In 1899, a year after local Spanish-American War hero Worth Bagley was killed at Cardenas, Cuba, in 1898, this Raleigh & Cape Fear Railroad station and post office were named in his honor. Rufus R. Sexton became the first postmaster, followed by William L. Johnson, and then Lena E. Sexton, who served for twenty years before the office closed in 1925.¹⁸
- △ Kemp B. Johnson erected telephone poles for a line from his home at Cardenas to Caraleigh Mill in Raleigh in 1896; in 1907 the area got its own exchange when Dr. James M. Judd, A. C. Burt, Ed H. Ballentine, and other local residents formed Cardenas Telephone Company. Mrs. Sexton operated the switchboard at her home near the railroad depot. A. N. Johnson had a general store at the depot. Dr. Judd lived nearby and carried on a medical practice covering Wake, Harnett, Johnston, and Chatham counties. Dr. H. H. Utley also practiced there in the early 1900s. In about 1895 Irene Johnson Cook built a small private school, which later became a public school for white children until the county school board authorized a new building, completed in about 1910. Kemp Johnson assembled a large lumber business. Dr. Judd's daughter, Edith Judd Parker, recalled that Johnson had a "music hall" near his home and allowed the community to use it for special speakers and events such as school Christmas programs. The area's earliest moving pictures were also shown there. Other businesses and industries included sawmills and cotton gins owned by W. M. Ballentine and W. Z. ("Zeb") Atkinson, and J. L. Brown's grocery. J. H. Hinesley's blacksmith shop was located there in the 1910s.¹⁹



Cows' last roundup generates sadness

At historic Ballentine Dairy:

Several motorists stopped their cars and waited patiently as a dozen or so black and white Holstein cows lumbered slowly across Sunset Lake Road one final time last Tuesday afternoon.

It was a "last roundup" of a different kind.

The cows were the last of the Ballentine Farm herd which was sold under a government-sponsored program designed to reduce milk surpluses.

To the owners of Ballentine's Farm the decision to participate in the federal buy-out program was a business one.

To many residents of southern Wake County, particularly those who are native to the area, the decision was a sad one.

The disappearance of the black and white cows from the rolling green pastures along Sunset Lake Road marks the passing of an era. Dairying has gone on on that land for almost 100 years. And motorists have been stopping twice a day to let the cows cross the road for as long as many area residents can remember.

Last week Mrs. Carolyn Ballentine Elliott, a descendant of the Ballentines who started the dairy,

said present plans are to use some of the pasture land for growing alfalfa and other crops. And she and her husband, Boyd, who live on the dairy farm land, plan to expand their horse breeding operations. The Elliotts breed thoroughbred horses for sale to horse racing enthusiasts.

Mrs. Elliott said some consideration has been given to preserving some of the dairying buildings and equipment for their historic interest, but no decision has been made.

About 300 acres of land has been devoted to the dairy operations, Roy Hair, manager of Ballentine Farm, Inc., said in an interview in April. Three fourths of the land is still owned by the Ballentine family. Owners of Ballentine Farm Inc. which has operated the dairy in recent years, are Haire, Mrs. Elliott and Rebecca Ballentine.

Haire said the dairy was started by Erastus and Lily Ballentine prior to 1900. "They started with two or three cows and a little butter operation," he said. Members of the Ballentine family have continued to be associated with the farm through the years.

L. Y. Ballentine, son of Erastus and Lily, one time lieutenant governor and later N. C. Commissioner of Agriculture, lived on the farm and continued an interest in the dairy business until his death in 1964. His sister, Miss Mabel Ballentine, spent most of her life actively involved in the business of running the dairy. She died in 1972.

The new federal program which led the owners of Ballentine Farm Inc. to get out of the dairying business, allows farmers to sell their herds for slaughter and to receive a subsidy for lost milk sales.

