Generations of confederate veterans work

to keep memories from fading

Gen. Douglas MacArthur's most memorable remark is "Old soldiers never die, they just fade away."

The Sons of Confederate Veterans (SCV) are working to make sure that doesn't happen to their ancestors' memory. To be a member, candidates must show lineage from a Confederate soldier or political leader.

Carl Eason, commander of the Apex camp, had at least four relatives who saw some of the heaviest action in the war, two on his mother's side of the family, and two on his father's side.

William Terry and Henry Mooneyham came from the Swift Creek area in Wake County. Apex wasn't even a town, then.

Each served in the infantry and saw action at Fredricksburg, Chancellorsville, the Wilderness campaign and Gettysburg.

"They dug trenches and did the walking," Eason said.

They served in the 6th N.C. regiment, Company I. The "bloody 6th," who fought in the First Battle of Bull Run, Eason said.

The SCV named their camp the 6th, in honor of those who served.

At Gettysburg Eason's ancestors took part in Pickett's charge, where they fought an uphill battle against deadly Union muskets and canons.

A small group of Confederates actually took a portion of the wall defending the hill, but most were cut down or captured, despite capturing a Union canon.

"They didn't have enough men to hold the position," Eason said.

"They went the farthest of any group of men at Gettysburg, and were among the last to surrender at Appomattox," Eason said.

All of his ancestors survived to return to Wake and Johnston Counties after the war, despite rampant dysentery that killed more soldiers than gunfire.

Eason said the area has much more history that is becoming forgotten, and it is his group's mission to make sure folks remember.

Gen. William T. Sherman's men occupied the Morrisville/Holly Springs area, Eason said.

North Carolina was spared much of the destruction that Sherman inflicted on South Carolina and Georgia during his march to the sea, Eason added.

Because of that, North Carolina's state records are surprisingly accurate. Sherman burned most capitol buildings in Georgia and South Carolina, destroying the records inside.

During the march to the sea Sherman and his men destroyed a 60-mile swathe of land, burning fields and mills, and killing livestock and wildlife.

"Sherman called total war total hell, but he made war against innocent women and children," Eason said.

In this area, Sherman's men tried to burn Yates Mill Pond, on Lake Willow Road, Eason said. The men threw torches into the mill, then left. Citizens took quick action to put out the fire.

"You can still see the burn marks," Eason said.

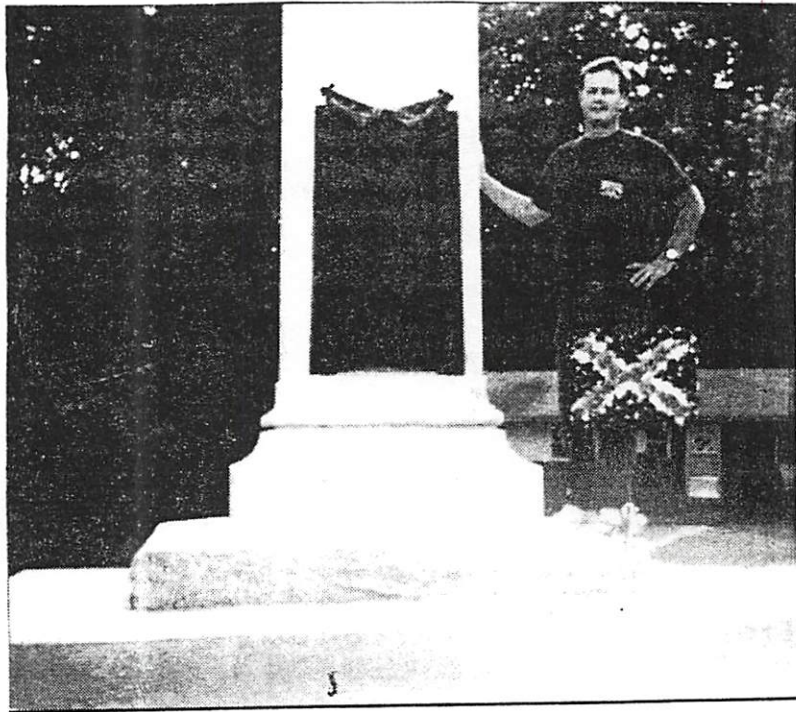
Sherman justified his actions by saying he was destroying the enemy's ability to make war.

