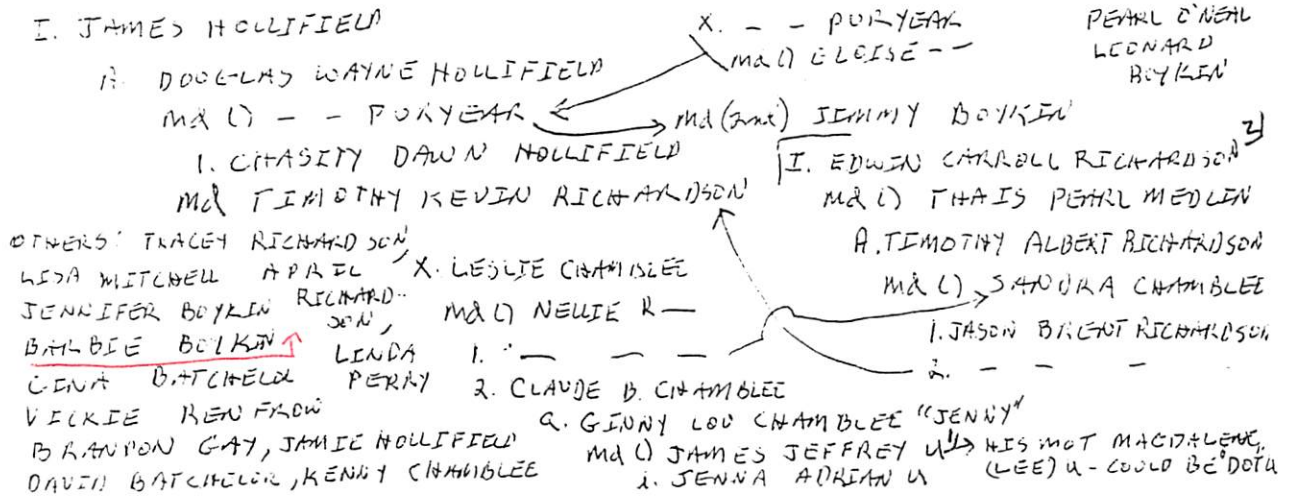

We have very little information about her, only that she died of diphtheria at age 19 (according to Barbara Williams Regulinski).

Note: Somehow, we have come to believe she died while she was in school at Peace Institute but the school apparently has no record of her enrollment there. Warren Bingham, whose wife Laura is president of Peace (April 2003) has searched for a record of either Nina or Ethel Burns and found nothing. Barbara's mother, Nina Burns Adams (Williams), was named for her aunt. She said her aunt was attending Peace Institute, and engaged, when she became ill and died, shortly after she had attended a picnic.

Willie Ethel Burns, called Ethel, was throughout her life very interested in education and government. We don't know where she went to school, but according to her daughter, Nina Burns Adams (Williams), her sister Nina Burns attended Peace Institute and while there, died of diphtheria, at age 19; however the school apparently has no record of enrollment for her. Warren Bingham, whose wife Laura is president of Peace (April 2003) has searched the archives and found no mention of either sister. Peace has extensive information about its students, and this leads us to believe that if either sister attended there, it was for a brief time only.

Ethel's son, Leary, said his mother knew more about state government than "all the men in the family put together." It was so ironic, he said, that she was never allowed to vote, as women's right to vote came after her death. She persuaded her husband to move into the town of Holly Springs, where they lived on the lower floor of the Masonic Lodge, so their children could attend school there. We do not know how she happened to be born in Duplin County (this is documented in a family Bible, in her son's handwriting), as the family lived in Wake County; we assume the family was in Duplin County because of the nature of Ethel's father's work in the tax department.

