Hi. I found your site on the Internet. I see that Mackey Johnson married Nathan Upchurch. and you suspect she was a daughter of Julius Johnson.

I have been trying to do research on Francis & Julius Johns(t)on of Granville / Bute/ Johnston et al. counties and I was wondering if in your research you determined what happened to Julius? (Or a clue of where to look?)

My last record of him is Wake County 1793.

My gggGrandfather Francis Johnston was born in Granville County in 1761 and research points to Francis Johnston of Granville / Bute County as his father.

We have a candidate on the Johnson DNA board and matched perfectly with an Andrew Johnson who was born in 1766 and lived most of his life in western Nash County, NC. We also have another match that points to a Virginia origin.

It appears these Johnsons had a long relation with the Upchurch, Alford and Pace families of the area and I suspect Francis I was the father of Julius and an overseer for one. (He was not a property owner and was on Crooked Creek 1751 - 1771).

My apologies for not replying sooner. Your letter came in late last week and I meant to reply sooner but got busy. Days turn into weeks around here real easy.

I have almost entered all of your information in the file and I want to send you a copy of it. Hopefully, I can complete it tonight.

I wouldn't say that I am "brick walled", but I am to the point that I need someone that has access to the various (7 I believe) county documents to work on it. I contracted with Vickie Burns awhile back to work on it and she was going to start the end of this month. She just emailed me that the Archives are closing due to renovations and she probably can't work on it until July.

I replied that I would keep chipping away on it.

I think I told you, but we "DNA'd" earlier and came up with an "Andrew Johnson" as a perfect match for my "1761 Francis" that was born in 1766 and lived most of his life on Turkey Creek.

At first glance (and very well might be) he appears to be a brother of Mackey.

However, on second glance, it appears that he married a daughter of Robert Vick and bought property from Vick 1st on Toisnot Swamp / Creek and then Turkey Creek.

Vick's 1st Granville Grant on Toisnot was 1761. So, I told Lea Johnson (Andrew's descendent) that all we needed to do was locate some Johns(t)ons on Toisnot.

Then, we get the bad news from Vickie.

So, as bad as I hate to,....I have emailed Mrs. Hofmann and ordered 3 Edgecombe County deed books.

I am not for sure what I am looking at.....A family of Johns(t)ons that came down the trading road from Virginia and some turned SE and settled between the Tar and Nuese or they migrated up the Valleys on one river or the other.

I need to go. Banker is coming out to inspect his collateral (cattle) this morning and while necessary, is such a waste of time.....Billy

If you are going to the Archives, be sure and call them because the Search Room is fixing to be closed.

I wish I could go with you. I am handicapped, not having access to a good library and I think if I could spend just 12 hours in a good one I could solve a lot of problems.

What part of Missouri are you in? I am located 55 miles NW of Roswell, NM on US 285. Right where the flyin' saucers land about every third night.

\* Attached is that file. I had formatted it as a semi letter to the genealogist. Since she can do nothing until July, it appears that there is no big hurry on dotting the i's.

If you will, look it over and make corrections. Your info is on page 12.

I am a little confused on the boundry. There is a 1746 Granville Map on the Internet that I can no longer find (or I would send you the link) that described the 1746 eastern boundary as this: "a southerly line from the mouth of Stonehouse Creek on the Roanoke River to the mouth of Cypress Swamp on the Tar River "and thence across the river in a direct course to the middle grounds between the Tar River and Neuse River".

The map shows the "middle grounds" was Little River being mostly the southeastern boundary. I drew that description in on my map on page 6.

So, we have the Upchurch, Pace and Johnson deeds of these guys being in Johnston County in the late 60s? Were they the other side of Little River or by then had the boundary been brought up to Moccasin Creek? (Look on page 3- 4)

Anyway, look this over and make corrections. Tell me what you think. I'm a rookie.

I've sent Ms. Burns a fair retainer and I'm afraid I'll burn it up with her just studying my files!!

My main problem here at the ranch is no help. (Or no rain :-)) When I was younger, the neighbors "neighbored" and the larger ranches were still able to hire cowboys. Today there are ropers and bull riders but no cowboys and the neighbors (if they don't live in town) are all off roping at a rodeo. Plus I'm aging alittle. (56)

I never realized I was a "man of the land" until I started the genealogy. Then it hit home that I am like my forefathers. Kind of a nice feeling. I'm not too for sure though that people like us aren't the last....but I hope not.

