Another arrest made in Franklin drug bust

A third suspect has been charged in connection with the Franklin County drug bust that produced the arrest of two Zebulon men earlier this month.

On Aug. 9, the Bunn Police Department and the Alcohol Law Enforcement agency arrested Carol Alston, 34, of Bunn. She was charged with the felony of maintaining a vehicle for the use, storage or selling of a controlled

substance, and felony maintaining a dwelling for the use, storage or selling of a controlled substance.

Ms. Alston is the girlfriend of Wilbert Ardell Baker, who, along with Donald Ray Dunn, was arrested Aug. 7 after selling cocaine to an undercover ALE agent. Baker and Dunn, both of Zebulon, were charged with a total of seven drug violations including felony possession with intent to sell and deliver.

During the initial bust near Royal, officers seized over \$20,000 in drugs and cash, and a 1990 Chevrolet Blazer.

Ms. Alston, the owner of Carol's Grocery on S.R. 1719 across from Bunn Elementary School, was released on \$5,000 bond. She was arrested by acting Bunn police Chief Watt Jones and ALE agent Ken Pike.

Miscellaneous Holmes County UPCHURCH's

Holmes County, Mississippi presented a big mystery in the UPCHURCH history. Two of the children of Moses UPCHURCH(498) went to Holmes County to marry, Walter Lane UPCHURCH(506) and Peter J. UPCHURCH(505). William Harrison UPCHURCH(509), son of Mark Wesley UPCHURCH(499) and nephew to the above men, also married here. However, there are additional UPCHURCH members in Holmes County that have not been tied in with any of the other UPCHURCH lines. Family history has it that Moses UPCHURCH(498) had one or two additional daughters that are not accounted for in this history. Perhaps part of all of these Holmes County lines are some of his descendants.

On 24 January 1894 Mrs. L or T.M. UPCHURCH married W.S. MADISON. The bride was eighteen and the groom twenty-one.⁶⁸⁷ On 3 January 1895 Maude UPCHURCH married Henry ALSTON.⁶⁸⁸ Nothing more is known about these girls. Due to the age of the first bride, the Mrs. could be in error. The two brides could be UPCHURCH sisters, sisters who had previously married UPCHURCH men, or totally unrelated.

In 1900 Holmes County, two widowed sisters lived in the same household, Eveline LUCUS and Fannie UPCHURCH. Eveline was born in June 1854 and Fannie in February 1872. Fannie had three children by her UPCHURCH husband: Mable UPCHURCH(964) born in October 1892; Fannie UPCHURCH(965) born in January 1895; and Jimmie UPCHURCH(966) born in June 1896.⁶⁸⁹ Fannie UPCHURCH(965) married Lee BURGE on 27 June 1913 in the same county.⁶⁹⁰ The father of these UPCHURCH children has not been found.

Fighting for freedom in an un-free time

African-Americans remember service in World War II

Sitting in the living room of his home on Tingen Road, the Rev. William Davis reflects on his days in the Navy during World War II.

Leaving his home as a young man of 23, Davis joined the Navy in 1943 -- two years after the Japanese bombed Pearl Harbor and the United States entered the war. After basic training in California, Davis boarded a ship and headed for Pearl Harbor which was still a strategic locale in the Pacific theater. There his job became supplying ammunition to Americans on the front lines.

Looking back on his time at Pearl Harbor, a vivid image remains in Davis' memory: the evening ships at Pearl Harbor were sabotaged. Completely loaded Navy ships ready for invasion exploded in the harbor, he said.

Davis has another, happier memory of the day the war ended in 1945. Still at Pearl Harbor, he

was watching a movie at the base when news of America's victory began flashing on the screen. Then Davis said he and others began celebrating. After the war ended in 1945, Davis returned to North Carolina, and later went to Illinois State University.

Davis was among many African-Americans from the area who served in World War II. The war took a long-time friend of Davis, Apex native Garfield Minter, to England, France and Germany where he transported large guns into combat. A youth of 18 when he left his home town, Minter also spent time in the Pacific before coming back to Apex.

William Adams, who now lives in Holly Springs, spent two years in the Army in World War II, as did Lolia Wilson who went to France, Germany and the Pacific like Minter.

Kever Jackson served as soldier for over three years in European campaigns, including the Normandy Invasion in 1944. Jackson said he was on his way to Japan in 1945 when the war ended.

Curtis Richardson, Joe Alston Jr., Leroy Farrar, Alton Judd, Forster Richardson, and Ed White also are among those who saw days of ser-

is still a struggle for many, Davis observes. Yet, total equality and freedom for people of all races is still a dream for Davis.

A minister of Oak Grove Baptist Church in New Hill, Davis preaches "love your enemy" and the value of helping others, regardless of color.

"If I see you in trouble, I do what I can to help you," he says. "People are people."

Davis says he hopes for the day when a person's color will no longer have any bearing on the way he is treated, or the opportunities offered him.

by," Davis said. Yet, even as they fought side by side, blacks did not receive the same treatment and have the same benefits as whites, he said.

Although he acknowledges the progress that has been made in recent years for minorities in this country, Davis says, "It is still not as free as it should be." There is still tokenism regarding African-Americans, he says.

For blacks in America, freedom has been a long time coming, Davis says. Older people here look back on not-too-distant times when if a white person said something, then it was true, he says.


Davis, his brothers Coldwell and James Davis, and other African-Americans from the Apex area who were in World War II fought in the same battles, took the same risks as other soldiers and sailors from this country. However there was one crucial difference for them that Davis remembers well: segregation because of their color.

Beginning in boot camp, Davis said blacks were separated from whites. Also, black leadership in the military during World War II was "token," he said.

"We were there for the same purpose, had the same standards to live



"Chatham Jack's" Cemetery Needs Restoration

"Chatham Jack," Joseph John Alston, Jr., (1767-1841) reportedly came to Chatham County from Halifax County, North Carolina, in 1791. Although he was titular head of one of Chatham's distinguished early families, several of his siblings were in the area before he was. His second-oldest half-brother, Col. Philip Alston, was captured in 1781 at his home, "The House in the Horseshoe," Moore County. His third-oldest half-brother, William Alston, served as Clerk of Chatham County Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions from 1774 to 1776.



It has been said that Chatham Jack came to own 40,000 acres in Chatham County. Nearly all of the land along the present highway US 64 between Pittsboro and Siler City was Alston-owned. Chatham Jack and his wife, Martha Kearney Alston, had eleven children. They first lived in Aspen Hall, five miles west of Pittsboro. This plantation was inherited by their son Gideon Alston. The Alston-DeGraffenreidt House was built by Chatham Jack for his first-born son, John Jones Alston. This was on Harlands Creek about two miles east of Aspen Hall. The Alston-Dark House, about four miles east of Siler City, was built about 1840 for his tenth child, Philip K. Alston.

Five of Chatham Jack's sons, and some other members of their families, are buried in the Alston family cemetery on private property north of Harold Hart Road, northwest of Hart's Furniture Store. There are many large stone grave monuments with fancy lettering and long epitaphs.

But the cemetery is in deplorable condition. Many large columns are broken or knocked off their pedestals. The cemetery is covered with weeds, brush, briars, and fallen trees. Because of the historical significance of Chatham Jack Alston and his family in the early development of Chatham County, it would be a worthy project to clean up this cemetery, repair broken gravestones and return them to their proper pedestals, and erect a historical marker in memory of Chatham Jack Alston. Volunteer help and money are needed to carry out this project. Anyone interested please contact the Chatham County Cemetery Coordinator, Will M. Heiser, (919) 542-4655. 
Alston deployed with Naval Mobile
