INTRODUCTION

Versions of the origin of the name Clegg include; Cleague from France, Cleg from horsefly, and that the family may have lived near a break in the hills, called a clough - thus Clegg as phonetic spelling. The name, in Europe and America, has been spelled as Cleg, Cleggs, Clegg, Cleage, etc. Klegg, Kleggi, Kleggr were Norse names.

Tradition of the Clegg family is that members of the family went to England, from France, in 1066, along with the Norman Invasion of William The Conqueror. They settled in England in adjoining Lancashire (Rochdale) and Yorkshire (Wakefield), a few miles inland from Liverpool Bay of the Irish Sea - the north west coastline of England, near the cities of Manchester and Liverpool.

Noted members of the Clegg family in England include: Nicholas Clegg and Mathew de Clegg, living in Lancashire in 1260; John Clegg, 1714-1746, concert master; James Clegg, 1679-1755, physician and Presbyterian minister; Samuel Clegg, Sr. and Jr., 1781-1861 and 1818-1856, gas lighting engineers. Members of the Clegg family were reported as titled in England. The Chatham Co., N. C. Clegg family had royal ancestry through Bridget Polk, and the maiden lines of the Polk family - see Burke's Peerage.

We show records of 3 Clegg migrations to America: 1st., Henry Clegg in 1682, from Wakefield, England to Northampton County, Va. This section of the family continued to migrate to Va. until at least 1734 - some reports say as many as 7 brothers - we list Henry in 1682, John in 1685, Peter and George, with Isaac D. Clegg, grandson of John, coming in 1734. All show to have settled in what is now Northampton County - was part of Accomack County. Marriage ties and many of the ancestral families were in adjoining Somerset County, Md. Early ancestry includes Capt. John Wilkins, in Va. in 1623; and Major John Hansford of the Jamestown Colony, May 23, 1609, who descends through Major John Birdsong to descendants of the Chatham Co., N. C. Clegg family. The Chatham Co., N. C. Clegg family was from the Virginia Clegg family, through Thomas A. Clegg and wife, Bridget Polk.

The 2nd. group of the Clegg family, known to have come to America, was Thomas, Matthew, and Alexander Clegg - from Rochdale, England - to Belfast, Ireland - to Philadelphia, Pa., after 1755. These brothers settled in Lancaster Co., Pa. They soon migrated to such other states as Indiana, Va., and Tenn. Col. Harland Sanders, of "Kentucky Fried Chicken" fame, was a 3rd. gr. grandson of the immigrant Thomas Clegg. Members of the Clegg family in Tenn. that descended from Alexander Clegg, changed the spelling to Cleage, after the Civil War.

The 3rd. group of the Clegg family, known to have come to America, was the family of Preston Nance Clegg - b.1882 Lancashire, England - to Boston, Mass. in 1900 - to Durham, N. C. in 1904 - to Granville Co., N. C. in 1907. Descendants live at Creedmoor, N. C.

The Virginia Clegg family is best known in Education, Religion, Science, and Government (including Military); with others at all levels of most professions and industries. The Pennsylvania Clegg family is best known as builders; but includes Educators, Ministers, and others in most professions, including Military.

The long-held tradition of Welsh ancestry of the Clegg family of Chatham Co., N. C. would seem to be based on the birthplace of Isaac D. Clegg - others may have emigrated through the Port of Cardiff, Wales. Members of the Clegg family, both Virginia and Pennsylvania, fought for America in the Rev. War - we show the proof-record for Capt. William Polk.

Descendants of both the Virginia and Penn. Clegg families are in Penn., Tenn., and most states west of the Miss. River. In general, Clegg descendants in Atlantic coastal states from Maryland to Louisiana are of the Virginia family. Other descendants from Ohio to Mississippi are more apt to be of the Pennsylvania family.

Some insist that Clegg was from the Danish Kleggi, meaning haystack. Klegg meant
dweller on clay soil; Kleggi dweller on a hill; with Kleggr as a personal name.

 CLEAGE - Crutchfield and Cleage Built Many Historic Buildings.

The appointment of William Crutchfield as chairman for the Chattanooga area for the studies which are to be made of historical buildings in this vicinity in connection with the historical building survey, brings to public attention a family of builders and contractors which has left its impress in brick and mortar across East Tennessee from Bristol to Chattanooga.

The pioneer of this family was Samuel Cleage (or Clegg), who moved with his family to Tennessee from Virginia in 1823. He was a noted contractor in his day, and with his son, Alexander Clegg, and son-in-law, Thomas Crutchfield, carried on their business under the name of Cleage & Crutchfield. Many of the public buildings as well as the antebellum mansions which were erected in East Tennessee before the War Between the States, were done under their direction.

Alexander Clegg

The Cleage family in Tennessee traces its ancestry to Alexander Clegg, who was born near Belfast, Ireland, about the year 1743. He came to America in his youth, seeking his fortune, and located in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. Here he was living during the Revolutionary War, and a return of Capt. Philip Duck's company, First Company, Third Battalion, Lancaster County Militia for the year 1780, shows him to have been a member. In 1781 and 1782 his name appears on a roster of the same organization, which was commanded by Lieut. Col. George Leather. (Pennsylvania Archives, Fifth series, Vol. 7, pages 233, 252, 289.)

