I have Biofiles by the thousands of Upchurches and people associated with them. There are about 14 such Biofiles for Seagroves (various spellings) with the first name William or W. which I will be glad to copy and send to you. They include Wake and Chatham references and going way back to Franklin County. Maybe they would give you some hints. The Wake County Heritage Book has one Segraves article and one Seagraves article which I will be happy to copy and send. The Wake County History Book by Murray has essentially nothing. There is one burial at Catawba Springs which I have annotate and can send. Also I have on accumulator sheet on the Woodward family to send. If you want this material let me know. If you study them and have questions we can exchange more.

I have so far produced three issues of INSIGHTS, my e-Newsletter on the Swift Creek Community. I doubt it would be of any value to you unless you plan to become a student of the Township. I do know that the land that my family owned was sold to the college at one point in the late 1800s or early 1900s, but I am not sure if that land was part of Swift Creek or Middle Creek or where? My family came to Wake in 1770; some stayed, some moved to Anson County, Chatham, Montgomery and Surry County. They came from IOW Virginia via Franklin/Bute County.

Hi Phil,

I got the package and have looked over it briefly. The early Franklin Deed was great. I have land grants/documents tracing back to Francis arrival in 1697. His son William, who married Sarah ? was the first to arrive in Wake in 1775, followed by his sons; William Jr and Thomas Jacob, who both received land grants in 1778/1779.

I had already the Wray Survey, but do you know if that particular area was later considered Swift Creek? There was also part of the family in Middle Creek, which is why things are so hard to put in place, not to mention everyone named there sons' William.

The church roster (E), was very amazing. At first, I thought it was my Rebecca (Edwards), because she had a daughter named Martha/Patricia and a daughter named Eliza (who married a Perry). But then on second look, I realized that neither daughters were born as of 1802 (date of charter), nor had William and Rebecca Edwards married yet. They married in 1812. But I had some earlier documents which suggested that my 3G grandfather was also William and had also married a Rebecca?? Also, it was great seeing the other names on the roster such as Turner, Brown, Edwards.

I am very interested in learning more about the Edwards, I know hardly anything. I have gotten copies of old notes from an old store which was in Swift Creek in the early 1800-1830 which came from the Walton family. But from you noted on Swannie Sr.; I am wondering if this was Rebecca's father? Thomas Swan was the bondsman for Rebecca and William. Also on many of the 1813-1825 land documents I have, Thomas Swan Jr, Burnell and Fielding were mentioned as witnesses. So I assumed Thomas Swan Sr was her father. But on the entire censuses of her life line, she has she is from VA. I know she lived next door to Sarah Edwards after William died in 1835 there in Swift Creek.

Thomas Swan Jr's son, Thomas Swan III, married Louisa Honeycutt, believed to be the granddaughter of William and Rebecca.

The info on Jacob Lewis and Solomon Seagroves/Seagraves I had...

The last page about John can only be incorrect. Francis died in 1727 and left a will. John is believed to be the bastard child of Francis' daughter Susannah. I am studying him as well and am very interested in John and John Jr.

I would love to work and investigate additionally with you, the Edwards. How are you related to them?

I am also very interested in the Utlely, Jones, and Brown families.

Good to hear from you following our exchanges some years ago which I have now reviewed. In your current report we need to get on the same page. I show that Alvin N. Upchurch married Mary Ann Overby. I assume this is the "Overlay" to which you refer. I am aware of the children of Alvin and Mary Ann and do not show a child named Clarence Upchurch. Like you, I have the record of a Clarence Upchurch on the 1880 census but have never been able to place him but would like to do so. One approach would be to search the Beasley ancestors of John Beasley and the Seagroves ancestors of Caroline Seagroves. For one of them to have been a cousin of Clarence Upchurch either the ancestors of John or of Caroline must trace back to a female who was descended from an Upchurch male who was the ancestor of Clarence Upchurch. Do you agree? I have considerable files on both the Beasley and Seagroves families which could be studied. Perhaps your next email could advance our mutual interests on this and other matters. Can you tell me of your particular interests in the Clarence Upchurch and the Alvin N. Upchurch families. I know the Alvin N. Upchurch family fairly well but there is always more to be learned.

I am phasing down my family history work due to age and health but am preparing Allied Families to carry on the work. Up to now I have mainly focused on the ones from the 1770 to 1850 range of the families. I am finding the Upchurch family tied in with the Goodwin and Beasley families when I started to researching some of the younger generations, such as Caroline. Alfred Seagroves, son of Isham and Uncle of Caroline was married to Laura Goodwin and Caroline's brother married Annie V Goodwin.