Last spring dairy farmers who were interested were asked to submit a bid stating the amount they would be willing to accept for each 100 pounds of milk they would have anticipated producing over the next five years. Haire said he submitted a bid of \$16.74 per 100 pounds. He didn't expect his bid to be accepted. But it was. Government officials averaged all the bids they received nationally and came up with \$22.50 per hundredweight as the maximum bid they would accept. Farmers who bid that amount, or less, found their bids accepted.

Participating farmers had to agree to get rid of their cows by August 31 of this year. And they

had to agree not to resume dairy operations for at least five years.


Haire said in April he was not optimistic about the longrange value of the new federal program. "I think the program is going to work temporarily, but not down the road," he said. He said so many improvements are being made in the way calves are raised and the amount of milk they can produce, he expects to see overproduction become a problem again in two to three years.

Haire thinks it would have been wiser for the government to establish milk quotas and allow dairies to enlarge only by purchasing base quotas from other farmers in much the way tobacco quotas are handled.

Although Ballentine Farm Inc. no longer owns dairy cows, about 60 cows will continue to graze on land which was a part of the original Ballentine's Dairy. That land belongs now to Mrs. Carolyn Randall, operator of Randall's Rainbow Farms. She leases the land to two Apex doctors who keep a few dairy cattle on it.

But that land and those cows aren't visible to motorists driving out Sunset Lake Road. And those cows won't be crossing the road to get milked every day.

The scene has changed.



In 1899, a year after local Spanish-American War hero Worth Bagley was killed at Cardenas, Cuba, in 1898, this Raleigh & Cape Fear Railroad station and post office were named in his honor. Rufus R. Sexton became the first postmaster, followed by William L. Johnson, and then Lena E. Sexton, who served for twenty years before the office closed in 1925.¹⁸
- △ Kemp B. Johnson erected telephone poles for a line from his home at Cardenas to Caraleigh Mill in Raleigh in 1896; in 1907 the area got its own exchange when Dr. James M. Judd, A. C. Burt, Ed H. Ballentine, and other local residents formed Cardenas Telephone Company. Mrs. Sexton operated the switchboard at her home near the railroad depot. A. N. Johnson had a general store at the depot. Dr. Judd lived nearby and carried on a medical practice covering Wake, Harnett, Johnston, and Chatham counties. Dr. H. H. Utley also practiced there in the early 1900s. In about 1895 Irene Johnson Cook built a small private school, which later became a public school for white children until the county school board authorized a new building, completed in about 1910. Kemp Johnson assembled a large lumber business. Dr. Judd's daughter, Edith Judd Parker, recalled that Johnson had a "music hall" near his home and allowed the community to use it for special speakers and events such as school Christmas programs. The area's earliest moving pictures were also shown there. Other businesses and industries included sawmills and cotton gins owned by W. M. Ballentine and W. Z. ("Zeb") Atkinson, and J. L. Brown's grocery. J. H. Hinesley's blacksmith shop was located there in the 1910s.¹⁹

William M. Ballentine

He came, he saw, he conquered!

William Ballentine was among the suitors who came pursuing the Jones girls who had grown up in the home of their grandfather Capt. Ethledred Jones on the original land grant sight of 1779 from the first Lord Caswell of the State of North Carolina.

□ Their father, Barnabas Jones, died in the year 1843 leaving
□ his wife, Polly, with the three little girls, ages 7, 6, and 4.

□ Grandmother Polly was a romantic soul. She loved young
□ people and children. Her sister-in-law, Sally Utley Rowland, wife
□ of her brother Isaac Rowland lived across the way - on what is still
□ known as the "Rowland Hill", the crest of the hill on the road lead-
□ ing to Raleigh on the North and Fayetteville on the South - at the
□ crossing of Terrible Creek.

These homes were the scenes of many parties - for friendship,
fun and matchmaking.

□ The middle daughter, Betsy Ann, was also engaged to be married
△ to one of the other Johnson boys! Though Uncle Billie Ballentine
△ won her heart and hand - He was a man of refinement, intelligence
and the gentleness and affection in his manner I think were the
qualities that won her life devotion.

