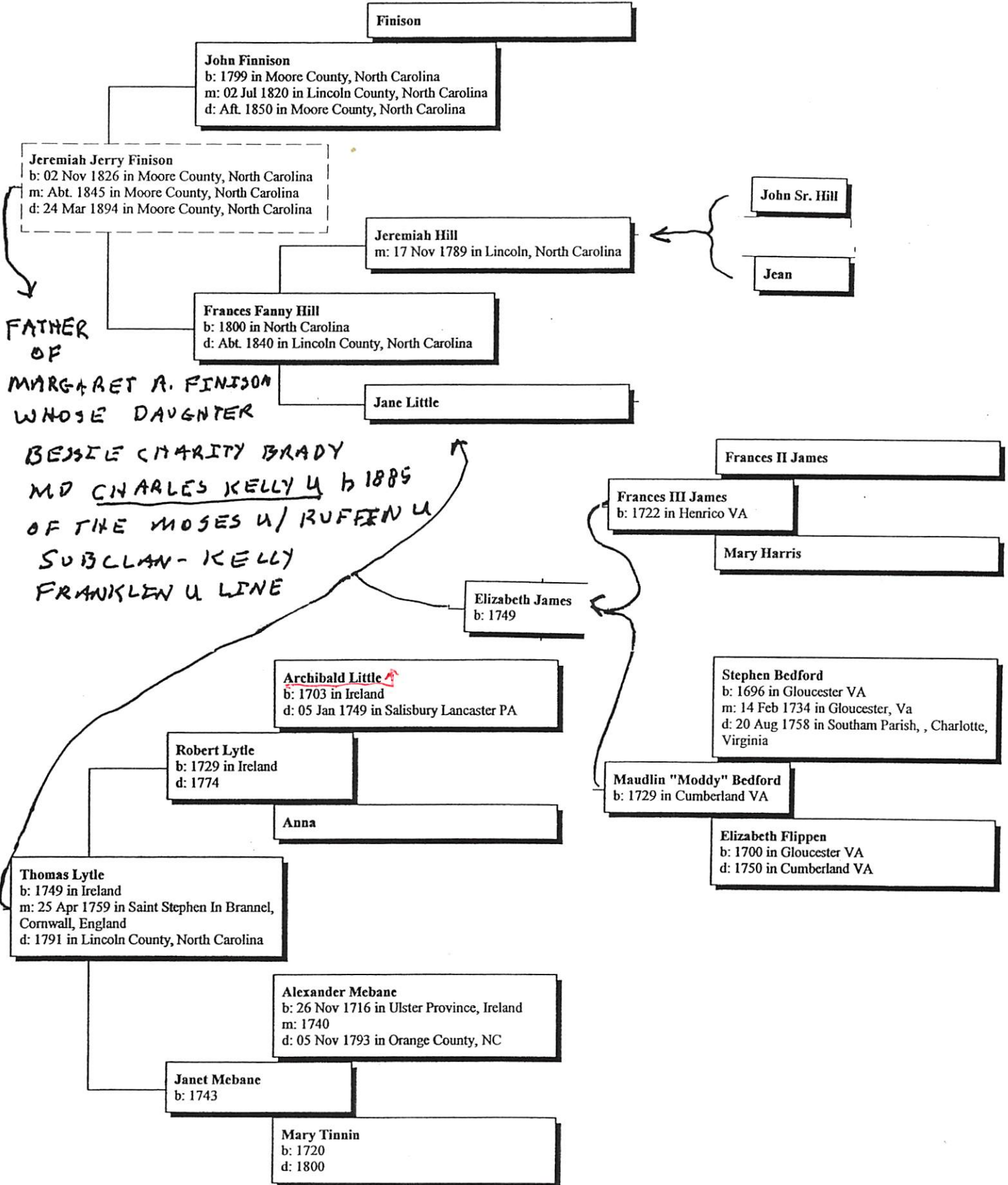
Ethel Mosteller Little, 73, of Zebulon, formerly of Lincolnton, died Saturday, Sept. 27, in Raleigh. Funeral

# Former mayor, town commissioner, George Rogers, dead at 99

George Thomas Rogers, former mayor, commissioner, long-time resident and fixture in the Apex community, died April 8 at the age of 99.