I see it is late. Yes, don't worry. We will stay in touch. Feel free to drop me a line anytime. (I usually work on this every night until late.)

It boils down to a couple of simple questions.

1. Who was this Francis Johnston on Crooked Creek?
2. Who was this Julius with him?
3. Are Andrew, Francis & Mackey siblings or cousins and who are their parents?
4. Is there another Johnston family living nearby that the radar screen picks up but doesn't quite bring in to focus?

Possibly with the Robert Vick connection on Toisnot Swamp, The Edgcombe Deed Books on order will shed some light.

I would suspect that after all of the years that you have been researching your family (and the Granville - Johnston area), you have all of the information I sent you.

I have corrected your name in the file. My apologies. I make mistakes every day but somehow can not get use to the fact.

I once had a lady tell me that she would share no information with anyone. That she "had worked very hard on "her" family and everyone else could do the same". I replied that the only people in the whole world that were even remotely interested in her family were a very small percentage of people in her family and those were the only people she was effecting. The rest could care less....

No one wants to see their work pirated and splattered across the Internet but these are not "National Security Secretes". Give credit where credit is due and keep the horses pulling.

I'll bring my "pedigree file" up to date in a few days. Let me know when you get back and I will then Email it.

Once upon a time I used Ancestry's program and then converted it into Word and edited it. That original has morphed into many as I use parts of it for the basis of a new. (Like the one I just sent you, 1761 Francis is the beginning in the old.)

For some reason, after Francis's death in 46 his son James and two sisters and his Mother Hannah moved from Ashe County to Schuyler County Mo. James married a girl he probably grew up with in Ashe County there and by 1858 they were in Texas and fought the Civil War. I know there is alot of history on James that I don't have but I elected to jump back and try and find the dinosaurs.

In closing, I want to add that I do understand. In my genealogy correspondence, I do not expect an immediate reply. I realize this is a hobby and that people are very busy. (I am). So, please don't ever feel that you just have to sit down and reply to one of my emails. As you said and I completely agree, Everything happens in due time.

Phil,  
I omitted a possibly important page in the file I sent you. It is attached.

I did some editing on my copy and pasted it on page 21 just before Francis I Comments.

When I became aware of Andrew Johnson, I naturally assumed that he was one of Julius's sons due to their Nash County Deeds. (And he very well might be.)

Evidently Andrew married a daughter of Robert Vick and Robert lived on Toisnot Swamp.

Other Granville grants reveal a couple of Johnsons on the Swamp in the early 1750s and a William Johnson was there as late as 1761. So, Julius might not be this boy's father.

The Toisnot Swamp appears to be a pretty long creek, being over 30 miles in length. Where it flows into the Neuse is now Wilson County. It appears to head about 5 miles SE of where the Franklin County line crosses the Tar River. It appears to rise just North of where Turkey Creek Rises.

One would assume that Robert Vick lived on the upper part but I imagine this is something the genealogist will have to determine with a plat or two.

I think I told you I ordered three Edgecombe County Deed Books and this is the reason.

This is the only thing I don't like about the computer but I guess it is still better than pounding out pages by hand. The files get so long and I get to copying and pasting / reorganizing and often neglect to delete something that I moved.... Winding up with double paragraphs in a file. Or, thinking (in this case) that I inserted something and didn't. The only way is to print the thing up and proof read it and with ink being so high, usually the Scott in me prevails.....Billy

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Phil,

I live with my widowed 80 year old Mother and she usually beats me to the mail box. Mother is getting forgetful and I found the letter you wrote me a month after it probably arrived here. I should have emailed you right back but the internet portion was out on the computer. (It turned out to be the phone line.) I started a "real letter" and it only got half finished and has languished in a computer file ever since. My apologies for not replying sooner.

The last half of this year has been about a half wreck. The spring was good and it even rained in June (unheard of). When our "rainy season" came (July on) it quit raining. It has been (sort of) green all summer and I have not had to feed the cattle but we missed the chance to have one of those exceptional years that we seldom get.

We water most of the ranch off of pipelines when the rainwater ponds dry up. I have had trouble with stopped up lines and wore out tubs and I am hauling some water now. It is hard to fix a problem if you are busy just trying to stay even.

I am in the process of weaning calves. It should have been done 45 days ago but I just have not been able to get enough help to gather and work our big pastures. I don't know how many times I have cancelled a day (s) due to people calling me and saying that they weren't coming. Some didn't bother to call.

