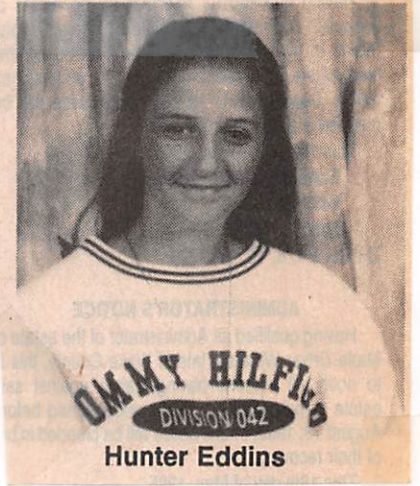

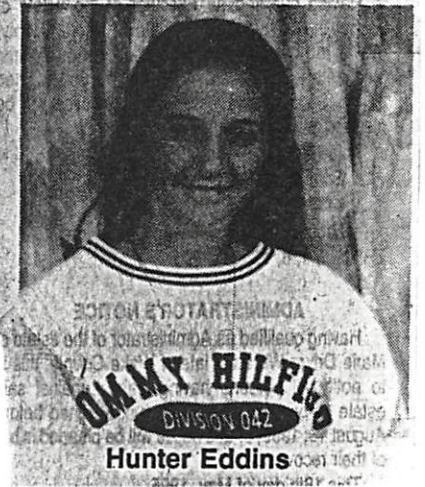

Don't burden the taxpayers

To the Editor:

I'm a senior citizen who lives in the town of Zebulon. I'm 67 years old and live on Social Security and a fixed income.

In a time of recession, how can Zebulon's commissioners and our mayor create such a hardship on the town of Zebulon's citizens by buying a share of Five County Stadium?

Yes, I feel it will be hardship as the town of Zebulon will have to pay at least 11-percent interest on the total amount of \$2,000,000 plus delivery costs of \$100,927.08 as stated on copy of lease/purchase proposal statement. This 11-percent interest paid on amount stated above to be borrowed of \$2,000,000 will cover period of about 20 years.

In the Aug. 10, 1990, issue of the Zebulon Record, Zebulon Mayor Thurston Debnam said, "There are ways (to raise the money) other than just plain old property taxes. The question is, "How creative can we get?"

I must say in an answer to this statement, that after you find other ways to raise the money for the pledge of \$2 million to the Mudcats (than just plain old property tax), how will this money be paid plus 11-percent interest over the period of about 20 years?

So our 1992 taxes are now based on the 1991 rates. To this I might add, that doesn't necessarily mean that these taxes will remain the same during the next 20 years, based on the 1991 rate, that is.

Yes, the town of Zebulon needs to move forward but not at the expense of the local taxpayers (of Zebulon), tax dollars being used to finance a private business. I know the people of Zebulon have

read and heard this statement before, but this is the first time I have written a letter to the editor of the Zebulon Record, that I feel the Mudcats venture is a private business.

I read in a recent issue of the Zebulon Record, in a letter to the editor, the following statement:

"Steve Bryant, owner of the Mudcats, has said that baseball rules require the Double-A Mudcats to have a permanent stadium costing \$8 million to \$10 million, but they will be permitted to begin playing in a temporary \$2.5 million stadium, which according to Bryant, Zebulon's money spent on his land will provide."

Now I must ask this question: Where do they expect to find the \$6 million to \$8 million needed to finish the permanent stadium? I have had this question on my mind for many months.

At my present age of 67, I probably will not live another 20 years, but there are many younger people who are living in Zebulon that will have the burden of the town of Zebulon expenditures in the future. Of course, I may add, I do not know how each of them feels about the possible increase of taxes in the future years. I certainly don't mean to be expressing their personal opinion on taxes in Zebulon. I'm just expressing my thought on this matter.

In the Sept. 15, 1990, issue of The

News and Observer, an article written by staff writer Billy Warden included the following: "The county has no interest right now in investing in big dollars in a stadium," says Vernon Malone, chairman of board of commissioners. "Our budget is for schools, libraries, parks and social services."

