Hello Phil-

I am researching my family and have made some interesting discoveries recently. I am descended from Lucinda Crocker Anderson (b Mar 10, 1810 Jackson Co TN)-d Aug 13, 1889 Iron Co MO), who married Peyton Anderson on Jan 8, 1937. He died in 1838. She had two sons, Francis Marion Anderson (b in 1840 or 1841) and William Jasper Anderson (b July 6, 1843 Jackson Co, d Sept 29, 1927 Iron Co MO). In 1850 they are still in TN. Francis Marion married his first cousin Patsy Elizabeth Crocker in TN around 1860. Shortly thereafter our family lore has them all going to Missouri with Lucinda's Crocker family. Rumor was that the father of one or both of the boys was named Upchurch.

△

We have tested descendants of both Anderson boys and of Gillum Upchurch, who seems a likely candidate, given that he was also born in 1810, was between marriages at the time the boys were born, and apparently said in a court case (though I have not seen a document) that he was reputed to be the father of two additional children by two different women. I was prepared to have only one Anderson match Upchurch DNA (if that).

But

The descendant of William Jasper Anderson matches the descendant of Gillum Upchurch 66 of 67 markers. The descendant of Francis Marion Anderson matches the descendant of Gillum Upchurch 64 of 67. (He is one more generation removed, since his father is no longer living) The two Andersons (again not the same generation, one fourth gen, one fifth, if we count Gillum as first generation) match 65 of 67.

I am told by someone in the office at FamilyTree DNA that these results are pretty definitive in terms of establishing kinship. But it wouldn't have to be Gillum...

I am wondering what you might be able to add that might relate to this story. If we are Upchurches, I would like to learn more about the Upchurches before they came to Tennessee. I understand that there is a book and a newsletter. I would be happy to purchase whatever materials would help me in this search.

Hi Jane---

Delighted to hear from you. I have spent considerable time researching the Jackson County, TN Upchurches and without checking my memory tells me that while I assembled a large body of organized information I was unable to find a link between the progenitor born in the late 1700's to earlier Upchurch generations. In a couple of hours We depart for a six day trip(from home -MO) to AZ to see a GS graduate from the University. I'll give you this quick response and hope we can continue to explore mutual interests as time goes by. However, after we return we reload and nine days later depart for three weeks of family history research in NC. So please be patient with me.

Several years ago I spent a day or so in Jackson County, TN interviewing people and looking for resources. This culminated in an article in the Upchurch Bulletin. For new cooperators I offer to go through all 100 issues of the Bulletin and for \$40 to select eight issues that I think might be most interesting to them. You can let me know if this interests you.

Our working theory has been that, with rare exceptions, all white American Upchurches descend from one person Michael Upchurch so that makes you and I cousins based on your research. I am impressed with your DNA work and wonder if it can be expanded to build a data base to solve other Upchurch issues. I have no good understanding of the matter but have a cousin in Utah that has long had an interest.

I have spent over 40 years researching and publishing on the Upchurch Family and can assure you that our Family has an interesting and well documented record.

I will get a check off to you today for whatever materials might be relevant to our case!
The family of Gillum Upchurch (born in TN in 1810) seems to have arrived in Jackson County TN sometime just before 1810, because I think his older siblings were born in North Carolina. A Steve Burris has posted on this family, but none of the email addresses I could find are valid. Perhaps he is no longer active. He lists Gillum's father as William Upchurch, born 1778 in NC. Perhaps you might learn more on your trip.

A DNA project where numerous different lines are tested might show genetic connections that are only speculative at the moment. It is exciting to contemplate. I know nothing about the Upchurches yet, having only just confirmed a connection beyond family rumor.

Would the book by Belle Lewter West, *The Upchurch Family of England, Virginia, and North Carolina*, be worth locating? Don't know if it's even available...

I am happy to have connected with you! Thanks for whatever you have for me!

Your message about this family has given me more questions to ponder.

There were at least five different Anderson families in Jackson Co., TN early on. I descend from two of them and have been trying to prove that these two lines were actually part of the same family for many years now. One of my lines is from Peyton Anderson who was born about 1792 and died 22 Mar 1838 in Jackson Co., TN. Peyton was the son of Charles Anderson of VA.

At the death of Peyton Anderson, his family Bible was presented to his youngest son Joel and is still in the possession of a family member today. I have a copy of several pages from this family Bible. Included in these pages are marriages, births and deaths. Peyton Anderson's death is recorded here. There is an entry on these pages for the second marriage of Peyton Anderson. It says he was married on the 8 day of January 1837. The name of this second wife is recorded on these pages but it is extremely hard to decipher what it actually says. The first name of the wife in the marriage entry looks like Lerisindy. Her last name is the most difficult for any of us to make out. It could be Chronky or Cronsky or something totally different. The only thing that is clear is the name begins with C. It looks to be about 7 letters long.

