- (1) 28 SEP 2011 - Prior interaction with Diane is filed with the People of James Pell Jones.
- (2) 27 SEP 2011 - TUE Diane called to inform me of the passing of her husband Jim on Sunday. I told her I had already learned of it. I told her of how the idea of a Tribute to Jim had come to my mind and that Diane Richards had inspired me to send it to her to read at the WCGS meeting on the evening of the 27th which I did. It will be published by WCGS & NCGS. Diane Jones approves of this - I will send her a copy & will make changes if she suggests any.

We had an extended conversation for 30+ minutes much of which was therapeutic for her. She told me a number of stories. I managed to work in the idea of me writing a letter to set in motion discussion on how to preserve Jim's LGP for posterity. Diane agrees but wants a six week grace period before she becomes involved. Diane gave me her private number & said I could give it to a select few. It is (919) 631-0472

In the end Diane asked me to tell her son Chris what I had done and she had a huge chat. He seems low key

I suggested we meet with Diane next May when we come to NC. She said she would be disappointed if we did not meet her

(2) 27 SEP 2011 - CONTINUED

Diane reminded me that Jim wore a cheap Timex watch - a way in which he & I were alike

Diane made a point that Jim was or was not religious - I am not sure which. She mentioned cremation so I think he was. She described their experience in selecting an urn unless Jim was alive

Jim came home on Thursday before he died on Sunday. Diane described how much Jim loved their bedroom and the way she decorated it and the aroma

Jim had a full suit - 3001 - (~~not~~ <sup>in</sup> shirt - deers?)

Below is someone's step-mother.

On his death bed a relative tried to talk to Jim about Jerome's witnesses. He could barely mouth "enough".

In the hospital Diane found 6 men in Jim's room letters, stoves. He murmured "Too much"

Diane's father had an IQ of 167 - Mensa Society & was very muscular. He was very kind and his boyfriend but took an immediate liking to Jim even though he came dressed casually

Diane + Jim lived for a time in Lewiston, ME so Diane placed his obituary there

Diane made some comment about the letter I wrote to Jim and I gather she or someone read all or parts of it to him. I did not entirely catch what Diane reported to me on this matter.

Diane made some comment about Yes or No for a memorial service for Jim - just what I am not sure.



③ Update on late OCT 2011 Interactions with Diane (Bush) Jones.

Earlier in the month I had several interactions with Diane's SIL Adrian Sigmore. Diane has never mentioned the interaction to me and did not in our late OCT phone calls. (I will let that sleeping dog lie)

21 OCT 2011 - AT about noon on FRI Diane reached me on my cell phone while I was in Kansas City, MO driving back from Des Moines (CAST junction) to St Louis. Gallaine answered and indicated I was driving in traffic and could not talk. I indicated I would call her later in the day when we arrived home. She was OK with this and gave Gallaine her new number (919) 629-7223

I tried repeatedly to reach her late on the 21st and repeatedly on the 22 (SAT) and on the 23rd leaving one message

Finally on the 24th (MON) Diane reached me saying right away - Phil I want you to listen to this. The connection was bad and I could not make out the message - so I asked if it was a recording of Jim's voice. She said no it was Sam Presley. Then she sort of broke down saying "why did it have to be so young?"

She vocalized her grief but soon had an interruption (phone call?) and said she would be back - my phone went dead. - I tried to get back to her but got a recording

on THUR the 27th I called her at 11:40 AM and we had a 30 minute conversation. She apologized for our broken conversation on the 24th. She went on to tell me stories about Jim and his interest in quality. Said her son wants her to sell the house. She will wait a year. I tried to console her. She sort of talked on and on. Wants to see us when we come next MAT. I am now even with her. The ball is in her court.

① Notes of Call from Diane Jones to RPU 5 MAY 2012

We (mostly she) chatted for about 20 minutes. She got my letter and wants to get together when we are in Raleigh. I will call her at her residential no (919) 629-7223 [she used \*82] and we will find a time. She mentioned having met at Yates Mill and having spoken with Rebecca Cope about me.