I mentioned this article because it will be year 1995 before Wake County would possibly put any money into a stadium. Even then it is at the bottom of their list, then the stadium is not likely to get any money.

I wish there was time enough before the publication of the Oct. 31 Zebulon Record for me to ask each of the people who signed the petition protesting that their tax dollars not be used to finance private business if they regretted signing this petition so I could give the results in my letter to the editor. There isn't time for me to do so. But I feel I would have been happy with the results.

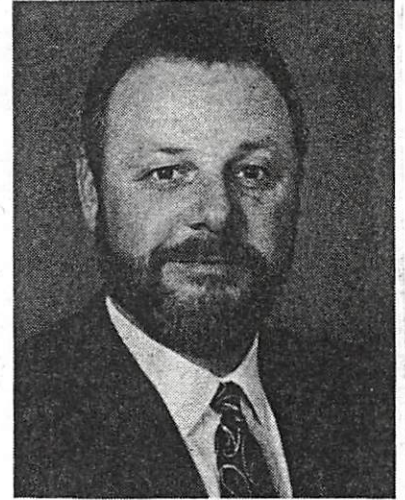

Down on the farm, somebody's dreams are ending.

When a way of life can be auctioned off, there's more than one fence that needs mending.

The dreams of a Zebulon family ended Saturday.

But unlike the country song made famous in 1985 by Charlie Pride, this family has some new dreams.

Joe Eddins ended four generations of tending the family-owned farm on Route 3, Zebulon, on Saturday when all of the farm equipment was sold at an auction.

It was, Eddins said, a tough decision, necessitated by a dwindling profit for farm commodities, a bleak forecast for the near future, and a chance

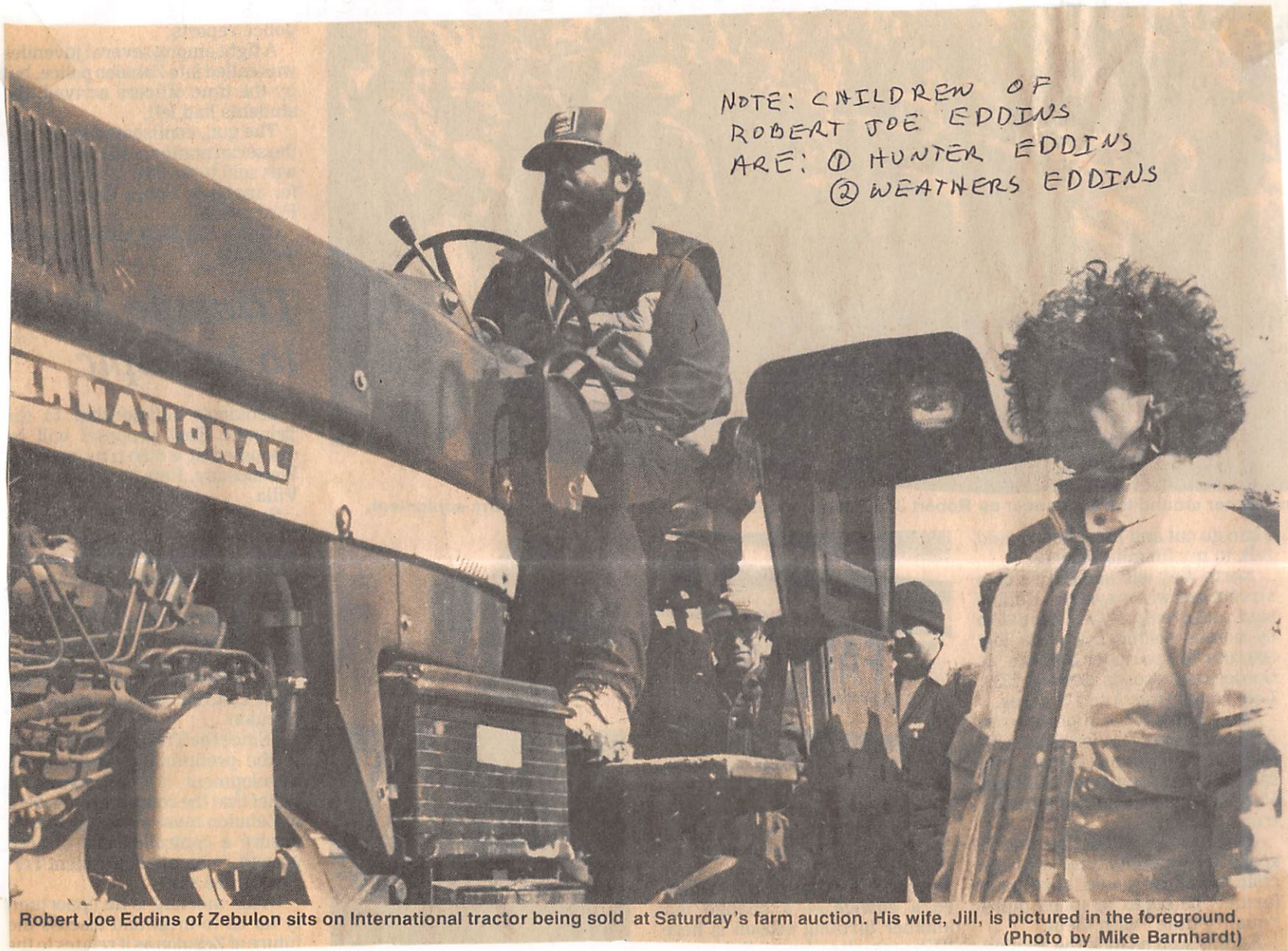
to begin another career.

