Almira Isabella (Johnson) McCullers died Tuesday, October 23, 1894 (12:30 AM) (Grace, their daughter was 14 days old when her mother died at her father, John Lewis Johnson's home.) She lived there and was reared by the devoted and loving care of her grandmother Mary Jane, and Aunt Ella Johnson until age 13. After Aunt Ella's marriage she was supported financially-principally by her Uncle Kemp B. and J. Beale Johnson. Grace and Ruth were usually dressed in the same "alike" clothes. Ruth's were blues, reds and colors for a very light blonde. Grace's clothes were greens, golds, or such as her hair was red and a very beautiful light red.

2. GREEN CLEMMONS MILLS, son of Nathan Mills and Celia Morgan, was born 20 Mar 1820 in Wake Co., NC, and died 5 Jun 1914. He married 8 Mar 1845 Cynthia Olive (b ca 1810, d aft 1860). They were married in Wake Co., NC - bondsman was Seth Jinks. He m 2ndly 7 Jan 1866 Eveline Broadwell (b Sep 1839, d 23 May 1910), daughter of Jarratt Broadwell and Elizabeth Reeves. They were married by Jesse Howell, in Wake Co., NC - bondsman was Thomas L. Lassiter.

Green and Eveline are buried at Olive Chapel Bap. Ch. Cem., Apex, NC. Green's gravesite is marked with a government military service marker - an upright white marble headstone with the "Southern Cross of Honor" at the top. The author obtained this headstone, which was installed Mar 1994.

Green served in the Confederate Army during the Civil War. For more info see ch. GRANDSONS OF NAAMAN MILLS: SOLDIERS IN THE CIVIL WAR. Green and his brother, Joseph Hinton Mills served in the 47th NC Regiment Infantry, Co. H, known as the "NC Tigers". After the Civil War, these two MILLS brothers married two BROADWELL sisters. Green married Eveline Broadwell on 7 Jan 1866, and Joseph married Hawkins Harriett (Broadwell) Upchurch on 3 Nov 1866. Harriett was the widow of Parker Upchurch, who had served with Green and Joseph during the Civil War.

Green was a farmer and Baptist Minister. They resided in Wake Co., NC (White Oak Twp.) on FC/1850-1910. In 1850, Green owned real estate valued at \$250. In 1860, he owned real estate valued at \$800 and a personal estate valued at \$433. In 1870, Green owned real estate valued at \$300 and a personal estate valued at \$500. The FC/1850-1880 contained the following info on the Agricultural Schedules regarding Green's farm:

1850 - 50 acres of improved land. 118 acres of unimproved land. Cash value of farm - \$250. Value of farming machinery and implements - \$10. 1 milch cow. 5 other cattle. 15 swine. Value of livestock - \$60. 30 bu. wheat. 375 bu. Indian corn. 10 lbs. wool. 20 bu. peas and beans. 5 bu. Irish potatoes. 300 bu. sweet potatoes. 20 lbs. butter. 1 ton of hay. Value of homemade manufactures - \$18. Value of animals slaughtered - \$64.

1860 - 60 acres of improved land. 114 acres of unimproved land. Cash value of farm - \$800. Value of farming machinery and implements - \$25. 1 horse. 1 milch cow. 1 other cattle. 18 swine. Value of livestock - \$147. 175 bu. Indian corn. 12 bu. peas and beans. 100 bu. sweet potatoes. Value of orchard products - \$20. 4 tons of hay. Value of homemade manufactures - \$15. Value of animals slaughtered - \$184.

1870 - 40 acres of improved land. 50 acres of woodland. 74 acres of other unimproved land. Present cash value of farm - \$600. Present value of farming implements and machinery - \$50. Total amount of wages paid during the year, including value of board - \$40. 1 horse. 4 other cattle. 2 sheep. 11 swine. Value of all livestock - \$202. 40 bu. spring wheat. 200 bu. Indian corn. 10 bu. oats. 2 450-lb. bales of cotton. 8 bu. Irish potatoes. 30 bu. sweet potatoes. 100 lbs. butter. Value of animals slaughtered or sold for slaughter - \$120. Estimated value of all farm production, including betterments and additions to stock - \$900.