She went on at some length about how the cars were sold, how Jim's wife-lye were used & how he was married. She continues to be involved with Bob Schines of UNC who visited Jim often at the end.

She mentioned that the Land Grant materials were now stored downstairs but said nothing about proceeding to process same. I did not mention the subject. She did not mention Adrian's name (strange??)

She has bought a new vehicle to drive A.K.A. - Says Jim would not trade the jeep even if it did hurt their backs.

Talked a lot about son Chris (lives in Georgetown?) (wife Laverie?) - Has 3 kids - travels internationally - makes a lot of money - Extroverted - It sounds like he has had 2 hip replacements.

Daughter Jennifer (like Adrian) has severe problems growing - was so close to her Dad (maybe her growing is why Jim does not mark on the Land Grant records)

## A TRIBUTE TO JIM JONES

The family and friends of James Pell Jones were deeply saddened to learn of his passing on Sunday, September 25, 2011 at his home in Cary, NC after a brief and sudden onset of cancer which led to his demise at a youthful age of 67. I had known Jim less than a decade but in short order we became fast friends and before long began discussing the fact that we felt like surrogate brothers. If Jim were placed in a random lot of 10,000 individuals, my conviction is that he would be looked upon as the number one member of the lot in terms of intellect, drive, determination, ability to assemble information and ability to communicate. Having come to know and to become a dear friend of this unique individual, his passing caused to be laid upon my heart a pressing need to pen a tribute to him. One hopes this, however inadequate mere words may be, will illustrate to family and friends that Jim was viewed by his peers as a grand man.

My first meeting with Jim was at Yates Mill, near the spot of my birth and ancestral home, in which Jim led me through progress being made on his Wake County Land Grant Project and on his penchant for DNA work on his Jones heritage. Wishing to somehow show appreciation for his monumental work, I offered to pay \$200.00 for a DNA testing on an individual of his choosing. He graciously accepted. From that point on we grew very close. On our periodic visits to NC he and his wife, Diane, and my wife would have dinner out together. Session after session unfolded in Jim's home office and he regaled me with the wonders of his Land Grant Project in which I was deeply interested. I introduced him to like-minded friends and supplied him with anchor tracts.

Jim was generous with his time to help others. He spent a day with me traveling to Raeford, NC to give an Upchurch talk. He monitored the Power Point projection. In route a simple question on my part about antique coins led to an eloquent impromptu one-hour lecture on the subject, for which he was a respected authority far and wide. The clarity with which Jim could speak was renown. Given time to prepare his presentation became a tour-de-force.

After a few years Jim became so helpful in my Upchurch research that we conferred upon him the title of Honorary Upchurch, devoting a page to this announcement in the UPCHURCH BULLETIN.

Jim and I had numerous lengthy phone conversations about how our respective projects might find their way into print or on line so that others might benefit from our labors. Thus I came to know of his passion for bringing his projects to fruition. He was unselfish, thoughtful of others and generous in sharing his knowledge.

In truth, Jim was a prince of a fellow. Embodied in his persona of being a helpful, gentle giant was a rare intellect. He could expound intelligently on a wide variety of subjects. I was a joy to be in his presence. I know that others felt the same way. The human race has benefited from his passing this way. Oh that we could have had him with us for more seasons. Jim, Good and Faithful Servant, May You Rest in Peace!

- ⑦ 3 OCT 2011 - Diane called at 5:12 PM to say she had rec'd my letter and it was beautiful. She said she wanted her SIL Adrian Seymour to be responsible for what happens to Jim's Land Grant stuff. Apparently Jim told Adrian what he wanted done with the Land Grant Records. There was more to Diane's recording for which see her call to me on the 4th
- ⑧ 4 OCT 2011. Diane called about 8:00 AM and we talked for about 30 minutes. Apparently she had told Diane Richard to come for lunch and to "take" Jim's Land Grant Records. DR had told DJ that I had a grandiose plan for the Land Grant stuff. After getting my letter DJ said she wanted me & Adrian to decide on a plan and she would not let the records go without a plan. Apparently, the idea is to produce a book in which the records will appear. Adrian will call me. He leaves his office and goes to work at 3:00 PM. I told DJ that details re OLRL, WCES & DR are complex and I will relate this to ~~Jim~~ Adrian.
- ⑨ SAT 26 MAY 2012 - RPH VISIT WITH Diane - NCTMSP MAY/JUNE