But Sherman captured North Carolina's records and sent them to Washington D.C., Eason said. Therefore, many North Carolinians can trace their heritage, Eason added.

"North Carolina records are probably some of the best there is," Eason said. "North Carolina records are pretty accurate."

Eason also has another good source of information, his mother and father. Eason's father, who is 93, still remembers talking to Confederate veterans as a little boy. His mother, who is in her 70s, also remembers.

"There's a lot of stuff we're losing," Eason said.

Understandably, Sherman is not very popular with the SCV, which is why they protested and eventually stopped plans to erect a monument in his honor near Bentonville.

The SCV argued that public money and public lands should not be used if Confederate memorials are not given equal treatment.

Confederate memorials erected by the SCV are bought with private money and put on private land, Eason said.

Eason said he fights for Confederate monuments because no one else will.

"If the flag goes, the monuments will be next," he said.

Eason reveres the Confederate flag for its historical value, and disparages its use by racist organizations.

"We're not a hate group," he said. "In fact, in 1992, the SCV adopted a resolution condemning the flag's use by the Ku Klux Klan, neo-Nazi and other hate groups."

Apex men are rebels with a cause

Tommy Morgan and Carl Eason are two rebels with a cause. Their cause is heritage, they insist, not hate.

Morgan and Eason are leaders of Apex's Sons of Confederate Veterans (SCV) camp. The group's primary mission is preserving the history of the Confederacy, through teaching, memorializing, and even one or two battle reenactments, although those are left up to the individual member.

"We have a meeting once a month where we have a different program," Morgan said. Meetings occur the second Thursday of each month and are open to the public. One such meeting involved Jeremy Scott, a Civil War painter.

Scott uses authentic pictures to put real faces on the soldiers in his paintings. Prints were made available of Scott's paintings, Morgan said.

Other meetings may have visiting authors, films, or presentations by Civil War experts.

"We've had some real good programs," Morgan said.

As a tax-exempt, non-profit civic organization, the SCV takes a large part in civic functions, mostly regarding confederate sites.

The group has raised money for maintenance of confederate memorials, including placing tombstones on confederate soldiers' graves in Oakwood Cemetery, in Raleigh.

Before the tombstones, the graves were marked with a number, which had to be checked against a list. The men replaced approximately 2,000 such markers with real headstones.

"Now we have gravestones with the man's name on it," Eason said.

Other groups in the area adopt highways for roadside maintenance, and the Sanford camp is raising money for a memorial to Gen. James Longstreet, who commanded the First Corps of Robert E. Lee's Army of Northern Virginia in the Battle of Gettysburg.

While civic functions require much of their time, another primary cause for the group is maintaining the South's history which has been distorted by revisionism, Eason said. History is often written by the winners. And so it was after the Civil War, he added.

During talks at Apex High School Eason said he tries to teach the kids something they've never learned before.

"The idea of secession, the idea of people wanting to run their own lives goes way back," Eason said.

Eason also subscribes to the theory of an agricultural South versus an industrial North.

"That's about what the war was about, a different society with different beliefs," he said.

In his lectures he also brings out some unpopular statistics and debunks more than a few myths.

For example, only 10 percent of southerners even owned slaves, Eason said. And in Wake County, eight freed black men owned slaves themselves, he added.

"It was a rich man's war and a poor man's fight," Eason said.

"No slave was brought to American under the Confederate flag," he added.

To Eason, slavery was not a cause of the war. Abraham Lincoln and Ulysses Grant each owned slaves prior to the Emancipation Proclamation, he said.

To those who cling to the slavery issue, Eason adds one startling observation.

"If you study world history, every human being is descended from slaves," he said.

The Angles and Saxons enslaved the Celts in England. The Romans conquered and enslaved the Anglo-Saxons along with most of Europe. Native American tribes conquered and enslaved each other, Eason added.

Eason's ancestors, through whom he is a member of the SCV, owned no slaves.

"My family didn't own any slaves, they were too poor," he said.

Despite the ongoing argument over causation, Eason said that membership continues to grow.

Sons of Confederate Veterans meetings are open to anyone, but membership has three requirements.

