A. Year of 1839 Alfred Upchurch lost his wife. Seven children to Willie Jackson until grown, named: Louisa J, age 14; James C, 12; Catherine J, age 10; William, age 8; Albert J, age 5; Elizabeth A, age 3; **Andrew J**, 2 months.

[William Jackson is presumed to be the brother of Penny Jackson who married 5 Dec 1823 Alfred Upchurch and gave birth to the children listed in (1) and (2) above – RPU]

I. James Upchurch, V – Head of Clan

A. Alfred A Upchurch

1. Albert Judtson Upchurch born about 1834 – XID – 37685. Served CSA, Co E, 43rd NC INF. Survived the war and is found on 1870 census in Wilson Co, NC with wife Elizabeth. He died 1873 and she married. No known issue. His sister named two children after him but spelled their names Judson rather than Judtson.

2. **Andrew J Upchurch** born 16 Nov 1838 – XID – 37687. Served CSA, Co E, 9th RGT. Died in the war 9 Jun 1863 – Battle of Brandy Station. No evidence of him ever having married.

(12) A J Upchurch private “Resided in Franklin County where he enlisted at age 22 on August 11, 1861 for the war. Killed in action at Brandy Station, VA June 9, 1863.” per “North Carolina Troops 1861 – 1865, Vol II” (6)