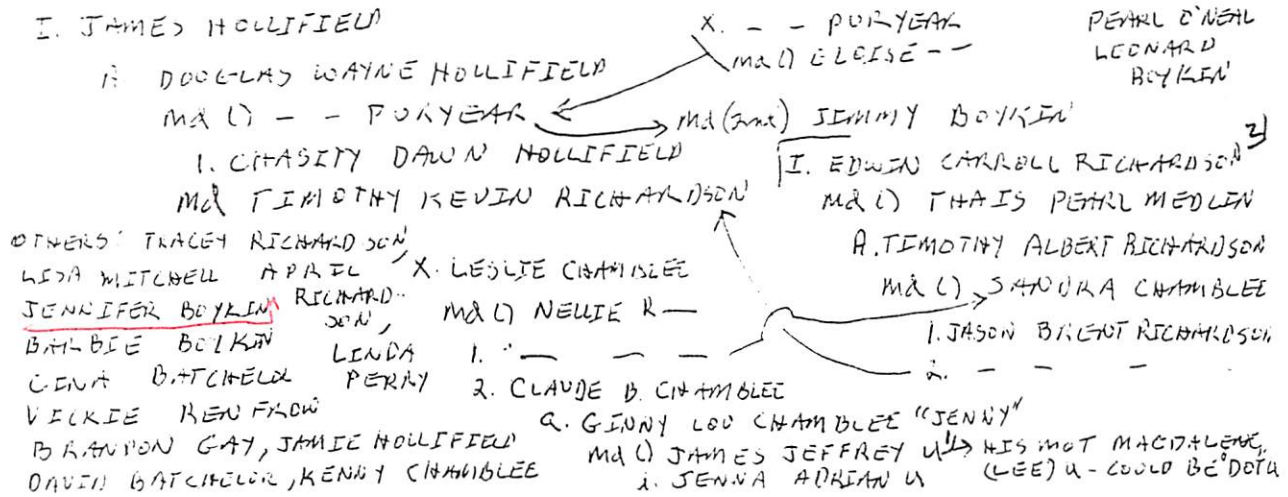

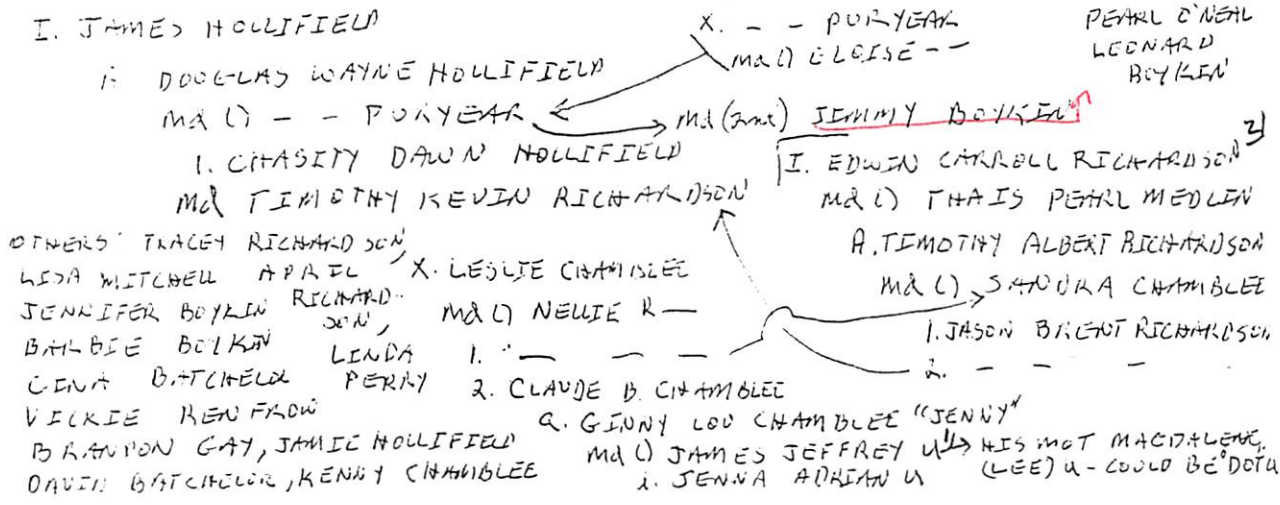

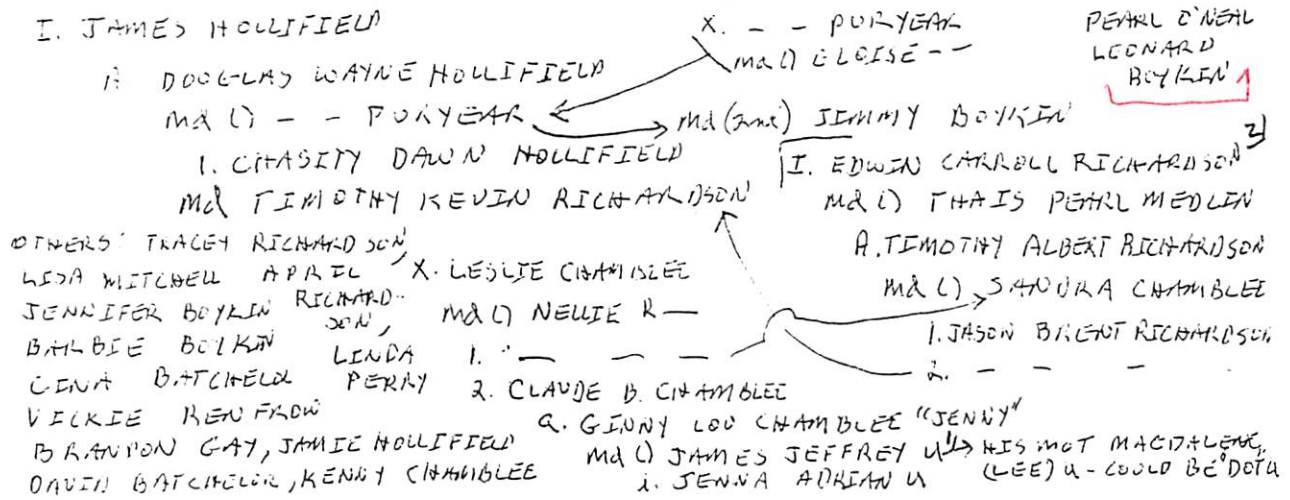

# Emit man often first on hand when you're 'wanting something'

Being unselfish is at the top of the list when you define the traits that make a good neighbor.

Unselfish could be Marshall Boykin's middle name, his neighbors and friends agree. Peggy Wilder, a Zebulon Elementary School teacher, grew up alongside Boykin in the Emit community, where Boykin's family were tenant farmers on the farm of Mrs. Wilder's father, Wade Lee.

Boykin's parents instilled in

him an ethic rooted in hard work, along with a pride in family and a belief to always look after your

friends and neighbors, said Mrs. Wilder.

Even when they were growing up together, Mrs. Wilder said, Boykin was considerate of others, and she's not surprised he turned

into such a good neighbor to the people of Emit.