Known affectionately as "Papa George" by many who knew him, Rogers owned and operated Rogers Insurance Agency from 1925 until his retirement. His agency was founded by his father, S.S. Rogers, in 1909.

He will be remembered for his love of life, his kind word, his continuous service to the community and his dedication to the Lord and his church.

"I don't know anything that I couldn't say that was nice about Papa George, friend and Lions Club member Bob McIver said Monday.

McIver is also co-owner of the Apex Funeral Home, where Rogers' service was held April 9.

"He really was a splendid old guy," McIver said. "He was just a very, very special friend of mine."

As a fellow Lion, McIver touted Rogers' service to the club.

"He was as dedicated as any lion could be," McIver said.

Rogers was the last living charter member of the Apex Lions Club, a past District Governor for District 31-G and a Melvin Jones Fellow of Lions International.

Having served in every office the club had, Rogers also faithfully produced the bi-monthly club newsletter, "Roaring Along," for as long as his only child, Elizabeth Covington, could remember.

"Golf and Lionism had really been the two loves of his life," Covington said Saturday. "And he was a faithful member of Apex Baptist Church as long as he lived."

Covington said as long as she can remember, her father loved to play golf.

He was an early member of the Raleigh Golf Association and later member of the Raleigh Golf Club and Wake County Senior Association.

"The man played golf until he was 85," she said.

He even claimed golf as an essential component to making business contacts, she said.

She said she served her father well as both caddy and companion.

"He liked to hunt ducks, deer and quail and he raised pheasants and quail," she said.

"As a child I went with him on the bird hunts," she added. "It was fun."

Aside from a few years after a short stint as a Lieutenant during World War I, and a five-year job with Southern Cotton Oil (Wesson Oil), Rogers returned to Apex in 1924 to help out his father with the insurance business.

In 1981, he sold the business to Triangle Real Estate who later sold it to its current owners.

"We knew George, he just knew everybody," co-owner Barbara Hall said. "He would come in and ask if he could help and kind of encourage us.

"He was a wonderful man, everybody loved him," she said. "He told me to treat his people like he wanted to be treated — we tried to keep that."

In 1925, he bought his first and only house at 201 S. Salem St.

That same year he married Apex Middle School teacher Emma Little. Mrs. Little died in 1985.

Rogers lived in that house until 1994 when he moved to the Parkway Retirement Home in Cary.

"He loved it when he went to the retirement home," Covington said. "He loved to play Bingo. He didn't want anyone to bother him when he was playing Bingo."

Covington said that in general, he had a real positive outlook on life.

"He believed in healthful living — he never smoked," she said. "He took vitamins all through his life."

She contributes this as part of the reason he lived to be 99.

"He just loved life and lived it to the fullest," she said. "He really was an optimistic person. He looked on the bright side — he just said 'I'm not going to let things worry me.'"

"He was certainly quite a leader, very outgoing, certainly an extrovert," Covington's husband, Henry added. "He had a tendency when he got involved with anything to run it."

When Luke died in 1810, he left five infant children (John, Rachel, Beddy, Winnafred and Charles).

Luke Ray is first mentioned in the Wake County Court records when he purchased land on February 3, 1778 so he was also born prior to 1757. Although this is the earliest surviving record of our Ray ancestors owning property in Wake County, there were probably earlier deeds that were destroyed by the 1832 fire in the Register's office. The 1781 Wake County Tax List (Captain Robert High's District) shows Luke Ray as the owner of 100 acres, 4 horses and 12 cattle valued at 116 pounds. On March 4, 1783, Luke acquired by grant 158 acres on the north side of the Neuse River. On November 16, 1791 by State Grant #1103 Luke Ray acquired 150 acres on the north side of the Neuse River and on both sides of Horse Creek adjacent to Stafford's Corner, Cedar Hill and a small path. The 1799 Wake County Tax List shows Luke Ray as the owner of 300 acres and 4 slaves.

Luke and Joseph are thought to be sons of Francis and Rachel Ray. They both named daughters Rachel, an indication that their mother's name was Rachel.

Luke's widow, Ruth, remarried Buckner Nipper (Knipper) by bond dated December 31, 1810.

