BRYANS OF MILL CREEK (12)

The first of the Bryan family to settle in Johnston County in the Mill Creek area was Lewis Bryan, who came here ca 1764 when he witnessed deeds of land sold in the Mill Creek area. In 1770 he bought a 300 ac. plantation from Edward Lee on the north side of Mill Creek beginning up the Little Swamp where Edward Lee's fifth line crossed the swamp, part of a tract granted to Lee 4 May 1769, witnessed by John Lee & Asa Bryan. On 1 Oct. 1772 Lewis Bryan sold part of this tract to Asa Bryan. He sold 150 ac., the other part of this tract, to William Bryan. He sold another tract of 188 ac. to John Bryan on 27 Apr. 1774.

No date has been found when Lewis Bryan died, but the Court of Pleas & Quarter Sessions of 29 Aug. 1792 give the following "that Lewis Bryan Senr. be exempt from paying a four fold tax in 1791 and that he be Exempt in the future from paying a Poll Tax on account of his age. (There were several Lewis Bryans in the county at the same time and it is not clear just which was the Lewis of Mill Ck.) On 18 Nov. 1796 Lewis made a deposition to John Bryan, Justice of the Peace, as to a land mark-

er or councery. Lewis Bryan was a son of John Bryan of [Garven County who made a Nuncupative Will 1 31 Oct. 1741, naming his son Lewis to receive the plantation whereon John lived on Beards 1 Creek; daughter Sarah Bryan to receive 3 ne- 1 groes and personal estate; and that daughter Sarah was to bring up his 3 small children with Sarah Bryan being the Executor of the Will. I Probated 1 Nov. 1741. The Will also gave the information that 'John Bryan departed this life 31 Oct. 1741'. On 17 Mar. 1745/46 Lewis Bryan, son of John Bryan, Deceased sold to Solomon Griffith 390 ac. for 200 N.C. Money, a tract of land' which my father held by deed from John Simmons lying on the North side of the Neuse River and on the west side of Beards Creek.' An inventory of the Estate of John Bryan by Solomon Griffin, 'who had intermarried with the Executor of the Last Will & Testamony of the deceased . . . ' Much of the Bryan family information comes from a law suite in 1826 filed by John Bryan Griffin, son of Sarah Bryan Griffin & Solomon Griffin who will was dated 13 Sept. 1807 and died 24 Mar. 1816. He left no brothers, sisters, aunts nor uncles and the estate fell to next of kin, descendants of his aunts and uncles. (Clerk of Supreme Court, Raleigh, N.C. Drawyer 17/18 & Supreme Court of July 1826, from Johnston Co. Term of Court of Equity). This records gives the names of the following children of John Bryan of Craven Co.: Lewis Bryan, Sarah Bryan, Jo-Anna Bryan, Mary Bryan, Alice Bryan and Elizabeth Bryan.

The name of the wife of Lewis Bryan has not been found and no date of death has been determined. The seven children of Lewis Bryan are (1) William Bryan b. 3 Aug. 1760 d. 11 Feb. 1846 Johnston Co. md. 14 Oct. 1783 Craven Co. Alice Vendrick (Nat. Archives File #S6699) Their children were Asa H. Bryan Jr. md. Susannah Lee 15 Mar. 1809 b. 28 Oct. 1784 d/o John Lee and a gg/gd of John Lee Esq.: Janet Bryan b. ca 1790 was living in Johnston Co. 1850 age 60 yrs.; Eliza Bryan b. ca 1798 and living with sister Janet in 1850 age 52.; Joseph Bryan b. ca 1797 (possibly the son of William); Alice Bryan; Joana Bryan md. 12 Oct. 1810 Owen Thornton; Simon Bryan md. 9 June 1819 Charlotte 'Lottie' Bryan d/o Asa Bryan Jr. William Bryan was a Pvt. in the Rev. War, and his pension went to his chil-

(3) John Bryan b. ca 1753 d. ca 1817 had the following children according to the law suit: Reading Bryan; Delle Fayette Bryan; Elizabeth, widow of James Welch; & Hester (Hule) wife of Miles Barfield who went to Georgia. (4) Mary Bryan md. 8 Sept. 1785 Johnston Co. William Sanders and moved to Tennessee.

(5) Elizabeth Bryan md. Samuel Elridge possibly of Sampson Co. Samuel Elridge made his Will 1 Mar. 1778 and it was probated in May 1778. He named wife Elizabeth, son-in-law David Lee (wife was possibly Anna) son-in-law Abner Ingram, son Samuel, and daughter Mildred Eldridge. (6) Charlotte Bryan md. 26 Feb. 1789 David Peacock of Johnston Co. Their children were William md. Nancy Roberson; Asa Bryan Peacock md. Katie Roberson; John Peacock; Nancy Peacock; Charlotte Peacock md. 28 Nov. 1848 Johnton Co. John Cogdell Hood; and Louis Peacock. It is thought that John & Louis Peacock went to Georoia.

(7) Sylvia Bryan (Lisha) md. 22 Aug. 1789 Aaron Godwin of Johnston Co. (8) Reading Bryan.

Sarah Bryan md. Solomon Griffin/Griffith by the time Solomon filed an inventory of the Estate of John Bryan, deceased. Their only child was Moses Griffin who died 24 Mar. 1816 Carven Co.

JoAnna Bryan md. Daniel Vendrick and their children were James Venderick; Penny Venderick; Alice Venderick who married William Bryan; Lydia Venderick and Polly Venderick both married a James Simpkins.

Mary Bryan md. Benjamin Griffin and their children were: Kezziah md. John Hill; Jesse Griffin; Benjamin Griffin; Mary Griffin md. Robert Jackson; William Griffin; Ann Griffin md. John Holloway; Sally Griffin md. William Holloway; and Betsy md. James West.

Alice Bryan md. Jonas Griffin whose will is recorded in Camden Co. S.C. Their children were Major Griffin; Jannet Griffin md. John Burton; and Jonas Griffin who went to Warren Co. Miss.

Elizabeth Bryan md. Richard Hart and lived in S.C. A son was possibly John Bryan Hart who probably was in the Revolutionary War.