One rule people soon learn after getting to know Boykin, said Mrs. Wilder — never mention anything around him about "wanting something" because,

more than likely, your wish will be granted.

For example, an acquaintance of both Boykin's and Mrs. Wilder's mentioned wanting to have a local high school reunion videotaped — Boykin showed up, video camera in hand.

Also, Mrs. Wilder said she once alluded to her love of pig skins when she came across Boykin toiling over a pig in a cooker one summer afternoon. Later that evening, she found a bag of the tasty skins at her front door.

Laboring in the garden and giving his vegetables to others is the best example she can think of to explain to others the kind of person Boykin is — "He plants a big garden and he never forgets the widow women in the community. He looks out for others — he's just that type of person," she added.

Boykin's mother, Lucille, said she is not surprised people think highly of her son. "He's one of the good ones."

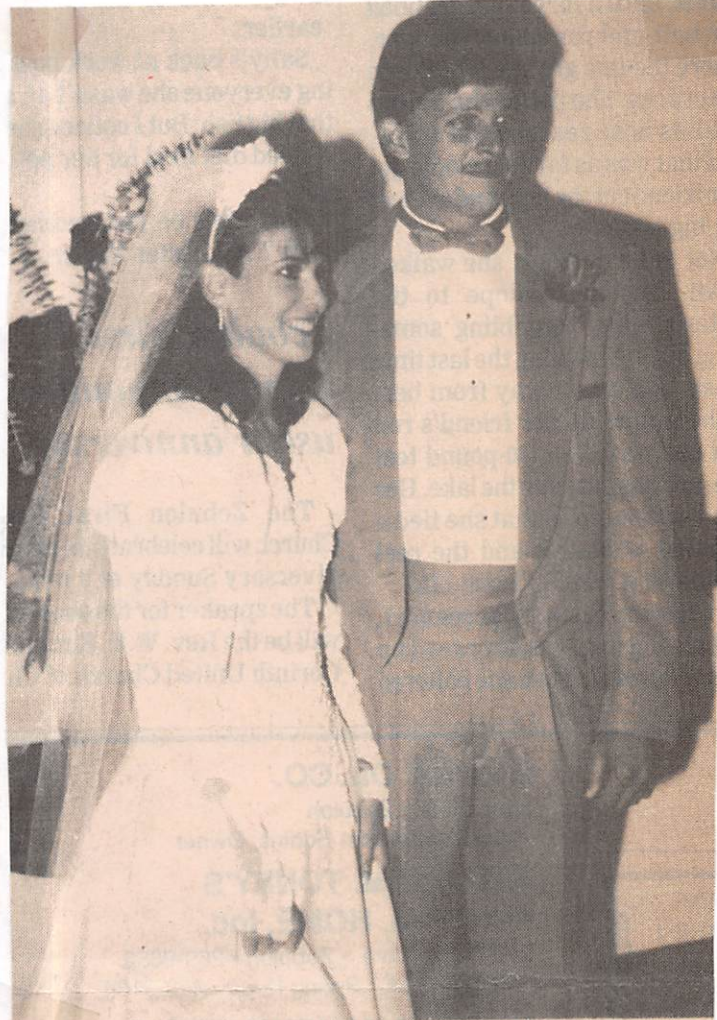
