# CARRICK FAMILY Peid in It 250CT 1995 Juiloue Paulsen DRP4 The Carrick Family

Carrick is an Irish name. It is found in Ireland today, the name of a large town. As heir to the Crown of Scotland, the Prince of Wales bears the titles of Prince and high stewart of Scotland, Duke of Rothsay, Earl of Carrick, Baron of Renfew and Lord of the Isles.

Some of the Carricks went to Scotland where, after several generations, some of them came to America and settled in Maryland and Virginia before the revolutionary war. In Virginia, on the Rapidan river is a ford called Carricks Ford; it dates to 1776.

Three brothers went to North Carolina and △ settled in lower Davidson County. Here James Harrison Carrick, eldest child of Joseph and Sara (Burrage) Carrick was born on February 25, 1825.

 $\triangle$  + In 1854, when he was 29, and his wife Rutha (Skeen) was 25, they came to Missouri. They came △ in a covered wagon. I have heard that others who came at the same time were the Morrises and the

+ D+D Beans. They had a son Joseph 6, and my △+△+ grandmother, Elizabeth (Betty), 4. They had a son △+△ William who died in infancy in North Carolina. I

- don't know how long it took for them to come to  $\Delta$ + Missouri from North Carolina. They camped near a spring in what was then Wright County. Next

morning James H. was preparing for the day's Δ journey. Rutha said, "Why go any farther, there's plenty of water and grass for the animals, and it's a

**Δ**+ pretty place." So that is where they stayed. The homestead papers are dated September 1854. There were seven more children born there.

> James H. served with the Northern Army, his brothers in North Carolina with the South. Joseph, Jr. was killed early in the war at Manassas Junction and John F. was seriously wounded at the same A [ELIZABETH CARRICK]

My grandmother told me stories of the war. She said for two days the soldiers passed their house going to the Battle of Wilson Creek. Her mother was forced to cook for some of them. She said the family hid their guns in the woods under

- the corn. Either army would take them if they found them. One day some soldiers caught her brother Joseph. They were seeking information.
- They put a rope around his neck and told him they would hang him if he didn't tell them. He refused and they finally let him go.

James H. gave land for a church and school. The  $\triangle$ same building was used for both. In the early years the school term was only three months, as the children were needed for work at home. James H.  $\triangle$ also taught school. At one time he owned and A operated a store in Wright County at Cedar Gap. I 🔑 don't know how long he owned it but I have his △ † △ record books from 1884 to 1895. From the records of October 18, 1884: 24 yds. of muslin \$2.58; a spelling book, 15 cents; jeans, 75 cents; February -21, 1893, 27 bales of hay, \$5; 6 bushel oats, \$2.40. -

Carrick and Co. also bought railroad ties and  $\triangle$ posts. In 1884, one man got \$9.50 for 38 ties at 25 cents each. Some names of those hauling ties were: -L. Henry, Amos Fox, John W. Hunt, L. Nobles, E. + Matney, J. Upchurch and John Cupler.

I have a tax receipt for September 18, 1886.  $\triangle$ James H. owned 560 acres and the tax was \$27.00. △ As each of his children married, he gave them 80 \( \rightarrow\$ acres of land. The names of his children are:

(1) Joseph Carrick, born 1848, married Martha △+ P. Sivils. Their children were James, who married Margaret Ellis; Charles, who died in infancy; Margaret, who married William Hale. Margaret and William owned a grocery store in Seymour for many years. Samuel Robert married Elsie Leathers. He, with Alonzo Andrews and William Hale, once had the mill in the east part of Seymour. Their daughter Martha Spriggs live in Seymour at the present time. Sara Belle married Clinton Calloway, Eli married Mary Clinkenbeard, Hattie married Homer McCulloch and Ed married Lilly Grimsley, my mother's sister. She lives in Seymour also.

(2) Elizabeth (Betty) Carrick, born February 16, D 1850, married Daniel Albert Herman. Their A children were Agustus, Pearl and Rosina May who died in infancy. George married Grace Martinear. Albert Cornelius (Cornie) married Gertrude Blansett. James never married. John Thomas married Anna Grimsley.

(3) Sara Jane Carrick, born 1856, married \( \triangle \) Touner Hailey. Their children, were John Wesley, who married Daisy Bell. She died and he married Tommy Robison. Clellia married Scott Bean; Louverna married Homer Bolender: Mary married George Taylor; Ruth never married; Walter married Ona Ellison; Lottie married Eldon Fleming and Pearl married Everett Odom. She

lives in Seymour now. She told me that her + D + grandfather James Hailey and a brother Robert and others came to Missouri from Tennessee. He became separated from his brother Robert during the crossing of the Mississippi River. They supposed he had drowned. Her grandfather settled at the Skillet. Many years later it was found that Robert went to Arkansas and raised a family there.