William Bryan, son of Lewis, made an ap-

plication for a Pension for his Revolutionary Service on 7 June 1832. The information that he gave for this application and the affedavits that were made by other persons who knew him, tell about the people who lived in the neighborhood. William stated that he "was 85" yrs. old and the name of Bryan was very numberous and widely connected and influential in Johnson Co., N.C. long before the Revolutionary War and continued so during the struggled for Independence, sharing largely in its support by their wealth and influence; same name has continued thus distingushed nearly up to this period, though many have removed to distant parts; Johnston County embraced several adjacent counties; his family lived in middle, extreme North, now perhaps Wake Co. and in extreme South end which was the family of the declarant; his father Lewis Bryan, raised three sons, Asa born 1750, John born 1753 and William born 1760 (the declarant); known distinction of his family was of "Mill Creek" and all served in the Revolution: brother John was an officer in county and then removed to Georgia where he died about 30 yrs. age; Asa, Captain in Revolution died about 20 yrs. ago, leaving the declarant the only living son of his father Lewis Bryan; . . . There was another William Bryan who died about 20 yrs, ago who belonged to the family in the North of the County, Swift Creek; he knew him well but he did not serve in Capt. Whitley's or Griffins Co." Other persons giving depositions were Jesse Adams, Minister of the Gospel, who was born and raised in the neighborhood. John Q. Adams and Thomas Bagley, Clerk of Court and Ann Hobby all gave information about knowing William Bryan and other informative was given in this application about the Bryan family of "Mill Creek."

William and Needham Bryan came to Johnston County about the time it was formed, 1746. William Bryan received grants for several hundred acres of land across the Neuse River from what was to become Smithfield. joining the lands of John Smith, Sr. Needham Bryan bought land just to the south of John Smith's acres on the east side of the Neuse River all the way down to Pole Cat Ck. Both William and Needham owned lands in other areas of the county but these were the acreages where their plantations were located. William's home was at or near the intersection of present Hwy. #70 & Hwy. #210, in the area of the cemetery. Needham's home was in the area of South Smithfield where the river turns back west after leaving the downtown area. In 1968 excavation was done on the site of Needham's family cemetery and items in prior Smithfield Heralds as early as 1916 mention the old cemetery located here. At the present time the cemetery does not exist, stones having been removed for preservation some years past. Those stone found here were for Loverd Bryan, Needham Bryan, Nancy Bryan and Leah Green.

William Bryan b. ca 1724 d. by Feb. 1780, Will dated 29 May 1780 and probated Feb. Court 1780. He married Elizabeth Smith ca 1744/50 b. ca 1724 d. ca 1792 Springfield Plantation, Johnston Co. William Bryan was active in public affairs and served as Sheriff, Justice of the Peace and Justice for the Court of Pleas & Quarter Sessions. He was appointed Colonel 4 Apr. 1776 in the Johnston County Militia and served in this capacity until he petition of the Seneral Assembly in Feb. 1779 to serve as a sustice of the

Court. He received £271, 12 Shillings and 11 pence for his services. In the years during Gov. Tryons leadership when the Regulators in the western counties were causing trouble, William Bryan sided with the Gov. and helped raise troops and supplies for the soldiers going to the Battle of Alamance. Just a few years later he was fighting on the side of the patriots fighting for independence from British rule. William served as a delegate to the Hillsborough Convention in 1775. Elizabeth was the daughter of John Smith Sr. and wife Elizabeth Whitfield.

This William Bryan lived in Bertie Co. and served in the 1775 Provincial Congress at Hillsborough: They are buried at Snowfields Plantation, Bertie Co. (3) Arthur Bryan b. 12 May 1749 d. ca 1792 Johnston Co. md. Oct. 1773 Mary McCullers, Arthur served as a member of N.C. Senate from Johnston Co.,

Needham Bryan b. 31 Oct. 1726 d. by May Court 1776 Johnston Co. (Needham Bryan Jr appointed Admr. to his father's Estate) md. Nancy Smith and Charlotte Moore. Needham represented Johnston Co. in the Colonial Assembly from 1760 to 1769 and 1773 to 1775. After independence was declared he was cack in the general Assembly in 1777. & 1775. He was a delegate to the Assembly to 1775. He

resources the builth the Assembly 23 Apr. 1777 to establish the town of Smithfield. The o's Court minutes at the Nov. term 1780 give an account of the trial, conviction and executon of a party accused of poisoning a sedham Bryan and members of his family. He s presumed to have been this Needham Bryan. He deeded thousands of acres of land to his son Needham Bryan Jr. before his death. The Court Minutes of August 1777 give the settlement of the Estate of Needham Bryan, dec'd among the orphans of the sd deceased'. Children of Needham and his two wives were: (1) Needham Bryan Jr. b. ca 1748/50 d. 1787 md. ca 1768 Sarah Hinton d/o John & Grizelle Hinton. Children were Loverd md. Militia and was a member of the Provincial Congress meeting in Halifax in 1776 and was often found as a Justice for the court. He was known as Needham Bryan, Esq. (2) Kedar Bryan b. ca 1752 d. ca 1808 md. ca 1775 Elizabeth Smith, a daughter of Jonathan

& Ellz. Smith. md. 2. Mary Whitfield md. 3. Betsy James md. 4. Anne Dickson d/o Catherine and Robert Dickson of Duplin Co. Kedar died in Sampson Co. and is buried between Clinton and Warsaw, N.C. Kader served as a Justice of the Johnston County Court and Wake Counties. He moved to Sampson Co. and represented that county in the House of Commons. Children of Kader and his wives were John Bryan; Rachel Bryan; Needham Bryan md. Margaret Slocumb; Kedar Bryan; Robert Bryan; Nancy Bryan md. lings; Catherine Bryan; & Elizabeth Bryan. Most of the children were by the fourth wife.(3) Winifred Bryan b. 5 May 1754 d. 5 Apr. 1783 md. Nathan Bryan s/o Hardy Bryan of Craven Co. Nathan Bryan fought at the Battle of Moore's Creek in 1776 and represented Jones Co. in the House of Commons and represented New Bern District in Congress, and died while serving there in Philadelphia in 1798. Their children were Mary; John Thomas; Nathan; Winifred Needham and Nancy Bryan. (4) Nancy Bryan b. ca 1756 md. Bryan Whitfield s/o William Whitfield. They lived at Rockford, Lenoir Co. Bryan Whitfield died 1817. Their children were: Bryan Whitfield md. Elizabeth Turner d/o Simon and Ann Smith Turner of Johnston and Wake Co.: Rachel b. ca 1783 d. 1850 md. Nathan Bryan md. 2 William Herring; William; Elizabeth; Needham; Polly; Ann; Nathan Bryan; Lewis; George; James Bryan; Winifred Bryan and Mary Ann Whitfield. (5) Charlotte Moore Bryan b. 2 Apr. 1765 d. 9 Mar. 1798 md. Lewis Whitfield 27 Oct. 1782 Wayne Co. Lewis was a Baptist Minister and served as Moderator for the Kehukee Association for a number of years. He died in Lenoir Co. 1849. Their children were Rachel Whitfield md. Wm. Wright; William md. Elizabeth Wimberly; Allen md. Edith Whitfield and Mary Jane Sloan; Janet Whitfield md. Col. Alex. Moseley; Harriett Whitfield md. Samuel Wiggins and Snoad B. Carraway. (6) Rigdon Bryan d. ca 1793 in Sampson Co. (7) Esther Bryan md. Christopher Curtis.