1880 - 40 acres of tilled land. 45 acres of woodland and forest. 74 acres of other unimproved land. Value of farm, including land, fences, and buildings - \$900. Value of farming implements and machinery - \$40. Value of livestock - \$100. Estimated value of all farm productions sold, consumed, or on hand for 1879 - \$200. 1 mules and asses of all ages on hand 1 Jun 1880.

Green served as "overseer of the road" on three occasions from 1845 to 1865. For more info see ch. OVERSEERS OF THE ROAD. In Nov 1867, Green served as surety for his cousin, Elijah L. Mills. For more info see ch. COURT DATES ETCHED IN TIME (Nov 1867-pg. 416).

In Green's compiled military service record from the Civil War, he is described as being 5 ft., 10 in. tall. On 1 Jul 1901 and 6 Jul 1903, Green applied for a soldier's pension from the State of NC, for wounds that he had received during the Civil War. Both applications were approved. Green lived to age 94.



Swinging in St. Pete

The Kids and Kubs are looking for a few good ball players

Fred Broadwell, 100, the oldest member of the Kids and Kubs, has played 21 years with the club. He is a retired North Carolina tobacco salesman.

The Kids and Kubs softball teams of the Three-Quarter Century Club in St. Petersburg, Fla., give unique meaning to the concept of "extra innings." The 35 members of the teams, open only to those age 75 and over, don't let age interfere with their love for the game.

The players are all AARP members and meet on the diamond three times a week between November and March. This was their 55th season and one in which players observed the 100th birthday of their oldest member, Fred Broadwell, who has been on the roster for 21 years.

The teams are considered the granddaddy of softball. They've drawn media attention not only in the United States, but also in Canada, Japan and England. Most recently, a West German television crew from the ZDF-TV network taped a segment on the Kids and Kubs for the *Pictures from America* program. (Wide World photos by Rusty Kennedy.)

'Whenever you think you are old, you sit around, get stiff and you are old. I can run just about as good now as I could when I was younger.'

Crouched at the plate, 93-year old Fred Broadwell eyes the softball carefully. He swings his bat, connects and begins his cautious canter towards first base.

In the infield, an alert shortstop, who is at least 75, reaches up and pulls in the fly ball. While Broadwell is still heading towards first, someone hollers, "Two outs," stopping him in his tracks.

Broadwell is the oldest member of the Three-Quarter Century Softball Club Inc., commonly known as the World Renowned Kids and Kubs.

Since Everlyn Barton Rittenhouse and Dr. M. H. Emory founded the Kids and Kubs 48 years ago, they have been entertaining crowds in their solid white shirt and trousers, black clip-on bowties and red or blue caps.

MS. RITTENHOUSE, a born organizer who is credited with founding the Grandmothers Club, the Three-Quarter Century Club and the Senior Citizens Club, happened onto the idea of founding such a team by finding a lost purse in the Tourist Relations department of the Chamber of Commerce.

Searching for identification, Ms. Rittenhouse discovered that the owner was a member of a Three-Quarter Century Club in California and if California could have one, she felt that Florida could also have one.

Ms. Rittenhouse, together with Emory, and with the cooperation of the city and recreation department, the Kids and Kubs were formed.

Through its first six years, the Kids and Kubs played in what Emory had nicknamed the "Sand Spur League." In 1938, the name was dropped and Three-Quarter Century Club became its official title.

There were many amazing men during those early years — both on and off the field. One such man was Charles W. Eldridge, who became club president at the spry age of 100. Eldridge held the office for five years and although he never played, he did coach occasionally.

ANOTHER WAS John Maloney, a pitcher for 23 years and led the club in pitching percentages for five years. One of his greatest accomplishments was in 1964 when at the age of 88, Maloney pitched every inning in every

game. Maloney died in 1974 at 97.

In 1973, George Bakewell published a book on the Kids and Kubs that details the history of the organization. Bakewell was in his 80s when he searched library records and local newspapers for facts about the Kids and Kubbers.

First-baseman Jack Wernz, 84, started out as a youngster with the organization's minor league division, the Pels and Gulls. Wernz played there for 20 years and has been with the Kids and Kubs for 11 years.

The players are constantly asked why they continue to play softball almost daily?

"It's an incentive to exercise," said the 85-year-old Bakewell, the club's secretary. "Most of us probably wouldn't be here if we weren't doing this."

