Hi Margot---

Yes I know of the record from 1904 about C. D. U. I never met him but his daughter, born 1925, lives in FL and is a subscriber to the Upchurch Bulletin. His GF was born in the Apex area and is one of the people I will highlight in my talk. C, D. U had a brother Willie whom I did know and who is buried at Inwood Church with his parents along with a ton of my relatives including my parents, grandparents, etc.

My previous reference to "Yankee" was perhaps cryptic. To make amends I will tell a story which was passed down in the family about my grandfather. He was a sharpshooter in Lee's Army. Years went by and Inwood Church engaged a Yankee Minister Rev Putnam. Grandfather was a pillar in the Church and often would invite the Minister to Sunday dinner. As the Minister arrived, so the story goes, Grandfather would greet him in the yard and say "Come inside. I like you as well as I do any Yankee and I suppose I have killed a thousand". I believe this story to be true and take it to have been a tongue-in-cheek comment by Grandfather. The larger message was that reconciliation had taken place. So sojourner Yankees may feel safe among my kin today.

The first name Green was actually very common back in the day! I have come across it quite a few times. It may refer to the Revolutionary War officer Green who was important to NC history, and/or it may refer to Green's Path in the eastern part of NC. Or it just may be they all liked that name! There were some very creative first names back then, too!

Green was a son of Isaac B. from Chatham Co.

Were such large tracts of land common back then? 3000 acres sounds like he was relatively prosperous!

I will try to follow up on the suggestions you made re the archives, etc.

If and when you do place his land, could you share that info w/ me?

Any thoughts/info on where the Old Smithfield road connected with the New Ruin Tavern as shown on the Fendol Bevers map? I can see the eastern edge of it on today's maps. Maybe Olive Chapel Rd today was part of it? Again, I guess I'm in the wrong century for you.

Henry Holland I am prepared to mail to you if you will provide me a mailing address. I will also mail a road map for the area involved as I am still struggling to convert from Road numbers to Road names. Jim can let me know if he wants these documents.

David Henry Holland testified that Naaman Mills and Nathan Upchurch deserved pensions for service in the Revolution. They are both my ancestors.

My impression has been that Whitney Upchurch (a nephew of Nathan) owned land around Green Level but Jim shows evidence that he had land south of Hiway #1. Whether he had land at both places I am yet to learn. The land south of #1 could have been from his wife.

Acrill Upchurch married Olive and after his father Nathan died in 1835 he moved to TN and from there sold his land in NC. He sold 142 acres to Green Beckwith in 1842. I always thought this land was some he inherited when Nathan died in which case I thought it would have been around Green Level. However, it could have been land from his wife in which case it could easily have been around New Hill.

Green Beckwith had a granddaughter, Ellie Beckwith, who married Oliver L. Stringfield, a very important Minister. He owned land in Zebulon and later owned two tracts in Rhamkette both tracts having an important linkage to my immediate family. His son and my Aunt Maude were and item.

The Land Grant work Jim is doing provides a basis for us to review once again family details and to shed new light.

Margot, I looked up the name Isaac Beckwith in Watson's Wake Co deed abstract book. I didn't find him. However, I did find that an "Isaac Beckworth" purchased land in Wake Co [Wake DB Q:67]. The abstract reads "William Barker Sr of Wake Co to Isaac Beckworth of same, June 30, 1798, for 15 pounds, a tract of 100 acres lying on the waters of Little White Oak Cr adjoining James Holland, Bolin Beckworth, Arthur Wood, Sampson Holland, and Etheldred Jones. Wit: William Bridges, Britain Utley". Note the adjacent property names. This tract is in the same general area as the Enoch Booker grant previously discussed. I suspect that "Isaac Beckworth" may actually be "Isaac Beckwith" with a spelling or transcription change.

The tract of land mentioned in the deed is also very close to the Green Family holdings. I would note the following. If Green Beckwith owned land in 1846, he had to have been at least 21 years old, and be b. before 1826. The Revolutionary War soldier you mentioned is most probably General Nathaniel Greene. He was b. 1742 and d. 1786. FYI, Green's Path passes through western Johnston Co and is shown on the 1770 John Collet map. It is believed to have been named for a preacher in the early part of the 18th century. Any of these could have been a source for the first name of Green Beckwith. Of course, it may also have been something entirely different.

