Re: Assignment No. 2

On December 23, 1983 I received your report on the first phase of Assignment No. 2 (1850 Census search - Upchurch Surname) and am pleased with the progress you have made. Provided herewith is a check for \$96.00 in payment for your work on phase one of Assignment No. 2.

At this time I request that you undertake phase 2 of Assignment No. 2 and for this I hereby authorize up to 32 hours of work at \$6.00/hr. After you have finished phase 2 of Assignment No. 2, please give me a report, and if the work is not completed, give me a rough estimate of how many hours would be required for completion. At this time I would like to define Assignment 2 as a search of the census records for details on Upchurches in any state for which the 1850 census index shows an Upchurch to be present - with the exception of NC. Even in those states for which the index shows only one or two Upchurch families present, I would still like for you to extract the details from the census records themselves.

To facilitate our communication and your work I am returning herewith a xerox copy of your letter of DEC 1983 and copies of Enclosures 1 (AL), 3(IL), 4(KY), 5(MS).

With respect to GA you report five reference numbers (007067 --- 007058) and state that "did no read census page by page" yet I find Enclosure 2 has attached to it the detailed extractions family by family. Can I assume that you have in fact completed the extractions for the Upchurches in GA in 1850? (Of course it is disappointing that the census taker used initials only).

For TN I note that you recorded extractions for each of the reference numbers listed (024561 -- 444-850) and that extracted information is given for reference numbers 444840 and 444841 not shown in your letter of transmittal. I assume the fact that these two latter numbers do not appear in the letter is an oversight.

I like the way your letter fits together with the enclosures. This allows me to follow what you are doing more easily. I assume the reference numbers are microfilm numbers - right?

Thank you for the packet of Updegraff information which arrived 12 AUG 1983. While this particular packet is largely a duplicate of what I already have I do not blame you for that. You did a professional job and I am pleased with your work. ~~The~~ The \$60.<sup>00</sup> check for payment for this work is enclosed.

At this point we will not pursue mining Link No 1 further although we may wish to do so in the future. I am convinced the F. Updegraff who and Jane Eason were really K. Updegraff and in fact Kelly U, he being the ~~Kelly U~~ Kelly U on the 1850 Cumberland Co, NC census. One of my correspondents <sup>(Calvin Kelly U)</sup> has now found this Kelly U on the 1860 Harnett Co census (Harnett Co was split out of Cumberland) <sup>and</sup> as you predicted William Henry U age 6 and John W. U age 4 are there. The key is the father of this Kelly U. I feel that there is a strong possibility it was Puffer U. Perhaps we shall return to that question in due course.

②

For your second batch of work I would like to suggest a new approach for which I hereby authorize 16 hours of work at \$6.00 per hour or a total of \$96.00. The new approach is for you to determine which counties in a given state had upchurches listed on the 1850 census and then to read the census records for each of the appropriate counties and extract all information for me for each household in which an upchurch appears. Please include the total information for the household (names of non upchurches, property values, place of birth, comments, or whatever is present). Please skip NC as I think I have all the relevant information for the 1850 census in all of the counties concerned. I do not have this for the other states and it will be good information for me to publish. I would suggest when you start on a given state to print all the counties in that state naming upchurches on the 1850 census.

F. COMMENTARY ON A - E ABOVE.

As far as is known all of the Upchurch heads of households existing in Chatham Co., NC from 1800 - 1840 are represented in the above listings. However, some of the census records were hard to read (especially 1820) and more heads may still be identified. All of the heads listed above are known to belong to specific Upchurch Clans\*. The Moses Upchurch Clan (XID-1) (Clan No. 1) is well represented by himself and by his children.

For the 1800 listing of Anny Upchurch it is presumed that she XID  
(2068) is the widow of John U., III, head of the John U., III Clan (157) (Clan No. 14) and the former Ann Hamilton of Brunswick Co., VA. (2068) Her husband, John U., III is known to have died in Chatham Co., NC (157) in 1795. Two of John U., III's sons appear in these records - Samuel U. in the 1800 listing and John U. in the 1810 listing. (4129)(4168) The female greater than 45 years of age in the John U. home in 1810 is probably his mother, Ann (Hamilton) Upchurch. Additional (2068) information on this clan is provided by Morgan in The Upchurch Story. She treats the Samuel Upchurch Subclan in great detail devoting 85 pages to it.

\*Kelly U., who appears on the 1840 census, is the only individual recorded for the 1800 - 1840 Chatham listings for whom a family relationship is not known.