The Bryan name is very scarce today in Johnston Co. Many of the descendants of these two men migrated to other counties and other states. They may have moved on to others places but their roots are buried deep into the soil of Johnston Co. and its early development.



THE BRYAN FAMILY

The Bryans were originally O'Brians (Americanized into Bryans, Brians, and Bryants), and they are descended from Brian Boru (926-1014), who was King of Munster, an old kingdom in Ireland, and for a time, he was King of Ireland. He married Gormflath, who had formerly married Olaf of Norway, and High King Malachy of Ireland. She was a sister of MacImborda, the King of Leinster. The O'Brian possessions included the whole county of Clare and large tracts in the counties of Limerick, Tipperary, and Waterford. Just before Brian Boru died, he repaired the old Romanesque Church at Killahoe on the Shannon, and some Irish historians believe this to have been his burial place after he was killed in a battle with the Danes on April 23, 1014. Several castles and fortifications were built by King Boru and his successors, including the O'Brian Castle of Bunratty (14th century) near Limerick, which has been restored by the government of Ireland and is open to the public. Boru's own castle was called Kincora but only a small portion of this castle remains. The O'Brians were later known as the princes of Thomond, and after the reign of King Henry VIII of England (1509-1547), they were known as the Earls of Thomond.

Teig O'Brian, second son of King Boru, was King of Thomond, was married to Morney Mochweig, ruler over Cinsal Fachadh and Frearceall. They had a son, Turlough More O'Brian, King of Munster, and principal King of Ireland. he died in 1086. Their daughter, More O'Brian, was married to Roderick O'Connor, the King of Connaught.

Roderick O'Connor and More O'Brian had a son, Dermot O'Brian, who took the Royal O'Brian name and became the King of Thomond. He married Sarah, the daughter of Tiege McCarthy, the ruler over Eoghanacht Caisil. He died in 1118.

Turough O'Brian, son of Dermot, was King of Thomond, died in 1167. He married Raghnait, the daughter of Foghartie, Lord of Ely Deisceart, Tipperary. They had a son, Donald More O'Brian, who was the last King of Thomond. Mr. and Mrs. S. C. Hall writing in their History of Ireland in 1850 (Vol. II, pages 102-103) state that Donald O'Brian gave homage to King Henry II of England (1154-1189), and that he was King of Limerick at that time. The Halls state (Vol. II, page 411) that the famous Irish harp at Trinity College in Dublin (seen by the writer in 1977) belonged to King Brian Boru and was passed to his descendant, Donald, who was deposed by his nephew. He fled to Rome and placed the harp in the hands of the Pope. On the arm of the harp are the arms of the O'Brian family, chased in silver. A later pope gave the harp to King Henry VIII of England, who in turn gave it to the first Earl of Clanricarde, and in 1782, it was given to



Trinity College, Dublin. Donald O'Brian married Oslacan, the daughter of Dermod, the King of Leinster. He died in 1194.

Donoch Cairbreach O'Brian, son of Donald O'Brian, was Prince of Thomond. He married Sabina, the daughter of Donogh O'Kemmedie, Lord of Musery Tire in Ireland. He died in 1242. They had a son, Conor Sinddine O'Brian, Prince of Thomond, who married More, the daughter of Macnamara, Lord of Hycollean. He was killed in battle in 1268.

Teige Caol Wlage O'Brian, son of Conor O'Brian, was Prince of Thomond. He married his cousin, Fynnola, the daughter of Kennedie O'Brian. He died in 1259. They had a son, Turlough More O'Brian, Prince of Thomond, who married Aurina, the daughter of Daniel McCarthy. He died in 1309. They had a son, More Muntegh O'Brian who married (first) his cousin, Sarah, daughter of Gillakneevgen O'Brian and later he married Edine, the daughter of MacGormon of Doracken. He died on June 3, 1343.

Maithain Maonmaighe O'Brian, son of More O'Brian, was Prince of Thomond, and he married (first) Edina, the granddaughter of More, the King of Leinster, and later he married Winnifred Core. He died on May 1, 1360. They had a son, Brian Catha Na Agnaith O'Brian, Prince of Thomond, who married Slony, the daughter of Ulick Fitzwalter Burke. He died in 1399.

Teige Au Chomhard O'Brian, son of Brian O'Brian, was Prince of Thomond, and he married Annabella, daughter of Urtigan Fina MacWilliam. He died in 1466. Their son, Turlough Don O'Brian, Prince of Thomond, married (first) Lady Joan, the daughter of Thomas, the eighth Lord of Kerry and later he married Navait, the daughter of John MacNamara of Clan Clocain. He died in 1528.

Murrough O'Brian, son of Turlough, surrendered his royalty and title to King Henry VIII of England, and on July 1, 1543, Henry VIII by patent created him Earl of Thomond and first Baron of Inchiquin.

Murrough O'Brian II, son of Murrough, married Eleanor, the daughter of Thomas Fitzgerald, Knight of Glunn. He died in 1551. The history of Ireland is filled with the illustrious O'Brians.

I. William Bryan, the progenitor of the North Carolina Bryans, is believed by historians to have been the son of William Bryan who married Lady Mary Boyle, the daughter of Roger Boyle, the first Earl of Orrey. This would have made William Bryan the twenty-second generation from King Boru Brian. William Bryan is also believed to have been the Marquis of Thomond. He was born in Ireland C. 1655-65, and later migrated to England, where he married Lady Alice Needham, the daughter of Sir Robert Needham, Viscount Kilmorey, whose family had lived in Chestershire, England, prior to 1375. William Bryan and his wife migrated to Isle of Wight County, Virginia, in 1689, where he received land grants. They

later migrated to Pasquotank County, North Carolina where he was living as early as 1722. He was Justice of the Peace, sheriff, and in 1739, he represented Pasquotank County in the Colonial Assembly. William Bryan died between 1742 and 1746, and his wife died in 1729. They had three sons: Needham Bryan; John Bryan, born January 2, 1692, and lived in Isle of Wight County, Virginia; and William Bryan.

