Following Shelton's death a committee to choose an interim pastor was elected: Jeff Armstrong, Alan Eaton, Otis Honeycutt, Agnes Grant, Gloria Peterson, Ronnie Upchurch, Basil Ayers, Lin Honeycutt, Barbara Honeycutt, Blake Brown, and Charles Mayhew. Not until May, however, did the committee have an interim in place. During that nearly six months following Shelton's death, the worship services were planned by Inwood's Associate Pastor and Minister of Music and Youth, Todd Medlin. Then, on May 26, 1996, W. C. Barham, who had served a number of churches in the area, became interim pastor. He was with the church for nearly a year before he resigned for reasons of ill health (March 31, 1997).

Larry Dix, Barbara Honeycutt, Charles Mayhew, Keith Stenzler, and David Swinson were named to the pastor search committee on June 26, 1996. Barbara Honeycutt was chosen to chair the committee.

On April 2, 1997, the pastor search committee went to the church with the recommendation of Ken Creekmore. A native of South Carolina, Creekmore was thirty-four years of age, married, and the father of two sons. He was a graduate of the University of South Carolina and of Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. During his student days he had served as youth minister in several churches. After graduating from the seminary he was for two and a half years pastor of Piney Grove Baptist Church in Dillon, S.C. He was currently pastor of First Baptist Church, Springfield, S. C., having begun his work there in January, 1993. In his resume, his statement of "Key Issues of Faith" suggest that he was entirely compatible with the recent developments within the Southern Baptist Convention. The search committee characterized Creekmore as a "God led, visiting pastor, outreach oriented with training in the Praxis (new beginnings) program, Mission minded, preaches from the Bible, a team player, and is a motivator with leadership abilities." After preaching at Inwood on April 6, he was called by a vote of 152 to 10, and began his work on May 25, 1997.

At the church conference on June 25, 1997, a covenant between pastor and church was adopted and signed. This covenant began by spelling out the pastor's responsibility to the church. In addition to the usual pastoral

duties it was specified that the pastor is "ex-officio member of all committees with the exception of the Personnel Committee" (1.06), that he is the chief administrator of the church (1.07), and that he is editor of all official publications" (1.12). One unusual note is the responsibility to "defend his people from spiritual attack, the sins of the world, and even each other as Paul seeks to do in Galatians" (1.14).

The second part of the covenant deals with the church's responsibility to the pastor. The first two responsibilities are to love and to support the pastor. The third is a bit unusual.

Defend the pastor . . . No church member should stand idly by while someone, be it member or non-member, speaks unkindly of their pastor. It is their duty to come to his defense. Hebrews 13:7-8 and 17 "Remember them which have the rule over you, who have spoken unto you the Word of God; whose faith follow, considering the end of their conversation: Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and today, and forever. Obey them that have the rule over you; submit yourselves: for they watch for your souls, as they must give account, that they may do it with joy, and not with grief: for that is unprofitable for you. Church members will defend their pastor from unkind critics. (2.03)

Another unusual statement is that it is "the duty of the deacons to suggest prospective programs and to cooperate with the pastor in his suggestions of programs and to serve generally as a 'sounding board.'" (2.06) Part three of the covenant details "Working Guidelines," and part four specifies "Employment guidelines."

Although the church had indicated that their priorities for their pastor were worship leadership, spiritual development of members, crisis ministry, and pastoral counseling, Creekmore's major emphasis was evangelism. During the ministry of his predecessors, the majority of professions of faith, and indeed the majority of transfers of membership, came during times of revival. During his ministry new members came throughout the year. Creekmore gave a clear indication of his priorities by writing for his first newsletter statement to the congregation (June, 1997) "A Soul-Winning Interview with the Pastor." Thereafter the newsletters spoke more of soul-winning than any other single topic. A little over two years after he began his ministry he wrote in the newsletter (September, 1999):

God keeps blessing our work and it is with joy that we all see the power of God displayed week after week as the invitation is given. Our motto is "Inwood Baptist . . . Where the people are the steeple." Leading someone to Jesus is our highest aim. It is the measuring stick of Christ and it is no mistake to say that it is the highest job in our church . . . If we serve God and fail to win souls then what purpose have we really served?

Then he spoke of his unwillingness to shorten the time of invitation at the end of the service, and announced that in order to give more time for that there would no longer be a "Children's Sermon" in the service.

ONE LAST WORD

To Another 59 Years Of North Caroliniana

A long-established tradition is always hard to live up to, especially when you consider that it has greeted folks at the mailbox monthly for the better part of the last 59 years.

When Carl Goerch founded *The State* magazine in 1933, I wonder if he had any idea that his baby would turn out so well.

Today, almost 22,000 people subscribe to the magazine. More importantly, though, it's a big part of many of your lives. If I've learned anything about the people who read *The State* in my short time as the new managing editor, it's that people care about these pages. They care about what goes in them, about what they can learn from them and how we go about putting them together.

The magazine matters to 78-year-old Ruby Creekmore of Wilson, who wrote asking us about her great grandfather's role in the Civil War. She said her grandfather, Manton Hill Lamm, was named for a battle called "Manton Hill," which his father fought in the Civil War. She had heard stories as a child about her great grandfather losing his leg in that battle, and wanted to know more.

Our research assistant, Alan Hodge, did his usual superb job of coming up with the information. It turns out that his name was Thomas Lamm. His company, the A-47th,

known as the Chicora Guards, played a prominent role in the Battle of Gettysburg. Shortly after Gettysburg, Thomas Lamm and his company were surprised one night by a surprise Union attack at Manton Hill in Falling Waters, Maryland. He was captured there and was eventually confined at Point Lookout, Maryland. After being transferred to a prison camp at Elmira, New York, the 40-year-old Mr. Lamm was released on June 12, 1865, after taking the Oath of Allegiance.

The war left him with a peg leg and a lot of stories. Mrs. Creekmore's excitement at finding out the ending to that particular story made my day here one afternoon.

She explained her interest.

"When you're young, you look ahead," she said. "When you get older, you look back, but can't always remember. These are things I wish I had found out when I was younger."

No need to worry, Mrs. Creekmore, you've got some help. That's what we're here for. It's part of what this magazine is all about.

Like Mrs. Creekmore, North Carolinians have a seemingly inbred curiosity about their state and its people, places and things. I'm glad those are the things that we cover. I'm even happier

about the fact that the people associated with *The State* have always gone out of their way to help solve any curiosity readers might have.

When I think of the people who have helped solve all your puzzles over the years, the name Billy Arthur comes foremost to mind. He's been writing what he calls "North Caroliniana" in these pages since Mr. Goerch opened the doors to the publication in 1933.

Talking to Billy, you get a good idea of what *The State* is all about, of why it makes the people who pick it up feel good.

Billy Arthur loves this state, as do the people who read his articles.

What I wish I had is the experience and knowledge of North Carolina that Billy has at his fingertips. It would come in awfully handy in this job. Although I'm a native Tar Heel. I've got just 28 years at my disposal. My hope is to learn from Billy and you folks, the readers.

We're all in this together. Like you, I have an intense interest in learning more about my state. The mission will be for us to do that together.

This is *your* magazine. Don't hesitate to call when you've got an idea or a concern. Or when you feel we're not living up to the idea that Carl Goerch had 59 years ago.

Together, though, I think we can live up to that tradition. And make Mr. Goerch proud.

Here's to another 59 years of North Caroliniana.