Left Yates Mill at 3:30 PM after calling Diane Jones. We agreed to meet for coffee at the Hampton Inn and spent a little over an hour in a chat. Diane brought a book over to attention off Jim's couch. It had a nice write-up on him - very elegant book. After 2-4 months of normal grieving, anger, etc Diane - CONT.

(9) 26 MAY 2012 - CONTINUED

is now purposefully moving on with her life. The big issue is that in Dec her dau Jennifer stopped speaking to Diane or her brother Chris for no discernible reason. Diane attributes this to exceptional griefing & failed closure [I suspect there is more than not telling the - which is OK]. Diane asked if Adrian had contacted me and I explained our exchange of emails. She says Adrian does not believe in counseling (- which Jennifer needs)

Diane brought up the Land Grant Project only to say it is safely boxed away downstairs. I urged her to set aside all considerations of it until the family situation is resolved - Jim's 1/2 sister is coming soon and they count on her to bridge the gap.

Without implying that she would dump the Project on me or anything like that she said she would get in touch with me (at some indefinite future time). I explained that any of several repositories would have pros & cons for the repository and for the family.

I explained that the Project has great value, not from what it could be sold for but for how much genealogists and historians could benefit from it.

Diane explained that she was very upset at Rebecca Cope at Yates Mill because Rebecca said she would write a eulogy for Jim and is now apologizing for not doing so.

Diane & I parted feeling that we had talked about Jim & the family and had achieved proper closure. However, Diane talked about a dinner (such as for her next dau wedding of Marciano) that all seems to be fluff. Unless the Land Grant Project forces us to interact, I see no reason that Diane would be reaching out to me & vice versa - although I have some ongoing responsibility towards the Project.

(10) 9 DEC 2013

I called Diane at (919) 629-7223 [Earlier No = (919) 631-0412] [\* #2 unlisted]. I left a message & she called me back and we had a nice chat. Told her we are coming to NC. She very much wants to get together & said the Hampton Inn where we had coffee before would be fine. I am to call her when we get to Raleigh. She mentions seeing Ballantyne as well.

Diane says she is now dating. It seems she uses Google to find men friends. She describes to me her process to protect herself. She says she will never get sad again. Mentions shopping for her 14-year old GD.

I did not mention the Land-Grant Project.

(11) 17 DEC 2013 - TUE - NOTES OF RPU VISIT WITH DIANE

Notes of meeting with Diane (Bank) Jones 10:00 - 11:00 am in the Hampton Inn breakfast room.

Diane was dressed in leather - a real NY girl

She said her daughter is still not speaking to her, but Diane still seems in touch with Adrian

Her son Chris has the Land Grant company. It may have some minor personal stuff on it

Diane is taking Jones to sail on a meter-ass cruise

TUESDAY 17 DEC 2013 - CONTINUED

Diane quickly launched into the Land Grant issue saying she felt had about not resolve the issue. She says there is useful information there that someone might want. And at this point she very briefly asked if interest of DIANE (Richard?). I let this drop.

I broke in to report on VAFB and how it was not designed with Jim's Land Grant Project in mind. There could be a fit. After I described this in some detail Diane began to express a positive feeling about this as a place for Jim's work. I had to emphasize that there are the 2200x4 paper documents that are important but that stuff on the computer is a second vital part. In the end she said she would get the computer from ~~for~~ Chris.

She said Adrian might have a disk with the important stuff. She encouraged me to contact Adrian & see what he was and if he can help.

I stressed that we need VAFB to have a repository in Wake to accommodate the computer & paper assets. Also the VAFB Board members have to agree.