II. Needham Bryan, son of William and Lady Alice Bryan was born on February 23, 1690. He married (1) Anne Rambeau on November 11, 1711, (2) Susan Harrell on August 14, 1732, and (3) Sarah Woodard on June 3, 1753. He and his first wife sold their land in Virginia (near Nansemond and Isle of Wight boundary line), and in 1722, he patented 640 acres in Bertie County (originally a part of Pasquotank), North Carolina, a plantation of which he named, "Snowfield". Anne Rambeau was born in 1695, and died in March 1730. Susanna Harrell died on June 14, 1752. Sarah Woodard died on June 19, 1776.

Needham Bryan was Justice of the Peace of Bertie County, was Sheriff in 1745, and from 1750-59, he was Church Warden for Society Anglican Parish. He died in 1770, and he and his three wives are buried on his plantation. He and his first wife, Anne Rambeau, had three children: William Bryan (1724-1781), more later; Needham Bryan (1726-1784) who married (1) Nancy Smith, (2) Charlotte Moore; and Rachel Bryan (1723-1780) who married William Whitfield.

III. William Bryan, son of Needham and Anne Bryan was born on October 31, 1724, and died on November 28, 1781. He and his brother, Needham, migrated to Johnston County (then Craven) C. 1744, from Bertie County. In 1744, he married Elizabeth Smith, a daughter of John Smith and Elizabeth Whitfield Smith, who had migrated from Middlesex County, Virginia, to Johnston County (then Craven), North Carolina, in 1743. Elizabeth Smith is believed to have been a direct descendant of Sir Thomas Smith, President of the Virginia Company, and settled in Isle of Wight County, Virginia, in 1622. They settled on a plantation about two miles from Smithfield, North Carolina, which they named, "Springfield". This old home is still standing on Highway 210, just west of Sunset Memorial park. He also owned lots in the town of Smithfield. His wife died in 1792.

William Bryan served as Justice of the Peace, and as Sheriff of Johnston County. He served as a Lieutenant-Colonel under Gov. William Tryon at the Battle of Alamance on May 16, 1771. He represented Johnston County in the Provincial Congress in 1775, and on April 4, 1776, he was appointed a Colonel in the North Carolina Militia, by the Provincial Congress meeting at Halifax, North Carolina. He served in the American Revolution until February 11, 1779. William and Elizabeth Bryan



are both buried at "Springfield". They had the following children: Lewis Bryan; William Bryan; Arthur Bryan; Elizabeth Bryan; Hardy Bryan, Blake Bryan; Esther Bryan; Süsannah Bryan; John Bryan; and Mary Bryan.

LGGGEIV. Hardy Bryan, son of William and Elizabeth Bryan, was born near Smithfield, North Carolina, on June 4, 1753. He married Winifred Mc-Cullers, and they lived on a plantation near Smithfield, North Carolina. During the War of 1812, Winifred Bryan wrote the following letter to her sons, Harry and David, who were serving in the United States Army:

> North Carolina Johnston County December 10, 1814

My Dear Sons:

Accompanying this letter you will receive some clothing for the relief of your present necessities.

One pair of breeches and two shirts to Harry, and a pair of drawers to David. If you require anything more you will not be backward in making it known, as frequent opportunities occur to send.

Your mother's hands that nursed you from infancy will be extended to your support while God shall give them strength. Leaving a rehearsal of the news of the neighborhood to your brother and others who may write, I will attend alone to that duty which is required of me as a mother — the instruction of her children.

My dear sons, you are now out of my sight and beyond the reach of my voice, among strangers and a variety of characters; Young men called into that service which has a tendency without strict regard over one's self to harden the feelings and brutalize the manners of men. I must, therefore, content myself with the mode of requesting you to remember the many instructions I have given you whilst you were with me; to remember that you were raised in civil society, and guard against that encroachment of savage disposition incidental to camp life.

It is my particular request that you abstain from drinking excessively, cursing and swearing, and other debaucheries of human nature. Guard against the temptation of evil, and indulge not in anything that will tarnish the character of the Christian or the gentleman. Be kind and attentive to your soldiers. Let not a hasty temper or unguarded expression incur their displeasure. Be obedient and dutiful to your superior officers. Endeavor to improve in discipline and should emergency require it support the honor of your family, your country, State and the interests of your country. Will (iam?) will, be into see me shortly after the Christmas holidays are over, and should you need anything more write me and I wll send it by him. You will deliver my compliments to Mr. Walton and Mr. Pool.

: I resign you to the protection of that God who gave you life with an anxious hope of seeing you return well when your term of service has expired.

V. Harry Bryan (sometimes called Henry), son of Hardy and Winifred Bryan, was born on May 7, 1786, in Johnston County, North Carolina, and died on March 16, 1857, near Newton Grove, Sampson County, North Carolina. He served as Captain in the War of 1812 (Col. McDonald's 1st Reg.) serving from September 24, 1814, to February 5, 1815. "With the return of peace Harry Bryan represented Johnston County in the North Carolina House of Commons, 1815-17, and again in 1819. He suffered considerable losses because of offering himself as security for others. How much he lost we do not know, but it is plain that he forsook Johnston and moved to Sampson County" and moved to a farm near Newton Grove which his wife had inherited. In 1815, he married Susan Blackman, the daughter of Josiah Blackman and Mary Ester Williams Blackman.

They had the following five children:

- 1. William Hardy Bryan (1817-1897). More later.
- 2. Susan Elizabeth Bryan married Joab Cox and lived near Newton Grove, N. C. Their children were: William Washington Cox who married Margaret Robinson; Susan Elizabeth Cox who married John Cogdell; Christopher Columbus never married; David Cox died young; Andrew Cox who married Flora McCalup; Louise Cox who married William West; Carrie Cox who married Roland Futrell; and Charles Carroll Cox who married_
- 3. Sarah Almira Bryan never married.