I have a vet coming to preg check cows next Thursday and Friday and I am sweating that one. (The help) Vets this time of the year are not easy to get.

So far these cattle have tested 98% bred. Just couldn't be any better.

I think all of this happened since our last emails. I hired Vickie Burns, NC Genealogist but she didn't want my records until she was ready. Then, the NC Archives closed for renovation. When they reopened she contacted me. I replied and told her that at the time, I just didn't have the time to go through the material with her and if was ok with her, we would try it again during the winter. She said that would be fine. (I do hope it was.)

So, I have done no work on it since we corresponded last.

Like I said, the computer was out about 60 days over the summer and I think most of my genealogy cousins think I'm dead.

My plan is to get back on the genealogy as soon as possible. The weather here turns bad about the 1st of December and what hasn't been done has to wait until spring. That is my genealogy season.

I occasionally check the Johns(t)on DNA site and there have been no new results.

So, I wish I had some information for you but don't. I really like your Upchurch bulletin.

There must be thousands of related Johnston's out there but I have only been able to track down a handful and half of them are not interested. I think you have a good thing going.

Well, I will close. I do hope all is / are well. Drop me a line sooner than later and I promise you I will reply.....Billy

Hello Phil!

It took a long time to find it but I connected my 1761 Francis Johnston to the Francis Johnson that lived on Crooked Creek.

Without going into detail, 1761 Francis said he was born in Bute County in his pension file.

A couple of Land Entries made in 1778 & 1779 in Rowan County, NC by Francis Johnston proved the case to my satisfaction.

The 1st entry / grant was sold by my Francis abt. 1800 and the 2nd was made while he was escaping from the British in SC in 1779. So, you can't be two places at once. The second entry was on a creek a few miles North of the 1st Entry and quickly sold / transferred over to a neighboring entry of another man's. In my opinion, due to 1761 Francis's age plus his war record, both Entries were the father's.

It is a long way from a spelled out will but I think that is about all I'm going to get.

So, that leaves Julius, son of Francis I floating around Wake County.

I have a whole bunch of Johnston / Wake deed / court minutes books on order and possibly I can determine something about him.

I have about decided that the Andrew Johnson that married Olive Vick (Robert's daughter) and lived on Turkey Creek is probably Julius's first son.

Julius seems to dissappear about 1800 and I know quite a few Wake people went south into Georgia. I am hoping Julius did not. NC is hard enough to research and as you know, census records don't start in Georgia until 1820.

There appears to be an even earlier Francis in the Halifax, NC area and that is where the Alford's originally settled. (1740) They were from New Kent and I am beginning to wonder if this Johnston family is the documented St. Peter's Parish / New Kent County Francis Johnson family.

I believe we just went through the driest winter / spring on record. There is not even a green weed showing and already temperatures are approaching the 90s. The roads and cow trails are powder. Not a good sign.

Cattle are still in pretty good shape but if it doesn't rain I am going to find out I own too many. I'm just praying that the calf buyers won't get even with us this fall on their losses they are taking now. :->

Well, will run. I'm trying to get some bulls out right now.....Billy

Hi Billy---

Glad to hear from you and to learn that you are making progress on your N.C. roots. I still feel there is a good chance we can find even more interest in common. I have two resource books which have many details on the southern part of Franklin County, NC where your and my ancestors lived. One is on the Massey Family and one on the Strickland Family both by one of my best Cooperators-Carla Tate. I have finished extracting these books and now must digest what they mean for my work. One step has been to use a number of land grant maps Carla published to create a combined map for the Community where my ancestors lived. I still have more work to do on it and will mail you a copy if you are interested. It may be June before I get to it. One of the tracts is for Julius Johnson.

We leave on 11May for a three week trip east. First to NC to take a load of stuff to the Upchurch Collection at N C State University. We will spend 8 days in NC and I already have arrangements to visit descendants of and early Upchurch/Johnson marriage. A local, Simon Rogers, will be my guide.

Then we are off to The University of Maryland to see a grandson graduate. Then we will tour Antietam and Gettysburg Civil War battlefield sites where my Grandfather Upchurch fought.

By the way, if you need a good researcher in NC Carla is great. I hire her to do some work for me. She does not advertise but sometimes will accept jobs.

Sorry to hear that all is not perfect on the Ranch. Same here for our farms. It is too wet to plant corn and it's time we were 50% finished. Fortunately, I let my farm operators worry about that. They are good farmers and good worriers.

Looking forward to our ongoing collaboration.

