## Ruth Upchurch, 1919-2016

Ruth Crowley Upchurch, 97, died Thursday, Dec. 29, 2016, at her home in Coffeeville, Miss.

A visitation will be held from 10 to 11 a.m. Saturday, Dec. 31, at the United Methodist Church of Coffeeville. Funeral services will follow the visitation at 11 a.m. with the Rev. Stacy Douglas officiating. Burial will be in the Shiloh Primitive Church Cemetery in Yalobusha County, Miss.

She was born Jan. 14, 1919, in Cookeville, Tenn., to the late A.C. and Mabel Peek Crowley.

Ruth earned her bachelor's of science degree in home economics from Tennessee Technology University and taught home economics for a number of years. She worked for University of Missouri Extension as a state home economist agent.

Ruth was a member of Coffeeville Friends of the Library and

very active in promoting literacy. She also worked as a volunteer with the Adult Literacy Programs. Ruth was an active member of the United Methodist Church of Coffeeville.

Survivors include Ruth's daughter, Jean (Steve) Abernathy of Ballwin; son, Robert Burton Upchurch of Falls Church, Va.; two grandsons, Jeff (Deidre) Abernathy and Will Abernathy; and two special caregivers, Mary Robinson and Rhonda Neal Spearman.

She was preceded in death by her husband, William Joseph Upchurch; twin sister; three brothers; and her parents. The family requests that memorials be made to the Coffeeville United Methodist Church, 14500 Main St., Coffeeville, Miss., 38922.

flow of blood to the heart, leading to chest pain or angina. I was scheduled for surgery early on Friday, October 3. The angioplasty exploration would reveal the extent of artery blockage and provide for an opportunity to use balloons to dislodge the blockage or to implant a stent. It turned out the blockage was severe and unsuitable for the planned corrections. A team of surgeons was standing by and took immediate action. They performed open heart surgery and created three bypasses using arteries from the arm and chest. Sallaine and our children here in St. Louis were present to offer advice, consultation, and encouragement. I received the most outstanding health care one can imagine. After three days, Sallaine brought me home and has provided outstanding support. She has been a rock throughout. Our daughter from Tucson has been with us for a week with her support also. I am so fortunate in so many ways.

Today, 7 days after the surgery, I am beginning to regain my perspective and to think more proactively about the future. Friends who have had this experience tell me that I should look forward to ten years of active life before getting another 30,000 mile check-up. Still, I know that some lifestyle changes are required.

I feel blessed to have such a great family, such good medical care and that I did not suffer any heart damage. Still, I feel more needs to be said to my friends. I considered myself to be in good health and my annual check-up last spring was favorable. We eat a variety of foods and in moderation and I thought my 211 pounds could be carried on my 6 foot frame. I now know that 190 is the number. Furthermore, in recapping my last year, I realize that signs of trouble were there even as I denied them. Furthermore, I now realize that my good diet has not been as good as I thought. Sallaine will help me do better. I hope all who read this will reexamine their own health status.

In our household, it is now "GOOD MORNING IN AMERICA".

This was a sudden and  
unexpected event. She seemed to  
have a slight cold but on the  
morning of the 17<sup>th</sup>, woke up with  
breathing difficulties. We were  
informed about 7:30 that she was  
being sent to the E.R. at the Oxford  
Hospital and we got up there about  
9 o'clock. The doctor said the  
prognosis was not good - pneumonia  
in one lung. She was admitted to  
the hospital and put on antibiotics.  
But about 5 p.m., she just suddenly  
and quietly quit breathing.

No one likes to think about going  
to a nursing home but we have  
no regrets about her time there. She  
had a better life this last year than  
she would have had at home. No  
one ever came to see her at home  
but she was visited there, they had

Dear Upchurch Cousins,  
your accident on the stairs  
was really unfortunate. To get  
the UB out is that condition was  
quite an accomplishment. We appreciate  
your effort.

I enjoyed reading about  
your trip to England. As I told  
you before, England is one place I'd  
like to visit again. At this point  
in life, I do not see it as a  
possibility.

On Memorial Day the women  
who come to Juana's to help her  
for a few hours each day called and  
said she had an emergency at home  
and couldn't come. So I went to  
Juana's to get her out of bed, get  
breakfast for her, etc., but found her  
on the floor. We took her to the  
E.R. at Oxford and she was  
in the hospital for several days.  
She was confused and could not  
sleep, get out of bed, or do any-

thing for herself. The diagnosis: a mini-stroke. We were told that she had to go to a nursing home or have 24-hour help at home. They sent her to the Water Valley Hospital for a couple of weeks of re-hab.