The birth date of this second wife was also recorded on these pages directly below the marriage entry. It says Loucindy C____? was born 9 day of March 1812.

Since there was no family in Jackson Co at the time with a name anything like Chronsky, I thought that perhaps it might be Crocker. Others working on Peyton Anderson's family are quite positive that it doesn't say Crocker. I still don't know what the entry says and am not positive of anything.

△△△ I am however fairly certain that Peyton and Lucinda C did not have any children together. The names of Peyton Anderson and his first wife Anna's children are all recorded in his bible, as well as many of their grandchildren. There is no entry for a Francis Marion or a William Jasper. Since Peyton Anderson definitely died in 1838, he could not be the father of either of these boys. I do still believe that it is possible their mother could have been the second wife of Peyton Anderson and that is why she was using the name Anderson in both Jackson Co., TN and Iron Co., MO. In the 1850 census entry for Lucinda and the two boys she is listed only two doors away from one of Peyton's daughters and near several other family members.

I know the birth date you have for Lucinda Crocker does not agree with what is recorded in Peyton Anderson's bible for his second wife, but it is certainly close enough to make one consider the possibility Peyton Anderson's widow Lucinda was the same woman as Lucinda Crocker.

Your mention of an Upchurch as being the father of the two boys was interesting to me as well. Gillum Upchurch was first married to Sarah Anderson, daughter of Caleb Anderson Sr and niece of my Peyton Anderson. Sarah died in 1839 after the birth of her third child. Gillum Upchurch's second wife was named Eliza. She was married to a Jones before she married Gillum, but I have never determined her maiden name. I am wondering why you speculate that the Anderson boys' father might be Gillum. Gillum Upchurch did give testimony in a court case in Jackson Co before his death in 1897. He stated in his deposition "I am the reputed father of two children each by different women". Could this be where your speculation comes from?

I was working on Elizabeth Terry who married Carroll Crocker in Jackson Co. TN when I came across the trail of Lucinda Anderson and her two sons in Iron Co., MO. I found the death certificates and the burial records for the Crocker and Anderson family there in MO and picked up again on trying to determine the maiden name of Peyton Anderson's second wife. I would be interested in any other information or theories you might have about Lucinda Crocker and her relationship to my Anderson family.

If I can help in any way, please let me know.

Jane,

It was nice talking to you today. I hope you won't think that it was all a waste of time now that I have the pages of the bible in front of me. In my first note to you about Lucinda I made some errors about the placement of some of the entries. I was doing this all from memory before and was wrong about some of what I said. Lucinda's entries are not on the same pages, but they are in the bible.

It also appears that I may have led you astray as to the connection. Once I scanned the pages in to the computer they are a lot easier to read. I should have done this years ago! It seems that my cousin was right and I was using wishful thinking about the last name. From what I now see the last name appears to read as Chrocky on one page and Chroncky on the other. Now I'm a little less certain that we are talking about the same Lucinda. While I feel that there is still a possibility that it could be the same lady, it certainly doesn't look like Crocker to me any more. That doesn't change the fact that there was no such family name as Chrocky or Chroncky in any records in Jackson Co. It is possible that the Crocker name has changed spelling over the years or was pronounced in such a way back then that the spelling is more like it sounded then than what it actually is or was then. I'm just not quite so sure as I once was that Peyton Anderson married Lucinda Crocker.

I hope that I haven't wasted your time in running down this possible connection to Peyton Anderson. The woman listed as Lucinda Anderson with two sons in the 1850 Jackson Co. census was definitely in the right area and of the right age to have been Peyton's second wife. I have found no connection between her and any of the other Anderson families in the county at the time. Let me know if you think this is still worth researching and I will do some more digging through my files for other information I found on her.

I will look through the Jackson Co. court records I have for other information on the Crocker and associated families and send those to you later. I'm also going to look for the newspaper records I found on the Anderson group that I think was in St. Francois Co., MO. I'm thinking that these were obits for some of either Jasper or Marion's descendants.

I tried to attach bible pages, but the files were too large. I'll reduce the size and send them later.

Again, I'm sorry if I sent you off on a wild goose chase.

Something else I see after rereading one of Natalie's letters. I think the people telling the story to her are confusing Andersons and Upchurches, but here it is...

"Upchurch family, travelling by wagon, camped on ? Anderson's land, and enlisted help of an Anderson girl to help ailing Mrs. Upchurch. ... Mrs. Upchurch died (I saw this in a chancery court minutes microfilm) 1839. Upchurch was kindly, provided means of support, was red-headed. Emma didn't know the mother's name but heard her referred to as Mam."