The member must be male, at least 12 year old, and have proof that an ancestor served honorably for the Confederacy, either as a soldier or in the Confederate government, Morgan said.

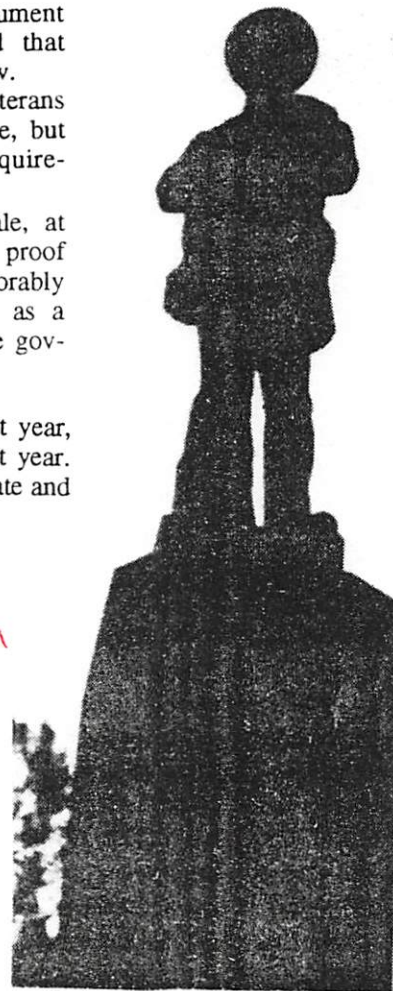
Dues cost \$30 for the first year, and \$28 for each subsequent year. Part of the money goes to state and federal coffers.

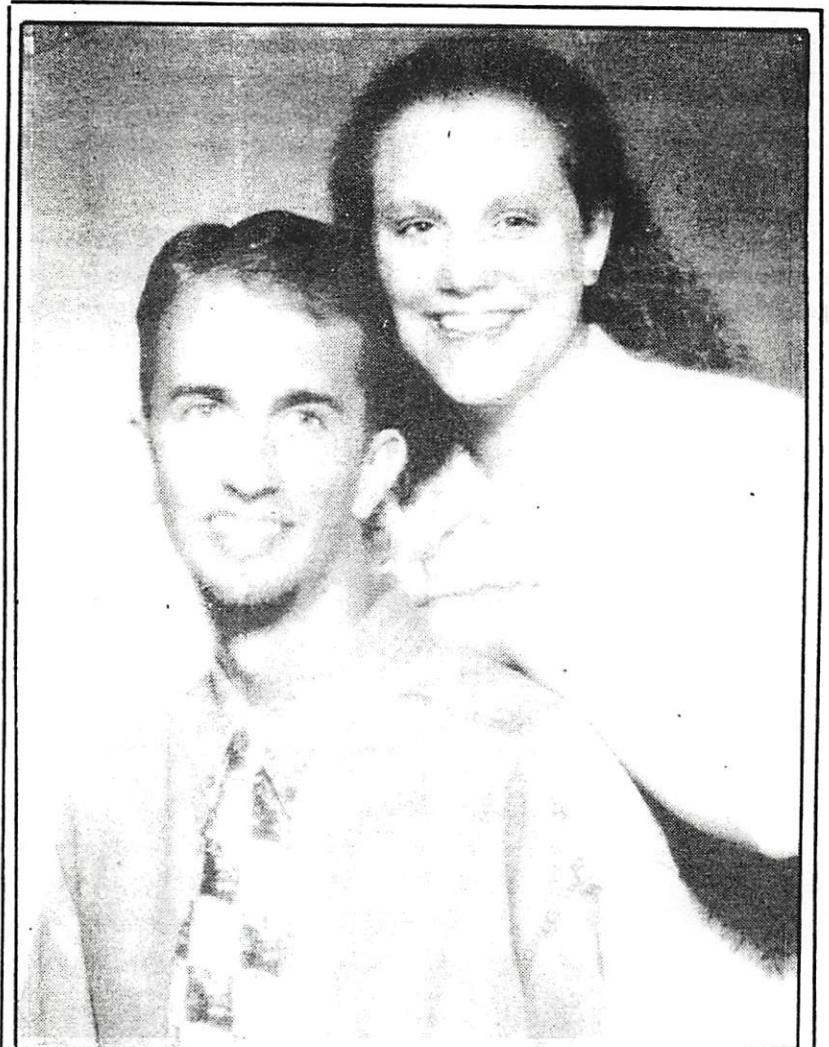

Zebulon woman takes life

A 65-year-old Zebulon woman died Sunday night of a self-inflicted gunshot wound to the head.

