Dear Cousin Phil

We hope this finds you and your family doing well and enjoying springtime. We were very sorry to hear of your illness and hope all is well.

Your letter and order form for the Upchurch Bulletin have been on my stack of "to do" things since I received it. We too had several medical emergencies when daughter, Kathryn, was found to have a malignancy on the thyroid gland -- which was removed and she is doing well. Then, husband, John, had a 100 percent blockage in the right artery. For an angioplasty and a stent, he went into the hospital one day and out the next -- and is doing well. You mentioned weight loss and the right foods -- those are our goals now.

Mother began receiving the Upchurch Bulletin in 1980 -- they were among her prized books. We took them to Norris Bookbinding Company in Greenwood, MS, and had them bound and as we accumulate two years of issues we take them up for binding. She also had a number of books on the family, which included Those Mississippi Upchurches and a book by Judge Coleman who had an Upchurch ancestor.

We have been involved in a remodeling project -- began September 2002 and was finished by Valentine's Day, 2003. What should have been a two-month project took six months. The doors and windows were late; the fans ordered in September were finally cancelled since the last date they gave us was after the New Year. It was finally finished and we are enjoying the added space. So, all of our genealogy materials have been stored in boxes in the office, along with other materials.

- Our son-in-law, Scott Owens, is from north Alabama -- in the Aliceville-Pleasant
- Hill area. There are still a number of Upchurches in that area. Research was limited
- there as the Greene County courthouse burned many years ago.

□ We appreciate all your in-depth work researching the family and publishing the Upchurch Bulletin. It is a tremendous history of our families. No one will ever be able to fill your place as our historian. We wish to continue receiving the Bulletin as long as it is published and especially your version of an Upchurch Book. Please find enclosed my check for the Upchurch Bulletin and the Archivist.

Your information on my part of the Upchurch family which you sent in 1993 has been very helpful as a starting point to update the family records. Many things have happened since 1993. I am trying to get it all together and will send you a package of copies of documents, births, deaths, marriages, etc. My cousin, Jo Anne Sudduth Alford (Aunt Annie Bell's daughter), is gathering information on her side of the family. I am attempting to get more information on Aunt Marie's side of the family.

My husband, John, and I belong to the Ocean Springs Genealogy Society. Our contribution to the organization last year was serving on the cookbook committee. Some of mother's recipes, as well as those of John's parents, were used in the book. Compiling the book was an experience--the hardest part was getting recipes from the members.

We have been working not only on the Upchurch family, but on my father's family, the Boleware's, and John's family. His grandfather and grandmother were from Austria; his mother was from County Cork, Ireland. We made a trip to Ireland in 1995 and visited the small village where she was born and the church where she was baptized. We obtained the name of a genealogist there and later had him do research on the family (59 handwritten legal-sized pages). We keep running into dead ends on the Austrian (previously Galicia and now Poland) connection.

We thoroughly enjoy the Upchurch Bulletin and appreciate all the work you do in compiling and publishing it.

There is not yet any evidence for my thought.

My correspondence with your mother indicates that you worked closely with her in earlier years to collect family history. I am sorry to learn that she is in poor health.

In recent issue of the UB I have detailed the proposal that your Ancestor Abel U, Sr was the son of Richard U, II and not of William U, IV. This places you in the Abel U, Sr / James Laker U, Sr Subclan and in the Samuel Pirece U Line in that Subclan. Abel U, Sr was a brother of my GGF Nathan U, I. These two brothers grew to adulthood in the Mezzasin Creek Area of present day Franklin Co, NC.