- 4. Josiah Henry Bryan, born October 14, 1828, married Mary Alice Blackman and had the following children: Emma Ella Bryan who married a Mr. Summerlin of Wayne County: Clara Middleton Bryan died young; William Alton Bryan who married and lived in Tampa, Florida; Henry DeVane Bryan who married and lived in Tampa, Florida; Susan Alice Bryan died young; David Hinton Bryan who married Eliza McClenny of Goldsboro and had several children; John Bryan who married Sallie Lee of Wayne County. After the death of his first wife; Josiah Henry Bryan married Mary Williams and had the following children: Winston Bryan who married Sallie Jackson of Sampson County; Ada Bryan who married Richard Carr of Clinton, N. C.: Nannie Elizabeth Bryan who married Lisker Wiliams of Newton Grove, N. C.; Dr. Norman Bryan (dentist) who married Mary Pilliams of Lakeland, Florida; Albert Bryan who married Isabelle Weeks of Newton Grove, N. C.; Florence Winafred Bryan who married Johnny Cogdell of Newton Grove, N. C.; Joseph Bryan who married Kate Williams of Lakeland, Florida; Marion Livingston Bryan who married Annie Jinnette of Goldsboro, N. C.
- Dr. John D. Bryan (dentist) married Cornelia _____ and lived in Lumberton, N. C. No children. He was a 1st Lieutenant in the Confederate Army and served under his brother, James D. Bryan.
- 6. James D. Bryan; enlisted in the Confederate Army on April 15, 1861, at Fort Macon, N. C.; was promoted to Captain of Co. "A", 27th N. C. Infantry; wounded at Bristow Station, Virginia, and died in Richmond, Virginia, on October 30, 1863. Never married.

VI. William Hardy Bryan (son of Harry and Susan Blackman Bryan) was born in 1817, on a plantation near Smithfield, N. C. He married his cousin, Mrs. Sarah Eason Vinson (born 1829), the daughter of John Eason, Jr., and Elizabeth Williams Eason. Sarah Vinson Bryan had a son, Edgar Vinson, by her first husband. Elizabeth Williams (1810-1891) was the daughter of Isaac Williams (1775-1830) and Elizabeth Bryan Blackman. Isaac Williams was the son of Col. Nathan Williams (1735-1796), officer of the American Revolution and of his wife, Sarah Averitt. Sarah Eason had the following brothers and sisters:

- Euphemia Eason who married Dr. John Monk and had the following children: Anna Monk who married Thomas Underwood and lived at Newton Grove; Flora Monk who married Dr. Robert West and lived in Salisbury; Katie Monk who married Dr. George Caton and lived in New Bern, N. C.
- 2. John Eason who married Katie Jarman but had no children.
- Julius Eason who married Charity Cox and lived in Goldsboro, N. C. Their children were: John Eason who married and lived in Goldsboro, N. C.: Sam Eason who married Carrie Hooks and lived in Goldsboro,

 $N.\ C.;$ and Florence Eason who married Robert Creech and lived in Goldsboro, $N.\ C.$

William Hardy Bryan lived on a plantation near Newton Grove, N. C. He represented Sampson County in the N. C. Legislature, 1873-75. William Hardy and Sarah Bryan had one son, James William Bryan. More later.

VII. James Williams Bryan, born July 22, 1863, near Newton Grove, N. C., and died on October 22, 1939. He was a farmer, nurseryman, and teacher. He attended Glenwood Academy in Sampson County. He was married on December 20, 1893, to Irene Carroll (born October 6, 1871, and died on May 30, 1927), the daughter of Francis Marion (Frank) and Eloise Taylor Carroll, of Turkey, N. C. Irene Carroll was educated at Harrell's Store Academy, living with her uncle, Knox Taylor. She finished her education at Oxford Female Seminary in Oxford, N. C., and taught near Clinton for a short while. She was a much loved and respected teacher. They had the following children: Pauline Elizabeth Bryan, William Carroll Bryan, James Edgar Bryan, Raymond Arthur Bryan, Robert Emmet Bryan, Margaret Eloise Bryan, Norwood Eason Bryan, Byron Eugene Bryan, and Josephine Rebecca Bryan, born April 13, 1915, and died April 9, 1919.

Pauline Elizabeth Bryan, a daughter of James Williams and Irene Carroll Bryan. Born October 12, 1894, in Newton Grove, N. C. Graduated from Newton Grove High School in 1913. Attended Pineland School for Girls in Salemburg, N. C. 1914-1915. Attended Oxford College, Oxford, N. C., 1917-1918. Taught school in Sampson County, N. C., 1918-1923. Married Price Ollen Bizzell May 23, 1923.

Price Ollen Bizzell, son of Walter Asher and Ellen Denning Bizzell, born December 15, 1892, in Newton Grove, N. C. Graduated from Newton Grove High School, attended Valparaiso University, Valparaiso, Indiana, 1913-1914. Served in the U. S. Army 1917-1918. Married Pauline Elizabeth Bryan.

Sarah Louise Bizzell was born December 30, 1924, in Goldsboro, N. C. She attended Fayetteville Public Schools and graduated from Fayetteville High School in 1941. She is a Dental Laboratory Technician and served as President of North Carolina Dental Assistants Association 1958-1959.

Frank Carroll Bizzell was born February 11, 1929, in Greenville, N. C. He attended Fayetteville Public Schools and graduated from Fayetteville



High School in 1947. He served in the U. S. Army 1951-1953.

Betsy Bryan Bizzell was born October 28, 1930, in Goldsboro, N. C. She attended Fayetteville Public Schools, graduated from Fayetteville High School in 1948, attended Mars Hill College and graduated from Duke University School of Nursing in 1952.

William Pitt Bizzell was born October 28, 1937, in Fayetteville, N. C. He attended Fayetteville Public Schools, graduated from Fayetteville High School in 1956 and attended North Carolina State University 1956-1960, receiving his B. S. in Civil Engineering. He served two years in the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers. He is a Registered Professional Engineer. He married Nancy Ellen Blackwell, March 17, 1961.

William Carroll and Lanie (Horton) Bryan

William Carroll Bryan was the son of James Williams and Irene (Carroll) Bryan, born December 6, 1895, Newton Grove, Sampson County, N. C. He attended Newton Grove Elementary School, graduated from Buies Creek Academy (now Campbell College) in 1916. Attended University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, N. C. On May 9, 1970, he received an award from Campbell College for outstanding alumnus of his class. After discharge from Army, World War I, with rank of Sqt., he went to Orlando, Florida, became co-owner of Bryan Realty Company for several years, came back to North Carolina in 1927 and was associated with W. P. Rose Construction Company and T. A. Loving and Company for approximately twelve years. During this time he lived in Columbia, S. C., and Williamsburg, Va. In 1938 he became Vice-President and co-owner of Builders Supplies Co. of Goldsboro, N. C., and was responsible for opening a branch of this company in Jacksonville, N. C. He delivered the first load of building material that went into the construction of Camp Lejeune, N. C. Served on the Board of Trustees of Campbell College for ten years and as Chairman for two years. In 1952 he helped organize First National Bank of Eastern North Carolina. Served as President for first nine years and Chairman of Board of Directors until a few years before his death.