Cleo G. Eason of 300½ W. Gannon Ave. was found by neighbors at about 9 p.m.

"On arrival, (Zebulon police) officers observed a person laying on a bed," reported Zebulon Chief of Police J. Wayne Medlin. "They

found that she had a gunshot wound to the head. There was a 12-gauge shotgun laying across the body."

The motive as to why Ms. Eason took her own life is still a mystery. "We weren't able to learn anything as to why she committed suicide," Medlin said. "She didn't leave any type of suicide note."

Two families live at the West Gannon Avenue residence. "The occupants in the other part of the house said that they had heard a loud noise, like someone slamming something down," Medlin said.

At this time, law enforcement officials do not plan to investigate the incident further.

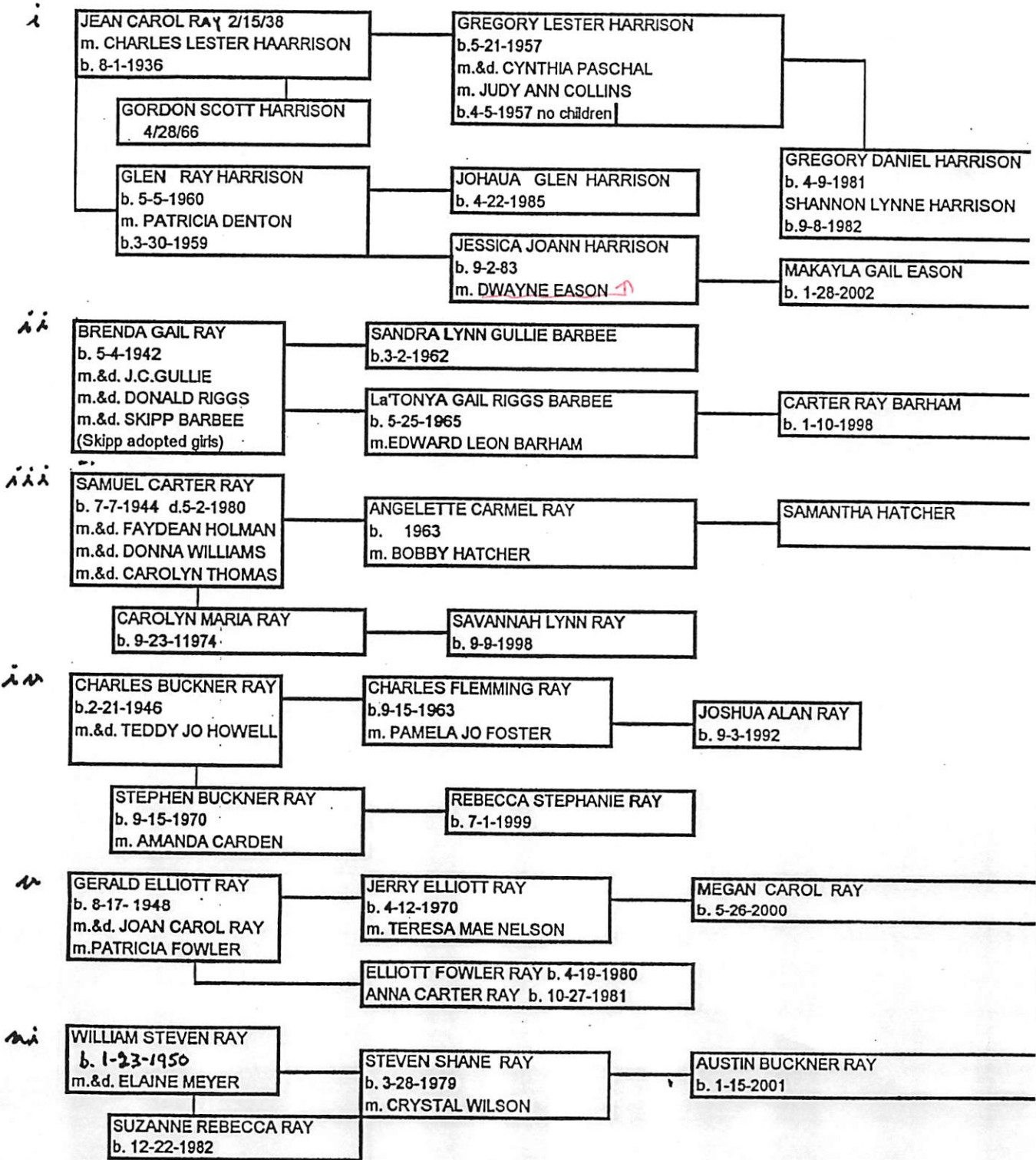

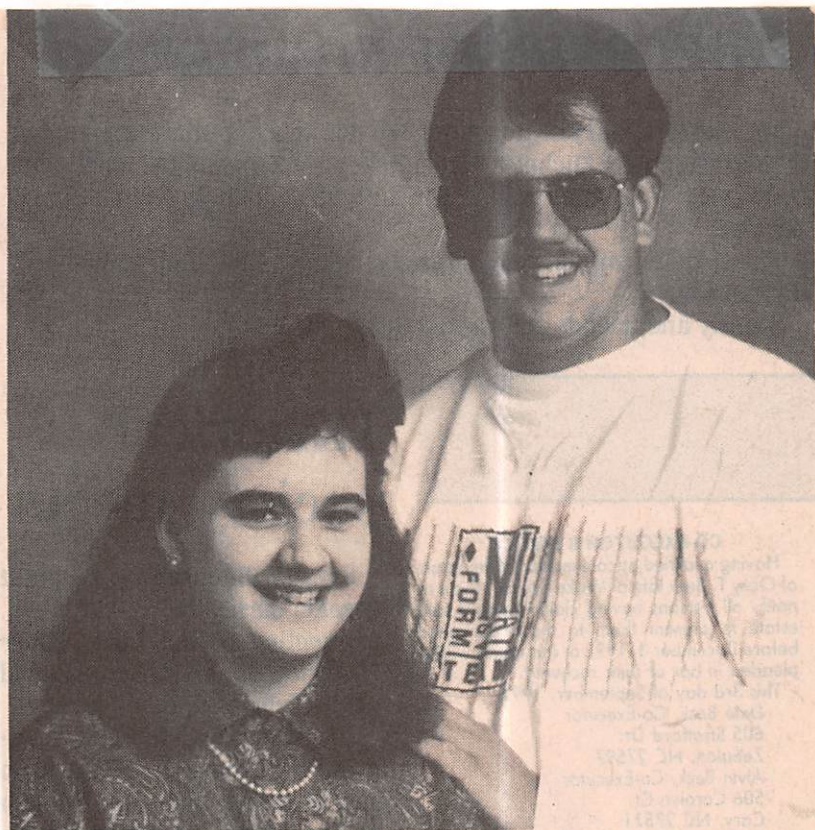

James Theophilus Adams served in Company D, North Carolina 26th Regiment, Confederate States of America, rising from the rank of lieutenant to lieutenant colonel. His picture and an account of his service appear in Chief Justice Walter Clark's History of North Carolina Regiments, Vol. II; in George C. Underwood's History of the Twenty-Sixth Regiment of the North Carolina Troops in the Great War 1861-65; and in Richard B. McCaslin's Portraits of Conflict, a Photographic History of North Carolina in the Civil War. He was in command of the regiment when General Robert E. Lee surrendered at Appomatox, VA; and he signed the paroles of the men. For a period he also commanded General James Johnston Pettigrew's Brigade, during its retreat from Petersburg, VA. His name appears on the Confederate monument in Holly Springs, NC; and a picture of him is on display in the Holly Springs Masonic Lodge.

Following the war he returned to his home in Wake County to farm and become engaged in the lumber business. He and other members of the Adams family bought the timber rights to tracts of land, then set up sawmills to cut and dress the lumber. His home, located near Holly Springs, is still (August 2000) standing. It is pictured on page 364 of Kelly A. Lally's book, The Historic Architecture of Wake County, North Carolina, and is incorrectly identified as the home of "Col. David Adams" (his brother). His birth, marriage and death dates are given in a family Bible, and photostats of those pages are included in these papers. He was named as Lucy Ann Beckwith's husband in Green Beckwith's will, Wake County, NC, Record of Wills, Book A, 1878-1884.