I too have looked for him as his name was in early records in the Little River Township area. Danny Bunn, another expert researcher (on the Bunn family) told me (I think) that the family moved to Johnston Co. (This was several years ago, and I'm not sure about this info.)  
  
I would like to point out to you that there is a Julius' Branch in present-day Franklin Co. that I believe was named for Julius Johnston (I have no proof of this, just a strong hunch). It feeds into Little River, and I believe is in present-day Harris Township.  
(Phil, Danny Bunn had located this on one of the maps in the back of my Strickland book, but I'm not convinced he has it in the right place, I think it's closer to Pearces.) I have some Perrys (the current research I'm working on) whose land was near there, so when I finish the current research I'm doing, I'm going to try to locate it more clearly.  
  
And please don't forget about looking for Johnstons on the tax records of Bute, Franklin and Wake. These records are invaluable information, but unfortunately are only available at the NC State Archives.

Carla Tate told me she was real busy and quoted (if I recall correctly) \$50.00 an hour plus expenses. I told her I'd get back with her after I sold the roping cattle. They aren't gone yet and it looks like the price of gas has killed that market dead.  
  
Sue Ashby of Genweb is on the way to the NC Archives for 3 weeks and she just happened to email and ask if I needed anything. I sent her an attachment (attached) and said, "Yes, tighten this up".

The ongoing rain has made it very difficult to plant corn and soybeans. As of a couple of days ago we still had one tract to be planted to corn-- a historically late date. I'll wait another two weeks to go out and take a look. Hopefully, crops will be growing like gangbusters.

Thanks for the quick reply and my apologies for my delay in replying.

As stated in the previous letter, Sue Ashby caught me by surprise and I have been busy updating and sending her files. That is all done and now all I can do is cross my fingers and hope that she can find some "good stuff".

She is there now. I will let you know what she finds.

Yes, I found Volume 1 quite easily. I had just been reading #2.

I have the abstracted Johnston Co. deeds up to 1771. They are 99% lost prior to 1765.

The Wake deeds are lost prior to 1785. That hurts us. I don't have a copy of Watson's abstracts but I asked Sue to look in it and copy the original deeds.

I have the abstracted Johnston Minutes from 1759- 1777 and the Wake Minutes 1771- 1784, 1785 & 1786 is missing and I have 1787-1807.

The problem with court minutes is, we know they were there....we want details!

I am not at all familiar with Johnston / Wake County, having spent all of my time researching elsewhere. It looks like some of the "Crooked Creek bunch" took claims on Little River also. In a triangle from Crooked Creek back to Youngsville and over to Little Creek and back, I have 5 Johns(t)ons documented as witnesses on deeds, chain bearers or something.....between 1755 and 1761.

That doesn't include Francis or Julius.

Jacob Johnston was one, witnessing a Granville Co. Deed for Richard Upchurch in 1755. The Granville tax lists are pretty complete and he is on none, indicating he was just across the county line.

William and Andrew Johnson were chain bearers for Samuel OBannon in 61, indicating they were big kids. OBannons property was next to E. Strickland's on Moccasin Creek.

And no deeds, no grants, no court mentions for any of the "aforsd".

Who are these people? Probably relations.

So, I am beginning to think I have done well, figuring out what little I have!

Will hang in with the cows. It will rain and wash us away.

I lost everything on c drive including my emails and I think I replied to your packet and email.....but that was a long time ago.

I have about rebuilt my files and hopefully, in a few days, I will send you a better version of the last that I sent.

Carla Tate pretty well finished the research I asked her to do (up to 1800 in the corners area) and while she found nothing earth shattering, her research gave me a lot better idea of what was going on in the area, who was there, when and where.

There is just no (Johnston) proof in the corners area of who is who. I believe Francis, Julius, James, William and Andrew were a family related unit just because there were no other Johnstons within 20 plus miles, at the time. It appears that William was the only one to stick around past 1800. (Maybe) Carla said, "Where is John?" No John.

I am debating whether to ask Carla to do more research on William. Probably should I guess while I'm in the area.

I asked her to look up the original Granville County deed in which Richard Upchurch & "Jacob Johnson" witnessed a deed for William Pace on Crooked Creek in 1755. The "Jacob" turned out to be "Francis".

