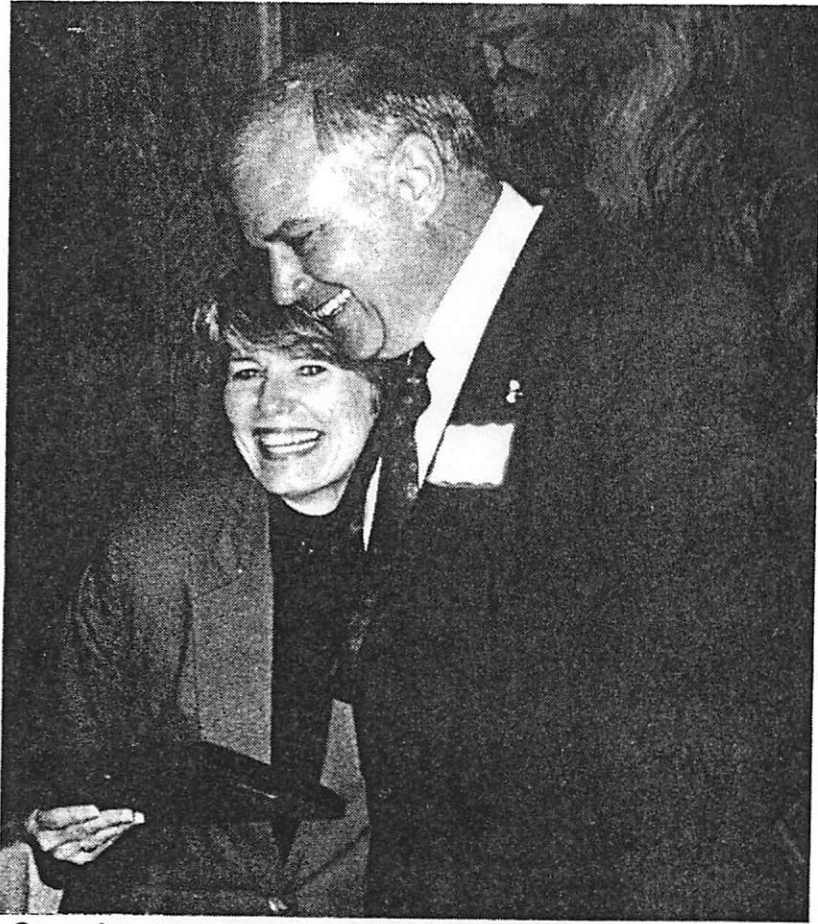

Zebulon psychologist tabbed by state council

The N.C. School Psychology Association presented its "Practitioner of the Year" award to Dr. Ann D. Matheny, a school psychologist with the Wake County public schools.

The award was presented during the association's fall conference in Wilmington on Oct. 16. The N.C. School Psychology Association presents this award to recognize school psychologists in North Carolina who exemplify the highest standards of the profession in their daily practice providing services to students, teachers, administrators, the community and to the profession.

Dr. Matheny of Zebulon is a licensed psychologist, a nationally certified school psychologist, and is on the N.C. School Psychology Registry of Approved Providers for Traumatic Brain Injury. She has over 23 years' experience as a school psychologist in the Wake County public schools. She obtained her undergraduate degree from Meredith College, and her M.S. and Ph.D. degrees from N.C. State University.

As a school psychologist, Dr. Matheny provides comprehensive psychological services to three schools — Knightdale, Lockhart and Hodge Road elementary schools. She serves 1,950 stu-

dents. She is a member of the Student Support Team and Crisis Intervention Team at each school, and of her district's area Crisis Team. Dr. Matheny has served on Zebulon Elementary's safe schools prevention/intervention grant committee providing liaison services with area mental health, social services and the Health Department to ensure integrated service delivery to the school. She has presented workshops on assessment, attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder, and helping with homework.

Dr. Matheny is recognized in her community and across the state for her advocacy regarding the welfare of children and their families, an NCSPA press release stated. She has served on the board of directors of the Triangle Red Cross. Through her work on the N.C. Psychological Foundation's disaster relief committee, she was instrumental in the establishment of a mental health component for disaster relief efforts.

As chair of the Christmas benevolence committee at Zebulon Baptist Church, Dr. Matheny worked with Sunday school classes, school guidance departments, social services, local businesses and the National Honor Society to conduct a food, clothing and toy drive which helped over 100 peo-

ple, the release said. She currently serves on the Human Relations Council in Zebulon.

Dr. Matheny is a charter member of the N.C. School Psychology Association and has served on the executive board of the association as a representative for the North Piedmont region. As regional representative, she planned and arranged a two-day workshop for school psychologists and other school support staff on sexual abuse of children and youth.

Dr. Matheny is married to Bob Matheny, mayor of Zebulon. They have three children: Michelle, Sam and Jim.