A 1973 SURVEY by the VA backs up Bakewell's claim. The VA's statistics reveal that the 1/2-Century Club members were in better physical condition than other men their age.

"When you are able to do what I am doing at my age," said 92-year old Jim Waldie, "You are pretty damn lucky."

Waldie found out about the club and went down to watch the the teams play at the old Waterfront Park (now site of the Bayfront Center). That was enough for him to end a 45-year retirement from semi-pro ball in Philadelphia and take up the game again. It is a decision he doesn't regret.

"I always try to keep busy and really have fun playing," he said. "But I don't hit grounders the way I used to."

Both Waldie and Broadwell play in each of the Kids and Kubs' games on Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday afternoons. Broadwell plays at least two innings of each game while Waldie goes the full seven innings.

EACH MAN ON the team realizes that his time could come while playing. In the history of the Kids and Kubs, only four men have died on the field.

In an interview a few years back, Bakewell described how Lee Morrison died on the field. Bakewell was on first coaching and when Morrison reached up to retrieve a throw, Morrison keeled over and fell back in Bakewell's arms. Bakewell is quoted as saying, "it was a great way to die — with your shoes on."

"Whenever you think you are old,

you sit around, get stiff and you are old," Broadwell said. "I can run just about as good now as I could when I was younger."

Among these three-quarter century men, changes are slow to come. One change is Ruby Simpson, who is listed as the team's first batgirl. Ms. Simpson's husband Robert played for the Kids and Kubs during the 1976-1977 season. On a Saturday, Simpson hit two home runs and was the day's hero. Two days later, Simpson died of a heart attack.

RUBY HAS FOUND that she really enjoys her batgirl duties. Although deep down, some team members may feel that it is wrong to have a woman on the field with them, most agree that she is doing a good job.

"I'll keep doing this for awhile," said Ruby, a spring chicken at 62. "I enjoy doing this and it gives me something to do."

This Saturday, the Kids and Kubs open their 48th season of play with a 1:45 p.m. game at North Shore Park. Special Kids and Kubbers for the day will be Mayor Corinne Freeman on the mound, Richard Dodge, the director of the Parks and Recreation Department will be that mayor's batterymate.

At press time, the Kids and Kubs had not yet been divided because of the illnesses of Kids' captain Doc Dinen, who is in a hospital in Virginia, and Kubs' captain Joe Belair, who remains at home in Taftville, Conn.

ONE CUSTOM still remains. The two oldest players will open the pre-game ceremonies. Waldie and Broadwell, the oldest active softball players in the world, will lead the flag procession before the game, Waldie also leads the club in cheers during the pre-game festivities. To them, the ceremony is a solemn one.

The brand of ball is humorous but competitive. Ten applications are on file for two vacancies on the team. It makes an enjoyable afternoon for the whole family and there is no admission.

"Very few make the entire season," Bakewell says. "At our age, you can't tell who will be coming out for each game."

Such is the spirit and life of the Kids and Kubs. Each week from November through March, they will be out there giving the game their all.





7. JOSEPH HINTON MILLS, son of Nathan Mills and Candis Wilson, was born 22 Aug 1841 in Wake Co., NC, and died 20 Mar 1904. He married 3 Nov 1866 Hawkins Harriett (Broadwell) Upchurch (b ca 1836, d ca 1870), daughter of Jarratt Broadwell and Elizabeth Reeves. They were married in Wake Co., NC - bondsman was Joseph's father, Nathan Mills.

Joseph served in the Confederate Army during the Civil War. For more info see ch. GRANDSONS OF NAAMAN MILLS: SOLDIERS IN THE CIVIL WAR. Joseph and his brother, Green Clemmons Mills served in the 47th Regiment NC Infantry, Co. H, known as the "NC Tigers". After the Civil War, these two MILLS brothers married two BROADWELL sisters. Green married Eveline Broadwell 7 Jan 1866, and Joseph married Harriett 3 Nov 1866. Harriett was the widow of Parker Upchurch, who had served with Joseph and Green during the Civil War.

Joseph and Harriett had at least two children: Candis Lizzie Helen, and Jetta Frances Mills. Harriett is buried at Mills Family Cemetery, Apex, NC - gravesite is marked with a fieldstone.

