



Original Siamese twins lived

They moved to North Carolina and have about 150 descendants.

WHITE PLAINS, N.C. — They're buried as they lived, side by side, in a plot that seems at once too small for their stature and a perfect fit with their surroundings.

Their grave marker is no bigger or more ornate than most others in the cemetery behind the small white Baptist church they helped build on land they donated nearly 150 years ago. The few facts carved in stone — Chang and Eng came into the world together on May 11, 1811, and died together on Jan. 17, 1874 — barely scratch the surface of this richly complex, real-life saga of the original Siamese twins.

They surely were among the most exotically foreign creatures this part of the world had ever seen. And yet their story — and that of their descendants — is quintessentially American.

"Once when I was 8 or 9, we were sitting around the table at home talking about famous people," recalls Milton Haynes, 64, of Raleigh, N.C. "And I said, 'Who are we?' I can still remember my daddy saying, 'You can tell 'em we're descended from Siamese twins.'"

It's the last Saturday in July, and Haynes is waiting his turn in a long buffet line in the White Plains Recreational Building. To his right, the U.S. and North Carolina flags are displayed on a beige brick wall. Dead ahead, a couple of tables laid end-to-end nearly buckle beneath the weight of homemade casseroles, platters of chicken and bowls of baked beans and banana pudding. The excited chatter of reunited cousins and great-aunts fills what little air circulates in the low-slung building.

It could be any one of countless family reunions held in small Southern towns on sultry summer afternoons. On their name tags, Haynes and his wife, Chase, also have printed the name "Chang." Across the room, Jessie Bunker Bryant, a statuesque woman in her early 70s bent low over a table of fat notebooks filled with genealogical information, has written "Eng"

All-American lives

So has Sarah Bunker, at 11 one of the youngest of the approximately 150 descendants of the twins packed into this small building. "I don't know how many 'greats' I am," sighs Sarah, who has no siblings and shudders slightly at the thought of being permanently attached to a certain pesky young relative.

Indeed, most family ties are figurative. For Chang and Eng Bunker, they were literal, although it is the way the two men worked with, around and through their condition that their descendants come together to celebrate.

Born in Thailand

Born in what is now Thailand, connected by a band of cartilage at the base of the breastbone, Chang and Eng unwittingly spawned the phrase Siamese twins (the accepted term now is "conjoined") and were initially considered to be such a bad omen that they were ordered put to death. Though they were spared, even being invited at age 13 to visit the king's palace, Chang and Eng's shared life was hardly their own for years.

Shortly before the twins turned 18, a Scottish trader paid a small sum of money to the boys' mother and got permission from the king to take them to New York. "The Siamese Double Boys," as an exhibition poster billed them, spent the next three years touring the United States and Great Britain with an act that largely featured them tumbling. In Britain alone, more than 300,000 people paid to see them. But after promoters and exhibitors took their cuts, little money was left for the twins. Soon after turning 21, the twins went into business for themselves in the United States.

By 1839, Chang and Eng were in need of a vacation and a career change. They found both in Wilkesboro, N.C., where they applied for U.S. citizenship and set about becoming farmers in an area known as Trap Hill. Adopting an arbitrary last name, Bunker, they began sinking roots. In a double ceremony

in April 1843, Chang married Adelaide Yates, with whom he would eventually have 10 children, and Eng married her sister, Sallie, with whom he would have 11. In 1845, the two growing families moved to a bigger house on a large piece of farmland near Mount Airy.

They lived in Andy's town

Today, Mount Airy is best known as the picturesque birthplace of TV's Andy Griffith. Its downtown is dotted with a Floyd's City Barbershop, a Snappy Lunch and other establishments offering fond reminders or actual souvenirs of the fictional Mayberry. But in the mid-1800s, the Bunker twins — having toured with P.T. Barnum and appeared onstage around the world — loomed largest in this area.

Today, the Interstate 74 runs through what was once their farmland in White Plains. The original White Plains Baptist Church stands

on their donated land, not far from Bunker Road. The "double chop" method Chang and Eng developed to fell large trees is still used by pairs of woodchoppers. The Bunkers grew tobacco, among other crops, and owned slaves.

Haynes contacted Jessie Bunker Bryant, one of Eng's great-granddaughters, and the resulting reunion at a church in Wallberg, N.C., drew about 175 people. Since then, Chang and Eng descendants from as far away as Idaho and Washington state have come to North Carolina for the annual reunion held on the last Saturday in July.

"We figured since these two gentlemen had never been separated, we should try to get together," says Haynes, inching his way along the buffet line at this year's gathering.

Surely the most unlikely guest at this year's reunion was 30-year-old Darin Strauss of New York. Strauss' first novel, "Chang and Eng," was published this summer to much acclaim. Starting with details from the twins' history, Strauss broadened his story into a "haunting exploration of themes relating to identity and all the books for all the kids," reports Blackmon.

