## Celebrating the yuletide spirit

## at Oak View Park

In his poem "Boy Scouts on a Great Hike," poet Fred A. guinge Olds described how Oak View Park epitomizes the natural beauty of the Old South.

And, its stately visions is still evident today. . . . . .

When entering the drive onto the property, formerly called the Wyatt Farm, you can again see it as it used to be when Historic Oak View County Park's holiday celebration kicks off with "Holidays Around the World," an exhibit featuring Christmas trees decorated from 13 different countries.

People are invited to come and learn about holiday traditions from all over the world. Sponsored by Wake Parks and Recreation and Wake Homemakers Extension, "Holidays Around the World" is Dec. 12-13. Located in the new Farm History Center at the park, this event will be open from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Thursday and Friday, noon to 7 p.m. Saturday, and 1-7 p.m. on Sunday.

Oak View's holiday celebrations climax with a candlelight tour and open house at the historic farmhouse on Saturday, Dec. 14, from 5:30-7:30 p.m. The public is invited for holiday music, storytelling for the kids and hot refreshments.

These events become a part of Oak View's rich history that began when Benton S.D. and Burchette Williams acquired 200 acres of the farm in 1835. In 1855, a two-story Greek

Revival-style farmhouse was built at Oak View. The name "Oak View" was derived from four large oak trees once located near the main house.

By 1860, the Williams farm now over 1,000 acres - produced cotton, corn, wheat, oats, hay, peas, sweet potatoes, livestock and butter cultivated by family members and 10 slaves.

Benton Williams served as one of four Wake County delegates to the N.C. Constitutional Convention of 1868. He died in 1870 and is buried in a family cemetery at Oak View.

Job P. Wyatt and Phil Taylor acquired Oak View in 1886 and operated the farm with wage laborers and a superintendent, primarily producing cotton. A cotton gin house, livestock barn and carriage house were built in 1900. George Williams served as farm manager.

In 1911, Will Wyatt inherited Oak View and, by 1919, George Williams retired as manager leading to the hiring of James A. Jones as superintendent. Wyatt and Jones started to diversity the farm's operations.

In addition to planting over 100 acres of cotton, they raised beef cattle and planted a pecan grove to supplement the farm's income.

The boll weevil forced Wyatt and Jones to abandon cotton in 1929 and further diversify operations to include vegetables and dairy products. Produce from Oak View was sold at Raleigh's City Market.

From 1940-41, the family of J. Gregory Poole Sr. acquired Oak View and remodeled the farmhouse in Colonial Revival style. James E. and Mary Z. Bryan owned the farm from 1944-55. preceding Chauncey and Ella

The farm was purchased by Wake County in 1984 and, in '89, the Oak View Restoration Steering Committee led an effort to save the farm complex. The committee began making plans for the restoration and use of Historic Oak View.

The buildings were stabilized by Wake County, and the committee developed a master plan, including restoring the main house for office space, adding space for public and private functions, and restoring the outbuildings to display and demonstrate the historical development of Wake, and agricultural life and practices.

It also included researching and restoring the cemetery; adding formal and herb gardens; building paths through the pecan grove; and constructing a new multipurpose building, a visitor greeting shelter and a band


Of the 109 pecan trees on the farm, 79 were destroyed by Hurricane Fran, but will be replaced and cared for as the original planters did. Only 17 acres are left of the original farm.

The public is invited to visit Historic Oak View Park. To arrange a group outing, call 250-1013. Kirk Smith is the manager of Oak View and Sean Sonderman is the assistant manager.



Tickets, \$5 each, will be sold at Victorian Seasons, 221 N. Salem St., downtown Apex, where a cider and cookie reception will also be held during the tour hours.

This year's tour will feature five area turn-of-century homes and a local church.

The home of Ron and Crystal Ragland and their children, Whitney and Trey, 203 E. Chatham St., is on the tour.

It is one of the oldest homes in Apex. It was built by J. Mc C. Ellington as a wedding gift for his daughter who married John Thompson, Wake County Register of Deeds.

Located on the corner of Elm and East Chatham Streets, the house actually faces Elm Street and originally had an Elm Street address Later it was the home of W. H. Harward, who was a prominent Apex merchant; and subsequently that of Mrs. Wrenn, who rented out an upstairs apartment to a number of young Apex couples over the years.

The interior has been totally renovated, while maintaining the original moldings. The very large windows are nine feet high and have a distinctive round-topped shape.

The home is furnished with numerous antiques which have been handed down from past generations. One of the most unusual is a cast iron stove that was used by Ron's great-grandmother. The curtains and upholstery in the parlor were done by Ron's mother, Betty Ragland.

The Raglands have owned the home since 1994.

Also on the tour is the Olive-E.E. Maynard Home at 206 S. Salem St.

This exceptional Queen Anne style home was built in 1905. It was originally owned by Percy Olive, the son of Apex's first mayor, H.C. Olive, an attorney who





practiced law in Raleigh and lived in Apex until 1926. It is now the residence of Maya Henderson Kelley and her sister Janeane Henderion, both Apex natives.

It is believed that E.E. Maynard, where of the home until 1980, vorked for Southern and Durham tailway for many years. Mrs.

Maynard greatly enjoyed sitting on her front porch for hours, chatting with friends and passers-by.

Long-time Apex residents may remember the cupola that was built on the home in approximately 1905 which no longer remains. A wraparound porch, detailed trimwork and an original barn presently highlight the exterior.

Inside the home, four original fireplaces, tongue-and-groove-ceiling and wainscoting remain. What was once the summer kitchen is now a modern and comfortable office.

Another stop on the tour will be the Seymour-Hedrick Home at 203 W. Moore St.