Joseph married 2ndly 29 May 1870 Mary Frances Whitehead (b 12 Jun 1849, d 10 Jun 1914), daughter of John Ruffin Whitehead and Louisa Yates. They were married by JP T.T. Holland, at J.R. Whitehead's residence in Wake Co., NC. Joseph and Mary are buried at Mills Family Cemetery, Apex, NC. Joseph's gravesite is marked with a government military service marker - an upright white marble headstone with the "Southern Cross of Honor" at the top. The author obtained this headstone, which was installed 20 Sep 1993. Mary's gravesite is marked with an upright monument.

Joseph was a farmer. They resided in Wake Co., NC (White Oak Twp.) on FC/1870-1900. Mary and son, Hermus continued to reside there on FC/1910. In 1870, Joseph owned real estate valued at \$350 and a personal estate valued at \$500. The FC/1870-1880 contained the following info on the Agricultural Schedules regarding Joseph's farm:

1870 - 45 acres of improved land. 40 acres of woodland. 120 acres of other unimproved land. Present cash value of farm - \$1,000. Present value of farming implements and machinery - \$20. Total amount of wages paid during the year, including value of board - \$120. 2 horses. 1 mules and asses. 2 milch cows. 2 other cattle. 14 swine. Value of all livestock - \$390. 44 bu. spring wheat. 125 bu. Indian corn. 20 bu. oats. 10 lbs. tobacco. 30 450-lb. bales of cotton. 12 lbs. wool. 10 bu. peas and beans. 3 bu. 1880 - 80 acres of tilled land. 40 acres of woodland and forest. 94 acres of other unimproved land. Value of farm, including land, fences and buildings - \$3,000. Value of farming implements and machinery - \$25. Value of livestock - \$210. Cost of building and repairing fences in 1879 - \$60. Amount paid for wages for farm labor in 1879, including value of board - \$80. 28 weeks of colored hired labor in 1879 upon farm. Estimated value of all farm productions sold, consumed, or on hand for 1879 - \$837. 1 horses of all ages on hand 1 Jun 1880.

In 1875, Joseph was a trustee of Good Hope Academy. On 25 Jan 1875, he and Mary deeded a tract of land to the Academy for the building site of a school house.

In Joseph's compiled military service record from the Civil War, he is described as being 6 feet, 2 1/2 inches tall, with a fair complexion, light hair, and hazel eyes.

Joseph died intestate (without a will). He lived to age 62. His son, Ernest was the administrator of his estate. The following info is from Joseph's loose estate records at the NC State Archives.

A section on fraternal orders describes several most if not all of which appear to be MASON LODGES, of which the following is presumed to be one:

George Washington Lodge No. 174

George Washington Lodge No. 174, located at Lassiter's Crossroads, was chartered December 5, 1855. William C. Mason was master; J. Broodwell, senior warden; M. C. Lewter, junior warden; Hinton Hudson, secretary; Sims Upchurch, treasurer; William Womble, senior deacon; Joseph Bell, junior deacon; and A. Barbee, tyler.

Dues for the year 1858 were one dollar per member and 75 members are listed in the lodge minute book.

The cornerstone of the lodge was laid by Columbus Lodge No. 102 on September 29, 1859.

In 1882 the lodge moved to Bell's Crossroads and on July 24, 1908, S. M. Baldwin sold the lodge a lot located behind the present Bell's Baptist Church where the lodge now stands.

With the coming of the New Hope Dam the members of George Washington Lodge will be forced to move from the Bell's Community and the Lodge will probably unite with some nearby lodge.



This deed is the final evidence in WAKE CO, NC of how the proceedings unfolded in Chatham Co, NC. A RECAP:

The Special Proceedings led to a Chatham Co, NC Court order on 20 NOV 1916 for the Chatham County Commission especially appointed to sell the property to the highest bidder at the Court House steps in Pittsboro. They were M. R. U, J. M. BROADWELL [James Marlon Broadwell - heir of Josephine Frances U one of the 13 heirs] & FRED W. BYNUM.

At a 5 JAN 1917 auction Partners Nevin & Flourney were high bidder at 26,000. However, later W. T. HUNT & brother added \$1,500 causing a 2nd auction on 12 MAR 1917 (order), held 2 APR 1917 - Result: W. T. HUNT & S. L. HUNT bid 27,500 but assigned their right to Partners trading as W. L. NEVINS & L. B. FLOURNOY.

