JAMES ALEXANDER JOHNSON

James Alexander Johnson & Ben A. J. CAMPBELL

James Alexander Johnson was the oldest son of Tapley Ormond Johnson, Jr. and Mary (Polly) Atkins.

He was born in Cumberland County, N. C., near the Cape Fear River - not far from the County Seat of the upper portion of the county that which was formed into Harnett County in 1855 by a bill introduced in the Legislature in N. C. by Cornelius Harnett Coffield - (a brother of Jeanette Coffield who married William Ira Rowland of Wake Co.)

The seat of the earliest settlers was at the time, Summerville, N. C. There stood a courthouse, jail, an academy of learning from which young men who pursued their education went to Chapel Hill - University of N. C. - and the old Tirzah Presbyterian Church - and the homes of a few families - the Atkins, the Betheas, and the Matthews.

The railroad crossing the river at Lillington - a hamlet a few miles east became this county seat. And was the hub of ferry crossings and the center of activities for the various families that came up from the lower Cape Fear from Fayetteville or Wilmington - or east from the Neuse or Black Rivers.

Jimmie Johnson as he was known in adult life was born November 7, 1824, and married Mary Ann Dewar January 30, 1851. They both were mild mannered and indulgent with their children and grandchildren.

In his old age he laid a coin in the hand of his nephew, Kerp Johnson, saying, "This is to urge you to remember not to be too indulgent with your sons - I erred in that respect." His children all recall his generosity to them. His granddaughter, May Betts gave as example: a teacher of organ and piano urged her to take

Lessons - pointing out the fact that she showed talent. May said her father, Jimmy Betts, thought she was too young to begin lessons. But when her grandpa, Jimmie learned she wanted to study music he said, "You go on with the music lessons; I'll pay for them". She declared to me when she was elderly that it had been the greatest joy of her life to have this talent developed and to remember her grandpa's interest in her development.

His grandsons, too, remembered him with such generous affection - extending even to the special care of his horses, his oxen or cows and every living thing on the place -- all had to be given plenty of food and the best care.

Their home was near Buies Creek. His daughter, Lena Betts and her husband lived there all of her life and raised their family there.

Now a granddaughter, and her husband Hubert Matthews make it their home, and it is much the same as it was one hundred and twenty-five years ago.

One interesting feature of the house is the ceiling in the parlor. A Frenchman designed and painted four in the area. Besides the home of James A. Johnson, were the homes of his brothers, John Lewis Johnson and William W. Johnson, as was the Wm. Ballentine home who married the other Jones girl. There was a design of heavy molding made by hand and the ceilings were painted like the sky by night - with moon and stars.

The other three homes have been replaced with modern ceilings, but the original remains at the Sheriff Jas. A. Johnson house.

Uncle Jirmie was the first Sheriff of Harnett when it was formed from Cumberland and Orange in 1855. He had a large Country Store across the road from his house and vast acres of farm land. He was a lifetime member and ardent supporter of Neill's Creek Baptist Church organized in 1780, and longtime friend of the Rev. Monroe Holleman, pastor there for 42 years.

He made some investments in his wife's family store in Raleigh - The Dewar-Wilder Hardware and Farm Supply Store on Wilmington Street.

He aided his son "Len" in starting there, also, a Livery Stable, when he was a young man. The livery stable had for hire and sale horses and buggies and also facilities caring for those of their customers - as feeding and grooming - and "trading" horses.

The garage replaced that business and his younger son Tapley IV was very apt at that trade in the age of "the gasoline buggy" in the early 1900's.

Uncle Jimmie also ran a turpentine still - which was one of the major enterprises of the day for large land owners with great forests of pine trees. And the Cape Fear River nearby was the Vein of Transportation for shipping to other countries as well as to the Northern cities.

I have recently learned it was one of the main secrets of Antonio Stradivari in making some of the finest violins of all time. A certain oil derived from the turpentine being put on the wood made the mellow tone that was known the Stradivari violin to have. There were various uses of the turpentine derivatives made into medicines - even as paints were. Many other uses of the fluids separated from the rosin base.

He was a close friend of the Rev. J. A. Campbell and assisted him in the building of Buies Creek Academy which was founded in 1887. He gave money and encouragement. I was told by his granddaughter, Pearl Betts Mitchell, that the first tuition fee that was paid in for entry was for his daughter Lena (Lorena Johnson) who later married Jimmy Betts. He was a man of high ideals and strength of mind and character.

Buies Creek Academy is now Campbell University and ranks high among the leading institutions of the State of North Carolina and is growing year by year in size and dedication to the high standards of life - meeting the needs of the facets of high standards of dedication in the various fields of endeavor - in music, business administration, and law as well as Christian culture at all levels.

I like to think of the fine quality of life that we inherit from these men who laid so well the foundation on which we build today and pray that our contributions may be worthy of that with which we are endowed.