Connected to the hospital is the Yalobusha County Nursing Home. It has an excellent reputation and a long waiting list but we were called to say they'd make an exception and take Jeonita. We don't know who told the Home about Jeonita. We think the social worker at Jeonita's. The Oxford Hospital might have done it. Anyway the administrator talked to Jeonita and told her she could continue her re-hab. program and if she got better she could go home. So she agreed to go to the Nursing Home.

She has had two other mini-strokes since then and was hospitalized at these times she is totally confused -- She has made no improvement physically in the Nursing home

We go to see her 2-4 times a week. She was very unhappy about the laundry situation there. So to relieve her worry about that I

am doing her laundry. Bill has her Power of attorney, makes all the decisions and pays her bills. We are totally consumed with her care and can make plans to go nowhere - not even to St Louis to see our daughter & family.

As I said, the Nursing Home has an excellent reputation as one of the best, in the state - if not the best. There's a waiting list of over 200 people. They are getting ready to enlarge it and double its size from 67 residents to 130.

Luckily the children and grandchildren can come home about two times a year.

Since our son lives in the Washington area we were concerned during the Sonoma attack, and we had reason to be. He lives in Falls Church VA, less than  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile from the attack there. He had planned to go to the Horse Depot that night but decided to stay home and watch the football game.

Dear Phil and Dallaine,

Your visit here seems like a dream so much has happened since then. We enjoyed meeting you so much. If you are ever back this way, <sup>again,</sup> the Historical Society would love to have you and we could gather up quite a few more research connections.

Bill has been working hard to get the information you want. Some people are eager to respond, others are not so cooperative.

If you remember, we had moved my sister from Tennessee to Mississippi the week before you were here to an assisted living facility in Oxford. She seemed to be adjusting quite well until the first of June when she had a stroke and was hospitalized for 12 days. She still cannot stand and is just beginning to use her right arm a little. The left arm is still useless. She cannot feed herself and is more or less helpless. She is still at the Assisted Living place but has a "sitter" during daytime hours who is really good.

with her. But there seem to be a crisis of some sort two or three times a week.

Last Sunday night, unknown to us, lightning took our telephones out of service. About 11:30 p.m. a deputy sheriff rang the doorbell and told us Lois had been taken to the hospital. Since I couldn't be reached they contacted my brother in Ft. Worth for permission to take her. We then went to Offord about midnight and got home about 3 a.m. Her trouble was not diagnosed - other than dehydration, and a bronchial congestion. She is still in the hospital. I go to Offord every day while she's hospitalized and 2 or 3 times a week at other times.

This has taken a toll on me. I have lost 18 pounds since you were here. Worry and stress cuts down my appetite. I'm glad to lose the weight but not this way.

Another concern is Juonita. Her legs are swollen below the knees and are an ugly reddish in color. I took her to a doctor two weeks ago; he gave her about 5 things to do: drink lots of fluid, elevate the legs when sitting down, leave salt, take laxatives and wear elastic hose. So far, she has done very little of his instructions. It's hard to believe

a former nurse does so little to follow a doctor's instructions,

I wish you were close enough for us to share Biel's garden. Would you believe 22 cantaloupes in the hothouse? also egg plant, okra, cucumbers, tomatoes, pepper, etc. We'll have to make a "give-away" run soon.

Your big fire was a terrible thing to experience. It must have been a shock to discover, I'm glad insurance covered your losses.

Jean had a similar experience on a much smaller scale a couple of years ago. The washing machine mal-functioned and flooded the basement. They had just finished a room down there. They discovered it in time before it damaged too much. A company came with big fans etc and got things back in order. Their insurance covered the cost of drying things.

This is enough so —

We were saddened to learn of the passing of Julia Upchurch Morgan. She and I had many exchanges about our mutual interest in family history. She lived a long life and died without suffering for which we can be thankful. May she rest in peace.

The facts unfolding about your Crowley family history illustrate that there is still a lot of information out there to be gained and how exciting family history can be to those of us who have the

interest. The story of Rugby, TN was new to me. I looked it up in the Fentress Co, TN Heritage Book and got a feel for this special community.

I must report to Bill on the farming situation. It is time to prepare for planting corn and in the next day or so the soil will be dry enough to work if it does not rain. Yesterday I went out to Montgomery Co to look over a 160 acre tract with my son and his wife. They will probably plant a bed on it today. It is a hilly tract with mostly Mexico Silt Loam and a nice zone sand. It does need terracing and some clearing. There are about 100 acres now tillable but this could be brought up to 135 acres.

