Clark has many stories to share

From a comfortable chair in the living room of her Columbia Avenue home, Mae Clark has many stories that she can share—stories that are even more intriguing than the fiction found in the novels she loves to read.

She can recall the time when there were no cars and people traveled by horse and wagon. She attended church with Alvin C. York and she worked as a rural librarian, delivering books on horseback. And Clark was the first woman on the line at a Chrysler plant in Indiana, making war materials.

Clark also recalls a story told to her about her grandfather, Thomas Riley, who was her mother's father. He and his brother-in-law, John Smith, fought on different sides during the Civil War—one for the North and the other for the South, though Clark cannot remember their specific allegiances.



This is Mae Clark's family. She is just a baby sitting on her father's lap. She was born on May 2, 1897 in Pickett County, Tennessee and was one of ten children of John Wolford and Lodema Riley Koger.

Her stories span the century in which she has lived, from the days when she was a youngster growing up in rural Pickett County, Tennessee to the days she spent raising her own family in Wayne County. While many have been in awe at seeing a new century begin, this marks the second one to begin in her lifetime. She will celebrate her 103rd birthday in May.

Clark said she really has no secrets to her longevity. She credits her long life to luck more than anything.

"I've just been a lucky old woman, and I appreciate that I have lived this long," Clark said during an interview in 1997. "I hope every-

body gets to make it as long as I have."

Clark can't get around as well as she used to, but she is still a very vibrant person. She enjoys talking and visiting with many of the children, grandchildren, great-grandchildren, and great-great-grandchildren who are a part of the large family.

She loves plants and flowers and tries to keep many on the porch and patio of her home. She professes to rolling and smoking Prince Albert cigarettes. And there are always plenty of books to read.

The bookmobile brings a fresh selection every two weeks, and Clark is an avid reader. Never a day goes by that she doesn't pick up a novel and read.

She was born May 2, 1897, in Pickett County, Tennessee, one of ten children of John Wolford and Lodema Riley Koger. Her grandfather's family came to the United States from Germany, Clark recalls. They first lived in Pennsylvania, then the family began to move, settling finally in Tennessee. She said several of her uncles had land in Pickett County, where she grew up.

Like many children of that day Clark worked on the farm.

"I've worked on the farm all my life, ever since I was big enough to," she said.

Unlike many children of that day—especially girls—Clark went to school. She attended through eighth grade, founding her love of reading.

She recalls attending church with Alvin C. York in Pickett County, Tenn. York was a distant relative and she said she can still show you the tree where he shot his initials into the wood.

Clark also recalls a story told to her about her grandfather, Thomas Riley, who was her mother's father. He and his brother-in-law, John Smith, fought on different sides during the Civil War—one for the North and the other for the South, though Clark cannot remember their specific allegiances.

She said the two killed each other with swords while riding horseback. Her great Aunt Jane went out at night and gathered up the bodies in a wagon, dug one grave and buried the two men together, Clark said.

She said her grandfather and Smith still share a grave in the Koger Cemetery on Koger Mountain.

She was married to John Clark and moved to Wayne County. Clark recalls living all over this area. She worked for the WPA program, created under the Roosevelt administration, and supervised 15 women in making books.

She worked for WPA for nine years, then began delivering books on horseback, using George Duncan's store at Zula as a headquarters. She later set up a library at the store, so people could come in and check out books.

Clark recalls that after 1945, she headed to Indiana and was hired at the Chrysler plant.

"I was the first woman who went in on the line at the Chrysler plant," she said. She recalls making "snag wheels," something that was used for large machinery.

Clark worked at Chrysler for two years, then came back home.

She had five children and one stepson. More than 20 years ago, Clark gave up life on the farm and moved into town. She lives alone now, and up until a few years ago took care of the house and yard work. Home health workers and relatives help with the work now.

From a comfortable chair in the living room of her Columbia Avenue home, Mae Clark has many stories that she can share—stories that are even more intriguing than the fiction found in the novels she loves to read.

She can recall the time when there were no cars and people traveled by horse and wagon. She attended church with Alvin C. York and she worked as a rural librarian, delivering books on horseback. And Clark was the first woman on the line at a Chrysler plant in Indiana, making war materials.

Clark also recalls a story told to her about her grandfather, Thomas Riley, who was her mother's father. He and his brother-in-law, John Smith, fought on different sides during the Civil War—one for the North and the other for the South, though Clark cannot remember their specific allegiances.

Her stories span the century in which she has lived, from the days when she was a youngster growing up in rural Pickett County, Tennessee to the days she spent raising her own family in Wayne County. While many have been in awe at seeing a new century begin, this marks the second one to begin in her lifetime. She will celebrate her 103rd birthday in May.

Clark said she really has no secrets to her longevity. She credits her long life to luck more than anything.

"I've just been a lucky old woman, and I appreciate that I have lived this long," Clark said during an interview in 1997. "I hope every-

body gets to make it as long as I have."

Clark can't get around as well as she used to, but she is still a very vibrant person. She enjoys talking and visiting with many of the children, grandchildren, great-grandchildren, and great-great-grandchildren who are a part of the large family.

