 a.m. Friday, April 21, 2000, in Restlawn Memorial Gardens.

Mrs. Alspaugh was a reporter and photographer for the following newspapers: the former Raleigh Times, the Mt. Vernon, New York Daily Argus, the UNCG News Bureau, and the Greensboro News & Record. Her career achievements were recognized while with those various papers, as well as her contributions of news promotions for the Humane Society. She retired in 1980.

She is survived by her husband of 55 years, William Alspaugh; two daughters, Billie B. Flores and Patricia Lane Alspaugh, both of Greensboro; one brother, Dr. Philip Upchurch of St. Louis, Mo.; and three grandchildren, Adrienne S. Lewis, Jessica Mims Futch and Dawn Andrea LaFrance.

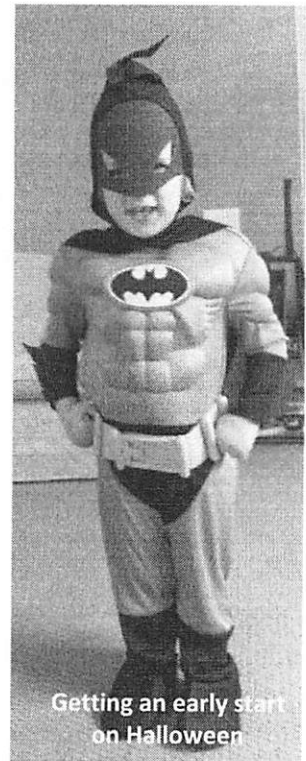

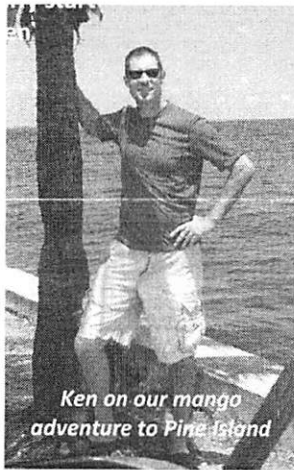

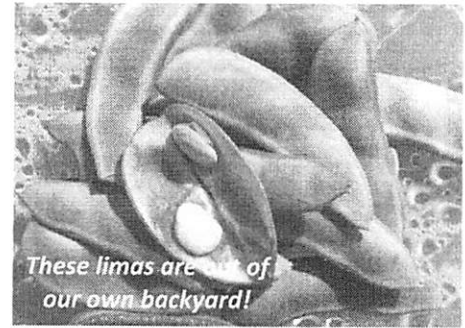

*Ken on our mango adventure to Pine Island*

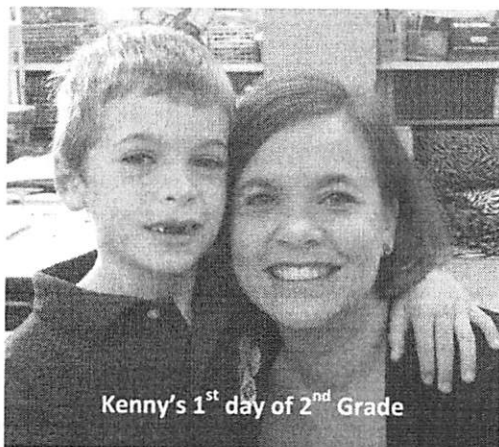

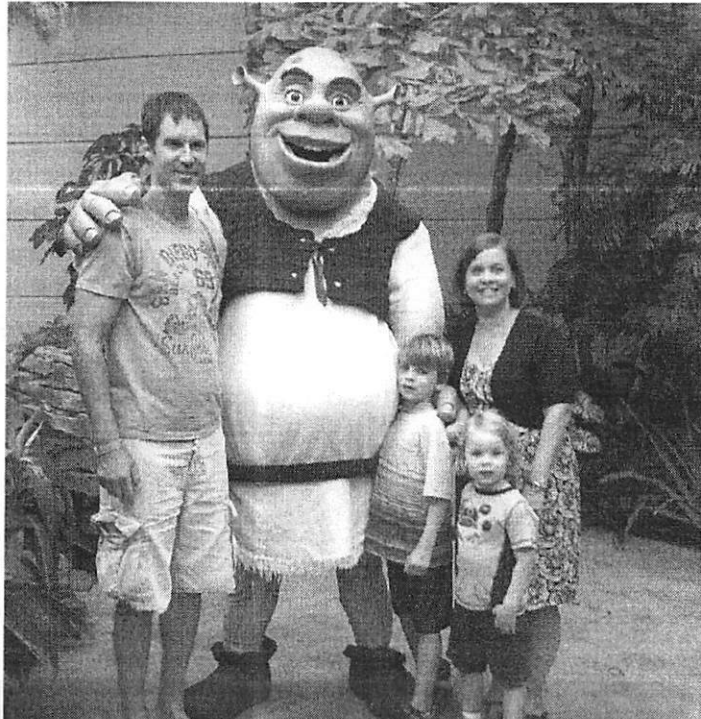

Love to you and your family and thank for working hard at keeping us in touch and connected!

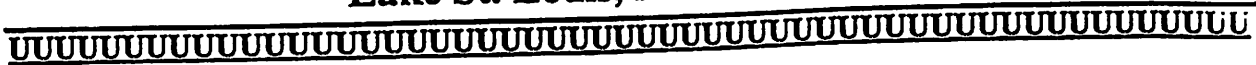

Dear Sloan & Jessica,

It was a pleasure to meet both of you on the sad occasion of the funeral of Pat, my dear sister and your devoted grandmother. I thought the event was a wonderful celebration of the life of Pat. It was wonderful that you two could come and offer support to your grandfather Bill. He and Pat loved you very much and I have many times heard them tell of their love and affection for you.

Pat and Bill were two of my parents' people. They were members of the small wedding party when Sallaine and I were married in 1948. I tried to pass along to you at the invitation some sense of our love for Pat and Bill. They were/are two unique individuals. I had words of recollection to say if asked but it was good that I was not asked as my emotions would have overcome me.

Perhaps there will be some future occasion when I will have the opportunity to visit with you and to relate more of the history that binds us as a family.

Over the years Pat and I corresponded off & on. Often it was about our mutual interest in family history. Enclosed is a copy of the 1996 letter she wrote to me. This was the last to come. I last saw her in December of 1998. We went out for lunch and enjoyed W.C. Barbeque.