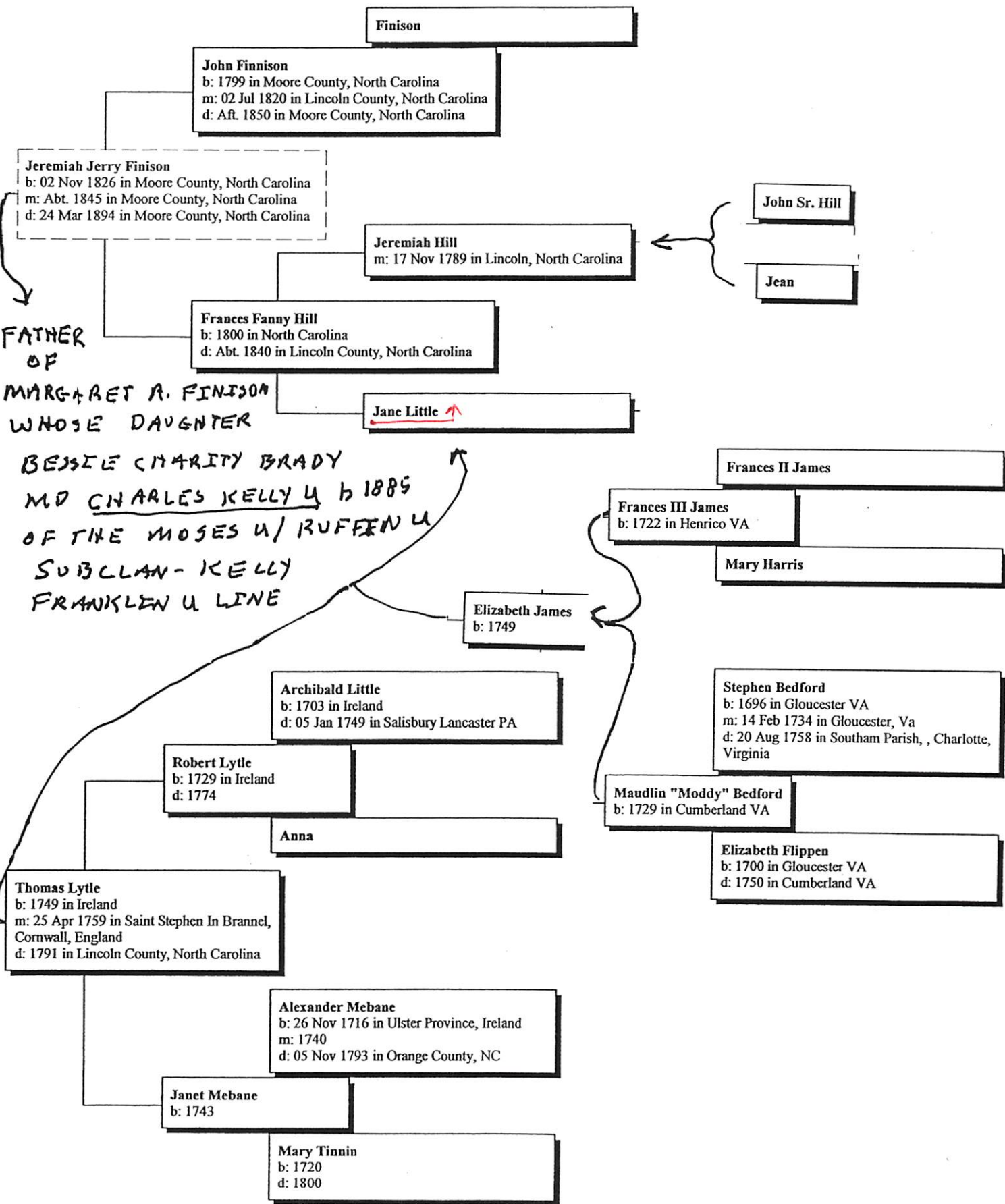

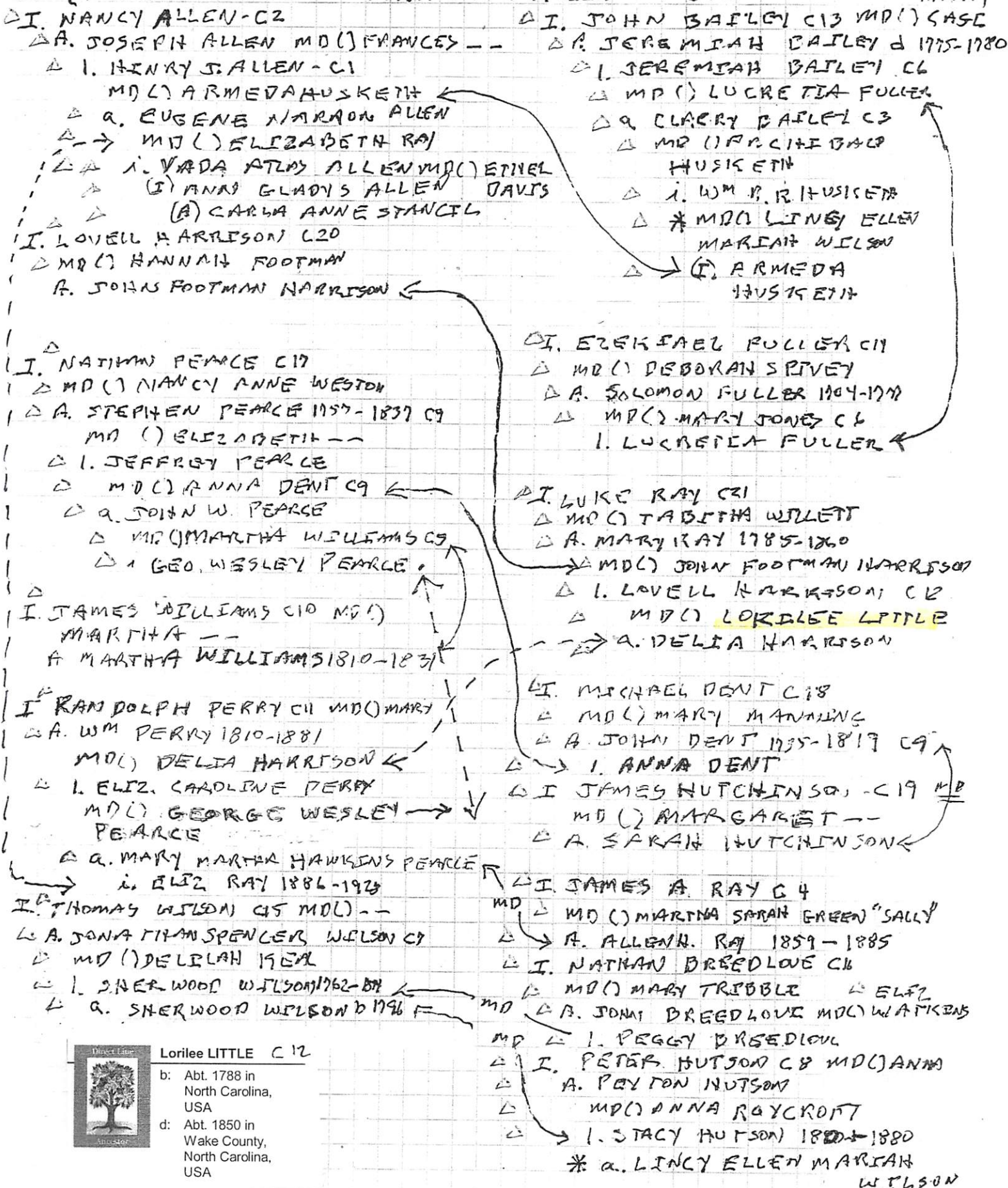

## LITTLE, OSCAR AND ALICE PETERS

F351

Oscar Denton Little who was born June 30, 1881 married Alice Peters, born June 24, 1884. They were married June 23, 1900. He was a native of Overton County, Tennessee and was born at Monroe, a farm community north of Livingston, Tennessee.

In his early teens Oscar came to Clarkrange to finish school. His older brother William Perry Little had attended Alpine Academy and was hired to teach in Fentress. He had married Paulina Peters who was also qualified to teach. Oscar stayed with them and attended school where Perry taught. He married Alice Peters a younger sister to Paulina.

Perry taught a one teacher school at first but Paulina was hired as his assistant after a few years and he taught a few secondary subjects.

By the time Oscar had finished with the subjects taught, Perry was made Superintendent of Schools of Fentress County.

As soon as he needed an extra teacher he hired Oscar and sent him to the Campground School where he taught several years. Of course he had to attend normal and take the test first.