Built at the turn of the century, this craftsman-styled bungalow located at 203 W. Moore St. is owned by Lonnie and Tracey Seymour-Hedrick and has been in their family since 1934.

The one-story design with single-gabled roof and heart pine weather-boarding is typical of the architecture of the period. Inside the house,

original crown molding and heart pine flooring are still present.

Other points of interest include corner fireplaces in the living room and dining room, the heart pine cabinets and the original blown glass six-over-one windows in Federal style.

Home to four generations of Seymours, this home is a hallmark of Apex hospitality. Visitors will enjoy the many pieces of family antique furniture and collectibles, as well as the newly-landscaped grounds.

Finally, the tour will include the Sears-Wells house at 209 S. Hughes St. The house is a two-story Queen Anne dwelling built on a large corner lot in 1910 for Apex 'mèrchant. L.J. Sears.

During the early 1920s Wake County provided the house as living quarters for the high school principal, Randolph Benton and his wife. They, in turn, offered room and board for unmarried school teachers. Thus, the house became known locally as "The Teacherage."

Later when Benton became superintendent of Wake County schools, his sister Mae Braswell served as the provider of room and

board for the teachers.

From the wrap-around porch supported by 16 Doric columns, to the decorative windows and four working fireplaces with their original mantles to the reworked period chandeliers, visitors will enjoy the history of the furniture and antiques which fill the house.

In February 1977 the present owners, Cloy and Shirley Wells, began completely refurbishing this home that had been proclaimed by the Town of Apex as unfit for human habitation.

Of special interest will be the "before" photographs displayed in the foyer. Visitors will gain an appreciation of the painstaking efforts of Shirley and Cloy Wells who have restored an important part of the heritage of Apex.

The ninth annual Christmas Homes Tour will be presented by the Apex Historical Society on Sunday from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m.

Tickets, \$5 each, will be sold at Victorian Seasons, 221 N. Salem St., downtown Apex, where a cider and cookie reception will also be held during the tour hours.

This year's tour will feature five area turn-of-century homes and a local church.

The home of Ron and Crystal Ragland and their children, Whitney and Trey, 203 E. Chatham St., is on the tour.

It is one of the oldest homes in Apex. It was built by J. Mc C. Ellington as a wedding gift for his daughter who married John Thompson, Wake County Register of Deeds.

Located on the corner of Elm and East Chatham Streets, the house actually faces Elm Street and originally had an Elm Street ad-

Later it was the home of W. H. Harward, who was a prominent Apex merchant; and subsequently that of Mrs. Wrenn, who rented out an upstairs apartment to a number of young Apex couples over the

The interior has been totally renovated, while maintaining the original moldings. The very large windows are nine feet high and have a distinctive round-topped

The home is furnished with numerous antiques which have been handed down from past generations. One of the most unusual is a cast iron stove that was used by Ron's great-grandmother. The curtains and upholstery in the parlor were done by Ron's mother. Betty Ragland.

The Raglands have owned the home since 1994.


Also on the tour is the Olive-E.E. Maynard Home at 206 S. Salem St.

This exceptional Queen Anne style home was built in 1905. It was originally owned by Percy Olive, the son of Apex's first mayor, H.C. Olive, an attorney who



practiced law in Raleigh and lived in Apex until 1926. It is now the residence of Maya Henderson Kelley and her sister Janeane Henderion, both Apex natives.

It is believed that E.E. Maynard, where of the home until 1980, vorked for Southern and Durham tailway for many years. Mrs.

Maynard greatly enjoyed sitting on her front porch for hours, chatting with friends and passers-by.

Long-time Apex residents may remember the cupola that was built on the home in approximately 1905 which no longer remains. A wraparound porch, detailed trimwork and an original barn presently highlight the exterior.

Inside the home, four original fireplaces, tongue-and-groove-ceiling and wainscoting remain. What was once the summer kitchen is now a modern and comfortable office.

Another stop on the tour will be the Seymour-Hedrick Home at 203 W. Moore St.

Built at the turn of the century, this craftsman-styled bungalow located at 203 W. Moore St. is owned by Lonnie and Tracey Seymour-Hedrick and has been in their family since 1934.

The one-story design with singlegabled roof and heart pine weatherboarding is typical of the architecture of the period. Inside the house, original crown molding and heart pine flooring are still present.

Other points of interest include corner fireplaces in the living room and dining room, the heart pine cabinets and the original blown glass six-over-one windows in Federal style.

Home to four generations of Seymours, this home is a hallmark of Apex hospitality. Visitors will enjoy the many pieces of family antique furniture and collectibles, as well as the newly-landscaped grounds.

Finally, the tour will include the Sears-Wells house at 209 S. Hughes St. The house is a two-story Queen Anne dwelling built on a large corner lot in 1910 for Apex 'mèrchant. L.J. Sears.

During the early 1920s Wake County provided the house as living quarters for the high school principal, Randolph Benton and his wife. They, in turn, offered room and board for unmarried school teachers. Thus, the house became known locally as "The Teacherage."

Later when Benton became superintendent of Wake County schools, his sister Mae Braswell served as the provider of room and

board for the teachers.

From the wrap-around porch supported by 16 Doric columns, to the decorative windows and four working fireplaces with their original mantles to the reworked period chandeliers, visitors will enjoy the history of the furniture and antiques which fill the house.

In February 1977 the present owners, Cloy and Shirley Wells, began completely refurbishing this home that had been proclaimed by the Town of Apex as unfit for human habitation.

Of special interest will be the "before" photographs displayed in the foyer. Visitors will gain an appreciation of the painstaking efforts of Shirley and Cloy Wells who have restored an important part of the heritage of Apex.