Fall hasn't been kind. The wall steet crash caught me in calf sale negotiations and I still own them. I really don't quite have the country to run them until spring so I just postponed weaning. I was going to wean 250 head last Friday and I scheduled a 250 cow preg check for the same day. So.....durned if the hydraulic chute motor didn't burn up the evening before and I canceled the weaning / preg check. I had begged and pleaded for help and had rounded up just enough people to maybe pull it off. AND I see "Old Man Winter" approaching very quickly.

I had previously weaned 60 calves that were out of 1st calf angus heifers by a blk. corriente bull. Those calves weigh about 40 lbs at birth and weaned at 390 lbs. I loaded them on a truck today headed for the sale barn. They weighed 460 lbs 60 days later. (today) A little over a pound a day gain eating 2.5 lbs of 20% range cubes every other day and dry grass. That is about a normal gain.

But, my spirits are good and God has blessed us with a good grass crop and we had a wonderful Thanksgiving. I hope all is well at your outfit.

Here at the beginning I would offer one caution. It has to do with the reference to Moccasin Creek and as to where people owned land in the 1750-1850 era. The present day southern tip of Franklin Co, NC at one time or another was in Granville County, Bute County, Johnston County, Wake County and Franklin County. Families in the 1750-1850 era were sometimes found on the west (south) side of Moccasin and sometimes on the North (East) - thus their home sites changed as the authorities moved the boundary lines. To complicate matters there are two prongs of Moccasin Creek.

## KEY, WILLIAM AND MAHALA

F340

My great-great grandfather, Anderson Key, with his widowed mother and four brothers moved from Virginia around 1810. They settled some place between Livingston and Carthage. My great grandfather, Stephen Key, moved from Overton to Fentress County around 1850. He married Matilda Austin. They lived in the Martha Washington Community near Hurricane Creek. My grandfather, William Key, married Mahala Norrod from Overton County. My mother's name was Druzilla Armintie.

My grandfather was a beekeeper having as many as 100 hives at one time. His hives were homemade, hollowed out blackgum. One time a swarm of bees settled on his shoulders. I do not remember how he got out of that predicament. Someone may have searched for the queen and put it in a hive so the other bees would follow.

Being so far from Jamestown, many times the citizens would take legal matters in their hand. One time a group of citizens were guarding a man who was a suspect in the murder of a cattle buyer from Texas. He had been killed near Wilder and dumped in a hole near the Baldwin Gulf (where East Fork and Hurricane Creek come together). I think some hunters had found the body. Anyway, grandpa and the other men fell asleep and the suspect ran out the door, jumped over a fairly high cliff and made his escape. It is my understanding that this man was later arrested by the sheriff, tried and sent to the pen.

My grandmother lived for many years in our home. She was a good story teller and having lived during the Civil War many of her stories concerned that time period. She had four brothers in the service at the same time: William who was a lieutenant under Captain Rufus Dowdy; Smith who was Rosco Norman's grandpa; Alex and Wade. One of her brothers joined the Confederate Army but after finding out that the other brothers had joined the Union Army, he changed over to keep from fighting his own brothers.

She told many tales of Champ Ferguson, a guerilla with sympathy for the Confederate cause. One time Alex and Wade were coming in to see their families. Champ and some of his men stopped them and inquired their names and knowing that if they said Norrods it would mean sure death, Wade merely said "Wade" as if that were his last name. Then Alex hurriedly said "Alex Wade." They then hurried around a curve in the road meeting a man with a cradle. They found where several trees had fallen. The holes were full of leaves and they jumped in one. Apparently the man with the cradle told Champ where they had gone for they came and rode around them many times but finally rode off.

She only had one brother to get killed during the war and he was not a soldier. It was Thomas. He and a friend were caught by a guerilla group in a field. They had made a vow that they would stick with each other. Thomas had already jumped his horse over the fence and making his escape when he looked back and saw that his friend had been wounded. He then went back to help his buddy and both of them were killed.

Many times the families left behind came near starvation. My grandmother said that they would boil the dirt in their smokehouses to get salt which was scarce. The guerillas would many times just destroy what crops they were able to make. There was a deep hollow behind their house and when they heard that the guerillas were around, they would take their milk cow there and hide her, just feeding her shucks.

My grandfather lived from 1850 to 1925. My grandmother lived from 1855 until 1941. They are buried in the Campground or Mt. Union Cemetery. Alex Norrod and many more of grandpa's relatives are buried in the Three Fork Cemetery. (To those interested in odd gravemarkers, there are many unusual stones in that cemetery.) Champ Ferguson is buried on the Calfkiller Road between Monterey and Sparta.