William Carroll Bryan served on the Selective Service Board, twenty years a Kiwanian and Past President, Charter member of the Chamber of Commerce, helped organize United Fund in Onslow County, Chairman of Emergency Relief for several years, served on Board of Directors of the American Red Cross, Charter member Jacksonville Country Club, member Onslow County Historical Association, Past President of Green

Thumbers Horticulture Society, and member U. S. O. He was a 32nd degree Scottish Rite Mason and Shriner, as well as a member of the American Legion. He was a member of First Baptist Church and was a Sunday School teacher and a life-time Deacon.

He married Lanie Horton of Bunn, N. C., in 1926. They had no children. His special hobbies were fishing and collecting sea shells with his wife, who arranged for display of more than 14,000 sea shells and had given them to libraries, classrooms, hospitals, reception centers and other places.

William Carroll Bryan died September 21, 1975.

Lanie Horton Bryan was born in Bunn, Franklin County, N. C., December 30, 1901, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Walter Herbert Horton. Her father operated a general merchandise store. She has a stepmother and eleven children born into her family.

Lanie attended Bunn High School and graduated with all honors at 15, being the only member in her class. She attended East Carolina Teachers College (East Carolina University now), majoring in elementary education. She taught the 6th grade for seven years in public schools, including Clinton, New Bern and Elizabeth City. She attended summer school yearly at Wake Forest or University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill.

Lanie married William Carroll Bryan on September 25, 1926. They lived in many cities and states where she was most active in church and community life. In Jacksonville she was chosen "Community Woman of the Year" in 1960 by the Jaycees. She taught an adult ladies Sunday School Class for 30 years, 1939-1969. Her hobbies include birds and collecting sea shells and sharing them with Garden Clubs, Libraries and special centers.

James Edgar and Mary (Zealy) Bryan Written by Robert E. Bryan

James Edgar Bryan, son of James William and Irene (Carroll) Bryan was born May 5, 1898, died February 5, 1953. Attended Newton Grove School through grammar school, after which he attended Dell Prep School, a private school at Delway, N. C., in lower Sampson Co. After this he completed his formal education by finishing prep school and a business course at Buies Creek Academy, now Campbell College.

Most other factual information relating to Jim Bryan is included in a printed pamphlet reproduced herein concerning the James E. and Mary Z. Bryan Foundation, Inc. In addition to the information in this pamphlet, however, it might be mentioned that he was a Director on the statewide



Board of First Citizens Bank and Trust Co., and a close friend of the late Mr. R. B. Holding who organized this bank.

Jim Bryan was known to be a rather rough and tough speaking character at times but as the late Rev. A. J. Smith, his old pastor, told one of his brothers at the time of his death this so-called rough and tough talk was only surface deep and that actually he had a heart of gold. This heart of gold was exemplified many, many times as he would give any one in need literally the shirt off his back. I think a fair statement would be that he had by far more friends throughout the State of North Carolina at the time of his death than any other member of this family.

The following is taken from the James E. and Mary Z. Bryan Foundation, Inc., Student Loan Plan pamphlet:

Origin of the Bryan Foundation

Born on a farm in Sampson County near Newton Grove, North Carolina, in 1898, James E. Bryan was one of nine children of James W. and Irene Carroll Bryan. His parents believed very strongly in the value of education. Well schooled for their time, they took an active interest in current educational affairs and though of modest means, they attempted to send all of their children through college. One of James Bryan's brothers recalls a case of their dedication to this ideal. A well-intentioned neighbor advised their father to add to the size of his farm. The neighboring farm was not only available but reasonably priced. Their father replied that he considered the education of his children to be a wiser investment and he was unable to invest in both.

James Bryan began his business career in the nineteen twenties as a bookkeeper for a Goldsboro firm where he soon became a partner. It was here that he labored and prospered until the advent of the Great Depression, when the firm joined thousands of others throughout the country in going out of business. During those early years in business, he married Elizabeth Allen, daughter of Judge and Mrs. W. R. Allen of Goldsboro, but their marriage was short-lived as she died during the birth of their first child, whose death coincided with hers.

In 1930, James Bryan married Mary Zealy, a daughter of Dr. and Mrs. A. H. Zealy of Goldsboro. From the beginning of their marriage, Mary Bryan exhibited a keen interest in the business and contributed greatly to its success. In 1932, the young couple found themselves with one remaining asset from James Bryan's years in business — their home. Being realists, they assessed their situation and promptly moved into a maid's quarters in the garage so that they might rent their home. With typical self-confidence, James Bryan immediately formed an aggregates in business in Goldsboro. With hard work, his small business, created on a

shoestring, flourished and grew to become Bryan Rock and Sand Company of Raleigh, the source of the Bryan Foundation funds.

James Bryan was convinced of the value of a good education in preparing an individual to better use his talents. So deep was his conviction that after his untimely death in 1953 at the age of 55, it became known that after providing for his wife (they had no children) he left his entire estate to be used for higher education of "worthy and needy" North Carolina boys and girls who would otherwise not have the opportunity for additional education. James Bryan's practical nature was exemplified by his recognition of the fact that a college education would not necessarily be the best experience for all, so he included means for study in recognized trade and vocational schools.

At James Bryan's death, Mary Bryan rose to meet the challenge of the flourishing business she had owned jointly with her husband, by assuming managerial responsibility. Under her guidance, the business continued to prosper. Having been a graduate of the University of North Carolina and a teacher for several years, Mary Bryan shared her husband's interest in education and immediately set about implementing his last wish by devoting her energy toward organizing the James E. Bryan Foundation. Mary Bryan came to an untimely death four years after her husband. Her devotion to education was further manifested when her will became known, as she had bequeathed one-half of her entire estate to the Bryan Foundation.

As a lasting memorial to Mary Zealy Bryan, a generous contributor to the Foundation, the Board of Directors changed the name to the James E. and Mary Z. Bryan Foundation, Inc.

Bryan Foundation Helps Students

The James E. and Mary Z. Bryan Foundation, Inc., Raleigh, continues to make loans and grants to North Carolina students to aid them in their education. Due to the increased availability of insured loans guaranteed by the federal government, the James E. and Mary Z. Bryan Foundation has made more direct grants to high schools, colleges, academies and vocational schools for them to give Bryan Scholarships to North Carolina students who qualify under the guidelines of the Foundation.

The James E. and Mary Z. Bryan Foundation has granted over \$2,000,000 in financial assistance to North Carolina students.

Bryon E. Bryan of Mount Olive serves as president and chairman of the Board of the Foundation along with A. H. Zealy, Jr., Goldsboro, vicepresident, Lewis R. Holding, Raleigh, secretary-treasurer. The Bryan Foundation Student Assistance Programs are administered by College Foundations, Inc., Raleigh, Duffy L. Paul, executive director.