> (4) Hulda Caroline Carrick, born 1858, married John Thomas Hunt. Their children were: Ada, who married Hugh Danforth; John, who was killed by lightning when a young man; Tommy and James, who were twins. Tommy died in infancy; James married Lydia McGrew. A son of James, Luther and his wife Jessie (Eaken) now live in Seymour. Lilly married Elijah Jackson and Holland married Elisha Jackson, twin brothers. Rutha Ann married James Miller. He died and she married Harlon Ferrell; Jessie married Lewis Selheim. Etsyl and Ethel were twins. He married Maud Adams and she married Charles Rush.

(5) Ruth Carrick, born 1861, married Alonzo 11 + 1  $\Omega + \Omega + i\Omega$  Andrews. Their children were Jason, who married Joyce Upchurch. Ollie married Lloyd Mackey, then Frank Blackman. May Belle died in infancy.

(6) Travis Carrick died age 12.

(7) James Skeen Carrick, born February 18, Δ △ 1884, married Mason Upchurch, born February 18, △ ↓ △ ↓ △ 1884. Their children were Freely, Nora and Nyhner, who died in infancy. Raymond married Effice ロートロートム Phillips. They live in Seymour. Jack (Genes), Iule  $\triangle + \triangle$  married Ada Dunnegan. Portia died when a young woman.

(8) Mary Ollie Carrick married James Patrick **&** + (Bud) Norman. Their children were Homer, Clyde, Etsyl (Boone), Emmet, Quincy, Glenn and Eula Leone.

(9) John Thomas Carrick, born March 4, 1869, Δ never married.

In 1869, William Carrick, brother of James H. brought his family to Missouri. His wife Rebecca (Skeen) was a sister of Rutha, James H's wife. William settled in Wright County. Their children were Ellen, Alonzo, Elizabeth, James, Alice, John William (Boss), and Ann who married M. D. Richmond. They had a store at Cedar Gap, then in later years one in Seymour. Melissa married Andrew Rippee and lived in the Star Community. Mollie married Joseph Philpott. Their daughter Mable Brixey lives at Marshfield.

All of James H. Carrick's children lived near the old home place except Mary Ollie who lived in the Ava vicinity. Her sons Clyde and Etsyl (Boone) had a drug store in Ava for many years. Boone still has one there. Glenn had a grocery store there. Ruth and Alonzo Andrews later moved from their farm to Seymour. He was once city marshal.

Before my grandmother Elizabeth Carrick was ムナ married she taught school at Skylight in Douglas Co. She rode a horse to and from school. I've heard her tell of coming home late one fall afternoon. It was growing dark and as she passed along a stretch of woods she could hear a heavy animal trotting along in the leaves beside her. When she stopped, it stopped. When she speeded up, it did too. She was afraid it was a panther. Soon she came to where her sister Sara Hailey lived and she spent the night there.

On January 3, 1875, Elizabeth married Daniel Albert Herman. He was born January 10, 1834, of German emigrant parents, in Davphin Co., Penn. He was a wheelright and coachmaker by trade. He came to Missouri in March of 1871. Mr. Heckendorn came at the same time. He had been in the Civil War, a member of the 149th Penn. volunteers. He acquired a farm just north of James H. Carricks. I have a ledger he kept. In April 1872  $\triangle$ he bought a mare and colt for \$113; another mare for \$75; a wagon and spring seat, \$25; one grain cradle, \$3; and four chairs, \$3.50. In July 1873. — Tavener Hailey and Co. threshed for him 39 bu. of wheat and 12½ bu. oats.

George Herman ran for state representative but he was defeated. He later became a United States Internal Revenue lawyer in St. Paul, Minn. -Cornelius (Cornie) lived for many years in the Carrick neighborhood. He reared his family there, Harold, Kathryn, Dorothy and Beatrice. His ++++ father-in-law, William Blansett was depot operator at Cedar Gap at one time and he owned the first car I ever saw. Uncle Cornie owned the first radio in A+ our community. We children could hardly wait our  $\triangle$ turn to listen with the earphones. Cornie is now 93 and lives in Seymour with his daughter Dorothy. + Kathryn McNealy lives in Marshfield.

My father John Thomas Herman was born  $\Delta +$ November 29, 1889 in the big new house that his father had built. When he was young he spent a short time in Kansas City. Outside of that he spent his entire life on the home farm living in the same house. He died May 1967 at age 77.