Oscar and Alice were the parents of ten children. The first one was Herbert Harris born May 17, 1903. He married Elizabeth Stuart. Their children were John Sevier, Jewel, Jean, Barbara and Harold. No. 2 was Clyde born 1905, married Hazel Norman. They had a son Phillip. No. 3 was Harvey V. born September 1907 married Edith Norman and had two children, William H. and Mary Frances. No. 4 was Zoe Dell born 1909, married Luther Medley. Their children were R.L. (Buddy), Joan and Martha. No. 5 was Bonnie Hall born 1911 who married Elbert

Hall. Their children were Fred, Terry and Peggy. No. 6 was Oscar Denton, Jr., born July 25, 1913, married Bessie Parris from Pickett County. Their children were Robert, Virginia, Steve, and Vivian. No. 7 was Claude born July 12, 1916, married Bernice Turner. Their children were Lynn and Nancy. No. 8 was J.M. born 1918, married Letha Beaty. Their children were, Joe, Patricia, Kay and Patrick Lee. No. 9 was Moneida Maxine born March 10, 1921, married W.J. Prater. Their children were Ronald, Marie, Eugene, Denny, Kenneth, Sue Ellen, Nancy and Ann.

Soon after Oscar and Alice were married they built a home on land her father W.H. Peters had given them. It was located about one mile northwest of the intersection of Highway 127 and 62. It was wooded land which had to be cleared and had only a trail leading into it. Near the house was a good spring which was a must in those days. Slate Creek, a small stream which separated the Clarkrange and Martha Washington Communities ran just north of the land.

He taught school at Camp Ground and Martha Washington schools for a few years during the winters then in the vacation period he carried the mail. There were two other men who carried it the rest of the year. The mail and passengers who needed to come to this section were picked up each day by the postal carrier at Creston which was the nearest railroad depot. Creston is a small community between Monterey and Crossville.

Oscar was the correct age to go to World War I but because of his large family he was not inducted.

During the war he became employed with a timber company from Nashville.

He bought tracts of timber and hired a man with a sawmill to make it into cross ties and lumber. These products were hauled by wagon or truck to Isoline where he had an office and a lumber yard. Isoline was also on the railroad and the products were graded and shipped by rail to various places.

He received a better salary and was able to build a better home. It was well built and was painted white. It is still in use by his younger son's wife Letha and their son Lee and family. It is located just back of the Clarkrange Manufacturing Building west from Highway 127.

The Little's believed in working hard but they also believed that families should take time for recreation. They wanted their children to be well educated, good citizens and to live clean moral lives. They took them to church where they all learned to sing and participate in the various activities of the church. They all joined the church as they grew up and were active members.

They bought a piano and gave them an opportunity to take lessons. He bought an RCA Victor record player. This was the day before radio's or T.V.'s.

He liked sports and bought balls for the children to play with. When basketball was introduced in the schools each child as he grew up played on the main team.

By the depression of the 30's most of the children had about finished the school in the community but three or four were ready for college. Oscar had a difficult time trying to provide funds for those who wanted to go. His company had to sell out and lay off their employees. They offered to let him work in another county but he didn't want to be away from home at night so he quit. He bought and sold ties and lumber independently for awhile but finally had to quit. He helped his children to borrow money at the bank in order to attend college. Three of them attended enough to receive degrees and taught enough to retire after thirty years. He also had a son-in-law and daughter-in-law to retire from teaching. He now has several grandchildren and even one great-grandchild employed in the State Educational System.

During the depression he didn't quit, he decided to farm. This was new to him but with the help of a farm hand he tried to raise beans for the fresh market. He made enough to install electricity in their home. T.V.A. had just been introduced in this section of the state and it was important to install it.

He liked politics and saw it as a means by which he could do something to help improve the county and home community conditions. He was manager for a Democrat governor and was the road commissioner for one term. He ran again but was unsuccessful. However, he didn't quit trying to raise the standards in the county. His brother Perry had worked for years to get a better telephone system in this area and Oscar continued as long as he was able physically to work for better schools, better roads and a better telephone system.

He worked through the State and Federal Officials on many issues concerning our county.

Oscar and Perry were direct descendants of the early frontier leader Col. John Sevier. John Sevier's daughter married a Windle. She was their great-grandmother and is buried on the lawn at their grandfather's home in Monroe, Tennessee.

The Seviere were of French Huguenot descent, the Littles were of German descent and most of the others who live in this area are of Scotch-Irish descent.
