play the game. I always thought Irene was the best cook! One time she kept feeding me biscuits just to see how many I would eat.

When I got married on June 23, 1990, my grandmother, Mildred Suitt Blackley, brought Irene and our neighbor, Bea Upchurch, to my wedding. They were seated with my family as special guests at my wedding.

Once when my husband and I were leaving for a vacation, we had a lady at RDU check our boarding passes. I didn't know her name but I knew her face. I knew she was from Franklinton so I told her I grew up there. She didn't know me but the minute I mentioned Irene's name. she knew exactly who I was. Another time Irene's name came up in the same way was when I was at Rex Hospital waiting for my youngest son, Nathan, to have surgery. A lady from Franklinton was working there in the same day surgery unit and I recognized her face. I also remembered her singing in the choir at Irene's funeral. She didn't recognize me until said Irene's name. Not only did Irene tell me and Betsy growing up that we were her 'babies', she told others as well. It meant the world to me to have these two ladies tell me that even after Irene had died.

Later in life, our family still stayed in touch with Irene. We and others helped move her to an apartment in Creedmoor. Experience has taught that the ME must play - major role in establishing and maintaining program components and relationships in LDCs. The roles of PLs, country coordinators, etc., should be allowed to become dominant only as the ME is confident that the situation is well in hand. Even then careful monitoring the ME is required. The sensitivity on these matters extends to the full array of L.C organizations including the AID Missions, LDC Ministeries, other don r groups, etc.

5. Other Scientific Linkages - International Network

Since the IARGs collectively have a broad me date and since they are substantially funded by AID it is imperative that the ME of each CRSF insure that appropriate coordination exists with the IARGs. In some cases joint or mutually compatible programs will evoive. In some cases planned and justifiable duplication will occur. MOUS should be utilized to formalize relationships and to promote understanding a coordination.

CRSF efforts may be programed in AID agaduat countries of such activity is based on logic. As an example, Mexico as an AID graduate country serves as a focal point for certain activities bearing upon Central and South America. GRSF activities in Mexic can take advantage of this focal arrangement.

There will be cases in which a GRSP will need to access resources in a developed country other than the U. S. In such cases the sole consideration should be that the acquisition of resources of the developed country through the GRSP effort represents the most effective way to accomplish the stated and approved purposes of the GRSP and that this approach is substantially superior to what could be done in the U. S. and/or a LDC.