I have heard the people in the family say that if ever he
knew or felt that she wanted to go some place or do any certain
thing - without consulting her he prepared the way - Maybe to say
to one of the children or to a servant "go hitch the horse to the
buggy", and see that everything was provided for her needs.

When Leonita Denmark, a Raleigh artist, was painting the oil minatures from the old daguerreotype pictures of the family, she would discuss with me the character she saw in the faces, the poses and every facet. While she made notes and pondered - building the character for her interpretation.

When she was researching, Aunt Betsy Ann seated in the arm chair so relaxed she said, "She doesn't have a care of the children at home - she knows everything is being taken care of."

She, like my own grandmother - her older sister, Mary Jane had a flair for giving the children about her an awareness of the beauty in each flower and the care for them. Mabel Ballentine, her granddaughter, attributed her appreciation for beauty in nature to her own garden - which grew and grew and at the time of her death, her helpers about the dairy and farm were calling her landscaping and plantings, "Miss Mabel's park." There was beauty at all seasons everywhere one looked and "flowers for the neighbors", for the rest homes, for the churches and truckfuls for the cemetery at Wake Chapel!

Uncle William Ballentine was a man with foresight, enterprise, very aware of the need for good schools and superior teachers in the community. He with the help of the two Johnson brothers, built and provided good schooling for their children and for the neighbors who had the same worthy goals and encouraged them in such attainment.

The old Oakwood school stood near his house and the best schooling of the day was a valued asset to the community and the best of schoolmasters too. Rev. W. G. Clements was among the first. He was also pastor of Wake Chapel Church for 13 years, and the first school superintendent of Wake County at Raleigh, North Carolina.

△ Uncle Billie was a man of vision with much concern for his neighbors. He was aware that in unity there is strength and he built by joining with others and for others in the development of
□ the land of vast acres his wife, Betsy Ann, had inherited from the
□ □ Captain Etheldred Jones land grants through her father, Barnabas Jones, and as the will states, "not a stick a - miss." (I assume none of the rich virgin forests had been cut.)

△ His sawmill was the means of much development in the area, young men who were given not only a means of income, but a stimuli for building ideas and character as well. Ties for life were built that endured and blessed both the gift and the giver.

To enrich the lives of this home were four boys and two girls. The older girl became a hunchback beginning the hump on her back soon after age 2. All known treatments and hospitals were tried,
□ but Cousin Dora grew all the sweeter in mind and goodness. She
□ was very active in Wake Chapel Church, as was her sister, Ammie, who was church organist for many years. However, when she married
□ Dr. James M. Judd, she joined with him in the Methodist church.

One interesting fact that might be mentioned. It was the year 1863 that each of the sisters had their first baby boy: To
□ □ □ Mary Jane, it was Kemp Betha Johnson, to Rhoda Ann, it was Archie
□ □ Neal, and to Betsy Ann, her first child, a son was James Erastus. The boys were quite different in manners, though very close in relationships and loyalties. They appreciated each others characteristics and devotion - each expressed in different manners and cooperation. How proud those three sisters must have been! A new baby boy, their first, the same year, 1863.

As has been pointed out, his mother-in-law, "Grandmother Polly" was a favorite of her many grandchildren and great-grandchildren. They all were dear to her heart as were her three husbands. She outlived them all, and when her home burned, Uncle Billy built a house for her alone on his own homeplace. He had a cabinet maker build for her three beautiful sideboards - one for each of her daughters.

They have been copied by the generations that came after her and are treasured antiques of special beauty.

Uncle Billie gave assistance and direction to the neighbors round about him, and near his home he built a mill cutting timbers for his own need and for those of his neighbors. He established a mill near his home. The Post Office was Ballentine's Mill, and when his son Joe came home from Elon College, Uncle Billie and his younger brother Squire Ballentine had built and were building, across the mineral spring in Fuquay a mercantile business, supplying the community with farm equipment and building supplies. Later they added furniture, and other home furnishing.

In the early 1930's a funeral home was established and a wide area of service has followed and expanded.