I mentioned Staley Smith as a collaborator. Diane says the Surgeon gave Jim an award - cartoon in ~~the~~ Ken Jones - a surgeon. I outlined various scenarios of VAFB gets the Land Grant Project. I mentioned time & money several times but Diane never took the bait on her gency money.

I explained the tax-exempt status of VAFB & how this might apply to Diane if she gives the stuff to VAFB. She did not respond to this one way or the other.

I appeared to keep her in the loop on VAFB. She seems to accept that Jim's Land Grant Project will go to VAFB. She says Jim would agree.

(12) 9 JAN 2014 - Following a phone conversation with Staley Smith on 8 JAN 2014 in which he agreed to participate in the free fence Land Grant Project I tried to reach Diane to get her reaction. Got a recording - left her a message to call me. She finally did call me on 2 FEB (see below). I had tried to contact her at weekly intervals in JAN but left no message

(13) 2 FEB 2014 - Diane called. Said her mother had died in MAY. In the meantime she has spent a lot of time with her apparent 89 year old mother in New York. The mother does not trust Diane & needs a nurse but will not. Diane said she is hospitalized in a center funded by their mother. Also Diane is upset in that her son Chris changed jobs & did not tell her. Her daughter Jennifer continues to shut out all family. (I later see her P. O. man had not responded to my emails of AUG 2013 or late DEC of 2013. Diane says she will be of no help going forward.).

I was eventually able to tell the story of how lucky we are to have Staley Smith be willing to participate. After some chatting Diane warmed to the idea & agreed that I should

Gene Staley has phone no & he could come over and see the Land Grant Collection & she might agree for him to take them. I explained she would still own the materials until an agreement to her satisfaction could be prepared.

I emphasized that the computer needs to be a part of the transfer package. She said she will work with Chris in deleting personal information from the computer & then make it available to us.

On 3 FEB 2014 I called Staley's briefcase in on the above. It will end in wife to go with him.

- (14) FEB 2014 - Although Staley had planned to follow up promptly on (13) it took a reminder a couple of weeks later from me to do so. He called Diane & had a warm reception and she agreed he should come to pick up the records. Then just before his appt to see her she called & left a message with Staley's secretary to cancel the appt. Staley reported this to me & we could not figure out if Diane had a change of heart or what?? In due course I will call them.

(15) 13 APR 2014. I called Diane twice & left a message the second time for her to call me unless she did. (919) 629-7223. First I did a catch-up. In the process I learned she was still intent on Staley County. Her cancellation had to do with a sudden need to travel to NY re her mother's illness. I will let Staley know.

Diane leaves for her Mediterranean trip with Jimmie under Kim on 20 MAY - for 2 weeks. Kim lives in Brooklyn.

Diane went over again in great detail her angst with her mother who is terminally ill with cancer. She wants treatment but Diane thinks that not advisable. Diane wants autonomy but her mother will not grant it. Diane thinks her mother terrible & always has been. She came from a wealthy family in Budapest but lost all & came to US & married a poor guy who became rich with drive stores in NY. He (Diane's father) was great. Diane says he died young because of her mother who was mean to him - Diane has a ver. doc. with notes from their mother's arguments but who would be responsible if using a power of atty for her mother.

I'll talk to Diane in ~~July~~ <sup>JUNE</sup> when she returns from her trip

About 8:00 AM Diane (Bum) Jones called in response to a letter I sent her. She reports that her son Adrian has done nothing. Her son Chris does not want the Land Grant stuff to leave the house. She says Jim wanted the material to appear as a book and did not want others to mess it up. She mentioned not giving it to Diane Richards (or others). Diane says she is well acquainted with a NY Publisher & has many & is willing to spend it to create a book. I told her that this is an excellent option. I suggested that after the book is published there will be follow-up work to do. I asked if she could keep me in the loop & she said yes. We agreed I would alert her to my future trips and that we would anticipate getting together for coffee or lunch. Her mother still alive & a problem. Hi Adrian---