I've heard my father tell of some of the pranks he  $\triangle + +$ pulled when he was young. The one I recall most vividly concerned Halley's Comet. The world was supposed to come to an end at a certain hour on a certain night. An old neighbor man was terribly concerned and would quit his work and stand staring off into space just thinking about it. The -



night and the hour came and my father took a 1 horn, he played in the band, out on the upstairs porch and blew a loud blast. It nearly scared the old gentleman to death. He was sure Gabriel had Ω blown his trumpet.

My brother Kenneth and I were born in the +0 same house as our father. In about 1918 we had our first car. It was a Metz touring car. It was owned jointly by Uncle Cornie, Grandma and my father. There were nine of us to ride in it.

We attended church and Sunday school at the + \( \triangle \) Carricks. My father was the song leader and my +\( \Delta\) mother played the old pump organ. I remember lots of different preachers during those years, but the one I recall most clearly was Rev. Joe Dunnegan. In memory I can still hear him as in a ringing voice he exhorted us to be sure and make our calling and election sure. I have a book of Δ minutes of the Sunday school for 1906 and 1907. The third Sunday of each month, Rev. Freme Goss + \( \Delta \) held services. He was the one who married my parents.

In the 1920's my father and Uncle Cornie had a tomato canning factory. We also grew tomatoes. Then my father began growing strawberries and grapes. Harmon Hodge and Russel Rippee also grew fruit. This gave work to lots of folks.

Kenneth and I walked a mile and one-half to the Carrick school where many of the pupils were our cousins. There were the Andrews children, Doris, Olga, Ruth Eleanor, Laurita, Hal and Vaudine, the Hunts, Luther and Georgie, Harold and Kathryn Herman and our aunt Vinita Brown. Those were happy days, making playhouses in the woods with moss for carpets, playing hide and seek, and in winter sliding down the school house hill on our sleds.

My first teacher was Maud Phelps. Then there + \( \text{was Myrtle Adams, who later married my cousin} \) Etsyl Hunt. My cousin Ramond Carrick also taught. Several years later he became postmaster at  $+ \triangle$ Seymour. Then there was John Denney and my last teacher there was Carl Edwards, son of Mrs. Mary Horn. In 1929 or 30 the Carrick school was consolidated with Seymour school.

During my years in grade school there were school fairs held at Seymour. The different schools competed for prizes in various categories. One year we decorated my father's Model T truck. We used green and white crepe paper and each pupil wore a crown-like hat of white with a green shamrock on it, in honor of our Irish heritage. We all rode in the back of the truck in the parade. I can't remember if we won a prize with it or not.

During those years I especially remember the  $\triangle$ Literary Society, the debates and the Kangaroo -Courts. I enjoyed hearing Uncle John Carrick, Jim D+ + Hicks and Harmon Hodge debate.

On our way to school we went through a woods  $\triangle$ that belonged to my grandmother. It is at the  $\triangle$  + headwaters of Finley and along the creek were three or four Indian mounds. My brother and I A+ always talked of digging in them but we never did.  $\triangle$  +

Adjoining the farm where I grew up was the  $\triangle$ Erb apple orchard. It was a beautiful sight in the spring when it was in full bloom. I recall seeing old  $\triangle$ Col. Erb driving in his buggy over his acreage. In those days the rich of Memphis, Tenn. had summer homes at Cedar Gap. I used to see them ride by our \( \triangle \) house on their fine horses. Grandma told me that she used to sell them milk, butter and eggs.

The June singing at Cedar Gap was the social event of the year. There was always a large crowd. In memory, I can still hear Aunt Ruth Andrews  $\Delta +$ singing in her clear treble voice.

John Thomas Carrick, my grandmother's voungest brother, was a bachelor. Everyone called him Uncle John, or just uncle. I found this verse among his things:

Bachelor life I do detest for there's Not an hour or minute to rest. Cooking, sweeping and making bed When that's done it's not half said. Churning, washing and ironing too, How would a job like that suit you?

For four years my mother's step-father Daniel  $\triangle + +$ (Bud) Brown, owned the red mill in the west part of -Seymour. Then he sold a part interest to Uncle John Carrick. Later my uncles George and Jim † † Herman bought Bud Brown out. The fireman at the mill was my mother's grandfather, James  $\Delta$ + Wendt. He had been a railroad engineer. He was + also a veteran of the Civil War. He had been a prisoner of war in the infamous Confederate -Andersonville prison.