"We didn't give up. We didn't quit," he said. "We decided, at this point, it was better for us to make a change.

"When I made this decision, strictly on a financial basis, I had a lot of second thoughts, because my great-grandfather, my grandfather, and my father and myself had all been farmers."

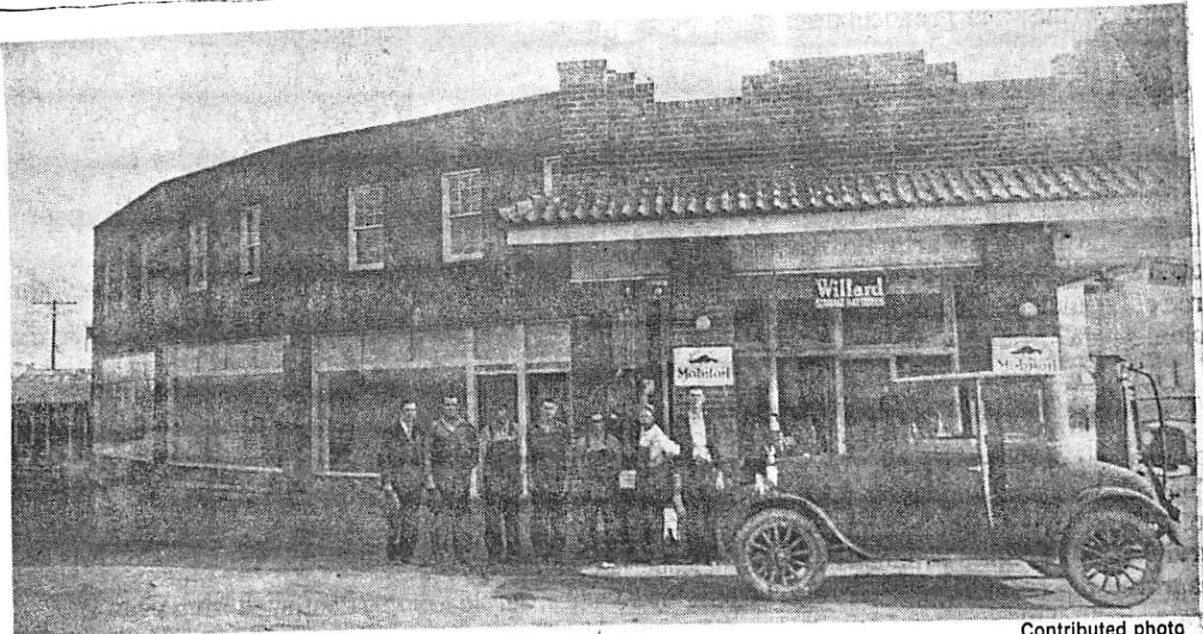

Zebulon landmark torn down

After standing in Zebulon for more than 60 years, the Phil-ett Oil Co. at the intersection of U.S. Business 64 and N.C. 97 was torn down last week.