"Kill Devil", the old flintlock rifle used by Alexander Clegg in the revolution, is now in the possession of William Crutchfield of Chattanooga.

The Pennsylvania census for the year 1790 lists Alexander Clegg as a resident of Elizabeth township, Lancaster County, with a family consisting of one male above the age of sixteen and seven females.

About the year 1800, Alexander Clegg moved with his family to Virginia, and settled in Botetourt County, near the town of Buchannon. The wife of Alexander Clegg was Susannah Marion, who was born about 1746 and died in Botetourt County, Virginia, in 1823. They were married about the year 1764. Alexander Clegg died in Botetourt County, Virginia in 1822, and his will is recorded at the December term of court, 1822, on the oaths of Daniel Wrightsman and Peter Bolton. (Wills of Botetourt County, Virginia, Vol. C, page 369). (by ed. - Botetourt Co., Va. and the town of Buchannon, located on Hwy. 11, bypassed by I-81, a short distance from Natural Bridge, southwest toward Roanoke, Va. - being after 1800, the Clegg records of Botetourt County do not show in Va. Wills & Adm. by Torrence)

The children of Alexander and Susannah (Marion) Clegg were: (1) John Clegg, who is said to have returned to Ireland; (2) Alexander Clegg, who settled in Washington County, Penn. (3) Elizabeth Clegg, who married Mr. Allen and remained in Pennsylvania; (4) Margaret Clegg, who married March 2, 1798, in Botetourt County, Virginia, Ebenezer Harper; (5) Martha Clegg, who married July 17, 1800, in Botetourt County, Virginia, Jesse Walker; (7) Samuel Clegg, born 1781, married May 1800, in Botetourt County, Mary Stanback.

Samuel Clegg

Samuel Clegg, son and youngest child of Alexander and Susannah Marion Clegg, was born in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, in 1781. He possessed unusual business ability and accumulated considerable property before his father's death in 1822. He was a contractor and built up a large fortune by building brick mansion houses for the landed gentry on the frontier who felt they had outgrown their primitive log cabins.

Rev. William Avent located in 1805 because of the unhealthy conditions of the areas in which he had been serving. They had contributed to the early death of his first wife.

Rev. William Avent, an only son, was raised at Avents Ferry on the Cape Fear River, in Chatham County, N. C. At the age of 14 he was admitted as a Methodist Minister to the Virginia Conference of the Methodist Church, just 5 years after the organization of the Methodist Episcopal Church denomination. He established Buckhorn Methodist Church at Corinth, N. C. in 1800, as high water often made crossing of the Cape Fear River to reach Memphis Methodist Church an impossible journey. See "Methodism in The Upper Cape Fear Valley", by Rev. C. F. Grill. The home was near Avents Ferry.

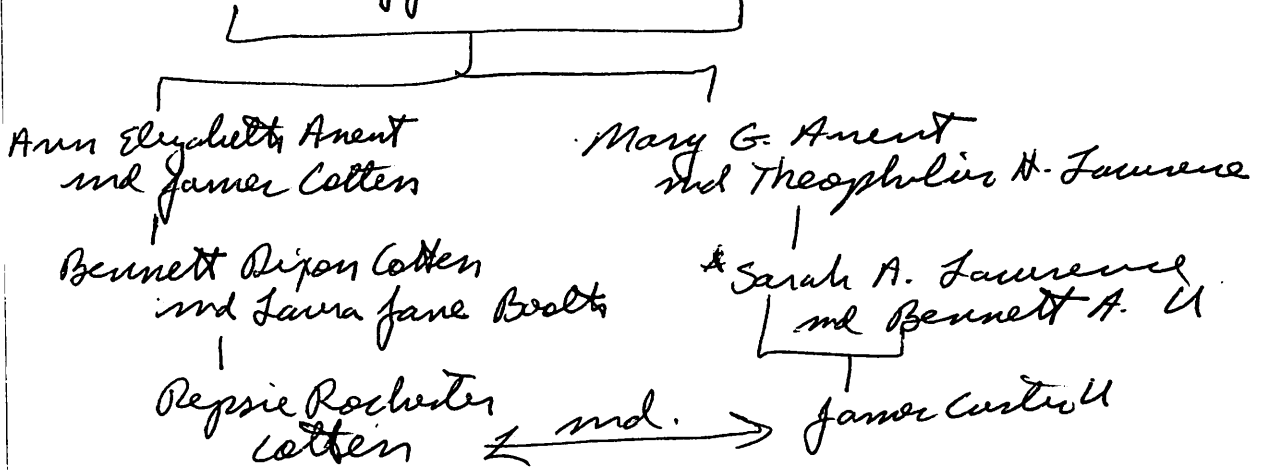

Rev. William Avent located in 1805 because of the unhealthy conditions of the areas in which he had been serving. They had contributed to the early death of his first wife.

Rev. William Avent, an only son, was raised at Avents Ferry on the Cape Fear River, in Chatham County, N. C. At the age of 14 he was admitted as a Methodist Minister to the Virginia Conference of the Methodist Church, just 5 years after the organization of the Methodist Episcopal Church denomination. He established Buckhorn Methodist Church at Corinth, N. C. in 1800, as high water often made crossing of the Cape Fear River to reach Memphis Methodist Church an impossible journey. See "Methodism in The Upper Cape Fear Valley", by Rev. C. F. Grill. The home was near Avents Ferry.