Uncle John owned the old home place and when I was a small child he lived there. I remember  $\Delta$  + one Christmas he bought a wooden bucket of hard candy. He carried it to home after home on Christmas day. He would stop at each home and visit while everyone ate candy, then on to the next house.

Uncle was very musical. He loved to sing and was a real entertainer. My father and Uncle Cornie A+ sang too. In later years Luther Hunt sang with them. To me there has never been music to  $\triangle$ compare with those barber shop quartets.

In 1925 Uncle John was fieldman for the

MFA. He traveled all over Webster County going to
 different school districts to speak and get new members. At one time Uncle taught writing school. He had a beautiful scribe.

Over the years the Carrick neighborhood changed. Old ones died and young ones moved away. New names took their place. They were the Turners, Samuels, Lushers, Duckworths and Otto and Nina Eaken, who owned the Pee Wee store where we did our trading for many years.

Otto and Nina had one of the first TV sets and most every night their store looked like a theater. Everyone around came to watch. When the chairs were all taken, we sat on benches, boxes or nail kegs.

It was during my school days at the Carricks

that I met my future husband, Otis Turner. On  $\triangle + \triangle +$  January 30, 1936 he and I, and Luther Hunt and  $+ \triangle +$  Jessie Eaken, were married in a double ceremony at the home of the Rev. Walter Goss.

For 42 years my husband and I have lived on  $\triangle$ <sup>†</sup> +  $\triangle$  part of the farm James H. Carrick homesteaded. We raised our two daughters Sharon and Suzy  $\triangle$ <sup>†</sup> + + here. The farm is situated at the headwaters of — Finley to the west, Bryant to the east and Cowskin — to the south.

My mother is now 87 years old and still lives in  $\triangle +$  the house where I was born. My brother Kenneth  $\triangle + \triangle +$  with his wife Dorothy (Bennett) and daughter Judy live on the farm adjoining ours. We are all that are left of the Carrick descendants in what was once a kinfolks community.

Carrick is an Irish name. It is found in Ireland today, the name of a large town. As heir to the Crown of Scotland, the Prince of Wales bears the titles of Prince and high stewart of Scotland, Duke of Rothsay, Earl of Carrick, Baron of Renfew and Lord of the Isles.

Some of the Carricks went to Scotland where, after several generations, some of them came to America and settled in Maryland and Virginia before the revolutionary war. In Virginia, on the Rapidan river is a ford called Carricks Ford; it, dates to 1776.

· Three brothers went to North Carolina and settled in lower Davidson County. Here James Harrison Carrick, eldest child of Joseph and Sara (Burrage) Carrick was born on February 25, 1825. In 1854, when he was 29, and his wife Rutha (Skeen) was 25, they came to Missouri. They came in a covered wagon. I have heard that others who came at the same time were the Morrises and the Beans. They had a son Joseph 6, and my grandmother, Elizabeth (Betty), 4. They had a son William who died in infancy in North Carolina. I don't know how long it took for them to come to Missouri from North Carolina. They camped near a spring in what was then Wright County. Next morning James H. was preparing for the day's journey. Rutha said, "Why go any farther, there's plenty of water and grass for the animals, and it's a pretty place." So that is where they stayed. The homestead papers are dated September 1854. There were seven more children born there.

James H. served with the Northern Army, his brothers in North Carolina with the South. Joseph, Jr. was killed early in the war at Manassas Junction and John F. was seriously wounded at the same time.

My grandmother told me stories of the war. She said for two days the soldiers passed their house going to the Battle of Wilson Creek. Her mother was forced to cook for some of them. She said the family hid their guns in the woods under the corn. Either army would take them if they found them. One day some soldiers caught her brother Joseph. They were seeking information. They put a rope around his neck and told him they would hang him if he didn't tell them. He refused and they finally let him go.

James H. gave land for a church and school. The same building was used for both. In the early years the school term was only three months, as the children were needed for work at home. James H. also taught school. At one time he owned and operated a store in Wright County at Cedar Gap. I don't know how long he owned it but I have his record books from 1884 to 1895. From the records of October 18, 1884: 24 yds. of muslin \$2.58; a spelling book, 15 cents; jeans, 75 cents; February 21, 1893, 27 bales of hay, \$5; 6 bushel oats, \$2.40.

Carrick and Co. also bought railroad ties and posts. In 1884, one man got \$9.50 for 38 ties at 25 cents each. Some names of those hauling ties were: L. Henry, Amos Fox, John W. Hunt, L. Nobles, E. Matney, J. Upchurch and John Cupler.

I have a tax receipt for September 18, 1886. James H. owned 560 acres and the tax was \$27.00. As each of his children married, he gave them 80 acres of land.