It looks to me as if Peyton Anderson's first wife was Marny, but it's hard to read! What do you think? Don't know if the Mrs. Upchurch was Sarah herself, who was an Anderson. And is Gillum the kindly redhead? And hadn't the Upchurches been there in Tennessee already? I think they came from North Carolina and before that Isle of Wight VA. but I don't know when.

Jane,

I think you are saying that in your family stories the name was pronounced as Chrocky and not Crocker. Is that right? If that is what you are saying, then I feel better about the spelling of Lucinda's name and her connection to Peyton Anderson.

I don't have the 1839 chancery page you referenced so I'm not certain this is the same Mrs. Upchurch. All I know for certain is that Sarah Anderson Upchurch was alive in 1838 when her father Caleb Anderson died. She died somewhere around 1839 -1840. There are several court cases that talk about her death but none

- □ Δ give an exact date. The oldest child of Gillum and Sarah Upchurch was named Carter Upchurch. According
- Δ to his death certificate he was born 4 July 1836. The second child was named H Ross Upchurch.
- Δ According to his civil war pension application Ross was born 5 May 1838. The third child (unnamed) was born and died either 1839 or 1840.

Gillum Upchurch testified in a case in 1897 where he talks about his wife and children. This case is a dispute concerning land that Gillum sold to his son John M Upchurch when Gillum was up in years. Sarah's two sons and several other Anderson heirs were contesting that Gillum was selling land that came from Caleb Anderson's estate to his daughter Sarah, and that Gillum had only a life estate not legally entitled to sell the land to anyone. John M Upchurch is from the second marriage to Eliza (possibly Murphy or Murray?). T B Upchurch is Thomas Bradford Upchurch, son of Thomas Upchurch and Rhoda Anderson, also a daughter of Caleb.

GILLIAM UPCHURCH for Defendants, deposition taken at residence of JNO M. UPCHURCH on Flynn's Creek in the presence of J. T. ANDERSON and T. B. UPCHURCH, September 4, 1897. Stated his first wife was SARAH ANDERSON; that her father died in 1838, that she had drawn Lot 5 following his death [Lot 3 was marked through, replaced with Lot 5], which was North of and adjoining Rhoda Upchurch draw and was 50 acres. Stated his wife had been dead for years, was living when land divided. "Can't state when she died, but lived over in the hollow where we first moved after the land was divided...lived there several years after...wife died". Could not remember when sons H. R. UPCHURCH and CARTER UPCHURCH were born; born after land was divided, born on the land. H. R. UPCHURCH about age two and CARTER UPCHURCH about age four when she died. Had another child, the youngest, who lived 15 days, was born after H. R. The children's mother died when the child was born.

Ques: Did you deed the land to your Brother Thomas, who was father of T. B. UPCHURH?

Ans: Don't know.

[Note: When questioned further, stated T. B. UPCHURCH "took possession after we traded". GILLAM UPCHURCH stated he never moved his second wife [Eliza] there. Did not recall how long wife Sarah had been dead when he made the trade with "brother THOMAS UPCHURCH".

↑ Ques: Were CARTER and H. R., or ROSS UPCHURCH born before the death of their grandfather [CALEB] ANDERSON?
 Ans: Must have been before. Did not recall when he and SARAH ANDERSON married. "First married, lived up in Hollow where JIM MURRAY lives now...lived there several years, about one-half mile and a little to the side from the land in controversy.
 Taken by W. H. HAILE 6 Sept 1897 GILLUM [X] UPCHURCH

Elsewhere in the case other community members stated that Sarah Anderson Upchurch died in 1839 or 1840 but they couldn't be sure of the date either.

I don't know exactly when the Upchurch family came to TN or where they were before. I only followed some of their descendants as they related to my various family members. There was a case in 1885 that had a little more that might establish residence of the Upchurch family.

↑ Deposition of P. McCarver for Defendant, age near 76, 7 September 1885:
 Knew Thomas Upchurch since boyhood, since the death of Caleb Anderson. Understand he married Rhoda Anderson. [Thomas] was pore before he married and his parents was pore they lived near me and after his marriage he lived near me several years and died near me. Knew Caleb Anderson many years... industrious. At the time land was divided and before Negroes were sold, "I think Joshua Hale hired Jes the first year and about the end of the year Wm C. Anderson bought him."

Some time after marrying Thomas Upchurch was gone to Western District [Tennessee] to his brother John's, came back before the division of Caleb Anderson's land. William Upchurch got in a fite [sic] with Wesley Raglin, bit off part of his ear. Thomas Upchurch as Security had to pay off, borrowed money from Elijah Wheeler for that purpose.