The Commission submitted their report 2 APR 1917 and the Court on 28 APR 1917 authorized them to issue a deed to WLN & LBF. Land Description (no shape given):





This is the birthday party for Isham Sims Upchurch (b 31 Dec 1824, d 5 Apr 1916). I have a brief sketch that I wrote about this photo, and will include it below. Taken 31 Dec 1899.

A TRIPLE CELEBRATION

December 31, 1899 was a very special day to have this photograph taken. It was New Year's Eve, the last day of the 19th Century, and it was also the 75th birthday of Isham Sims Upchurch. Isham is pictured sitting in a chair, with his daughters and their husbands standing behind him. Isham's wife, Adelia Beavers Upchurch had passed away 24 Sep 1893 and is buried in the Upchurch Cemetery near the Chatham & Wake County line. Isham had fought for the Confederacy during the Civil War, in the 16th North Carolina, Company G. He was released from the prison at Point Lookout, MD on 21 June 1865. He and his wife, Adelia had 13 children. Sidney died at age 10, and Mary at age 8. On 3 Feb 1903, Isham married for a second time, at age 79 to Rosanna Taylor (age 53), who died 10 Dec 1911. Isham Upchurch died 5 Apr 1916 at age 91. Isham's daughter, Josephine Frances Upchurch lived to age 102, as did her son, Fred Broadwell. The Upchurch and Mills families had intermarried many times, from the early 1800s to the present day.

Confined at Newport News, Virginia, until released after taking the Oath of Allegiance on June 30, 1865.





A third contender for the two available positions on the Morrisville Board of Commissioners announced her candidacy Monday afternoon.

Morrisville resident Margaret E. Broadwell filed Monday to run for one of the two commission seats available. She currently serves as chairman of the Morrisville Board of Adjustment, a position she said has helped familiarize her with the workings of the town's government.

"Through my dealings with the Town of Morrisville and what I am gaining through knowledge of being on the Board of Adjustment, I see several areas I feel could be improved. I have the time and desire to do it, and I feel we need people out there who will bring perhaps new ideas to the established government and not be afraid to speak out," said Mrs. Broadwell.

Mrs. Broadwell was raised in the Cary area and moved to Morrisville

in May of last year. She lives with her husband, Jerry, and their son, Jarrett, on Stella Court. Her father-in-law, Raymond Broadwell, is a former Morrisville commissioner, and her husband is a member of the town's volunteer fire department.

Several important issues are facing the town, not the least of which is growth and development, according to Mrs. Broadwell.

"I think, as others have said, we need some orderly growth," she said. "It's inevitable that Morrisville and the area are going to grow. We are having better planning now than ever before in Morrisville. But one shortage we have is lack of single-family dwellings. There are a lot of people who would like to live out here, but we don't have any place to offer them right now, only land."

The Huntington residential and commercial development under construction in eastern Morrisville will help provide residential

housing, but more is needed, she said.

Developing an adequate sewer system to handle the expected residential and industrial development is also a real concern, said Mrs. Broadwell.

"Development of a sewer system I think is our number one priority. We need to make sure it has a built-in plan for future needs, so that it's not outdated by the time we finish completion of this section of it," she said. "And the quality of water has always been a concern of mine."

Mrs. Broadwell said she supports a town beautification plan, and said she would like to see better communication between the administrative government and departments of town hall.

Mrs. Broadwell said she is particularly concerned about Morrisville's street address system, which is fragmented into two separate systems, she said. She has adopted establishing one street system as a personal project.

"I'm trying to coordinate the street addresses and mailing addresses in one uniform map to be used by the police department, fire department and town hall," she said.

Currently the mail is delivered to residential addresses using post office box numbers, she said. But fire and police departments need to know specific house numbers and streets when responding to emergency calls. Many houses in Morrisville are not numbered according to a street address.

"I have been told that people have tried it (coordinate one address system) before and failed, but I don't usually give up on things. It might take me a little longer, but I usually get the job done," she said.

Mrs. Broadwell is a member of St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Cary, and also attends First Baptist Church in Morrisville with her husband.

She is vying for one of the two available commission seats, each

with a four-year term, against incumbent commissioner Gerald Perry and former police officer Dennis Craddock. Incumbent commissioner Wade Davis, whose position is also up for election, had not filed for re-election as of Monday afternoon.
