Lambeth Lassiter Upchurch

XID - 104

Commentary: Lambeth aka Lamberth Lasiter Upchurch was born on 26 July 1830 and died on 31 Dec 1905. He was the son of Gilbert and the grandson of Nathan I, head of Upchurch clan #3. Lamberth was partially blind and never married.

- (1) Tombstone in Inwood Baptist Church shows <u>Laster Upchurch</u> born 26 July 1830 died 31 Dec 1905 (21)
- (2) Plaque inside Inwood Baptist Church shows church organized 25 Feb 1877 and shows 3 Upchurches among founders **Lamberth Lasiter Upchurch**, Mariah Upchurch and Aurora Ray Upchurch (25).
- (3) 1850 Census of Wake Co shows Lamberth at home with family and age 18 on day of census 17 Aug 1850 (hence born 1832 +1). His name garbled to read **Laten**. See Gilbert Upchurch for listings.
- (4) Notes from Gettys Upchurch shows <u>Lass Upchurch</u> as son of Gilbert Upchurch (XID -82) and as being single and part blind.
- (5) See Deed File on 1 Oct 1881 B J Upchurch and W G Upchurch and wives filed a Wake Co NC deed giving 1-acre land to Inwood Baptist Church. <u>Lassiter Upchurch</u> was listed as a Trustee along with John Strain & Anderson Betts.
- (6) See notes of 25 Feb 1978 visit by RPU to Lena Perry home
 - A. Thinks Grandpa did not join church right away but <u>Uncle Lass</u> and Aunt Mariah joined promptly
 - B. Uncle Lass was sent to Blind School
- (7) See 1860 Census Wake Co, NC

<u>Lasillor (Lasiter) Upchurch</u> age 29 was in home headed by his mother Lucretia Upchurch age 59. Brother Bartley Upchurch was also there.

- (8) See 1870 Census Wake Co, NC Barton's Creek Township Laseter (Lasiter) Upchurch age 45 was in home headed by his brother Jefferson Upchurch age 26.
- (9) See 1880 Census Wake Co, NC Swift Creek Township **Lambeth Upchurch** age 50 was in home headed by his brother Bartley Upchurch age 39.



(10) See 1850 Census – Wake Co, NC – Western Division <u>Laseter Upchurch</u> age 18 M blind was in home headed by his mother Creecy (Lucretia) Upchurch age 46 F.

(11) See notes of RPU 24 Feb 1979 visit to Edna Lois Upchurch Page 8 – Uncle <u>Lass</u> died 31 Dec 1904.

(12) On 27 Feb 1985 RPU visited Eleanor Upchurch Martin and obtained the walking stick that had belonged to **Lamberth Lasiter Upchurch**. This had been given by her niece Eleanor Marks Upchurch, II to her son James Martin who in turn gave it to Eleanor Upchurch Martin for safe keeping who in turn gave it to RPU.

(13) Extract of letters 10 & 23 Oct 1980 Frank Jefferson Upchurch, Sr to RPU [Note: blind brother – Lamberth Lassiter Upchurch – CJM 17 Sep 2020]

During the civil war, Uncle Las, the blind brother and the ladies of the house got along as well as could be expected. After the war, there was a lot of trouble with carpet baggers and run away soldiers and other "trash" robbing homes. One night someone knocked on the door and continued to bang on it as though to knock the door in. Uncle Las, who could see very little but could see as well as anyone else in the dark, went out the back door and slipped up on the three carpet baggers who were trying to get into the house. Uncle Las had with him a walking stick that he had made and had bored a hole in the head of the stick and filled it with lead. He knocked two of them down with the stick and the other one ran. One of the men knocked down did not leave. They buried him in the hog pen so that the mud and hog tracks would erase any sign of a graye.

5. LAMBERTH LASSITER UPCHURCH, son of Gilbert Upchurch and Lucretia Milis, was born 26 Jul 1830 in NC, and died 31 Dec 1905. He is buried at Inwood Bap. Ch. Cem., Wake Co., NC. Lamberth was blind, according to FC/1850. He resided in Wake Co., NC (White Oak Twp.) with his mother on FC/1850-1860; (Barton's Creek Twp.) with his brother, Bartley and family on FC/1870 and (Swift Creek Twp.) on FC/1880. Lamberth was one of the founding members of Inwood Baptist Church, Wake Co., NC. He lived to age 75.

(15) Input from Miley Albert Perry "Monk" to RPU on 4 Oct 2005

Monk showed RPU two walking canes [presumably owned by Uncle Lass [<u>Lambert Lassiter Upchurch</u>]. They were given to him by Sister Perry [Lena Perry]. One is an elaborately carved item showing an alligator claimed to have been created by Uncle Lass. Considering that Uncle Lass was blind Monk and RPU agree that is unlikely he did the carving.

RPU Comments as of 13 Dec 2003 – Possible relationships related to I & X above: Nathan Upchurch, I head of Clan married () Mackey --- ---, thought to have been Mackey Johnson, possibly daughter of Julius Johnson. I speculate that somehow the proposed Mackey Johnson could be related to the above families of Johnson, Lambeth, and Lasater considering that she had grandchildren with given names of Mariah, Lambeth & Lasater. More especially note that Mackey had a grandson (my great uncle) **Lambeth Lasater Upchurch** – an unlikely combination of given names unless tied to earlier related family members.