He said Grandpap used to have some pure Hamiltonian trotters and that he gave his mother a black mars once that could show her heels to anything in the country. When I described the picture to Joyce and told her of the bee incident, she insists it must be a picture of her Grandfather.

During his quiszing me about our side of the family he asked if any of them had a tendency to believe in signs, tokens and other mysterious indications. I told him we did and I remembered many of the old folks having visions, dreams and tokens which they would interpret and forecast happenings and events which as a general rule came true, and that we always planted our taters on Good Friday, and never killed hogs or any other kind of meat unless it was in the right time of the moon and that when I was young I tried to get them to do some planting and meat killing at other times just to see whether it was so or not but was never successful. He said it was just as well that we didn't waste the time because they always did their planting and killing when the moon was just exactly right, while neighbors who didn't understand their signs would plant and kill hit or miss, and that his folks' taters and truck was always bigger and better and their meat never shrunk up but remained firm and never spoiled.

He said Joyce used to be a school teacher and that he was also connected with the school system down there before he was appointed Fostmaster. He also said that I couldn't have contacted a better person that Joyce to help me in obtaining the information I wanted, or any other kind of information, although there were a few down around there who could give her pretty close competition.

In the meantime, Raymond Carrick, cousin of Joyce, who is with the Post Office Department here in Washington, who formerly was Postmaster at Seymour, Mo., and who also is the son of one of the sisters of John Henderson Upchurch, got the word about me and called me up. We have had several telephone conversations and dinner together once. He has quite a lot of dry humor in him and if encouraged a little I think would develop into a fairly good "Tall Tale Teller" although not necessarily the bragging kind. I thought I had him started several times but when thinking about it afterwards believe I must have discouraged him by matching the ones he did tell (or trying to).

Heltold me about his other fameous uncle, Absolum Upchurch, a brother of John Henderson, who went back and forth to California eight times with nothing but a buckboard and a span of mules and that he must have driven them back and forth to Kaintuck at least twentyfive times; that he always had plenty of money, mostly in twenty dollar gold pieces, and no one could figure out where he kept it or how he carried it around without getting robbed; but they finally found out that he had it hidden in a false bottom of his mules grain buckets and fastened at various strategic spots in his mules harness and besides all that it was considered very dangerous to even let Uncle Absolum think that you might consider pestering him.

However, he said, that his best liked uncle but probably the worst, Columbus Upchurch, was fameous for his lies and practical jokes which were sometimes quite troublesome. One time they saw him riding down the road whipping and spurring his horse like the sheriff was after him, so they all yelled to him "Whats your hurry, stop off a while and tell us a few lies". He yelled back "I havn't got time, Aunt Dody just died and I am going over and see if I can help out". They all liked Aunt Dody (whoever she was), so they hooked up to the carriage and drove over to see if they could help out also, but

when they arrived Aunt Dody met them at the door and said "Lands sakes, I was just wonderin when you all would get around to coming over, Columbus just rode by but didn't stop".

Since Joyce had told me her Grandfather was T. S. (3hade) Upchurch, I showed him the tintype picture of the "Shade" that I have always been told was our great uncle or great great uncle or cousin or something else. He said as near as he could remember him or any other pictures he had seen of him that looked like him. When I told him the story about that "Shade" when he was talking to some girls and the small boys run up and said "Shade the bees are stinging your horse to death down by the hitch rack", and his reply was "Just let them sting, I can't be bothered while I am talking to the pretty girls". He said from what he could remember about his Grandpap Shade that sounded like him all right, except for letting the bees sting the hoss to death, for Grandpap was very particular about letting anybody handle his hosses and he figgered if a bee pestered one of them it wouldn't stand no more chance of livin than a hoss fly.

Jason and Joyce Andrews had seven children. One, a twin, died in infancy. Doris of Lynden, Washington, married Rev. Loyal Werner who at one time was minister of Seymour Christian Church. He died in 1991. They had a son, Dr. Lance Werner, who teaches in College at Vancouver, Canada; Ruth Eleanor Turner of Mobile, Alabama, had Shirley and Joy, of Mobile and John, an attorney of Lancaster, PA; La Rita married Leonard Minter. They live in Olympia, Washington; Hal, who died in 1990, married Betty Jo Benton. They had two sons, Jack of Ottawa, Illinois, and Bill of Cincinnati; Vaudine married George Elliott. After his death, married Calvin Cory of Penn Valley, California. She had four children, Jeff, Gail, Stan and Chris who live in California. Olga's history is in a separate story.