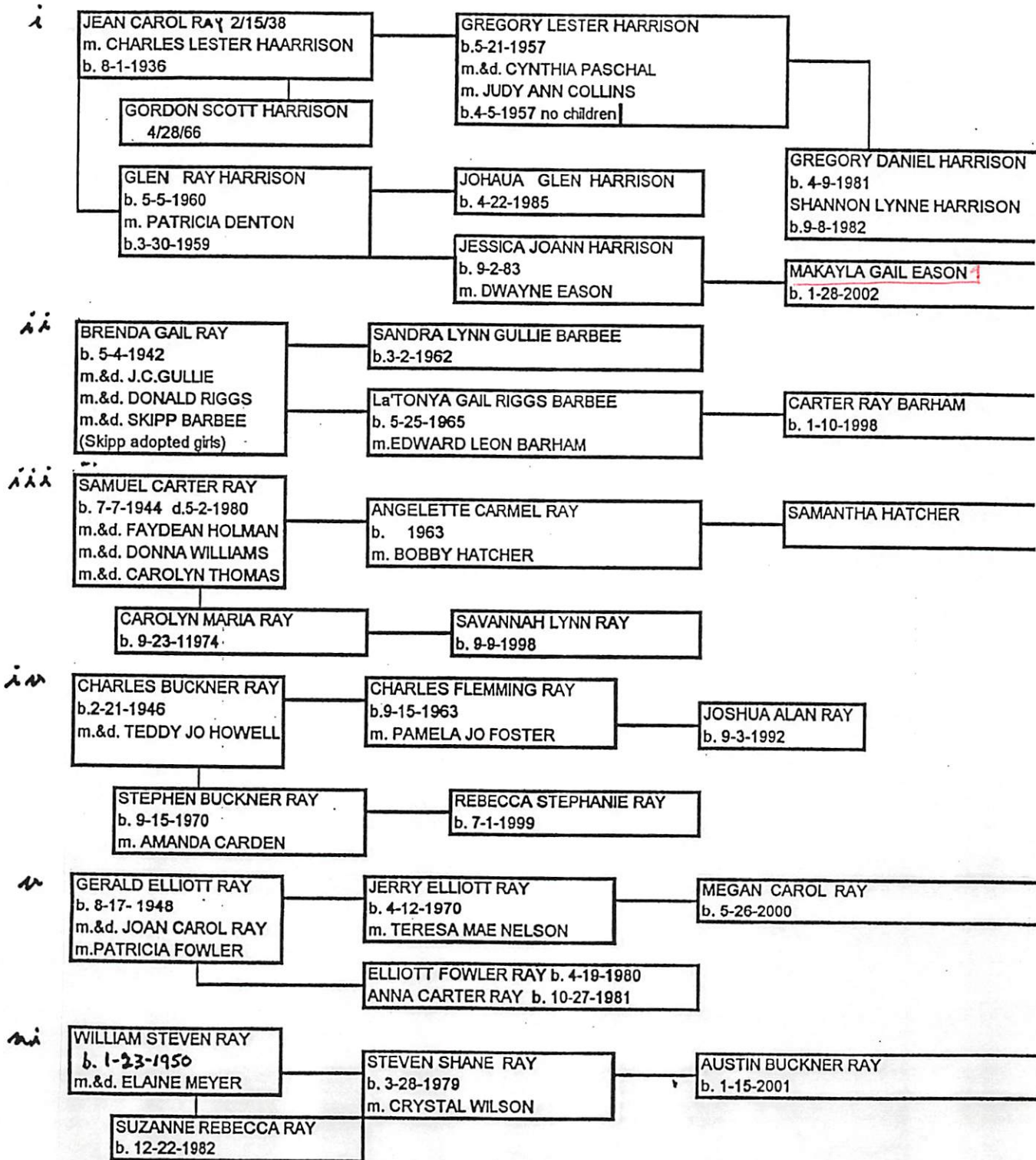