Was acquainted with H. J. Atkins; believed he sold his claim to the estate [of Thomas Upchurch] and left [the area] before the sale of Negroes. Thomas was considered in bad health for several years.

Q by Atty: Who owns the land where Gillem Upchurch lives/lived?
 A: I do I reckon...at his death he only claimed a lifetime estate in it on his answer in the suit we had...I had a deed to it from his former wife's heirs Carter and Ross [Upchurch]
 [Signed] P. McCarver

↑ It appears from this testimony that Thomas and Gillum Upchurch also had a brother named John who was in another area of TN in the 1830's. I don't know if any of this will help you with the story about the Upchurch or Crocker or whichever family is was that supposedly camped on the Anderson land. I just don't know enough about either Upchurch or Crocker right now to tell you something that will explain the family stories.

□ I'm still combing the court records for more on Crocker and will send you what I find.

□ On another note for you and the Andersons, my cousin on my father's side has done a great deal of work on our family and on her mother's family as well. She has Andersons on that side. Here is what she says:

My Andersons descend from Joseph Anderson, 1753, New Bern Dist, North Carolina - 1848, Thomas Co., Georgia. He had two sons, and our DNA matches go back to one son or the other. We can't find anyone else, so don't know whether Joseph had siblings; and we also can't trace farther back. There is a close match still in Scotland, so we conclude that Joseph's people came from there. There are two Anderson lines who married into my line, and I have worked on them, too. It had always been assumed that those Andersons were related to ours because they were in the same area, but their DNA doesn't match us or each other.

If any of this sounds familiar, I can put you in touch with her.

Thank you for your letter of 12 OCT 2011 and for your \$10 check for the upcoming UB. Also, I will now respond to your email of 27 SEP 2011. As you can see I am quite behind in my work. My ankle is much improved and for a week I have been putting full weight on it with just a little pain.

I have now spent quite a few hours on the Wilbanks / Linnax / Upchurch (Frank) names you asked about. I will here share what I have found which still leaves many puzzles. What I found is in western TN (Weakley, Henry Counties) - far removed from your Jackson Co, TN. Maybe you have reason that your set of folks may have moved to western TN. Henry Co, TN is the headquarters for the John 4, III / John 4, II subclass starting in the early 1800's. A few from other Clans were there also.

I have many references to migrations stopping off in Weakley Co, TN. There were Upchurches there at one time or another. My RAJ relatives were there from NC by 1850. Maybe some of them are still there.

Enclosed is my Brief sheet for Norma J. Wilbanks. I doubt that he ties into MARK WILBANKS whom you reference but you can decide. This is the only Wilbanks I have in my system.

Enclosed is my 3-Page 4-Item Brief on Frank U. The plot for him thickens and it appears he is the Frank you reference. I still have not been able to link him fully to earlier generations. The same may be said for his stated father Anderson U. (How odd that we see the first name Anderson here while your ancestors included the last name Anderson!!).

Dear Jane -

After several weeks of being overwhelmed as a result of the bus trips and the follow-up activity I now find a quiet morning to go into our exchange in more detail. I trust that my new year cold is completely behind you.

There is bad news and good news.

The bad news is that my conference with friends Jim Jones in NC leads me to believe that DNA Technology will not be very helpful in guiding us to which branches of the Upchurch Family a given living male traces. The reason for this is that we presume all American White Male Upchurches and their male descendants trace back to a single person - Michael Upchurch 1624-1687.

A DNA test of a male living today can tell you whether or not the male belongs to that large set of males covering several generations that do descend from Michael U. It seems you need to compare the DNA samples for the descendants of the two Andersen boys (b. 1840, 1843) with

Other males who are also presumed descendants of Michael U (such as myself). Has this been done? I would think the DNA Yehuda Project to which you refer would allow the needed comparisons. It will still not tell you which of the several generations of some from Michael U was the ancestor of the present day descendants.

I am reluctant to name my DNA test as the only thing I can learn from it is that I am not an Yehuda. I have too many years invested in being an Yehuda only to learn now that I am not.

I still encourage you to promote the use of DNA technology in family history research for what it can do to help. I am sorry I cannot become a leader in this effort - already have too many irons in the fire.

Now for the good news - I have done a huge amount of work on William U b1778 and his descendants but know there is much more to do - especially to find his father and thus the place of his Group in the Yehuda Family. I'll be glad to work with you on this and on organizing more on his descendants.

I want to get more from you as to just exactly ^{how} you trace back to Linda Crocker b. 1810 and add it to my system - but print my report to gen.

Now to my efforts on William U b 1778. I have two kinds of records for all of my work on all families - A Profile System - where a file is maintained on every individual I record and a Master Outline Notebook for each Group (Clan, Subclan, etc) I record.