Dear Cousin Phil,

Two bits of news about Uppchurches - if you haven't heard:

- +△ (1) Bill's oldest sister, Julia Uppchurch Morgan, died Feb. 19, 1999 following a massive stroke on Feb. 15. She never regained consciousness.
- 2 As seen in the enclosed article, our son Robert Burton Uppchurch, retired from the Navy officially on Oct. 31 and began employment at Aegis on Nov. 2. He doesn't even have to move.

Our daughter, Jean, no longer works at the St Louis Journal but is now a Public Relations Consultant at St. John's Hospital and also teaches a course on Journalism at Webster University.

An interesting genealogy note - not connected to Uppchurch history:

As children, my sister and I played with a large leather-bound book. It contained copies of the Illustrated London News, dated 1845. On the margins of the newspapers were hand written addresses to William Crowley, Buffalo Barracks, Lake Erie, N.Y. We always wondered why our great-grandfather had a U.S. address. We thought he immigrated directly from England to Canada. Our grandfather immigrated to the U.S. from Canada and we always thought he was a native of Canada. Now, we are wondering!

One night my sister-in-law was surfing the Internet and found an address for Buffalo Barracks →

I don't think it is an active base but there are records.  
My sister-in-law E-mailed an inquiry about Willis Crowley,<sup>(13<sup>th</sup>)</sup>  
The cursor answered quickly - the color of his eyes, his height,  
weight, color of hair, his home town in England, etc. He had joined  
the U.S. Army, served out one enlistment and re-joined but  
left before his time was out - and moved to Canada (near Detroit)

My brother surmises he got ill <sup>so</sup> died within 3 years. But  
he also thinks his children were born in New York so our grandfather  
might be a native U.S. citizen. That's being checked out.

My grandfather crossed into the U.S. at Detroit with a  
brother and settled there. The brother was never heard from again.  
We have a relative who writes to every Crowley she hears about.  
Maybe someday we'll know!

My grandfather settled in Jamestown, TN and my  
father was born there. Why he came to that wilderness (at  
that time) I don't know, unless he was attracted to the  
near-by English settlement at Rugby being promoted by  
Thomas Hughes, the English author. My grandparents did  
live at Rugby for a time.

## Robert Upchurch Retires From Navy

Commander Robert B. Upchurch, son of Mr. and Mrs. William J. Upchurch of Coffeyville, retired from the United States Navy after twenty years of service on September 8, 1998. The retirement ceremony was conducted at the Joint National Test Facility, Schriever Air Force Base, Colorado Springs, Colorado and was presided over by Captain James Abbott, the Joint National Test Facility Commanding Officer.

CDR Upchurch joined the Navy after graduation from the University of Missouri. His sea duty assignments included Main Propulsion Assistant in USS JOSEPH STRAUSS (DDG 16), Chief Engineer in USS HAROLD E. HOLT (FF 1074) and USS LEAHY (CG 16) and as Executive Officer in USS HORNE (CG 30). His shore duty assignments included Naval

Postgraduate School, Monterey, California; the Armed Forces Staff College, Norfolk, Virginia; and Headquarters U. S. European Command, Stuttgart, Germany. His last assignment was at the Ballistic Missile Defense Organization, Washington D. C. serving in the System Engineering, the Theater Missile Defense Integration and the modeling and Simulation Directorates.

At the ceremony Captain Abbott presented CDR Upchurch the Defense Meritorious Service Medal. CDR Upchurch has taken a position in Washington D. C. as a Senior Simulation Engineer with Aegis Research Corporation of Huntsville, Alabama. He currently resides with six motorcycles in Falls Church, Virginia.

Dear Upchurches,

I was interested in your description of your trip to Fentress County, TN. That part of the country has a special place in my life.

We lived in Cookeville but my father's parents lived in Jamestown as did aunts & uncles. So we visited there one or two times a year. In my young days, it was a trip of several hours. There was no short route. We travelled through Paup Mill right by Alvin York's home. We sometimes saw him sitting on the porch.

In my father's young days, his parents ran "The Crowley House", the only hotel in town, Cordell Hull often stayed there when he was a judge. When they sold the

hotel, it became "The Mark Twain Hotel." Mark Twain never was in Jonestown but his parents lived there until shortly before he was born. The hotel later burned.

After Bill & I were married we visited Jonestown. An Upshur was sheriff and had confiscated a whiskey still. My uncle gave us the spiral of copper tubing from that still (I don't know what ever happened to it).

Anyways, I have many fond memories of Jonestown, even though it was known as a rough, tough little town. An uncle was a doctor there and could tell many tales about situations he encountered.

Just thought you might be interested in my memories