(18) New inputs about RPU ancestors from Cousin William Alan Mills.

In a 25 Jul 2009 email W A M reports to RPU that there is lots of circumstantial evidence to show that our mutual ancestor Naaman Mills married Penelope Lassiter. On 26 Jul 2009 Cousin Billy Mills followed up with more details:

Consider the following:

The Will (prior to 1820) of James Lassiter (Northampton or Edgecombe Co., NC), lists among his heirs, "Penelope Mills".

Penelope Lassiter had brothers, such as Elijah, Shadrack, Green Lassiter, and others ... all names that Naaman Mills' children had.

Elijah Lassiter was the witness on Naaman Mills' Revolutionary War pension application in the 1830s.

Matthew Mills named one of his sons, Elijah Lassiter Mills. James Lassiter's ancestors were from Nansemond Co., VA.

There is a Lassiter Road in the same vicinity of the property that Naaman Mills owned in Northampton Co., NC.

I am reciting this from memory only, but there are many other gleanings of circumstantial evidence to add meat to the bare bones of this potential Lassiter tree.

I have surmised much of this online since 1999, and a search online thru google or various genealogical data bases may provide many other variations by now.

My interpretation- RPU – 31 Aug 2009

I. James Lassiter (originally of Nansemond Co, VA) of Northhampton & Edgecombe Counties, NC wrote his will prior to 1820 and listed Penelope Mills as an heir – presumably his daughter. Billy provides names of sons of James Lassiter... So:

- *A. Elijah Lassiter signed Revolutionary War Pension application for his brother-inlaw Naaman Mills in 1830s.
- *B. Shadrack Lassiter
- *C. Green Lassiter
- D. Penelope Lassiter

married () Naaman Mills whose mother was reputedly nee Smith → (Naaman Mills owned land in Northhamptom Co, NC near which is a Lassiter Rd)

- 1. Matthew Mills
 - a. Elijah **Lassiter Mills
- 2. Lucretia Mills

married () Gilbert Upchurch

- a. Bartley Jefferson Upchurch
 - i. Robert Jefferson Upchurch
 - (I) Robert Phillip Upchurch
- b. Lamberth **Lassiter Upchurch



c. Nathaniel **Smith Upchurch

From book: The Naaman Mills Family of North Carolina 1757 – 1996 by William A Mills On Page 16 and beyond the author implies that Richard Smith might have been the grandfather of Naaman Mills which presumably implies that the mother of Naaman Mills was nee --- --- Smith.

(19) Upchurch Insanity Records – on 8 Sep 2011 Kay Lind Slappey sent RPU 6 emails regarding insanity of four members of the Nathan Upchurch I clan which I have coded to show pages = A10, B6, C15, D13, E55, F34. The pages are filed in the biofiles of the four as shown in the boxed names below. All four were declared legally insane an INDIGENT and committed to the Florida Asylum for the insane (Florida State Hospital) at Chattahoochee, Gadsden, Florida. The documents were shared with Margaret Louise Harris on 10 Sep 2011.

RPU - Extract 29 Nov 2013

More research would be required to conclude that an "insanity" genetic trait existed in the Nathan Upchurch I clan. In any family + and – traits are distributed unevenly. With today's medicines some or all of the four might have led more or less normal lives outside of an institution. At this remove we cannot know what environmental conditions may have contributed to their ill health. It is a surprise that all four were declared indigent in view of the wealth of the family – but we judge from afar. The available records fail to show much family concern for those incarcerated (except for Rebecca) but more evidence is needed.

(20) Was blindness among the descendants of Nathan Upchurch, I related to the cases to the cases of insanity in the family. (See RPU Extract 29 Nov 2011) – RPU 30 Nov 2011.

By reference to the 29 Nov 2011 Extract Sheet it will be seen that the insanity / blindness cases all involved descendants of Nathan's son Gilbert Upchurch.

Gilbert's son Nathaniel Smith Upchurch had two sons and one granddaughter declared insane (Susie).

Susie was also a granddaughter of Gilbert's son William George Upchurch (due to intermarriages in the family.)

[In the Extract I explain how these cases of insanity could have been the "luck of the draw" and how modern medicine might have made unnecessary the pejorative term "insanity". However, in the case of Susie, one cannot overlook the two close marriages of four of her ancestors (two couples). Susie and her full siblings did not show robust health records.]

The blindness involved the other sons of Gilbert – Bartley, <u>Lamberth</u>, and Mariah. The latter two were blind (completely or partially?) (from birth?). My unsubstantiated guess has always been that the blindness of these two could have traced to venerial disease introduced by Gilbert as he had some known weakness of character. These two children had different mothers.

Bartley had a great-granddaughter, Frances Holt Tilly who developed complete blindness as an adult. Her years of explaining her condition led her to believe that her blindness was hereditary and thus connected to that of **Lamberth** and Mariah.

In conclusion, I have developed no connection that the insanity or blindness cases are genetic in nature or that they are related. Others with more expertise may show genetic causes.