Before the building was demolished, Avon Privette Jr., whose father, Avon Privette Sr., founded the company in 1926, went and sat in his father's office.

"It was a very, very strange feeling," Privette Jr. said.

The service station's name came about from Privett Sr. (he did not spell his name with an "e" whereas Privette Jr. does) and his partner Kerney Phillips, thus the name Phil-ett.

For people traveling east, the station was a good stopping place for a drink, Privette Jr. said.

Privett Sr. operated the station from 1926-66 before suffer-

ing a stroke and being forced to retire.

"He was a real successful businessperson," Privette Jr. said.

The service station was expanded to include a garage and later on a Dodge-Plymouth dealership.

Donald Stallings, 89, worked in the garage for 24 years from 1929-53. He even bought one-half interest in the garage, and in the late 1940s, he purchased one-half interest in the dealership.

In the early 1950s, Sidney Eddins, former town commissioner, was manager of the station and also a partner. Even after Privette Jr. inherited the station, Eddins operated it until his death in 1980.

"It was quite an impressive looking building in its day," Privette Jr. said.

He said he remembers visiting the station when he was a

boy and listening to local men talk around the potbellied stove.

"A lot of business went on in that building and not just things about the service station," Privette Jr. said.

Across the street from the station, Privett Sr. had bears and deer that customers would feed, Privette Jr. said.

The service station was closed in 1983 and recently Privette Jr. sold the building and the buyer agreed to tear it down.

One of the reasons for the building's destruction is the improvement of the intersection, and repairs to bring the station up to building-code specifications would have cost too much money, he said. Red Star Oil Co. is planning to build a convenience store and fuel service center at the site, in conjunction with the Department of Transportation's realignment of the intersection.

He was a Paul Harris fellow of the Rotary Foundation, and at the time of his death was president of the Rotary Foundation of Zebulon, a non-profit corporation holding title to the quarter of a million dollar Rotary-Woman's Club building in Zebulon.

A Mason for more than 40 years, Eddins was a member of Zebulon Lodge No. 609, as well as the Zebulon Shrine Club.

Eddins was active in civic and political functions. He led the ticket in Zebulon's last municipal election and served 10 years on the town's board of commissioners. He was a lifelong Democrat and served

as Democratic precinct chairman in Zebulon until 1984 when he was succeeded by his wife.

Eddins had served as member and chairman of the Zebulon School Advisory Council, having been appointed in 1964 when it was still a district school committee.

He was a graduate of Wakelon High School in Zebulon.

Eddins lived all his life in Zebulon, except for a period during World War II when he was employed by a Wilmington shipbuilding firm. He was associated for about 45 years with Phil-Ett Oil Company, Exxon distributor, from which he retired in 1981 upon the sale of his interest in the firm. In 1984 he was selected by Exxon of-

officials as district distributor of the year. Since his retirement from the oil firm he has been engaged in the construction and operation of housing in his home community.

Resolutions of appreciation for his good works have been passed by the Baraca Sunday school class at Zebulon Baptist Church and by the Zebulon Rotary Club, which have made memorial gifts to the local library, of which he was the first president.

He was also president of the Wakelon Nursing Home in Zebulon.

He was a charter member and benefactor of the Little

River Historical Society.

"I have nothing but the best of accolades for Mr. Eddins," Zebulon Mayor Frank Wall said Monday. "He was a civic minded individual. He was interested in the town and its people and he worked hard. I've appreciated him on the board."