It is the intention of the officers of this foundation to keep the principal intact and only spend the income from the principal.

These companies combined, were the oldest and largest American Oil jobberships in the two Carolinas, and among the largest in the Atlanta Region consisting of all the Southeast



The question about where Sarah M. McGreger U. Bryan and her family is not settled as for as I am concerned. That would be 5 graves plus the children of JBU and Julia HU 3, a total of 8 graves. They have in last few years tried to plot the graves and identify lost graves. I was told there are only a few unmarked graves. None of them are in area where the Upchurches and M McGregor are buried. Plus there is not record of where Julia Hardison's father and his brother are buried. The other factor that bother's me about where they are buried or not buried in Boxelder cem. is that we always had cemetery cleaning days 2-3 times a yr. Mother always had us to go with her and Aunt Mary always attended. I feel if the graves had were in Boxelder C Aunt Mae would have cleaned the graves and had us helping her. It would make sense for them to have been buried there because Sarah was a founding member of the church. The Alston family donated the land for the church and for the cemetery. A clause in the papers state that if the church is ever closed, the land goes to the cemetery. I vaguely remember my mother telling me that when the cemetery opned up, some people who had family members buried in the old cemetery moved them to the new cemetery. I donot remember for sure why she told me this, but I think I asked questions about the old cem. I donot remember if I asked about our family.





Celebrating the yuletide spirit

at Oak View Park

In his poem "Boy Scouts on a Great Hike," poet Fred A. 2011qc Olds described how Oak View Park epitomizes the natural beauty of the Old South.

And, its stately visions is still

evident today.

When entering the drive onto the property, formerly called the Wyatt Farm, you can again see it as it used to be when Historic Oak View County Park's holiday celebration kicks off with "Holidays Around the World," an exhibit featuring Christmas trees decorated from 13 different countries.

People are invited to come and learn about holiday traditions from all over the world. Sponsored by Wake Parks and Recreation and Wake Homemakers Extension, "Holidays Around the World" is Dec. 12-15. Located in the new Farm History Center at the park, this event will be open from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Thursday and Friday, noon to 7 p.m. Saturday, and 1-7 p.m. on Sunday.

Oak View's holiday celebrations climax with a candlelight tour and open house at the historic farmhouse on Saturday, Dec. 14, from 5:30-7:30 p.m. The public is invited for holiday music, storytelling for the kids and hot refreshments.

These events become a part of Oak View's rich history that began when Benton S.D. and Burchette Williams acquired 200 acres of the farm in 1835. In 1855, a two-story Greek

Revival-style farmhouse was built at Oak View. The name "Oak View" was derived from four large oak trees once located near the main house.

By 1860, the Williams farm - now over 1,000 acres - produced cotton, corn, wheat, oats, hay, peas, sweet potatoes, livestock and butter cultivated by family members and 10 slaves.

Benton Williams served as one of four Wake County delegates to the N.C. Constitutional Convention of 1868. He died in 1870 and is buried in a family cemetery at Oak View.

Job P. Wyatt and Phil Taylor acquired Oak View in 1886 and operated the farm with wage laborers and a superintendent, primarily producing cotton. A cotton gin house, livestock barn and carriage house were built in 1900. George Williams served as farm manager.

In 1911, Will Wyatt inherited Oak View and, by 1919, George Williams retired as manager leading to the hiring of James A. Jones as superintendent. Wyatt and Jones started to diversity the farm's operations.

In addition to planting over 100 acres of cotton, they raised beef cattle and planted a pecan grove to supplement the farm's income.

The boll weevil forced Wyatt and Jones to abandon cotton in 1929 and further diversify operations to include vegetables and dairy products. Produce from Oak View was sold at Raleigh's City Market.

From 1940-41, the family of J. Gregory Poole Sr. acquired Oak View and remodeled the farmhouse in Colonial Revival style. James E. and Mary Z. Bryan. owned the farm from 1944-55," preceding Chauncey and Ella Jones.

The farm was purchased by Wake County in 1984 and, in '89, the Oak View Restoration Steering Committee led an effort to save the farm complex. The committee began making plans for the restoration and use of Historic Oak View.

The buildings were stabilized by Wake County, and the committee developed a master plan, including restoring the main house for office space, adding space for public and private functions, and restoring the outbuildings to display and demonstrate the historical development of Wake, and agricultural life and practices.

It also included researching and restoring the cemetery; adding formal and herb gardens; building paths through the pecan grove; and constructing a new multipurpose building, a visitor greeting shelter and a band


Of the 109 pecan trees on the farm, 79 were destroyed by Hurricane Fran, but will be replaced and cared for as the original planters did. Only 17 acres are left of the original farm.

The public is invited to visit Historic Oak View Park. To arrange a group outing, call 250-1013. Kirk Smith is the manager of Oak View and Sean Sonderman is the assistant manager.







On Wednesday aftermoon, November 2nd, your correspondent found himself beside a bonny little girl, en route for the splendid residence of Phares Yates, Esq. of Swift Creek Township, Wake County. Either the balmy aftermoon, the instinct which taught him it was a wedding occasion, or a pair of laughing eyes beside him, made the road mighty smooth the distance mighty short, for ere he knew it, fifteen miles had been traveled, his destination reached, to find already assembled a large crowd of friends to witness the marriage of Prof. J. Frastus Ballentine to Miss Iillie, the beautiful and accomplished daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Phares Yates.

Hiss Mary Banks, one of Make's fairest daughters, was organist, and as the first sweet solemn strain of the wedding march fell upon the still-sweet amid the hush that always pervades an altar like it. While "the bride and groom tarry" the following couples, viz: Mr. K. B. Johnson with Miss Anna Yates, Mr. Emmet Yates with Miss Molly Barnes, Mr. Needham Bryan with Miss Lena Upchurch entering to witness the beautiful marriage ceremony, which made a loving trusting couple one, by Dr. Hall, a Baptist Minister of Raleigh. The bride who is always pretty, looked indescribably sweet in her beautiful bridal costume while the pretty young ladies in their faultless evening dresses, the brilliantly illumed parlor, combined to make it just the prettiest marriage scene the writer has ever witnessed.

The congratulations were profuse and the bridal presents were numerous. And after this subsided the entire party repaired to the large dining room and without a dissenting voice paid their respects to the feast which could best be described in these words: It was in perfect harmony with the appearance of the bride, and her mother had supervised it. The evening was the most perfect of a lifetime, and was whirled away as only young people know best how to; but like other evenings, its pleasure had an end.