She loves plants and flowers and tries to keep many on the porch and patio of her home. She professes to rolling and smoking Prince Albert cigarettes. And there are always plenty of books to read.

The bookmobile brings a fresh selection every two weeks, and Clark is an avid reader. Never a day goes by that she doesn't pick up a novel and read.

She was born May 2, 1897, in Pickett County, Tennessee, one of ten children of John Wolford and Lodema Riley Koger. Her grandfather's family came to the United States from Germany, Clark recalls. They first lived in Pennsylvania, then the family began to move, settling finally in Tennessee. She said several of her uncles had land in Pickett County, where she grew up.

Like many children of that day Clark worked on the farm.

"I've worked on the farm all my life, ever since I was big enough to," she said.

Unlike many children of that day—especially girls—Clark went to school. She attended through eighth grade, founding her love of reading.

She recalls attending church with Alvin C. York in Pickett County, Tenn. York was a distant relative and she said she can still show you the tree where he shot his initials into the wood.

Clark also recalls a story told to her about her grandfather, Thomas Riley, who was her mother's father. He and his brother-in-law, John Smith, fought on different sides during the Civil War—one for the North and the other for the South, though Clark cannot remember their specific allegiances.

She said the two killed each other with swords while riding horseback. Her great Aunt Jane went out at night and gathered up the bodies in a wagon, dug one grave and buried the two men together, Clark said.

She said her grandfather and Smith still share a grave in the Koger Cemetery on Koger Mountain.

She was married to John Clark and moved to Wayne County. Clark recalls living all over this area. She worked for the WPA program, created under the Roosevelt administration, and supervised 15 women in making books.

She worked for WPA for nine years, then began delivering books on horseback, using George Duncan's store at Zula as a headquarters. She later set up a library at the store, so people could come in and check out books.

Clark recalls that after 1945, she headed to Indiana and was hired at the Chrysler plant.

"I was the first woman who went in on the line at the Chrysler plant," she said. She recalls making "snag wheels," something that was used for large machinery.

Clark worked at Chrysler for two years, then came back home.

She had five children and one stepson. More than 20 years ago, Clark gave up life on the farm and moved into town. She lives alone now, and up until a few years ago took care of the house and yard work. Home health workers and relatives help with the work now.



Mae Clark celebrated her 99th birthday at home. She will be 103 in May of this year.

Recollections of 101-year-old Mae Koger Clark

Born May 2, 1897

Interview: Feb. 4, 1999

Mae Koger Clark was one of 10 children born to James Koger and Lodema Riley. The family lived near Chanute, Tennessee. One vivid childhood memory is of watching Alvin C. York take a gun and shoot his initials into the trunk of a big beech tree. Another is of the wagon load of dried apples the family prepared each fall. They would sell the apples in town and use the money to buy shoes. Mae moved to Wayne County in 1915 when she married John Clark.

Working on the farm...

I had two old, poor mules then. I was always up before sunup. I'd go to the field about sunup. I'd plow one of them mules until about 10:30 or 11:00, and quit and go in to get dinner. Then I'd catch up the other mule and do the same until about 4:00. Then do the housework, and the milking and one thing and another. Always kept chickens and hogs. Had a 10-acre field of corn and it took me three days of hard work to plow it. Had to go twice to a row with a double-shovel. Had a acre of tobacco right in the middle of the field.

Working with the WPA Sewing Project...

Along in the thirties, I worked in the sewing room at Genene Rednour's. It was on the hill above the Zula bridge. Made 95 cents a day - for eight hours. Me and Mattie Taylor would sew up shirts. We had new Singer sewing machines. They was pedal - they wasn't no electric then. We was quick and young and had good eyes. We'd sew up the shirts and hand them to the older women. They'd make button holes and put buttons on. Made sheets for people when a family would get down sick. Worked awhile in a sewing room in Monticello. Worked for Lizzie McKechnie and Betty Humble.

Working with the Pack Horse Library...

I come to town every Saturday to get books. Took them to Windy City, Gap Creek, and the lower end of Buncom. Packed 'em on my back when I could - and walked. Furnished my own horse. First I sold a sow and pigs to Roe Markum and bought a little pony. It was too little for me. I didn't like it. I sold it to Charlie Pratt over in Parnell for a two-year-old race horse. Had to break him. He run away a time or two with the kids. Wouldn't let the boys ride him. He never bothered me though. I could ride up to a gate and get down and open it, and he'd just stand there. I swapped him to a gray western mare that we used to plow the garden and corn and stuff. Sometimes I carried the books in a grass sack; sometimes in saddle riders; sometimes in a sack on my lap. Then I was given a library in the side room of George Duncan's store there at Zula. That lasted until about '42, I guess.

Working as a cook...

I worked in the cook room at Number One. They had about a hundred children that came in there to school. Made \$2.00 a day. I thought I was rich.

Notes: The sewing, cooking, and library jobs were all part of WPA projects.

The government paid the library workers, but the books/library space were donated.

Mae Koger Clark is the mother of five children: Ruby, Gladys, Ernest, Wilma and Willie.

Update: Mrs. Clark is looking forward to her 103rd birthday celebration. A gathering of family and friends is planned for April 30, 2000.
