


EDITOR'S DESK

The 2021 Version of the REALLY Big Upchurch Family Tree is Here!

The UAFA American Upchurch
Index Tree in Ancestry has grown to
104,114 People, 14,765
Photos and 141,421
Records, an increase
of almost 30,000 per-

sons and thousands of records and photos since this time last year.

The Big Tree is created every January by Tree Master Linda Sparks who electronically merges information from 19 smaller Upchurch Clan Trees that have been updated and expanded by their Tree Masters during the proceeding twelve months.

"Every additional person, photo, and bit of information that we add contributes to the richness of the family genealogy tapestry we are weaving." The Big Tree can be viewed by anyone who has an Ancestry.com account by <u>clicking</u> <u>here</u>. But before you begin to explore it, we suggest that you review these important features:

First, this is a public tree so for privacy reasons you will not see living peo**ple**. This frustrates some seekers of information who would like to see information about themselves or their children. Our best advice is to search for a deceased older relative and track ancestors back from there. Actually, there is extensive information in the tree on living people but much like a recent US census it is only available to authorized researchers and developers. The information becomes visible on public trees after a death date has been entered into the record. We at UAFA wish to make the tree interesting and useful for as many people as possible and a crucial part of that effort requires continuous update of death records. We probably should stress again that new information including death records is first entered into the Clan trees and isn't integrated into the Big Tree until the annual merge each January.

Alfred Upchurch House

A question on the Facebook page, Where in Raleigh? was answered by a reader, Rob Sessoms. The house is too beautiful to pass by and the builder was an Upchurch! Rob writes:

Pictured is 402 East Hargett Street (present -day 313 East Cabarrus Street) c. 1908.

This Queen Anne style house was built c. 1899 on an East Hargett Street parcel owned by the Upchurch family. Alfred Upchurch, a carriage builder, purchased the entire block in 1867. It is unclear, but possible, that his son Allen Upchurch built the residence seen here. For unknown reasons, the Upchurch family did not occupy the house initially.

The first resident of the home was H. H. Brimley, the pioneering naturalist and first director of the North Carolina State Museum.



He and his wife Edith, along with their two boys Arthur and Robert, spent nearly ten years in the home before Brimley built his own residence on Ashe Avenue. Subsequently, members of the Upchurch family occupied the house until the death of Allen in 1937.

Seventy years later, in 2007, this entire block was cleared of all structures (save one) in preparation for development. Owner,







Gordon Smith, made considerable effort to move many of the houses to vacant lots in the area—including this house, which ended up at 313 East Cabarrus Street.

It now sits vacant and in forlorn condition, but thankfully it was saved given its significance in relation to H. H. Brimley.

And may I add, its significance to Upchurch genealogy and ancestry! —Editor





Second, when the Big Tree opens the page may seem rather empty. Do not be deceived, this is just the entrance room to a vast treasure of information.

Go to the "tree search" option and enter the name of an older relative to get started. If you don't locate a relative you expected to find, try different spellings and remember living persons will not be identified at all.

Third, as you begin to trace your ancestry back through previous generations you will encounter the Clan Head who will be identified with wording such as "Head of UAFA Clan # 3 Nathan Upchurch I". The is a unique UAFA feature in the Big Tree. If you wish to see the most recent information in this clan you can find a link to the clan by opening the Clan head's profile. After you select the link, the Clan tree will open. As noted previously, all new material is entered into clan trees so information there is always the most up to date available in UAFA.

Finally, you may encounter another feature unique to UAFA, a two-face emoji like the this. These smiley faces signify marriage of individuals who are both descendants of Michael Upchurch.

Our tree masters have been very productive this year, but we need additional help to add more peo-

ple and information and to update our current records, especially death records as we noted before. There are enormous resources on the Internet and in Phil Upchurch's research, to be identified and added to the Ancestry trees. Every additional person, photo, and bit of information that we add contributes to the richness of the family genealogy tapestry we are weaving.