I was in Raleigh earlier this month and Diane and I had a pleasant visit. She brought up the matter of Jim's Land Grant Project saying she would like to resolve the matter. We reviewed the background and options. I told her about a new organization which six of us incorporated on November 10, 2013 in MO. On December 17, 2013 we applied for IRS 501 (c) 3 tax-exempt status. I told her this organization "Upchurch and Allied Families Association, Inc" was not formed with the Land Grant Project in mind but that it could accommodate it if the six organizers would agree and if the arrangement could be made satisfactory to all concerned. Plans are to have a physical site/repository/museum in Wake County, N.C. which would be relevant for the Land Grant Project. Let me know if you need more information on UAFA.

Of course there would be many details to consider. As we talked about this prospect it seemed that Diane began to become comfortable with the idea that we should jointly begin to explore the possibility. While I do not understand all of the ramifications, I expressed to Diane that it would make matters simpler if Jim's computer with all of it's content could be made part of a transfer along with the 2200+ paper documents plus any notes Jim left. It will be a challenge for anyone to pick up where Jim left off. Diane said she would look into getting the computer back from Chris. We both agreed that any personal information on the computer should be removed.

Diane asked me to contact you and explain the above. One of her thoughts was that in the event Jim's computer does not surface with the appropriate content that you might have a disk that would contain what would be needed or some component of the project that would be useful. I would be most grateful for any comment/advice you have to offer.

I cannot guarantee that the proposal advanced will work as we would have to work through issues and questions that would arise and which we cannot even visualize at present. But we can continue to explore the possibilities if Diane and others concerned on both sides of the fence so desire.

Dear Diane:

All of the family and friends of James P. Jones were deeply saddened by his untimely death on September 25, 2011. Many of his friends and colleagues knew of the prodigious amount of effort he had expended over several years to create a superb searchable database pertaining to Land Grants in Wake County, NC. My guess is that Jim had the project 90% complete but that it currently is in a usable form. It is of the highest urgency that the utility of this effort not be lost.

It readily comes to mind that the placement of Jim's work product computer, data bases, hard copies of input records, etc. reside in a permanent setting accessible to the public. This would be a fitting memorial to the memory of our dear friend. The complexity of this project and the vim and vigor with which he spent many thousands of hours bringing the effort to fruition is a powerful testimonial to the uniqueness of James Pell Jones. His wife, Diane Jones, has authorized me to issue this letter which is designed to lead to the formation of a committee to examine the options for preserving the project, for making it available to the public and for consideration of any financial and management needs. In due course Diane indicates she will be pleased to hear from the committee.

For the present I suggest that Diane Richard of the Wake County Genealogical Society and I take the responsibility for recruiting a small committee of 3 - 5 people who will address the issues involved. Some suggested guiding principles might be as follows:

1. The Committee should be kept small - say 3 - 5 individuals to make deliberations and decisions easier.
2. Wherever possible committee members should represent organizations and be officially appointed to the committee by their organization and be expected to keep their organization informed of progress.
3. Item 2 notwithstanding there could be a unique individual available to serve who would not be the representative of an organization.
4. The committee should elect a chairperson to call meetings, issue documentation and in due course interact with Diane Jones and her family as appropriate.
5. The committee should maintain a written record of its deliberations.
6. The committee should perform the following functions:
  - Prepare a written description of the LGP as visualized and carried out the Jim Jones.
  - Identify the extent to which more work is required to make the project useful to the public.
  - Identify additional work that needs to be done even when the project is made useful to the public.
  - Identify how raw documents used by Jim should be treated.
  - Identify possible costs associated with the transfer of the project to an entity.

- Identify potential entities that might serve as the conservator of the project or in other capacities.
- Negotiate with entities that might be involved to accept the project as a perpetual memorial to James P. Jones.
- Explore funding as necessary and appropriate.
- Consider the option of having multiple co-sponsors of the project. (The Surveyors Association, Yates Mill, etc., etc.).
- Review the status of the copyright for the project and elucidate pathway options.

These are only suggestions and are offered only as a basis for getting underway. We need to start somewhere.