In the 18th c. Granville grants were limited to 700 A. Grants from the State of NC, were limited to 640 A. There are only a few exceptions, e.g., prominent citizens and officials. Some larger grants were issued for Revolutionary War service in the NC military preserve, located in several parts of present day Tennessee. All that said, an individual could obtain multiple grants and could make other purchases from neighbors. This allowed him to accumulate large holdings. For example, the Etheldred Jones mentioned in the above grant accumulated some 12,000 A in southern Wake Co from some 20+ grants. Also, I've just finished a piece of work on the Mark Myatt holdings, also in southern Wake Co. Some 20+ smaller grants were aggregated into a single 7,000+ A tract, which was then divided amongst his six children.

I am unfamiliar with the New Ruin Tavern, and have not been able to locate it on the Fendol Bevers map. Where should I look?

I'll make a note to let you know when I think I have the subject tracts reasonably placed.

I know the road where Green's grave is supposed to be, and that is across from the church on that road. I pedaled by and there are two houses now on land across from the church. I walked down one lane a short distance, but couldn't see much and was hesitant about proceeding further. Have you been/seen his grave? Is there a tombstone/marker?

Those Upchurches! They did get around. I was driving on Rt. 27 w towards Coats yesterday and passed a road that was marked Upchurch Farm!

I know the Beckwiths have had a presence in the Green Level area for a long, long time. There is a Beckwith Farm lane off Green Level Church Rd, and I know those Beckwiths. They recently sold the farm to a developer, probably Toll Bros. The area where Green B. had his property is rather far away from Green Level, though, isn't it, considering the era?

My Great Uncle once leased this Mill from the owner.

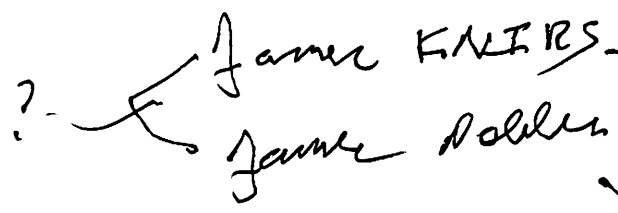

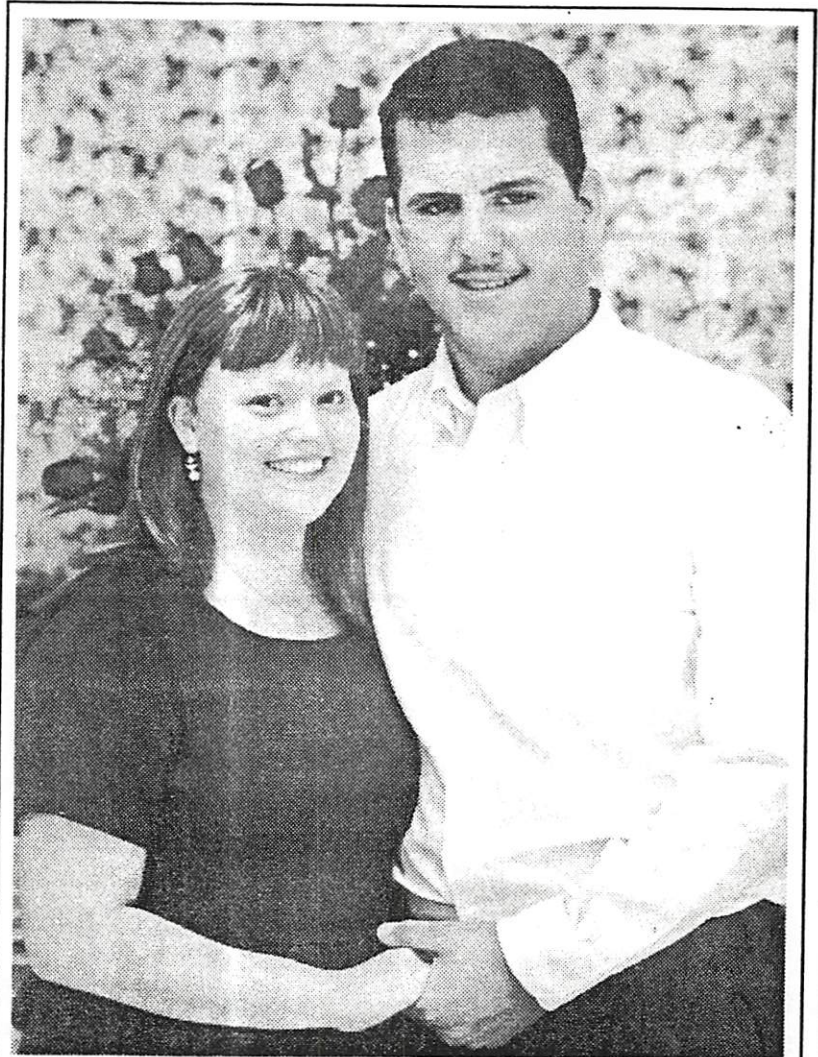