The F. U. and the Jane Eason mentioned above could have been the Kelly U. and Sarah Jane Eason who md. 19 SEP 1837 in Chatham C., NC. (We do not know the father of this Kelly U. either). Also, the F. U. could be Farrington U., b. 15 APR 1832, son of Murray U. of the Moses/Murray Upchurch subclan cited on page 36 of West's Upchurch book. Would anyone having details on the F. Upchurch family described above please contact Calvin Kelly Upchurch or the Editor of this Bulletin.

B. Mrs. Annie O'Neal Waters, 2817 Jackson Drive, Greenville, NC 27834 Has traced her Upchurch ancestors back to the early 19th century but needs help to complete her line. The best estimate of her line so far is as follows:

1. Alfred U. md. 5 DEC 1823 (Franklin Co., NC) Penny Jackson (In 1839 Penny died and the children were placed with William Jackson - probably a brother of Penny).

In view of his wedding date, Alfred would likely have been born about 1800 plus or minus 5 years. This means he was probably the grandson of Richard Upchurch II (1725-1800) who moved his family from VA to the Franklin Co., NC area about 1755. Would anyone having information about the father of Alfred U. please contact Mrs. Waters or the Editor of this Bulletin.

Dear Ms Byington,

My cousin Roy White writes that he showed you my letter about wanting someone to search certain records. He sent me your card and indicates that your charge is \$6.00/hour. So far about \$300.00 has been given to the Upchurch Research Fund and perhaps more will come in the months and years ahead. I am considering spending some or perhaps all of the Upchurch Research Funds for research to be done on specific questions by a person such as yourself. Could you drop me a note and indicate arrangements that you would propose.

All <sup>white</sup> Upchurches in America are related (so far as we have determined) and descend from Michael U I who came to VA from England about 1649. [Even the black Upchurches seem to take the name of their owners]. I have a crude chart which shows what we know of the first five generations with

a little 6th generation information added. I call the 5th generation members the Hodge of Clave and of those there are 22. I could send you the chart. There are more 2-5 generation Upchurches around who remain to be fitted into the chart (At least they are the right ages to be 2-5 generation Upchurches).

The questions I would like researched are those in which a current member of our extended family accumulates information on her/his Upchurch line and gets back to the period 1800-1850 and cannot connect into the five generation chart I mentioned above. I could send you my biographical sheet on the earliest member of the line and ask you to check the records on what you could find (census, births, marriage, tax records, etc). In each case I would want you to extract all the 'Upchurch' information you would find even if not related to the question posed. The reason is that I want all Upchurch information eventually. Of course I have some segments relatively well in hand (such as the census records Wake Co. NC - 1790-1880 inclusive)

I would not need you to write a polished narrative but would need clear notes so as to understand your findings.

How would it work if I sent you a request to do 10 hours of work so that we could check at the end of the 10 hours to see how to proceed from that point on.

Do you type your output? This is not necessary from my standpoint if the writing is clear. I had rather pay for research than typing. How do you handle materials that need to be reproduced such as wills, marriage records, etc. That is, do you simply make the copies and charge your customer for them. In a certain number of cases I would desire such evidence but it is too much to presume that I would be able to afford copies of everything. In some cases it is a lot more efficient to <sup>machine</sup> copy something than to spend time copying by hand.

I do hope we can work out something. I know Ray would not have suggested you unless he had great confidence in you. He is a mighty fine person.

I have your letter and would like for you to proceed on a 10-hour - 60<sup>00</sup> search. Please send a handwritten report rather than a typed one. A new job, out-of-town travel and out-of-town visitors have kept my time for genealogy to a minimum recently but I hope to find a few more hours per week for it soon. I usually write U B during the first half of FEB, MAI, AUG and NOV and get it in the mail the first week in the next month. On the last mailing I sent you a full set of U B since this helped to fill out the 200 numbers required for bulk mailing and it seemed to me that your having the copies would make it easier for us to communicate.

I want to give you leeway on how you proceed to search for me. The idea is that you will know best how to use your time efficiently. I suggest you proceed along one of two paths as follows:

PATH 1

Select one or more of the unresolved missing links listed in UB and proceed to search. Unresolved missing links are detailed as follows:

Take TN as a project and begin at the earliest dates to organize information on Upchurch from the Census, Marriage records, wills, deeds, etc. This would lead you to treatment of certain of the missing links listed above. I have done a lot on NC records (much remains to be done) but relatively little on TN

whichever path you follow I would want you to send me information on whatever Upchurch you encounter, even if we don't understand how a bit of information fits in now I like to get it into my files with appropriate cross-reference so that we can use it to complete information on an Upchurch line in due course.

I am looking forward to your first report and hope that I can continue working with you over the year.