"One by one the roses fell." One by one sweet voices died away into musical pulsations, one by one and two by two this happy party went away, one by one lamps went out; darkness succeeded light, silence followed music and the Yates mansion was wrapped in slumber, and this happy event was a thing of the past.

Thursday morning dawned in all the beauty of the day which preceded it, and the happy couple with a few friends proceeded to the home of the groom where an elegant reception awaited them. Seldom has a couple embarked on a life voyage under more favorable circumstances, a calmer sea, a brighter sky, a more gentle breeze. The home to which they have gone is perfect in detail, surrounded by every creature comfort, and adorned with everything that ample means and refined taste could suggest made by one who was guided in all of its arrangements by a heart that loved and will be presided over by her for whom it was made with dignity and all Christian graces, which have been so characteristic of the young bride's life. A vote of thanks is due Mr. George McCullers and Misses Mary Banks and Florence Stephenson for the splendid music with which they delighted all.

In 1763, William Owen Medlin (Sr.) was included on a list of insolvents in Granville County.

In 1764, William Owen Medlin (Sr.) (Madlen) (Meddelon), planter from Bute County, sold 100 acres of land to John Franklin on north side of Crooked Creek in Bute County adjoining William Maynard and Julius Alford, witnessed by William Maynard, James Bolton, and Julius Alford.

Bute County, which bordered Virginia, was formed from Granville County in 1764 and was named after John Stewart, Earl of Bute, who was the first Lord of Treasury under King George III. Bute County occupied the part of Granville County formerly known as St. John's Parish. The Medlin families slowly migrated from southeastern Bute (later Franklin) County down into the heartland of North Carolina.

On August 15, 1764, William Owen Medlin (Sr.) purchased 100 acres of land in Johnston County on the south side of Moccasin (Mockerson) Creek.

In 1766, William Owen Medlin (Sr.), Joseph Medlin, Timothy Ryal Medlin, and William (Owen) Medlin (Jr.) were listed as taxpayers in Bute County.

On April 25, 1767, John Medlin (Madlens) received a land grant from Governor William Tryon for 100 acres on Rich Land Creek, joining Joseph Dunn, Weirs line, and Henry Atkinson in the section of old Cumberland County that was later partitioned off in 1784 as Moore County.

On February 15, 1768, Timothy Ryal (Royal) Medlin, planter from Bute County, sold 100 acres of land to Andrew (Drury) Cade in Johnston County on the north side of the Little River and a fork of Julises Branch, adjacent to land owned by Drewry Cade, witnessed by James Batten and Joshua Mize.

On June 3, 1768, in Bute County, 380 acres were sold to John Young at the sale of the estate of John Medlin (Modglin), deceased, held by Julius Nichols, late sheriff, as recorded in August 1768 court by deputy sheriff William Moore. Joseph Wright was listed among the buyers.

On February 6, 1769, William Owen (Oen) Medlin (Meddelen), planter in Johnston County, sold 100 acres on the south side of Moccasin Creek adjacent to Elisha Strickland in Johnston County to Demsey Sumner, witnessed by James Bolton, Julius Johnson and Drury Cade.

In February 1769 in Johnston County Court, William Owen (Oen) Medlin proyed a deed from Sampson Bracwell and Christian Bracwell to Pettipool Massey. Needham Bryan was present and was appointed a justice for Johnston County by commission from the governor. or m

On March 10, 1769, William Owen Medlin (Sr.) bought 177 acres of land in Bute County on the south side of Crooked Creek from Julius Johnson, witnessed by James Alford, Robert Chamblee, and James Strickland.

On March 20, 1769, John Medlin sold to Joseph Dunn the 100 acres of land granted on Richland Creek in old Cumberland County (later Moore County).

On September 22, 1779, Timothy Ryal Medlin was issued a land grant by the State of North Carolina for 200 acres on Buck Branch in Franklin County.

On October 29, 1779, Timothy Ryal Medlin sold to John Gay 100 acres in Franklin County adjoining land that had been previously owned by Edward Haithcock, Frances Bradley, and Nathaniel Carter.

In 1779, William Owen Medlin (Jr.) was included on a tax list in Wilkes County.

In 1780, Bryan(t) Medlin, Sr., Bryan(t) Medlin, Jr., Benjamin Medlin, Nicholas Medlin, and William (Owen) Medlin, Sr. were listed as taxpayers in Dobbs County. Bryant Medlin, Sr., Bryant Medlin, Jr., and Benjamin Medlin were living in 1780 in Captain John Granger's district of Dobbs County, which included the townships of Contentnea Neck, Vance, and Sandhill, on the north side of the Neuse River, above Kinston, in what became Lenoir County in 1791.

As best as can be determined from inconsistent census data, Bryant Medlin, Jr. must have been born around 1764, probably in Bute (Franklin) County, North Carolina.

In 1781, Timothy Ryal Medlin purchased land from Abraham Rogers in Franklin County.

On September 13, 1782 in Franklin County, Martin Hall sold to Alexius Mador Foster 340 acres on Crooked Creek joining Shadrach Medlin, William Taunt, John Dent, Jesse Horn, and Giles Driver.

On December 25, 1782, Timothy Ryal Medlin sold to Frances Bradley the 100 acres in Franklin County previously owned by Edward Haithcock.

In 1782, William Owen Medlin (Jr.) was included in a tax list in Wilkes County.

On March 30, 1784, Bryant Medlin (Jr.) bought 150 acres of land from Benjamin Sellers on the north side of Bawdy Swamp in Johnston County, adjacent to Colonel Williams, John Whitley, Joseph Edwards, and Richard Warren, the sale of which was witnessed by Benjamin Medlin and Benjamin Williams, Jr.

On September 14, 1784, Bryant Medlin sold 150 acres on the north side of Bawdy Swamp in Johnston County to Richard Warren, witnessed by Benjamin Medlin. Both of these deeds were admitted into Johnston County Court records on December 2, 1784, with Needham Bryant, William Avera, and Richard Warren present as justices.


In 1784, Bryan(t) Medlin (Jr.) and Nicholas Medlin were listed as taxpayers in Johnston County in Captain Joseph Boon's Company.

On September 9, 1784, in Moore County, Joel Medlin entered 100 acres on south side of Lower Little River bordering Robert Smith.

Between 1785 and 1787 in Moore County, Thomas Woods and Fereby Medlin were issued a marriage license, with John Medlin posting security.

On May 31, 1785, Bryan(t) Medlin is listed in Johnston County Court as insolvent.

In 1786, William (Owen) Medlin (Sr.) appears on a Johnston County tax list.