"He seems a little nervous," says Haymore, watching two women position themselves on either side of Strauss for a photo.

Twins are rediscovered

As family members are opening up, talking about and celebrating their exotic ancestors, the local community seems to have rediscovered Chang and Eng. Beyond Strauss' book, there now is an entire room of exhibits on Chang and Eng at the Mount Airy Visitors Center. The Surry County Commission recently voted to name the bridge that crosses over Stewart's Creek on busy U.S. 601 in honor of the twins. And "Twin Sunday" is even making a comeback at the circa-1956 brick White Plains Baptist Church that stands alongside the original white wood structure.

"When I first came here, (Eng's grandson) Woo was still coming, and he had one of the original big chairs the twins sat in," says Dale Hawkes, director of visitation and busing at the church where he's been for 28½ years. "For a while we had Twin Sunday. We got people to bring a guest to church, and Woo brought the chair."

Back up the road in Mount Airy, the meeting room in the Hampton Inn owned by Betty Bunker Blackmon is named the Bunker Room. It features pictures of the twins and a poster for "Chang and Eng," an original show that debuted recently in Singapore and went on to become the longest-running musical in that country's history. Next winter, it will tour Australia, Thailand and possibly the United States.

Yet for all the big deal being made in the outside world about Chang and Eng, inside the White Plains Rec Hall on this last Saturday in July, the moments are smaller and the connections arguably deeper. Here, it's all about pulling people in and putting things together. "He needs to be taking notes," says Marge Jenkins of Winston-Salem, smiling as she watches her 80-year-old husband, Louie — whose father's half-sister married one of Eng's sons — clasp hands with yet another rediscovered "branchwater kin."

"Please make corrections on pages."

The handwritten plea appears on the first page of a big notebook whose cover simply reads "Eng." Packed with photos, family trees, newspaper clippings, even funeral programs, the notebooks are the work of Jessie Bunker Bryant,

who's seeking more information for a book she plans to compile on the twins and their descendants.

"It's something that when you start it, it gets in your blood," says Bryant, who later joins reunion organizer Jim Haynes at a microphone to sort people for group photos according to which child of Chang or Eng they were descended from.

Souvenirs are hot now

Indeed, as the lunch hour draws near, the room fills with excited chatter. Sisters Harriet McMaster and Margaret McNeely are first-timers, but they arrive bearing several pieces of the twins' engraved silverware. Charleston resident McNeely, a great-granddaughter of Chang's, also owns one of the twins' double chairs, which she recently had appraised for an episode of the popular PBS program "Antiques Roadshow." Until the show airs, she's keeping mum about what the appraisers said. But she delightedly displays a snapshot

of "Roadshow's" own celebrity twins, the identical blond appraisers, Leigh and Leslie Keno, seated side-by-side in the chair.

Underlying everything at the Bunker family reunion is a quiet sense of pride. During lunch, Dick Shoemaker is an ebullient purveyor of colorful stories about Patrick Henry Bunker, the fifth child of Eng and the man from whom he is directly descended. Yet when asked if he is proud of Chang and Eng, immigrants who made good here despite almost impossible odds, the Gwinnett man drops his head almost shyly.

"Yes, I am," he says softly, but emphatically. "I think they were

intelligent men. And they had a of perseverance."

Even the man who wrote book says as much — and more.

Half an hour into the reunion Strauss shows up with a big box chicken from Long John Silver's his contribution to the feast.

He hasn't brought any copies his book, but some of the descendants have. He signs a few and listens patiently to family members who want to tell him what they think of his work. After lunch Strauss is called to the microphone where he thanks the descendants for their hospitality, and assures them he understands if there are any bruised feelings as a result of his novel. His intent was not to sensationalize the twins' lives, he says, but rather to do them justice.

"They are two of the most heroic people in American history," says.

Three hours after getting underway, the Bunker family reunion ends with a flurry of final snapshots being taken, phone numbers exchanged and talk of next year's reunion begun.

Afterward, descendant Betty Blackmon leads a small contingent of cars from the recreation center to a nearby country club, passing the original White Plains Baptist Church. Everyone waves at a cluster of descendants paying a post-reunion visit to Chang and Eng's grave.

The church was recently remodeled, according to Dale Hawkes, the longtime church associate. New heating system and carpeting were installed, and an ironic structural problem corrected.

Part of the church "was leaning," Hawkes explains, positioning his hands so that one remains upright while the other appears to be pulling away from it slightly. "The church pulled it back up."

The church is now used several times a week for children's and teen services, and classes for married couples.

After all this time, Chang and Eng's building is stronger than ever.


